SOBIESKI SOARS

Sobieski (Ire) (Polish Precedent) quickened brilliantly in the straight to capture the G2 Prix Eugene Adam vesterday at Deauville. Unplaced on his only juvenile start, the homebred colt had made steady progress this year, with a sixth-place effort in the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Longchamp Apr. 23 sandwiched between Saint-Cloud wins in the Listed Prix Maurice Caillault Mar. 18, and the Listed Prix Pelleas June 26. Recording his best win to date, he showed an excellent turn of foot inside the final furlong to record his first group success with ease and provided trainer Andre Fabre with his eleventh race win in seventeen years. He was settled last of the five runners as Bleu d'Altair (Fr) (Green Tune) led from Hesiode, Premier Pas (Fr) (Sillery) and the British-trained Compton Bolter (Ire) (Red Sunset {Ire}). The order was maintained into the 2 1/2-furlong straight, where the race began in earnest. Sobieski, on the outside, was ridden with 1 1/2 furlongs to go, but drifted in slightly approaching the final furlong. Despite that, he left the opposition toiling in his wake as he drew away entering the final furlong and ran on strongly for a comprehensive win. Premier Pas didn't enjoy the best of passages, but once getting clear, finished in good style to secure second in the dying strides. Hesiode kept on dourly and was just caught for second approaching the line, claiming third ahead of Compton Bolter.

As the lone Grade I run at six furlongs outside of the Breeders' Cup, the 'Dash has drawn a competitive field of seven. Heading the list is morning-line favorite Richter Scale, who had a four-race skein snapped in the GI Met Mile May 29. The six-year-old bay had previously taken the GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup at Keeneland Apr. 16, and will be tough to beat if he gains an early lead. Intidab rallied strongly in taking the GII True North on Belmont Day and has recorded consistently high Beyer figures. Maryland-based Just Call Me Carl sports a four-for-eight record at Laurel and is riding a three-race win streak, including a 2 1/4-length score over Holiday Music in the Chesapeake H. at Pimlico June 10.

The unbeaten Brave Quest makes his stakes debut here. A \$950,000 juvenile purchase, he has progressed through his conditions since starting his career in March, and defeated older horses in a nine-furlong allowance at Belmont June 16. Stronach colorbearer Milwaukee Brew has won three straight over 8 1/2 furlongs, including a victory in the GIII Marine S. at Woodbine May 21. Early favorite Snuck In has lost his last three, including a fourth at 3-5 in the Leonard Richards S. at Delaware June 18. Winner of the GIII Rebel at Oaklawn in March, he will have to overcome his outside post.

Perfect Sting is unbeaten in four starts over the Belmont turf and has been perfect in two 2000 starts. Heroine of the GIII Just a Game Breeders' Cup H. over a mile here June 10, she finished sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf last November, her lone start longer than nine furlongs. The main challenger may be Innuendo, who finished second in the GIII Bewitch H. at Keeneland in her stateside debut before capturing a money allowance over this course and distance June 23. California shipper Spanish Fern, winner of the 1999 GI Yellow Ribbon at Santa Anita, will have blinkers on once again. The dark bay captured the GII Santa Ana at Santa Anita in March, but faltered on the dirt in her last try, the GI Milady Breeders' Cup H. at Hollywood May 28.

THE CURRAGH ALL SET FOR OAKS

After the history-making, bonus-winning performance of Sinndar (Ire) in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh Sunday July 2, the racecourse seemed to have a momentous task to follow that. However, with the help of a strong field for the G1 Kildangan Stud Irish Oaks, they have every reason to look forward to another vintage day. Jason Morris, Racecourse Manager, is certainly of that opinion. "We're absolutely delighted to have the most competitive, wide-open Irish Oaks for many a year, and it's wonderful to have such a strong race," he said. "It looks extremely well-balanced, with the the second, third and fourth in the G1 Epsom Oaks (June 9), and the first and second in the G2 Ribblesdale S. (Royal Ascot June 22), plus the Irish fillies." In other news, Jeremy Noseda has handed the ride on G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up, and Sunday's favourite Kalypso Katie (Ire) (Fairy King) to George Duffield. The 53-year-old, who rode the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. winner Giant's Causeway at Sandown last Saturday, is enjoying a revival in fortunes at present, and his agent Keith Bradley commented: "It's a splendid ride--she must have a good chance."

