SUNDAY SILENCE FOAL SETS RECORD

A colt by champion Japanese sire and U.S. Horse of the Year Sunday Silence brought ¥320,000,000 during the opening session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's select sale of foals at Northern Horse Park yesterday to set a world record for a foal sold at auction. He is out of the French stakes winner Franc Argument (Argument {Fr}), who was also multiple graded-stakes placed in the U.S. including a second in the GI Flower Bowl H. Consigned by Northern Farm, the foal was purchased by Misako Okada. The previous record was set in 1985, when the British Bloodstock Agency purchased Magic Of Life for \$2.5 million from the Newstead Farm dispersal at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky, according to the *Thoroughbred Times*. The second highest-priced foal at yesterday's opener was a filly by Sunday Silence, also from the Northern Farm consignment, who brought ¥230,000,000. The first foal out of Japanese Horse of the Year Air Groove (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}), who won seven stakes and was twice second in the G1 Japan Cup to earn more than \$6.8 million, the filly was purchased by Riichi Kondo. A total of 91 foals brought an aggregate ¥3,525,200,000 for an average of ¥38,738,461. The final session will be held today.

YOSHIDA REVEALS PEGASUS PARTNERSHIP

Prominent Japanese horseman Teruya Yoshida has revealed that his family's Shadai Farm owns a minority interest in Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), and that the farm has not sold its share in the colt to Coolmore, the *Blood-Horse* reports. Coolmore recently purchased the breeding rights to the three-year-old for a price believed to be in the \$70 million range, and plans are to stand him at their Kentucky division, Ashford Stud, next year. His stud fee is expected to be about \$200,000, live foal. Yoshida told the *Blood-Horse* that Shadai purchased shares in approximately 20 of owner Fusao Sekiguchi's horses, including Fusaichi Pegasus, last fall. He did not specify the size of Shadai's share in the Derby winner, but speculation is that they own 40 percent.

KEEPING "PACE" IN PRINCESS OF WALES

It is hard to believe that Yavana's Pace (Ire) (Accordion {Ire}) could still be improving, but that is what his recent form suggests. The eight-year-old gelding heads the field for today's G2 Princess Of Wales's S. at Newmarket. Last time out, the veteran found only stablemate Fruits Of Love too good in the June 23 G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot, and it would probably have taken something special to stop Fruits Of Love on the good-to-firm going that day. Previously, Yavana's Pace had won the G3 John Porter S. Haydock Apr. 22 on ever-worsening soft ground, so he is as versatile as he is tough and genuine. This race looks at his mercy, but both Little Rock (GB) (Warning {GB}) and Sea Wave (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) have enough ability to take him on, if they have a good day. Sea Wave has won at this level, but that was back in 1997 in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. He has not matched that form since, partly due to his quirky temperament. Little Rock was disappointing when last in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly June 11, but captured the G3 Marriott Hotel S. at Sandown Apr. 29.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

With considerable help from Coolmore and Fusaichi Pegasus, Fusao Sekiguchi has shown that boldness in the sales pavilion can still reap huge rewards; the Coolmore team has also seen one of its high-priced investments soar in value over recent weeks.

When Mariah's Storm appeared as Hip 359 at the 1996 Keeneland November Sale, the daughter of Rahy looked sure to be highly popular. In addition to being a six-time graded-stakes winner, the five-year-old was carrying her first foal to Storm Cat. This enticing combination persuaded John Magnier to pay \$2.6 million, \$700,000 more than the next highest-priced mare.

Magnier explained that Mariah's Storm had been bought because Michael Tabor needed a top-class mare to send to Cigar in 1997. Although Cigar's infertility ruined these plans, Mariah's Storm's buyers were sufficiently impressed with the Storm Cat foal she produced Feb. 14 that the mare was returned to Overbrook's champion sire in 1997, 1998 and again this year.

The 1997 mating resulted in Freud, who was narrowly beaten as a hot favorite on his recent debut, but there have been very few setbacks for Freud's older brother, Giant's Causeway, who wound up his unbeaten juvenile campaign with a victory in the G1 Prix de la Salamandre.

Aidan O'Brien reportedly altered Giant's Causeway's training regime after his colt was beaten into second place when favorite for both the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, the intention being to inject more speed into his lazy colt.

