On Tuesday, my colleague Andrew Caulfield reviewed the pedigree of A.P. Indy's daughter Secret Status, who captured the GI Mother Goose S. on Saturday. A.P. Indy and his family were again in the news on Independence Day, with Lemon Drop Kid and Lu Ravi, respectively, taking the GII Suburban H. and GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H., the day's two most richly endowed events.

Lemon Drop Kid and Lu Ravi stem from very similar gene pools. In fact, three of Lemon Drop Kid's four grandparents also appear in the pedigree of Lu Ravi. Lemon Drop Kid is by the Mr. Prospector sire Kingmambo (a stud-mate of A.P. Indy, and another sire who is having a tremendous year), out of Charming Lassie, a three-quarters sister to A.P. Indy (she is by A.P. Indy's sire Seattle Slew, out of A.P. Indy's granddam Lassie Dear). Lu Ravi is by A.P. Indy, and her dam is by Seeking the Gold, a son of Mr. Prospector. The pair have another very close relative in the Y2K stakes winner Welcome Surprise, who is by Seeking the Gold out of Weekend Surprise (which means that she

has the same grandsire and granddam as Lemon Drop Kid). Welcome Surprise's relationship with Lu Ravi is a little more complex--she is a half sister to Lu Ravi's sire (A.P. Indy), and she is by Lu Ravi's maternal grandsire (Seeking the Gold)--which means that her sire and dam turn up in the second generation of Lu Ravi's pedigree. And we shouldn't leave this "round robin" of relationships without mentioning that Kingmambo's current turf star, King Cugat, is out of a half sister to Seeking the Gold.

We have reviewed Lemon Drop Kid's pedigree before, but it is worth noting that his sire (like most of the Mr. Prospector line) appears to work very well with Seattle Slew. Not only has Kingmambo sired Lemon Drop Kid and stakes winner American Odyssey out of mares by Seattle Slew, but he has also sired champion El Condor Pasa out of a mare whose dam is by Seattle Slew.


Of course, there is no mystery in the success of the Mr. Prospector/Seattle Slew combination. Two of the dominant influences of the era, the pair go back to the great broodmare Myrtlewood (fifth dam of Seattle Slew, fourth dam of Mr. Prospector). Seattle Slew's granddam is actually inbred to this family, the second cross coming through Black Wave, a three-quarters sister to Mr. Prospector's third dam Miss Dogwood). Seattle Slew's dam is linebred to *La Troienne through the sisters Striking and Busher, and A.P. Indy has a third cross of the strain via Buckpasser, who is out of a three-quarters sister to Striking and Busher.

This sets up Seattle Slew and A.P. Indy to work particularly well with horses combining Mr. Prospector and La Troienne, and Seeking the Gold is one who fits the bill, as he is out of a mare by Buckpasser. A.P. Indy has already sired four graded stakes winners out of Mr. Prospector-line mares and nine stakes winners out of mares carrying La Troienne. Lu Ravi, Grade I winner Tomisue's Delight and graded stakes winner Accelerator all have both Mr. Prospector and La Troienne in their dams. We should also note that the excellent filly Surfside is by A.P. Indy's sire Seattle Slew out of a Seeking the Gold mare.

As might be expected, the reverse cross is also working, and Seeking the Gold has sired Grade I winners Seeking the Pearl and Cape Town, and stakes winner Mutakddim out of mares by Seattle Slew, and stakes winner Sneaky Quiet out of a mare by Slew o' Gold (himself out of a Buckpasser mare).

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We have always liked the idea of combining Roberto and Dixieland Band, as Roberto's dam, Bramalea, is a three-parts genetic relative to Beautillion, the dam of Dixieland Band's broodmare sire, Delta Judge. One mare who has particularly benefitted from the combination is Dixie Card. She is dam of the GII Wood Memorial S. and GIII Discovery H. victor, Adonis (by Roberto's son, Kris S.) and of Adonis's year younger three-quarters sister, Kentucky Storm (f, 3, Dynaformer--Dixie Card, by Dixieland Band), who became a stakes winner with a victory in the Pleasanton Senorita S. this weekend.

