BROAD BRUSH COLT TOPS KEENELAND DAY 1

A colt by Broad Brush out of Kentucky Derby-winning champion Winning Colors (Caro {Ire}) brought \$2.5 million to top the opening session of the Keeneland July Sale, held last night in Lexington. The gray, a May 22 foal, was consigned by Gainesway, agent, and purchased by Aaron Jones, who was not surprised by the seven-figure final bid. "That's about what we expected to pay," Jones said. "He is an excellent individual. He looks like he has the makings to be a good horse." Added Jones' advisor, Frank Taylor, general manager of Taylor Made Farm, "We thought he had a great stallion's pedigree. He's an outcross to most of the breed and a great individual. We think he'll make a great stallion if he performs on the track." The underbidders for the colt were led by D. Wayne Lukas, who trained Winning Colors. Lukas did make the winning bid for the night's second highest-priced colt, a son of Seeking the Gold out of MGSP Sheila's Revenge (Lord Avie). Consigned by Walnut Green (Jones Bros.), agent, the chestnut sold for \$2,150,000. "We didn't expect him to bring this much, but we were committed to buying him," Lukas, buying on behalf of Satish Sanan's Padua Stables, said. "Good horses are at a premium and are very hard to buy." As for the fillies, they saved the best for last as Hip #69, the last horse through the ring during Monday's session, attracted a bid of \$950,000 as the top-selling filly on the night. Consigned by Calumet Farm, the daughter of Unbridled out of Surely Georgie's (Alleged) was purchased by Reynolds Bell, Jr., agent for Rich Santulli. The dark bay is a half sister to Irish champion George Augustus. "Unbridled is getting the job done as a sire and we thought she was just a big, nice filly," Bell said. The Keeneland July Sale continues today with an afternoon session beginning at 1:30 p.m., followed by an evening session which starts at 7:30 p.m.

There were 61 yearlings sent through the ring, last night, of which 44--72 percent--were listed as sales. Of the 44 listed sales, 25, or 57 percent of the horses sold, brought final bids of \$500,000 or more, including nine seven-figure yearlings, seven at \$1-\$2 million, and two which brought \$2 million-plus. Compared with last year's totals of 20 seven-figure yearlings for the entire sale, and 56 at \$500,000+, you would say this sale is well on course to match or surpass last year's figures.

In fact, last year the Monday night session average was within minutes of the overall sale's. If that pattern is repeated, last night's session should have seen seven \$1 million-plus yearlings (20 last year), and 19 at \$500,000+. Last night's actual totals were nine at \$1 million-plus, and 25.

Ahead of schedule in both categories--as is borne out, of course, in the 22-percent rise in gross and a 14-percent gain in average.

Far from behaving like a sale which is on its last legs, last night's session was in fact a clinic in what can be achieved when you start with a top sire and end up with a serious individual with a defensible pedigree.

Demi O'Byrne signed for six colts, totalling just over \$5 million and averaging over \$841,000--two Storm Cats, and one each by A.P. Indy, Danzig, Deputy Minister and Kris S.

John Ferguson spent \$4 million on three colts, each costing between \$1.2 and \$1.5 million, by Mr. Prospector, Deputy Minister and Kingmambo.

The Sanan family's Padua Stable, with Wayne Lukas alongside, bought four colts (one in partnership with Overbrook) and a filly, including a Seeking the Gold colt for \$2,150,000.

I'm guessing John Ferguson "out back" was the underbidder there.

Aaron Jones bought the session topper, which kind of woke everybody up because it was hip number 8, an absolutely cracking colt by Broad Brush out of the great racemare, but thus far disappointing producer, Winning Colors. Padua, with Demi as well as Lukas this time, was underbidder there.

Among the young stallions, early returns kind of indicated a draw so far in both contests. Of the two top second-crop sires, Hennessy had two RNAs and a \$950,000 colt (Padua and Overbrook), while Unbridled's Song had fillies bring \$850,000 (Aaron Jones) and \$525,000 (B. Wayne Hughes).

Of the two top first-year sires, Spinning World had three fillies, one for \$600,000, two others for \$200,000 and \$150,000 respectively, so three averaged \$317,000. Pulpit had a \$675,000 colt to Padua, plus fillies for \$300,000 and \$230,000 (and one RNA), so his three averaged \$401,000.

It was a session in which the top half sold extremely well, and the bottom half visibly struggled. Of the 27 horses with a final hammer price of \$500,000 or more, 25 sold--93 percent. Twelve horses were hammered down for prices between \$300,000 and \$500,000; nine sold--75 percent. But of 22 with hammer prices below \$300,000, only 10 sold--45 percent. That's the tale of the tape ... if you haven't got a \$300,000 yearling, you're in the wrong sale.

