#### THE KID'S GOT IT

Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), flashing more speed than customary, made it two in a row since adding blinkers as he downed Behrens (Pleasant Colony) in the GII Suburban H. at Belmont Park yesterday. The time of 1:58 4/5 was the second-fastest in the history of the Suburban, behind only the 1:58 1/5 put up by In Excess (Ire) in 1991. In his last start, Lemon Drop Kid sported blinkers for the first time and was part of the pace scenario before storming home by 7 1/4 lengths in the GII Brooklyn H. June 11. Breaking just outside of Behrens from post two, he shadowed Wild Imagination (Wild Again) through a half in :46 3/5 and three-quarters in 1:09 4/5. With a clear lead at the quarter pole, Lemon Drop Kid stole a march on Behrens, who had to angle out for room, and drove home a convincing winner. "We broke sharp and we were galloping real easy off the pace," said winning jockey Edgar Prado, "I knew I had Behrens pinned on the inside of me, and at the top of the stretch, I wanted to get the jump on him. My horse just took off and I knew Behrens was chasing me." Unraced since the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 25, Behrens put forth a valiant effort. "I thought he ran a good race," commented trainer H. James Bond. "I knew if Lemon Drop Kid could beat him, this was probably the spot he would do it in." The top two are both expected for the GI Whitney H. Aug. 6 at Saratoga.

WELL DONE, LU RAVI

Millionaire Lu Ravi (A.P. Indy) returned from a twomonth layoff to defeat champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) in yesterday's GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. at Monmouth Park. The bay mare had run into divisional leader Heritage of Gold earlier this year, finishing second in the GIII Oaklawn Breeders' Cup and the GI Apple Blossom H. Shipped to Chicago for the GIII Sixty Sails H. May 7, she got her first victory of 2000 with a two-length score over Tap to Music (Pleasant Tap). Given a brief freshening, she worked strongly at Churchill in preparation for this outing. Away smartly, the second choice prompted the early pace of Bella Chiarra (Phone Trick) through a half in :47 4/5, with Silverbulletday tucked in along the rail. Turning for home, jockey Pat Day shook the reins on Lu Ravi, and the big mare responded by opening up two lengths on the field. Silverbulletday was switched to the outside in the stretch, but could not run down the leader. It was a case of promise fulfilled for the oft-injured Lu Ravi. "Each year I've had her, her year has been compromised by injury--from her two-year-old campaign up to this year--but so far this year we've been lucky," explained winning trainer Carl Bowman. "She's sounder now than she's ever been in her career." Lu Ravi is expected to start next in the July 23 GIII Delaware H. Plans for the runner-up are up in the air. "She tried to win," trainer Bob Baffert said of Silverbulletday. "She showed her competitive spirit. At least she still has that."

Bradley H. and was twice runner-up to Northcote Road in New Orleans before breaking through with a victory in Keeneland's Apr. 14 GII Maker's Mark Mile S. in his last trip to the post. Second choice in the field of eight, the bay colt stepped out to set the pace, took a clear lead into the stretch but was hard-pressed to hold off the lateclosing favorite Riviera. "He had a soft pace and that always helps a speed horse like that," said winning trainer Frank Brothers. "He ran very well, but he's kind of running to the wire, which is, I think, the difference of winning and losing. The last little bit, he's got a little fight to him now and maybe he's just learning how to run."

Recently deceased Alleged, dual winner of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe over 1 1/2 miles, sired the first two home in this 12-furlong event. Williams News, collecting his first stakes victory here, romped home by six lengths in a conditions allowance at Churchill May 21 before finishing second to Buff in the Louisville H. June 11. Rating in midpack early, he launched his rally at the three-eighths pole and swept to the front, drawing off under a hand ride. "He's like one of those horses from overseas--you get him covered up and he relaxes," said winning jockey Robby Albarado. "This horse will run all day."