One of the cleverest matings of the weekend was the one which produced Song of the Moment (f, 2, River Special--Memorable Moment, by Secretariat), winner of the Juan Gonzalez Memorial S. at Pleasanton. Song of the Moment has Nijinsky II (broodmare sire of River Special) and his three-quarters brother Far North 3x3. There is actually a more complex relationship at work as River Special is by a son of Never Bend out of a Nijinsky II mare, and Song of the Moment's granddam North Mist is by Far North out a Never Bend mare.

We don't often feature South African horses in this column, but we noted one with an international pedigree in the shape of Tytola (Aus) (c, 2, Last Tycoon {Ire}-Tolanda {Aus}, by Tolomeo {Ire}), a two-year-old who captured the G1 Premier's Champion S. Tytola is inbred 4x4 to the sisters Best In Show (granddam of Last Tycoon's sire, Try My Best) and Reckless Driver (fourth dam of Tytola). Sisters also appear in the pedigree of two-year-old stakes winner Distinct (f, 2, Out of Place-Maeve O., by Medieval Man). Winner of the J J's Dream S. at Calder, Distinct has the Calumet-bred Miz Clementine/Two Lea 5x5.

The duplication of the mare Mixed Marriage via her son Atan (sire of Sharpen Up) and daughter Tamerett (dam of Known Fact and Tentam, and granddam of Gone West) has been working well lately. Nakoda (f, 2, Real West--Classy Cloque, by Capote), winner of the Timber Music S. at Hastings Park, is by a son of Gone West and his second dam is by Diesis (GB) (by Sharpen Up {GB}). Ozone Layer (GB) (c, 2, Zafonic--Ozone Friendly, by Green Forest), winner of the G3 Prix du Bois is by Zafonic and has a second dam by Kris (GB) (by Sharpen Up). Earlier in the year, Pacino (by Zafonic and with a granddam by Diesis) won the German 2000 Guineas equivalent, and Crimplene (by Gone West's son Lion Cavern out of a mare by Diesis) has swept the German 1000 Guineas equivalent, the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Coronation S.

We've frequently written about the success enjoyed by horses who combine Tom Fool with various genetic relatives. Red God (the sire of Blushing Groom {Fr}) is out of Spring Run, a genetic three-parts relative to Tom Fool, and the combination of Red God and Tom Fool ran wild over the holiday period. Weekend stakes winners with the pair in the pedigree included GI United Nations H. victor Down the Aisle (h, 7, Runaway Groom--That's My Hon, by L'Enjoleur); GIII Tremont S. victor City Zip (c, 2, Carson City--Baby Zip, by Relaunch); Taiki Treasure (Miswaki--Royal Bride, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), who took the G3 Hakodate Sprint S.; and Swallow Flight (Ire) (c, 4, Bluebird--Mirage {Ire}, by Red Sunset {Ire}), winner of the On the House S. at Goodwood in England.

Likely favorite General Challenge (General Meeting) had his final re-race prep yesterday, drilling five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 under the watchful eye of trainer Bob Baffert. "The work was perfect, an easy five, he's ready to run," the conditioner commented. Unraced since a third-place finish in the Apr. 9 GII San Bernardino H., Baffert is trying for his second consecutive Gold Cup victory, following the success of Real Quiet a year ago. Blueprint (Ire) (Generous {Ire}) worked a half mile for trainer Bob Hess and is also likely for the \$1 million event. "He hasn't broken a sweat," Hess said. "He galloped in :49 flat, came back like he did nothing. He's done everything beautifully." The winner of this year's May 5 G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket will need to be supplemented for \$25,000. Four other contenders worked over the Hollywood strip Monday, according to Daily Racing Form. David (Mt. Livermore), third in the GII Massachusetts H. worked five furlongs in :59.60. Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap), seventh in the MassCap, went the same distance in :58.80, the second fastest work at the distance Monday. MassCap runner-up Out of Mind (Brz) (Sestero {Brz}) worked five panels in 1:03. Breeders' Cup Classic winner Cat Thief (Storm Cat) worked six furlongs in 1:13.20. Other probables for the race are Big Ten (Chi) (Barkerville), Chester House (Mr. Prospector) and Early Pioneer (Rahy).