IN MY OPINION...

WHY I SUPPORT THE NTRA'S ¼% CONTRIBUTION PROGRAM

By Richard Santulli, Managing Partner, Jayeff B Stables

Maybe I'm not the most objective guy when it comes to Thoroughbred racing. To put it simply, I'm hooked. Racing has been very good to me and I'll always feel like I need to put something back into the sport.

My personal devotion notwithstanding, however, I can tell you that the prospects for the Thoroughbred industry have never been brighter. And the single biggest reason for this, at least during the last couple of years, is the NTRA. We *need* this organization-we need what it's doing now and what it's capable of doing in the future.

Believe me, I know that one-quarter-of-one-percent can add up to a significant amount of money. Maybe not to the guy who spends \$50,000 during the course of a year. But it sure does when you spend seven figures on a single horse, as I have on a few occasions.

Still, it's not the kind of money that's going to affect my decision to buy a particular horse. If I spend, say, \$850,000 on a horse at auction, an extra \$2,125 isn't going to have any direct impact on whether this is a good or a bad purchase. If I'm willing to buy a horse for \$850,000, I'm willing to buy him for \$853,000. I also sell plenty of horses at auction, and the same dynamic applies on that end of things as well.

But let's assume the various NTRA initiatives succeed and purses rise dramatically. Everyone reaps the rewards, and suddenly that investment seems awfully small. And let me stress that this ¼ % program is, indeed, an *investment* in our industry. If I viewed it as a fee, I would flatly refuse to pay it.

Why is it an investment? Let's look at just a few of the things that the NTRA is working on. The IBM relationship with all its potential for Internet applications and broadband technology? Huge. TVG and the opportunity to expose racing in a stimulating way to a mass audience? Huge. The NTRA Racing Integrity & Drug

Testing Task Force? Also huge. Do you think I or anyone else would spend big money on bloodstock without the confidence that racing was being conducted on a fair and level playing field? No way.

But the single biggest reason I think we, as an industry, need the NTRA is to bolster our lobbying efforts in Washington. This is what a significant portion of that ½ % has been earmarked for, and rightly so. I'm in the aviation industry, and what we are able to accomplish is frequently dependent on the actions of the Federal Aviation Administration. Our industry has a major presence in Washington and, as a result, we are represented well. Anyone who feels that such representation in D.C. isn't important just doesn't know anything about business.

The work of the NTRA and the American Horse Council these last several months during the debate about the Kyl Bill and the Wire Act has been absolutely crucial to the long-term success and viability of racing. Just to cite one example, what if those in the Justice Department who think interstate simulcasting is illegal had not been met with reasoned and forceful opposition? Our business would be over. Period. Having a strong voice is Washington is one area where the Thoroughbred industry can absolutely not afford to cut corners.

We also cannot underestimate the power of marketing and advertising. We need TV exposure. We need related promotions that help drive viewers to racing telecasts. We need fan education so people want to come out to the track and make a bet or two. (That's how I got started in the sport.) When we do these things properly, we bring new people into our industry and lay the foundation for handle, purses and Thoroughbred sales figures to rise, as they did in 1999, to record highs.

Yes, Thoroughbred racing is a great sport with the potential to get even better and more popular, but it won't happen by itself. For so long, racing had been disjointed, not taking advantage of all the various powers inherent in our industry. At last, we have that one organization.

Now it's up to us to support it.

WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER By Bronwyn Farr



Every so often a television program that makes a difference comes along and they're usually from our much-maligned public broadcaster, ABC. On a wintry Wednesday night, Australia's far-flung racing community tuned in to the debut of the six-part series *The*

Track--The Story of Good Breeding and Bad Behaviour produced by prominent filmmaker Penny Chapman for the ABC.

It is a show that could potentially do more for racing than the combined marketing efforts of our clubs and industry bodies. While the racing pages of our major newspapers seem ever-more preoccupied with the dull machinations of the TAB and racing's administrative bodies, *The Track* leaves a punter-based audience at the gates and goes successfully to a mainstream viewer.