Giant's Causeway has responded with very courageous victories in two of England's top prizes, the G1 St James's Palace S. over a mile and Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse over 1 1/4 miles.

This impressive colt is now guaranteed to be much in demand when he retires to one or other of the Coolmore stallion stations.

After Giant's Causeway's Guineas defeats, I wondered whether connections would consider switching him to the U.S. He looked just the type to shine under American conditions. He has a high cruising speed, is happy to make the running and both his parents excelled on dirt tracks. Such a move is no longer necessary, but it would be fascinating to see him tackle the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, which was won last year by another of Storm Cat's free-running chestnut sons, Cat Thief.

Mariah's Storm liked to stalk the pacesetter before taking control in her races, as she showed in her three graded-takes victories as a four-year-old. These were headed by her defeat of Serena's Song, another Rahy filly, in the GII Turfway Budweiser Breeders' Cup.

In terms of appearance, Serena's Song was the more typical daughter of the diminutive Rahy. Mariah's Storm, I'm told, is very strong and stands three inches taller than her sire, perhaps because she is inbred 4x3 to the big Hail To Reason. It could also be significant that her dam, a daughter of Roberto, was named Immense.

Although she was a tough and durable Grade III winner on turf, Immense wasn't so talented as her half-sister Dearly Precious, who won the last eight of her nine races in 1975 to take the title of best two-year-old filly. However, Immense has proved the better broodmare. Her Rainbow Quest colt Panoramic (now best known as the sire of Tuzla) was a leading middle-distance colt who once finished second to Sky Classic in the GI Rothmans International.

Immense has been a very irregular breeder since she was sold to Japan for \$700,000 in 1991, just months after producing Mariah's Storm, but she produced a filly in 1996 to Groom Dancer. This filly, Air Zion, collected a Group 3-Jpn prize going 1 1/8 miles on turf at Nakayama last October to improve Immense's record to three graded winners from seven foals. Remarkably, these three are by three different sons of Blushing Groom, so this combination works very well.

NTRA ANNOUNCES "TWO-YEAR-OLD CHALLENGE" The National Thoroughbred Racing Association yesterday unveiled plans for a televised series of races for two-year-olds which will debut this fall. The seven races in the program are the Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga, Sept. 13 GI Del Mar Futurity, Sept. 17 GI Futurity at Belmont Park, Sept. 23 GI Arlington-Washington Futurity, Oct. 7 GI Norfolk S. at Santa Anita, Oct. 8 GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland and the Oct. 14 GI Champagne S. at Belmont. Any horse which wins one of these races and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs Nov. 4 will win his owner a \$250,000 bonus. If that horse has been sold at public auction, the consignor will receive a \$50,000 bonus, and if the horse goes on to win the 2001 GI Kentucky Derby, the owner will be awarded a \$1 million bonus. All owners and consignors will qualify for bonuses in 2000, but thereafter, only those horsemen participating in the NTRA's voluntary 1/4-percent sales program will be eligible. The sales program, which begins with the 2000 July sales, asks owners, breeders and consignors to donate 1/4 percent of a horse's purchase price at auction to the NTRA. Five of the seven "Challenge" races will be televised on TVG. The Breeders' Futurity will be aired on ESPN, and the Champagne will be broadcast on NBC.

FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC SALE SET FOR TODAY The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age Sale, with 143 lots catalogued, will be held today at the Timonium Sales Pavilion in Maryland. Bidding begins at noon. The two-year-olds on offer represent such popular stallions as Belong to Me, Glitterman, Go for Gin, Meadowlake, Saint Ballado and Theatrical (Ire), as well as freshmen including Forest Wildcat, Honour and Glory and Islefaxyou. A colt by Candy Stripes, selling as Hip #19, posted the fastest quarter during yesterday's Under Tack Preview, getting the distance in :21 3/5. Hip #34, a colt by Anjiz, put in the quickest three-furlong breeze, going in :34 3/5. There were three juveniles who tied for the best one-furlong work: Hip #1, a gelding by Safe Prospect; Hip #32, a gelding by Mister Jolie; and Hip #94, a colt by In Case, all clocked an eighth in :11 1/5.