Affirmed Success, a multiple Grade I winner on the dirt, was making his turf debut off a third-place effort in the May 7 GI Carter H. Never far back, the bay gelding moved up turning for home, took charge at midstretch and was inching clear late. "After he lost two Breeders' Cup Sprints in a row, we decided that six furlongs wasn't his game," explained winning trainer Richard Schosberg, "But he is a Breeders' Cup horse; he has that kind of talent. So, our other alternative was to put him on turf and see if he could make the mile." Schosberg added that longterm goals for his speedy charge would likely be the Sept. 10 GI Atto Mile at Woodbine and the Oct. 8 GII Kelso at Belmont. Winning jockey Jorge Chavez commented, "Once we got in front, he just kept going. He really loved the turf." The race was marred when multiple graded stakes placed Divide and Conquer (Danzig) broke down midway on the turn. With likely favourite Noverre (Rahy), winner of the Listed Prix la Fleche at Maisons-Laffitte May 14, scratched beforehand, it was left to Prix la Fleche second and third, Iron Mask and Ozone Layer to dominate the betting and the finish. The result was not as expected as Ozone Layer reversed that form, outbattling Iron Mask for a game first pattern race success and emulated the victory of last year's winner Morning Pride (Ire) for owner, breeder, trainer and jockey. Italian-trained challenger Distinctly Dancer cut out the running from Valleeski (Fr) (Sky Lawyer (Fr)), Iron Mask and Never Loser (Fr) (Nevernevey), as Ozone Layer was settled at the back of the fivestrong field. Distinctly Dancer still held the call entering the final furlong, but Iron Mask and Ozone Layer were ridden to make their bids on the outside soon after. Responding to jockey Olivier Peslier's vigorous urgings, without recourse to the persuader, Ozone Laver battled to the front inside the last 75 yards and held enough in reserve to withstand the persistent bid of Iron Mask for a game win. Distinctly Dancer's trans-Alpine expedition proved worthwhile, picking up a creditable third prize.

# FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



#### SINNDAR THE MAGNIFICENT

In spite of his wide-margin nine-length win in Sunday's Irish Derby, I agreed with Paul Curtis's assessment in yesterday's *Racing Post* that the race was anticlimactic. On form, there were only three possible winners of Sunday's Clash of the Titans, and two of them didn't run their race: impressive English 2000 Guineas winner King's Best (Kingmambo) was pulled up with a cracked cannon bone, and French Derby winner Holding Court (Hernando), clearly feeling the effects of three impressive wire-to-wire wins, was never at the races. Under the circumstances, Sinndar only had to get round to win. Take nothing away from him, win impressively he did--adding further kudos for his sire, Grand Lodge, and his owner-breeder, the Aga Khan.

The Epsom second, Sakhee (Bahri), takes on Godolphin four-year-old Fantastic Light (Rahy) in this weekend's 10-furlong Eclipse (rain would bring the Niarchos mare Shiva into calculations), and the Epsom third, Beat Hollow, subsequently won the G1 GP de Paris (also 10f). Trained, like Shiva, by Henry Cecil, Beat Hollow could also run in the Eclipse if it doesn't rain.

But the Racing Post's Postmark ratings have probably just about got it right. They rate King's Best at 128, Sinndar at 127, but four-year-olds Dubai Millennium (139) and Montjeu (138)--the latter had an exercise gallop to win last Sunday's G1 GP de Saint-Cloud--look out on their own among what looks a very solid group of top three-year-olds and up in Europe.

#### The Germans are Coming...

You know that old adage about retail business--the three most important issues are location, location, and location. Something like that. In horse racing, the three most important issues are Form, Form, and Form. If you study and understand form, you have a chance to predict what will happen.

It usually doesn't, of course, but that's horse racing. But if you don't study and understand form, you are at a disadvantage, because you're only guessing, and you can only get it right by accident or coincidence. That's my view, anyway.

This is relevant in light of recent results in Germany. My colleague Tony Morris, who I rarely disagree with because I think he's an excellent analyst, again advanced the argument that Germany is Coming Soon. It's an appealing argument, because their pedigrees and families are mostly outcrosses, and it would be great to find a new source of top-class blood to cross with the established Phalaris sire lines.