BAZE WINS 7,000TH Jockey Russell Baze won the 7,000th race of his career Tuesday at Pleasanton, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. The Hall of Famer rode This is the Moment to victory in the Pleasanton S. He is only the sixth jockey to reach the 7,000 plateau, joining Laffit Pincay, Jr., Bill Shoemaker, Pat Day, David Gall and Angel Cordero, Jr. The 41-year-old Baze won 400 or more races in eight consecutive seasons and won the Isaac Murphy Award for the highest winning percentage among jockeys in the United States in five straight years.

STILL CALLING THE SHOTS

"Grid!" "Five!" "Four!" "Seven!" "Three!" "Button click!"

No, that isn't a quarterback calling signals. It's just Robin Cleary working on her computer.

Cleary uses a program called Dragon Dictate to move her cursor around the screen because she can't use her hands to guide the mouse. She suffered a severed spinal cord during a morning workout accident at Calder July 29, 1996. As an assistant trainer for her husband Brian, the horsewoman was aboard Phon E Actor when he broke both front legs. She was thrown forward, landing on her head. The injury made her a quadriplegic and confined to a wheelchair for the rest of her life.

After months of rehab, she finally came home to a house that was retro fitted to accommodate her wheelchair. But she wanted to get back to the track to resume as normal a life as possible.

With contributions from around the country, Cleary was able to get a wheelchair-accessible van. With the aid of Claudia Lyole and Sarah Johnson, who spent 10-hour shifts with her day after day, she is able to move around the community to shop and run errands.

Cleary also goes to the barn every morning to help her husband with the tasks that need to be done.

"Claudia and I go to the track to watch the workouts while Brian stays behind," she said. "I've taught Claudia how to time horses and which poles to watch for. We can do all the workouts which frees Brian up for other chores." *Cont. p. 4*

But, it was the computer that really freed Cleary.

"It's the only thing I can do completely by myself,"
she said with confidence. "I can sit in front of the
computer for three or four hours at a time by myself
surfing the Internet, working the word processor,
building a data base."

The computer was a donation from The Jockey Club. "Nancy Kelly was the person I worked with from The Jockey Club, and she was wonderful," Cleary explained.

Sitting in front of her computer, Cleary looks like a telemarketer hawking newspaper subscriptions. She's decked out with a head set and mike that's connected to a speaker card in the computer.

When the computer is fired up, Dragon Dictate loads in at the start-up along with the operating system. With the headset in place Cleary can move the cursor around the screen by calling numbers from a grid. As she zeroes in, the grid gets progressively smaller until she's over an icon. Once the grid is in place she says "button click," which is the same as double clicking the left mouse button. Once a program is opened Cleary can move around the screen calling up bookmarks, HTML sites and downloading files.

A couple of years ago, Cleary got involved with the Miami Project, a fund-raising effort to raise money to cure paralysis. The Miami Project has sponsored Walk-n-Roll-a-Thon for the last 10 years. In her first two years with the event Cleary was able to collect over \$62,500, 33 percent of all the funds raised. She gathered over \$55,000 in 1999, most of which came from members of the Thoroughbred community.

"Claudia would drive me over to the barns and I would tell her who to go and see at each barn. She would have to wait until the trainer was off the phone and tell them what we were collecting for. Everybody was so generous. When the sales companies came in February and March to Calder, Claudia and I were waiting for them. It's amazing how generous the Thoroughbred community has been."

This year, Cleary was asked to start a separate fund-raising effort that would involve just the Thoroughbred industry. Both Calder and Gulfstream are helping Cleary put on fund drives. Calder Vice President Mike Cronin said, "We are working with the Miami Project to put together a joint effort that will be connected with the Festival of the Sun (Oct. 7)."

