JAPANESE FOALS SALE CONCLUDES

The Japan Racing Horse Association Select Sale of Foals concluded vesterday with gross receipts for two sessions of ¥6,066,399,960. A total of 173 horses were purchased for an average of ¥35,065,896. Yesterday's second and final session was topped by hip number 181, a colt by Sunday Silence--Fadetta (Fappiano), who brought a winning bid of ¥220,000,000 from Makoto Kaneko. The half brother to three-time Japanese winner Monte Carlo (Jpn) hailed from the consignment of Northern Farm, who sold six of the top 11 lots. Sunday Silence, who was the sire of 10 of the top 11 selling foals, is the sire of the afternoon's second-highest priced offering, hip number 186, purchased for ¥185,000,000 by Isao Okowa. Consigned to the sale by Shadai Farm, the bay colt, out of Daring Danzig (Danzig), is a half brother to American Grade I winner Ecton Park.

ROCK SOLID

Little Rock (GB) (Warning {GB}), found subsequent Epsom Derby winner Oath (Ire) too strong in the Listed Dee S. at Chester last May, but progressed to win the Listed James Seymour S. in October and the G3 Marriott Hotel S. at Sandown Apr. 29. Disappointing when last home in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly June 11 on his most recent start, he bounced back yesterday to take the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket. Settled on the rail in third early as Yavana's Pace (Accordion (Ire)) made the running in front, jockey Pat Eddery allowed Little Rock to bowl along until the leader looked as though he may get away from the field a half mile from the line. Little Rock began a true run up the inside rail and, benefitting when Yavana's Pace drifted to the left in the closing stages, got on top near the line. Trainer Michael Stoute, winning the race for the fourth time, said, "After the Dee S. last year he came back with a chip in his near-fore fetlock, so he was kept off for a while. He was a little bit delicate from two to three, but he's matured physically from three to four." For owner John Greetham it was a welcome success. "He's a good horse from a good family. Everything was positive today, and he stays, he's got guts and a bit of pace."

When Primo Valentino (Ire) stormed up these six furlongs last October, he gave trainer Peter Harris his first Group 1 winner in the Middle Park S. As a precursor to Primo Valentino's G1 July Cup bid on Thursday, his half sister Dora Carrington added to the family's resume with a win here. Successful in a Pontefract maiden last time on good to firm ground, she showed early speed and when the pace quickened past halfway, she was traveling well, but looked destined for second place as Enthused went away with two furlongs remaining. Dora Carrington stuck to her guns, however, and as jockey Richard Quinn asked her to go after the leader, she responded gamely to grab the front with 100 yards to race as Enthused faltered. "She's only had one race, and I don't really test them at home, so there is a lot of improvement in her," said winning trainer Peter Harris. "It is very satisfying because we bred the dam as well. We thought she would come here with a winning chance or we wouldn't have come. I suppose we'll have to stick to the top fillies' races now, and the Lowther S. (G2, York, Aug. 24) is the natural progression from here. We'll stick to six furlongs with her this season, but I do feel she is likely to get a mile as a three-year-old."

Successful in raids to Ireland and Germany last year and second on his previous outing in the G3 Holsten Trophy at Hamburg July 1, Gorse was making his first start in France. It was a successful first Gallic experience as he held on bravely in the closing stages when challenged by Danger Over to record his third Group 3 win. Gorse travelled to the fore as the favourite Khasayl (Ire) (Lycius) held a slight lead with Danger Over in midfield and Tomba in rear. Gorse was ridden from the quarter-mile marker and seized the initiative with 1½ furlongs to run as Khasayl weakened quickly. Danger Over was produced on the outside to tackle Gorse from the furlong pole, but the latter responded in game fashion to hold on well as the line approached. Tomba ran on strongly from the rear and poached third place on the line, although some way adrift of the leading pair.

CORRECTION: Yesterday's *TDN* incorrectly reported that the Sunday Silence foal which sold for ¥320,000,000 (\$2.9 million) during Monday's JHRA Select Foal Sale broke the world record for a foal sold at auction. The actual record is held by a foal by Caerleon-Doff The Derby, which sold for 2,500,000 guineas (\$4.2 million) at the 1997 Tattersalls December Sale.