There are two points which really buttress this point of view. Germany has been importing stallions for years, and yet only once in the last 20 years has an import (it was Dashing Blade, as a matter of fact) topped the German sire list. So the homegrown stallions are pretty good. Also, all four of the prominent young German stallions of the last two years demonstrated really good, legitimate form in the early 'Nineties--often outside Germany. Lomitas, last year's whiz kid, as well as Lando, Monsun, and Sternkoenig, were all rated in the 120s by Timeform.

There were 20 runners in last Sunday's German Derby; 11 were by first-crop sires, including five by Monsun, four by Sternkoenig, and one each for Lando and 1995 Irish Derby winner Winged Love. Monsun colts ran 1-2, with the Winged Love colt third. There were no runners in the race, by the way, by Lomitas. What happened to him?

Well, of course it's a good result, but is it a life-changing one? Does it mean German stallions have Arrived? Germany's been tried before, remember. Leslie Harrison went and found Slip Anchor's dam for Lord Howard de Walden, and Sheikh Mohammed has also bought a few from there, including the dam of Annus Mirabilis. For the most part, all of them and all their produce are mile-and-a-half horses. Quite adequate mile-and-a-half horses, to be sure, but not, I don't think, all-conquering. *Bill Oppenheim cont. p. 5*

Preakness winner Red Bullet (Unbridled) breezed four furlongs Monday at Belmont in :49 2/5...More Than Ready (Southern Halo) worked five furlongs in company with GII Arkansas Derby winner Graeme Hall (Dehere) in :58 yesterday. "It was fast but he was within himself," trainer Todd Pletcher said of More Than Ready's drill. "He's ready to run. We've given him plenty of time since the Derby and I think skipping the Met Mile was the right thing to do. Red Bullet is obviously going to be tough, but I think More Than Ready will be okay going a one-turn mile and an eighth." Also expected for Sunday's Dwyer is Belmont S. victor Commendable (Gone West).

That is my opinion because of my reading of the form lines, and those form lines all involve another three-year-old of 1993 who raced through his five-year-old year, Hernando. Winner of the 1993 French Derby (in which year Lando, Monsun, and Sternkoenig ran 1-2-3 in the German Derby), Hernando had form with these horses, and quite a bit of form with Lando, who was the best of the German trio on the racetrack. Lando did beat Hernando in the 1995 Japan Cup, but Hernando was otherwise consistently a better horse than Lando, including when they were second and eighth, respectively, behind Carnegie in the 1994 Arc.

The fact that Hernando sired French Derby winner Holding Court in his first crop validates the entire form line. There is a lot to be said for all these horses as middle-distance sires. I certainly agree with that. But I hope in the big rush to ship mares to Germany, breeders won't overlook a horse who the form lines say is every bit as good as these German stars, but happens to stand in Newmarket. I'm sorry if that sounds like an advertisement for Hernando, because I only mean it as a demonstration of what I consider the relevance of reading form lines. I love all these horses. I just want to point out that Hernando's form, both on the racecourse and at stud, is every bit as good.

#### Dazzling Danehill...

Danehill proved the Coolmore dual-hemisphere point in spades by becoming the next Sir Tristram in Australia in the 1990s, but I've always been Remained to Be Convinced up this way. Maybe it is elitist, but I have come to believe it has to happen in Britain, France, Ireland, or North America before it achieves first-world status, at least in the racing and breeding world. Whether this is the first crop of really top mares or what. I don't know, but what the form book does say is that he's now got seven two-year-old winners, including last Sunday's Curragh G3 winner Honours List. As you'll remember, he also had the 2-3 in the Queen Mary (the second is not yet a winner). Aidan O'Brien trains three (all sales colts, interestingly): Honours List, plus deeply impressive maiden winners Darwin and Mozart, as well as Queen Mary third, Little Firefly. Plus there's Chianti, a brother to Desert King trained by J. Dunlop for Wafic Said. He won his first start and is evidently very highly thought of. And, just to top it off, young Danehill mares also produced Queen Mary winner Romantic Myth, as well as Blixen, the John Oxx-trained Gone West filly of Sheikh Mohammed's who upset Giant's Causeway's highly touted full brother Freud in a Curragh maiden race last Saturday. Get On Board.