This is a social history of racing and its debut gave us a thought-provoking insight into how racing contributed to a sense of national consciousness, a fierce inter-colony rivalry that still exists between Melbourne and Sydney, and the battle between upper-class Governors who sought to impart something of England's refined sport and the libertarians who fought for the track to be an egalitarian forum where "convict stock" could cheer alongside the gentry for early heroes like Archer and Carbine--a division that ultimately resulted in the foundation of the more progressive Sydney Turf Club and the more aristocratic Australian Jockey Club.

Future epidodes will touch on the great bookmakers, wowsers and villians, racing's parallel with emerging class divisions in Australia, and how governments became addicted to revenue generated from gambling. The rise of icons like Phar Lap and Tommy Smith is covered along with Australia's great tradition of race calling and scandals such as the 1984 Fine Cotton ring-in, concluding with coverage of the 1999 Melbourne Cup.

Truman Show for Horses

Remember the Truman Show where an oblivious Jim Carrey was broadcast live 24 hours a day? Now horses at Flemington trainer Leon Corstens' stable are on the internet around-the-clock thanks at www.horsecam.com.au in what Patrick Wheelahan of BloodstockTrader.com maintains is a national first.

You won't be on the edge of your seat watching two horses resting in their boxes at midday but there's also trackcam for earlybirds and images refresh every 15 seconds.

"Who wouldn't like to see their horse live at any time from their own computer?" Wheelahan asked. "Through this service, owners, syndicate members and their friends can view their horse and see it going out for morning work as well as anything else that is going on at the time."

Might and Power Makes Guest Appearance

Two-time Horse of the Year Might and Power (Zabeel {NZ}) will have his first public outing since November, 1998 when he makes a charity guest appearance at Rosehill Gardens this Saturday.

On the comeback trail after an extended absence, Might And Power will canter between races on the Rosehill course. His appearance is in support of the Spastic Centre of NSW and prominent businessmen including Rene Rivkin, James Parker, Jack Ingham and Bob Lapointe have also supported the day. Might And Power is back in Jack Denham's stable attempting another comeback from a bowed tendon injury.

Magic Millions on the Move

The Sydney Turf Club has lost the \$1 million Magic Millions for three-year-olds held last year over 1500m at Rosehill in July. The Gold Coast-based sales company has opted to move the race back to the Gold Coast in January to coincide with its big two-year-old race and sales and drop it back to 1400m. The race attracted criticism in Sydney for disrupting the tradition spring campaigns of three-year-olds.

Randwick Delay

The Australian Jockey Club is creating consternation with a second announcement this week that construction work at Randwick won't be finished until the eve of the spring carnival. The club closed Randwick in early May to build long-awaited underground tunnels and trainers such as Gai Waterhouse, bidding for a second premiership, have been forced to use provincial tracks and other facilities with restricted use of Randwick for trackwork.

Meetings Aug. 13 and 23 have been transferred to Warwick Farm and two barrier trials on July 21 and Aug. 11 have been cancelled with the club saying the course proper will be ready Sept. 2 for the G2 Chelmsford S.

WINTER YEARLING SALE TESTS NEW TAX SYSTEM

The first thoroughbred auction conducted in Australia under the new GST tax system, the 2000 Winter Yearling and Thoroughbred Sale at Newmarket, saw 196 yearlings, weanlings, broodmares and racehorses, gross a total of A\$1,065,650, for an average of A\$5,469. This year's sale may not have experienced the total effect of the GST tax system, said Jonathan D'Arcy, associate director of the Winter Yearling Sale. "The introduction of the GST passed without notice, with competition on most types of bloodstock similar to recent sales," he said. "The real test of the new tax system will probably come with the first round of yearling sales in 2001." Topping the yearling prices was hip number 127, a filly by leading first-season sire Flying Spur (Aus), out of Merry Life (Ire), a Bletchingly (Aus) mare. Selling for A\$90,000, the filly was consigned by Orange Grove Thoroughbreds and purchased by William Inglis as agent for the Gary Portelli stable, Warwick Farm. Taking top ticket price in the broodmare section, Star Plume (Aus), by Military Plume (NZ), out of Group 3 winner Scarlet Crown (Aus) and in foal to top sire Danzero (Aus), went for A\$50,000.