James Fanshawe has a strong hand in this renewal, providing Listed Swinley S. winner Embraced and Bedazzling, a Leicester conditions winner. The former created a favourable impresssion when running away with that contest, but found conditions against her when sixth in the G3 Musidora S. May 16, when the further trip and firm going diminished her chance. Brought back to a mile and with suitable conditions underfoot, she has a major chance of winning at this level. Golden Silca showed she was as tough and genuine as ever when winning the Listed Victress S. at Epsom June 9. She made no real impression last time behind Kalanisi (Ire) in the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 20, but this looks to be an easier spot. Alshakr belied inexperience to be third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) May 14, and if she has improved since, she will be a force to be reckoned with here, on the course that saw her take her maiden Apr. 19. Geoff Wragg always seems to have a useful three-year-old filly in his yard, and this year it could be Danceabout, who was a creditable fifth in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot June 21, having only won a Goodwood maiden in May.

MAJESTIC LIGHT DEAD Claiborne farm stallion Majestic Light (Majestic Prince) died on July 7 at the Hagyard-Davidson-McGee clinic following colic surgery. The 27-year-old stallion had covered 27 mares this season. A multiple Grade I winner of \$650,158, Majestic Light sired champions Lacovia and Nishino Flower, as well as Graded/Group winners Eagleton, Lite Light, Hidden Light, Patches, Simply Majestic and Solar Splendor for a total of 69 stakes winners to date from 20 crops of racing age.

DRUG POSITIVE FOR GUINEAS WINNER It was reported in yesterday's Tutto Sport, Turin's leading sports paper, that G2 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) winner Davide Umbro (Ity) (In The Wings {GB}) has tested positive for the banned substance phenyl-butazone ("bute") following his win in the Classic at Rome Apr. 30. The original urine samples taken immediately after the race, were stolen from the racetrack and all samples were ordered to be retaken. According to Tutto Sport, trainers were asked before the urine samples were retaken whether or not their horses had been prescribed medication subsequent to the race and trainer Emanuele Russo had declared that Davide Umbro had not. Under Italian rules, when a positive result has been given, a second test has to be carried out in order to confirm the first. That test will take place today and, if positive, it is likely that Davide Umbro will face disqualifi-

SALE TIME

There's been a perception the last couple of years that expensive sales horses are doing better. Two teams who wouldn't be arguing that point are the Coolmore boys, and Team Lukas. There have already been six Group 1 winners out of the 1998 Keeneland July sale--that's about four percent, which is five times the percentage of Group 1 winners by 130 current summer sales sires, as defined in the current issue of Market Watch. Lukas and/or Coolmore have four of the six, and Coolmore was underbidder on another of them, Fusaichi Pegasus. To be specific, Lukas trains or trained three: Breeders' Cup winner Cash Run, Classic winner Commendable, and High Yield, who is partowned by Coolmore. Coolmore also had last year's European champion two-year-old, Fasliyev, from the 1998 July sale.

In spite of the dwindling numbers in the world's most expensive yearling sale, the success rate is improving. Combined with the resurgence across town at the Fasig-Tipton sale--two full days and 556 yearlings catalogued--there will be plenty to see, and hear about. This column will be appearing overnight, after each session, for the next day's paper, so hopefully there will be plenty to be keeping track of, and chat about.

There are a few general markers we can use to follow along, particularly for Keeneland's opening Monday night session. If we assume the distribution of power continues to center on the final Tuesday night session, we should look for about a quarter of the sale's key measurements from the Monday night session. Last year, for example, there were 20 million-dollar yearlings, and 56 which sold for \$500,000+, through the entire three-session sale. The previous year there had been 15 and 56, with about 12 percent more horses sold. If there are five million-dollar yearlings Monday night, and around 14 which bring \$500,000 +, the sale is roughly on course to match last year's totals. With such a small number catalogued, though--just 69 in the opening

session--Monday night's events may or may not tell us that much about the overall North American yearling market.

