NEW WORLDS TO CONQUER

Favored **Agnes World** (Danzig) showed all his class to fend off the strong challenges of **Lincoln Dancer** (Ire) (Turtle Island {Ire}) and **Pipalong** (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}) by two short heads in a thrilling finish to win the G1 July Cup yesterday afternoon at Newmarket, England. Despite his win in last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp in October, Agnes World was allowed to start at 16-1 in his English debut, running second in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 20. The five-year-old broke well and showed early speed to sit in behind **Primo Valentino** (Ire) (Primo Dominie {GB}), as jockey Philip Robinson was hard at work to keep Lincoln Dancer in a prominent position on the stands' side. Primo Valentino began to falter with a furlong to race, at which point Lincoln Dancer headed the Japanese horse, but strong driving managed to get him to the front with 150 yards remaining before holding off the persistent last efforts of the second and third. "It's very good, and we're very excited," said assistant trainer Masafumi Matsuda. "This is something we have been hoping and dreaming for. If we were back home in Japan we would be having a big sake and sushi party but as we are over here I will celebrate with an English cup of tea."

SMALL FIELD FOR EUGENE ADAM

The G2 Prix Eugene Adam, the race that re-launched Dubai Millennium (GB) in 1999 after his unplaced effort in the G1 Epsom Derby, offers a small field today at Deauville, without anything that stands out as of that quality. Criquette Head's **Premier Pas** (Fr) (Sillery) was a length second to Beat Hollow (GB) last time in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp June 25, form which entitles him to be close here. Previously he had disappointed when unplaced in the G3 Prix de la Jonchere at Chantilly June 11, but he was apparently ill afterwards. **Sobieski** (Ire) (Polish Precedent) was similarly disappointing in the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Longchamp Apr. 23, but the manner of his wins either side of that in conditions races at Saint-Cloud Mar. 18 and June 26 stamped him as a decent colt. Gerard Butler's **Compton Bolter** (Ire) (Red Sunset {Ire}) did not build on his fifth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6 when ninth in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 20, but a reproduction of the Newmarket form would see him go close here.

July 12, 1971...Bold Ruler, sire of 82 stakes winners including Secretariat, died at Claiborne Farm.

July 13, 1996...Cigar tied Citation's record of 16 consecutive victories, winning the Citation Challenge at Arlington International Racecourse.

July 14, 1951...Making his last career start at the age of six, Citation won the Hollywood Gold Cup by four lengths and became racing's first millionaire horse.

July 15, 1966...Off at odds of 10-1 Dr. Fager won his first race by seven lengths at Aqueduct.

July 15, 1972...After finishing fourth in his debut 11 days earlier, Secretariat broke his maiden by six lengths at Aqueduct.

July 15, 1987...Jack Van Berg became the first trainer to win 5,000 races, sending out Art's Chandelle to victory at Arlington Park.

FAIR GROUNDS UNVEILS STAKES SCHEDULE

Spearheaded by the Mar. 11 running of the \$750,000 GII Louisiana Derby, Fair Grounds released its 2000/2001 stakes schedule yesterday. In addition to the winner's share of the track's richest race, the Louisiana Derby victor would earn a \$1 million bonus with a Kentucky Derby victory. The bonus, worth \$500,000 last year, will be offered for the third time in 2001. "This year's Louisiana Derby field was our strongest ever," said Fair Grounds director of racing Mervin Muniz. "With the increased bonus, we would expect all the top three-year-olds to consider the Louisiana Derby in their plans." The GIII Davona Dale S. has been re-named the Silverbulletday S., in honor of the two-time champion filly, and will be run on Feb. 17 next year. A total of 60 stakes worth \$6.95 million are on tap for the New Orleans track's 2000-2001 season, which opens Nov. 23 and runs through Mar. 26. Other highlights of the meeting are the Mar. 4 \$500,000 GIII New Orleans H., the Mar. 10 \$350,000 GIII Fair Grounds Oaks and the Mar. 25 \$600,000 GIII Explosive Bid H. The 10th annual Louisiana Champions Day, worth \$1 million in purses, will be held Dec. 9.

TINNITUS DEAD Tinnitus (Restless Wind--Dors, by Corporal II) was put down due to the infirmities of old age on June 23 at Knockgriffin Farm near Paris, Kentucky, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. The 25-year-old mare, owned by P.L.D. Stables, is the dam of 1987 champion sprinter Groovy (Norcliffe). She produced nine winners from 16 foals, including stakes winner Harbor Springs (Vice Regent), the dam of juvenile champion Boston Harbor (Capote), and graded-stakes placed Kentucky Jazz (Dixieland Band). Her last foal is a yearling filly by Gulch.