### **GODOLPHIN BUY CELTIC SILENCE**

Peter Savill's Celtic Silence (GB) (Celtic Swing {GB}), winner of the Listed Chesham S. at Royal Ascot June 22, has been purchased by Godolphin for an undisclosed sum, it was revealed yesterday. The colt will be sent to trainer David Loder at his current base in Evry, before wintering in Dubai. From the first crop of Celtic Swing, winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in 1994, and G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly in his Classic year of 1995, Celtic Silence was also owned by the chairman of the British Horseracing Board, Nick Babbington, racing manager to Savill, commented on the sale vesterday, "Peter was reluctant to sell, but he owns the sire and the dam, so it is terrific for Celtic Swing in his first season. Peter is also trying to build up the breeding side of the operation too, so it can only do it good." Trainer Mark Johnston. who loses the colt to Godolphin, added, "It's been in the offing since Royal Ascot, but the final vetting happened on Monday. I certainly wouldn't have tried to influence Mr. Savill to sell and I totally support his decision to do so."

#### SINNDAR TO PREP FOR ARC IN NIEL

Emulating the exploits of last year's G1 Arc de Triomphe winner Montjeu (Ire), dual Derby winner Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}) is likely to prep for the Longchamp feature with a run in the G2 Prix Niel at the Paris track Sept. 10. Trainer John Oxx told Racing Post's Alan Sweetman, "There is no rush to decide exactly where he will run, but it's a distinct possibility that he could go to France for the Prix Niel. #### FRESHMAN SIRES AT THE FORE

The G1 BMW Deutsches Derby last Sunday ended in a sheer demonstration of pure class when Stall Blankenese's Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) took command two furlongs from home and ran away from the battling pack to remain unbeaten in five starts. Bred by Gestut Karlshof, who also bred third-placed Acamani, Samum was selected and bought by the late Bruno Schutz, who sadly passed away on the Thursday before the race. The first three colts home, Samum, Subiaco and Acamani all hailed from the Andreas Schutz yard, a feat which has only ocurred twice before in German turf history. The last trainer to achieve that was when 31times champion trainer Heinz Jentzsch sent out Acatenango, Bismarck and Lirung in 1985. The junior Schutz and Samum's rider, champion jockey Andrasch Starke, both celebrated their second Derby victory following Robertico in 1998.

The first four horses home in the Derby all represent the first crops of their respective sires. Samum and Subiaco (Ger) are by Monsun (Ger), while Acamani (Ger) is by Irish Derby hero Winged Love (Ire). Kallisto (Ger), previously the winner of the G1 Derby Italiano, is by Sternkonig (Ire). The latter three sires were each Group 1 winners over 12 furlongs. Samum is the first foal bred from the unraced Old Vic (GB) mare Sacarina. Old Vic was himself a dual Derby winner, as was The Minstrel, the damsire of Subiaco. Acamani is out of a mare by 1974 German Derby hero Surumu, while Kallisto's dam is by the sole German Triple Crown winner Konigsstuhl. Moreover, Monsun is out of a mare by the great German sire influence Surumu who was represented in eleven pedigrees of all twenty Deutsches Derby runners. This means that the first three home all carry at least one strain of Surumu-blood in their respective genetic make-up.

The strength of German breeding clearly lies in the Classic performer over 2400m. Apart from the German Derby, German horses have scored in three additional foreign Derbys this season. In addition to Kallisto, Speedmaster (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), second to Samum in the G2 Grosser Muller Brot-Preis at Munich, took the Austrian Derby and Indurain (Ger) (Platini {Ger}) won the Czechoslovakian Derby.