While the number sold has dropped 30 percent since 1995, the sale's average has more than doubled. Last year the average jumped almost \$100,000, a more than 20-percent average increase. Whether those kinds of gains can be sustained looks problematical. Stability and consistency are almost as desirable in a market economy as continuing big gains, and I should think that is all Keeneland is hoping to achieve at this sale. That and a few more Group 1 winners.

Fasig-Tipton, meanwhile, has recaptured the buzz that made this such a hot sale in the early 'eighties. Last year, the highest number sold since 1985 produced the highest gross since 1985, and the highest average (a highly commendable \$75,000) since 1986. And there are nearly a third more yearlings catalogued this year to a sale which has regained the reputation as a conformation sale it once enjoyed. It's not out of the question the sale will gross \$30 million, and/or average \$100,000 for only the third time ever, the first two times being in 1983-84.

Y2K Compliant?

First, a final word about the three-year-olds of 2000. What can you say about the American three-year-olds, except that a crop which looked so promising two months ago now looks pretty ordinary. It never pays to take four-runner races at face value, but Albert the Great's win in the Dwyer, running a Beyer 108--exactly the same range as the Derby and Preakness--didn't exactly pay the Classic form a compliment; not with two Classic winners last and second last. The winner is maybe the best of Go for Gin's first crop, and confirms this stallion's very promising performance in 2000. The second, the now-underrated More Than Ready, is from the first North American crop of multiple champion Argentinian sire Southern Halo, too.

Last Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. over 10-furlongs at Sandown was an extremely informative race. The finish was fought out in titanic fashion by two one-mile Royal Ascot winners stepping up in trip, the three-year-old Bill Oppenheim cont. p. 5

Giant's Causeway (by Storm Cat) coming back to best the four-year-old Kalanisi (by Daylami's sire, Doyoun). The five-year-old mare Shiva, who had a bad trip and prefers it softer, was a gallant third under the circumstances, but Derby second Sakhee (from Bahri's first crop) was a disappointing fourth.

Like I say, this race told us a lot. Commentators had generally been very complimentary about the Epsom Derby form after Sinndar's bloodless victory at The Curragh, and Derby third Beat Hollow's Group 1 win over 10-furlong in Paris. But that win was against three-year-olds, and Sinndar's Irish win was compromised because his two main rivals didn't run their races. Sinndar is a very good colt, no doubt about it, but there are two other very good three-year-old colts in Europe whose form came from the Guineas--King's Best and Giant's Causeway. No one can say whether King's Best would have beaten Sinndar had he not broken down in the Irish Derby, but, whatever the speculation about that, I think Europe has three top-class three-year-olds this year in King's Best, Giant's Causeway, and Sinndar.

We already know Europe has two superstar four-year-olds in the 10-furlong colt Dubai Millennium and the 12-furlong colt Montjeu. But Kalanisi's tremendous second on Saturday, following his defeat of Dansili in the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, gives us a very reliable form line to the top four-year-old milers in Europe. This means Sendawar, who I still believe is 2-3 pounds better at a mile than Aljabr, Kalanisi, and Dansili-all legitimate Group 1 horses. That adds up to nine three or four-year-old colts in Europe that I would argue are all right out of the top drawer.

A Forty Niner Franchise...

Many of you will remember that among the bandwagons I've been hesitant about leaping on is the Forty Niner Sire-of-Sires stampede. Pretty is as pretty does, to coin a phrase, and the great thing about being a skeptic is that you can see right away which way the form is going--you remember my speech about form from last week, of course. We've now seen a couple of pretty good performances from Forty Niner sons: first of all, End Sweep has proven this year he's a very legitimate sire at his level. I still say they aren't superstars, but then, he wasn't either, and I think in Trippi he's sired a horse probably at least as good as himself, plus he's getting good-level horses in quantity, which I always think is a good indicator. And another Forty Niner son, first-crop sire Gold Fever, has certainly come out with a runner in the filly Gold Miner, now three-for-three including two Churchill Downs Grade 3 wins. So I would say now, it's not all glitz and promises. There's some solid form there. Right on.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

The Bible warns us not to be quick to judge. Perhaps we need to remember to apply that caveat to young stallions as well as to our fellow man. There is no doubt that the rate at which information can be now gathered and disseminated has made markets in general much more volatile than in years gone by. The stallion market is no exception, and these days a young sire can be written off in months (or even weeks) rather than years.