Calder already has contributed over \$250,000 to the Miami Project over the past five years, in addition to separate contributions to Cleary's efforts. Cleary also was presented with an \$85,000 check during the Gulfstream meet, money which came from the Breeders' Cup and from the Gulfstream Park Gala party that was thrown a couple of days before the Breeders' Cup.

"I'm sending out 'Thank You' letters to everyone that's contributed," said Cleary as she worked her way through her word-processing programming to run the Mail Merge function. "I'd never be able to do any of this without the computer."

GIANT'S CAUSEWAY MAY TAKE IN ECLIPSE

Giant's Causeway (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}), whose racing has been of the highest order over a mile so far this year, may be ready to make the step up to the ten furlongs of Sandown's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. on Saturday. Runner-up in the English and Irish 2000 Guineas, the Aidan O'Brien-trained colt took the G1 St James' Palace S. Royal Ascot June 20, and afterwards his jockey Michael Kinane stated that he may need further in the future. The trainer has been pleased with his work since and said yesterday, "He worked very well and we are seriously considering the race. I'd prefer it didn't rain as the horse is such a good mover, but we'll decide later in the week." It is hoped that Michael Kinane will be able to take the ride should he line up, as he is recovering from a muscle problem that arose last Saturday at The Curragh. The sponsors Coral make the Ballydoyle colt a 6-1 chance at present, with G1 Epsom Derby S. runnerup Sakhee (USA) (Bahri {USA}) their 2-1 favourite. The forecast rain arrived on Tuesday night at the Esher track, with an inch and a quarter falling on the ground, changing the advance going to good, and good-to-soft in places. That will bode well for Henry Cecil's Shiva (Jpn) (Hector Protector {USA}), who needs cut in the ground, and is currently quoted as the 7-2 second favourite. The trainer also provides the G1 Epsom Derby S. third, Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), who is quoted at 11-2. Although a decision has yet to be made on their participation, they both worked well on Newmarket Heath yesterday morning, and connections were pleased with their efforts.

IPSWICH AFTERMATH

Popular Gold Coast jockey Gary Doughty will need another miracle if he's to ever ride again, after doctors confirmed he had lost the sight in his right eye following his fall at Ipswich races last Saturday. Doughty's wife Kelly said her husband was slowly coming to terms with the prospect of not riding again, but was thankful to be still alive. "It's hit him a bit hard but he's thankful he's still with us." Mrs Doughty said. Doughty, 41, suffered severe head injuries, including a brain haemorrhage, when he was dislodged from River Affair on the home turn in the Eye Liner Stakes. Doughty began his career in Victoria, where he rode Showmeran to victory in the G1 The IXL in 1983 at Caulfield, which today has reverted to its original name, the Toorak Handicap. Matthew Paget is the only rider still hospitalised after the dramatic Ipswich Cup crash. He will remain in hospital for several weeks recovering from a dislocated hip, broken collarbone and broken arm suffered when his mount Sea Breeze was one of eight horses to come to grief in the Ipswich Cup.

Australasian Report cont. QUARANTINE AT FANNIE BAY

Three hundred horses from throughout Australia have been guarantined at Fannie Bay racecourse after the highly infectious disease strangles was detected in the Northern Territory. Darwin Turf Club chief executive David Aldred said today there was little risk to the horses who had come from New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia for the Darwin Cup Carnival. "Because we have our carnival on here at the moment, we've got 300 horses stabled on the racecourse," Aldred told Australian Associated Press. "We decided that since we've got racehorses coming to and from the track, that we'd quarantine the racecourse and not let any outside horse come in beyond yesterday." He expected no disruption to the carnival, which began at the weekend and will continue through August. "We believe that 99 percent of the horses would be at the track already," Aldred said. "As soon as we heard a hint that there was an infectious disease around, we moved swiftly to make sure that we weren't going to be affected here because we just couldn't take risk." The latest outbreak of the disease, which is rarely fatal, is thought to have originated from a cattle station at Pine Creek about two hours drive south of Darwin.