PERUGIA TOPS TATTERSALLS FINALE

The top lot at the 2000 Tattersalls July Sales was sold at yesterday's concluding session when **Perugia (Ire)** (Perugino {USA}) was bought for 65,000gns by John O'Connor of the Ballykelly Stud near Cashel with Swedish trainer Michael Kahn the underbidder. O'Kelly's interest in the three-year-old, who was Listed placed last year and fourth at Newmarket last Friday, was understandable as he also bred her. "I stood in the same spot 12 years ago when I bought her dam Lightning Bug unraced out of training for 1,300gns from Luca Cumani's stable," said O'Connor. "Kevin McAuliffe will train Perugia and we'll try and get some winning black type in France or somewhere. I'm a neighbour of John Magnier I have plenty of stallions to choose from." O'Connor will be consigning Perugia's full-brother at the December Sales. Edmond Mahony, chairman of Tattersalls, was pleased with the sale, which despite lacking a top-class individual recorded figures that almost reached last year's records. "We would have to be pleased with the outcome of the week's trade," said Mahony. "Last year's sale broke records in all categories including the 200,000gns top price. (This year's) average price broke the 10,000gns barrier for only the second time, and the median matched the 1999 figure. As ever the demand has been global." (*Stats p5*)

EDDERY, DUFFIELD FEEL WRATH OF JOCKEY CLUB

Jockeys Pat Eddery and George Duffield were both handed ten-day suspensions by a Jockey Club disciplinary committee yesterday. Both riders fought out the finish of the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown on Saturday, but both were found guilty of excessive use of the whip as a result. Eddery's title hopes will take a significant blow, as this means he will not ride from July 16 until Aug. 3, as he already has nine days' suspension for other offences carried out at the end of last week. He will miss the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. meeting at Ascot, as well as the first three days of Glorious Goodwood. Duffield's suspension runs from July 18 to July 27, and he said, "Rules are rules and they have to be obeyed. I got my chance to put over my point of view, but you have to abide by the rules. But we don't like the separate rule for Group 1 races. We are not happy with it. For two identical crimes in two different races you can end up with different punishments." Julia Cook, spokesperson for the Jockey Club, commented, "Saturday's Eclipse was the first time two jockeys have breached the whip guidelines for frequency in a major race since the referral rule was introduced 16 months ago. In fact, the first breach of its kind since the G1 Juddmonte International in August 1998. Previous referrals have been for technical breaches of the whip rules but on this occasion two experienced jockeys chose to ignore the rules when they were riding out the finish. The view that every close finish in a major race results in a whip breach is a myth and in the last year or so there will have been at least a dozen examples which show this to be the case. We have a whip instruction that we believe in, that the jockeys are familiar with and accept, and that gives a degree of flexibility to both jockeys and stewards without compromising the welfare of the horse. If a jockey breaches the instruction, we have to call him to account and if a jockey breaches the rules in a Group 1 race we cannot ignore it because of the profile of the event."

The sun and wind has then got to it and dried it quicker, while the ground further out is still lush." The 53 yearlings offered include youngsters by leading sires Flying Spur (Aus), Royal Academy (USA) and Baratheia (Ire). International star Woodman (USA) will be represented by a chestnut gelding, the first foal of Joy (Aus) (Bluebird {USA}), who last month topped the Australian Broodmare Sale with a bid of A\$470,000. The yearling is part of the consignment of Tony Huang's Sino Dynasty Stud, which dispersed the majority of its breeding stock at the Inglis' broodmare and weanling sale in June. Previous Winter Sale graduates include outstanding performer Adam (Aus), a Group 1 winner of 10 races and over A\$1.4 million who was purchased at the 1995 Winter Sale for just A\$11,000. Classy three-year-old filly Forest Express (Aus) is another bargain success story. Purchased at the 1998 Winter Yearling Sale for just A\$2,400, she went on to win G3 The Vanity S. at Flemington and over A\$300,000 before being sent to the U.S. to race. Some 72 broodmares will be offered in foal to popular sires such as Danzero (Aus), Brocco (USA), Spectrum (Ire), End Sweep (USA) and Nothin' Leica Dane (Aus). The weanling section features the progeny of exciting young sires Thunder Gulch (USA), Timber Country (USA), Langfuhr (Can) and Fuji Kiseki (Jpn). Racehorses entered for sale include the talented seven-year-old stakes performer Beauchamp (Aus) (Bureaucracy {NZ}), a Group 3-placed winner of nine races.