Two young stallions who might eventually show that they were prematurely judged are the three-quarters brothers Pleasant Tap and Go for Gin. Pleasant Tap, a son of Pleasant Colony, was precocious enough to have captured the Sunny Slope S. at two, and fast enough to win the GII Malibu S. at three, and finish second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at four. It was at five, however. that Pleasant Tap really shone, earning champion older horse honors after winning four stakes, including the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and GI Suburban Handicap, both at a mile and a quarter, and finishing second to three-year-old A. P. Indy in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at the same distance. Like their sire, Pleasant Tap's runners have taken some time to reach their best, and Pleasant Tap quickly fell out of favor with breeders. He has been making a rally in the past couple of seasons, however, and while he may not ever reach superstar status, he has certainly done enough to be regarded as more than useful. In fact, from his first three crops, the youngest of which are now four, Pleasant Tap has sired 14 stakes winners and 22 stakes horses from 122 named foals. These include Grade I winner Tap to Music and graded stakes scorers Pleasant Breeze, Sapphire n' Silk and Lager.

ASHFORD STUD

Go for Gin is by Cormorant and, like Pleasant Tap, is a grandson of His Majesty. He captured the Chief's Crown S. and GII Remsen S. at two, but like his three-quarters brother earned his most important victory over a mile and a quarter, taking the 1994 GI Kentucky Derby. Go for Gin looked as if he might be ready to disappear from view at the end of last year, with his first crop two-year-olds yielding just three winners. Six months on things look rather different, as Go for Gin's first crop now has 20 individual winners from 35 starters. What's more, they include Albert the Great, who defeated classic winners Red Bullet and Commendable in last weekend's GII Dwyer S.; Curule, a highly impressive Belmont Park allowance winner on the Friday before the Dwyer; and other promising sorts such as Croupier and Hallucinogin, who have both won two out of three starts this year; She's a Go, a four-time winner this year; and Rhum, who has been successful in her only start to date.

That it should take some time for Pleasant Tap and Go for Gin to hit their stride as stallions is not surprising. In addition to being descendants of Ribot--a line which is frequently associated with later maturity, they are out of Never Knock, a mare whose sire Stage Door Johnny is almost a synonym for the need for time and distance.

Oddly enough, both Albert the Great and Curule, who would appear to be the most talented members of Go for Gin's first crop, are bred on similar lines. Albert the Great is out of the Fappiano mare Bright Feather, and Curule is out of a mare by Fappiano's son Cryptoclearance. Incidentally, of the other Go for Gin representatives we noted, Croupier is out of a mare by Forty Niner (by Fappiano's sire Mr. Prospector), Hallucinogin is out of a mare by Mr. Prospector, and She's a Go is out of a mare by Majestic Light, a grandson of Mr. Prospector's sire Raise a Native.

Albert the Great is the third foal of Bright Feather, and she now has a 100 percent stakes product record with the trio. Her first foal Watch the Bird, a son of Rahy, won the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct in 1998, and her second, the Relaunch filly Sheer Bliss, won the Aspidistra H. at Calder. Bright Feather herself was no slouch on the racetrack, winning three times and finishing second in the Canadian Oaks. Her dam, the Vice Regent mare In My Cap, was also second in the Canadian Oaks, but she did capture six other Canadian stakes, including the Dominion's leading two-year-old filly contest, the Princess Elizabeth S. In My Cap was a full sister to another talented juvenile in Gl Arlington-Washington Lassie S. heroine Trumpet's Blare.