ALBERT THE GREAT TO JIM DANDY Trainer Nick Zito said yesterday that **Albert The Great** (Go for Gin), winner of Sunday's GI Dwyer S. in his stakes debut, will make his next start in the Aug. 5 GI Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga and then point to the Aug. 26 GI Travers S. "He came out of the race great," Zito said. "We're looking forward to the Jim Dandy and then the Travers." As for the mile and a quarter of the Travers, Zito said, "I think he'll handle that. He's certainly bred for it, and he has gone a mile and an eighth three times with no problem. He'll get a mile and a quarter, don't worry about that."

TATTERSALLS JULY SALE STARTS TODAY

More horses than ever before are catalogued for this year's Tattersalls July Sales, which begins its three-day run at 10 a.m. this morning in Newmarket. The 388-lot sale is largely made up of horses in and out of training with a few broodmares also catalogued. Overseas buyers often compete with domestic jump trainers for the better lots and one that looks to be popular with foreign bidders is lot 378, the high-class handicapper **King Priam (Ire)** (Priolo {USA}), who finished runner-up in this year's Worthington Lincoln H. and should handle racing on dirt as he is an all-weather winner. The Queen's **Amritsar (GB)** (Indian Ridge {GB}), lot 175, has consistent form in handicaps, including a third at Bath yesterday. The Listed-placed three-year-old **Perugia (Ire)** (Perugino {USA}), lot 354, will be of interest as both a racing and breeding prospect, especially if she runs well at Newmarket this afternoon. Another three-year-old filly with winning form is lot 319, **Bella Bellissimo (Ire)** (Alzao {USA}), who has definite paddock potential coming from the outstanding family of Nashwan (USA) and Unfuwain (USA). But **Columbus (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), lot 276, will only make a fraction of what he cost on his last visit to Tattersalls, when he brought 1 million guineas at the 1998 Houghton Sales. Of the two-year-olds catalogued, lot 369, **Flummox (GB)** (Rudimentary {USA}), who won a Warwick maiden in his debut in May, boasts as good form as any. This sale's most famous recent graduate is three-time Champion Hurdle winner **Istabraq (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) who was sold by Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum. Also by the champion sire and offered from the same owner is the lightly raced **Turaath (Ire)**, lot 346, who won a Doncaster maiden last year. Of the mares in foal, **Virtue Rewarded (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), lot 36, is unraced but presents an attractive package being out of a half sister to the G1 Irish Oaks winner Give Thanks and covered by Entrepreneur (GB). A stallion prospect could be **Sheer Danzig (Ire)** (Roi Danzig {USA}), lot 193, who has not raced since the 1998 Melbourne Cup and is a half brother to last year's G1 Derby winner **Oath (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}). Selling begins today, tomorrow and Thursday at 10 a.m. with evening sessions both tonight and Wednesday commencing at 5:45 p.m.

TRB Inspects Safety Vests:

Thoroughbred Racing Board stewards swooped on jockeys' rooms statewide Saturday to inspect and weigh compulsory riding vests after it was revealed that injured rider Justin Sheehan had tampered with his vest. Sheehan suffered fractured ribs when his mount Mushtak broke both forelegs in an eight-horse crash in the Ipswich Cup last Saturday and he confirmed today he'd been fined \$1,000 for altering his body protector. Sheehan admitted to Queensland Principal Club stewards last Monday at an inquiry into the fall that he had removed a layer of padding from his safety vest two days earlier. "I admitted my guilt, I was upfront. I tampered with my vest," Sheehan told *The Sydney Morning Herald*. "I realise I was a mug for doing it. The circumstances could have been a lot worse." At Warwick Farm in Sydney on Saturday, 14 jockeys and five apprentices were ordered to line up by stewards who weighed each rider's vest. The mandatory body protectors weigh about 500g but professionally altering them can reduce them to about 160g. "I've got a weight problem and I took matters into my own hands and I shouldn't have," Sheehan said. "I've realised since that I could have been seriously maimed in the Cup fall and my wife would have got nothing, I probably would have had no insurance. It is not something I'll do in the future." TRB chief steward Ray Murrhiy warned that any rider caught with a faulty vest was, "looking at a penalty starting with a one-month suspension."