Albert the Great's pedigree is free of close inbreeding, although he is linebred to the stallions Alibhai, Princequillo, Nasrullah and Polynesian, who all appear 5x6 in his pedigree; to Nearco, whom he has 6x6; and to Count Fleet, who appears 6x6x6. As we find so often these days, there is also some significant linebreeding to La Troienne. Go for Gin's dam has the brother/sister Bimelech/Black Helen 4x2 in her pedigree. Bimelech also turns up in the pedigree of Albert the Great's broodmare sire Fappiano. Albert the Great's third dam Passing Look is a daughter of Buckpasser, and he brings in another strain of La Troienne through Businesslike, who is a five-eighths relative to Bimelech/Black Helen.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The GI Sempra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup provided a first Grade I victory for Early Pioneer (g, 5, Rahy--Golden Darling, by Slew o' Gold). Another major male stakes winner for Rahy, who is now thoroughly refuting his "filly sire" tag, Early Pioneer is the third graded stakes winner for his sire to be out of a mare by Slew o' Gold. Obviously this represents an "in house" nick, since Rahy and Slew o' Gold both stand at Three Chimneys Farm, but there are a couple of pedigree points to ponder. Firstly, Rahy with Slew o' Gold gives a double of Hail to Reason, who hasn't been the greatest target for inbreeding and linebreeding, but here may help size up the diminutive Rahy. Secondly, Slew o' Gold brings in Tom Fool, a three-parts genetic relative to Spring Run, the dam of Rahy's grandsire Red God (Early Pioneer also has a second strain of Tom Fool through Dunce, the sire of his second dam Close Control).

Since Gilded Time's sire Timeless Moment is out of a mare bred on a Native Dancer/Count Fleet combination, there has always been the possibility that Gilded Time would work with mares carrying Mr. Prospector (by a son of Native Dancer and with a second dam by Count Fleet). To date, three of the stakes winners from his first two crops have been out of Mr. Prospector line mares, including the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. victress Added Gold, and this weekend's GII Triple Bend Breeders' Cup H. victor, Elaborate (h, 5, Gilded Time--Jeanie's Gift, by Gulch).

Winner of the GIII Dance Smartly H. at Woodbine on Sunday was Except For Wanda (m, 5, Tejabo--Unique Gal, by Bold Ruckus). She has a very appealing pedigree since her sire (by Deputy Minister) is a grandson of Vice Regent, and her third dam is by Vice Regent's brother, Viceregal, which gives Except For Wanda the siblings Vice Regent/Viceregal 3x4.

Fasig-Tipton sold 92 horses yesterday for \$1,315,900 and an average of \$14,303.

BARN FIRE KILLS THREE HORSES A barn fire claimed the life of three horses in the early morning Tuesday at Gerald Ford's Diamond A Farm near Versailles, Kentucky, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The fire was reported at 1:30 a.m. and when Woodford County firefighters arrived, the barn was completely engulfed in flames. No official cause was listed, but Diamond A manager Ted Carr said the building had been struck by lightning. Among the three horses killed was a yearling filly by Allen's Prospect owned by Allen and Madeleine Paulson, who operated Diamond A as Brookside Farms before selling it to Ford earlier this year.

The three-year-old is a maiden who raced in France and comes from the family of Seattle Slew (USA). Five Horses Ltd was the name on the buyer's ticket for Wishful (Ire) (Irish River {Fr}), a three-year-old offered from Sheikh Mohammed's Dalham Hall Stud, who sold for 32,000gns. The half-sister to G3 Park Hill S. winner Book At Bedtime (Ire) (Mtoto {GB}) heads to the Stock Hill Stud in Dorset, which has been bought by Bob and Soo Thomas, owners of G1 Sagitta 1,000 Guineas runner-up Princess Ellen (Ire) (Tirol {Ire}), whose operation will be known as Five Horses. Barry Reilly, who signalled the successful bid on their behalf, said, "They have five mares at the moment. and of course Princess Ellen. Wishful will go to one of the Coolmore stallions." The first of three sessions saw 85 horses sold for total gross receipts of 730,230gns and an average of 8,591, both down significantly against the corresponding figures from a year ago. The second session gets underway today at 10:00 a.m.