On the basis of last night's results, if you do have a yearling who is really worth from \$300,000 up to--well, at least 10 or 15 times that--the July sale is very much alive and kicking.

It's a rarefied market, to be sure, but it was very much alive and kicking last night.

CLASSICS ADDED TO DUBAI SCHEDULE The Emirates Racing Association has added three stakes races, worth \$250,000 apiece, to the Nad al Sheba schedule for 2001, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. The new races are the UAE 2000 Guineas for three-year-olds going a mile on the dirt, set for Mar. 1; the UAE 1000 Guineas for the three-year-old fillies at a mile on the dirt, to be run Mar. 15; and the UAE Oaks for three-year-old fillies going 1 1/8 miles on the main track, set for Apr. 14. The UAE 2000 Guineas, previously run as the Khor Dubai, was won by Bachir (Ire) this year. "All major racing centers around the world have their own Classics and with the Emirates being recognized as a leader in world racing, we thought it time that the United Arab Emirates had its own set of Classics," Les Benton, chief executive officer of the Emirates Racing Association, said.

Sodexo Prestige Scottish Classic cont.
 Endless Hall was an impressive 5 1/2-length winner of the June 18 G1 Gran Premio Di Milano at San Siro. He paid the penalty here in his first start in Britain, however, having to shoulder seven pounds more than the other older horses. Last time, when allowed to dictate the pace from the front on good-to-firm going, he simply destroyed a competitive field including the talented German filly Catella (Ger). Here he enjoyed the same luxury and, although he had to fight harder, he had enough to claim his third stakes success. Taken to the front early by Jamie Spencer, he was traveling easily as the others lined up behind waiting for him to crack. Asked to quicken as they turned into the straight, the colt did so immediately, stealing an advantage with only Beat All looking likely to throw down a serious challenge in the final two furlongs. The runner-up headed him with 100 yards remaining, but the determined Spencer drove his horse's head back to the front near the line to win by inches. Trainer Luca Cumani said, "He loves the fast ground and he loves going out in front and dictating the pace, and Jamie executed it magnificently. For a moment I thought when Beat All came at him we were going to be second, but then the horse battled back and he did the job well in the end. We thought that 1 1/4 miles might be a little bit tight for him, but it was a good performance all round. Where he goes will be totally determined by the ground, but I want him back at 1 1/2 miles, because that's where he's more effective. He is a hell of a horse, so the Breeders' Cup Turf is the long-term target."

Unsuccessful in two previous attempts this year, Late Parade returned to his favourite Agnano track, where he has tasted defeat only once in 11 starts, to win his third Gran Premio Citta di Napoli with another impressive performance. The well backed 6-4 favourite showed tremendous speed throughout to win unchallenged ahead of Development and the German challenger Kaka. Racecourse whispers suggested this was to be Late Parade's final race but trainer Armando Renzoni was quick to quash those rumours indicating Italy's top sprinter may start in the five-furlong G3 Premio Omenoni at Milan Oct. 14. Renzoni would also like his stable star to receive an invitation to the Listed Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin in December.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

Only time will tell whether John Magnier struck as a good a bargain when he bought Winglet for \$4.6 million at Keeneland last November as he did when he bid \$2.6 million for Giant's Causeway's dam three years earlier, but the signs are certainly promising.

Winglet's price reflected her achievement of having produced Ajina, the champion three-year-old filly of 1997, as her first foal. Now she appears to have another potential Grade I winner to her credit in the progressive Rob's Spirit, a decisive winner of Sunday's GIII Lexington S. Although Ajina made her name on the main track, winning the Mother Goose S., CCA Oaks and Breeders' Cup Distaff, Rob's Spirit is following the turf route generally pursued by the progeny of his highly effective sire, Theatrical.

Theatrical now has the enviable record of having sired 32 Group/Graded winners in North America, England, Ireland, France, Australia and Japan. It would be a remarkable statistic that only four of the 32--including Grade I winners Geri, Golden Treat and Run Man Run--have won a graded stakes on dirt were it not for the fact that Theatrical was a champion turf performer.

Although Theatrical is a tall, leggy horse standing just under 16.2 hands, this hasn't stopped him occasionally doing well with mares by sizeable stallions, such as Seattle Slew (broodmare sire of his very good daughter Astra, winner of this year's GI Gamely H.), Caro and Tyrant. Winglet's sire is the magnificent Alydar, another who stood nearly 16.2. As Alydar is also the broodmare sire of Gordi, a Theatrical colt who won the G3 Queen's Vase over two miles at Royal Ascot, it is not surprising that Rob's Spirit proved so well suited to 1 1/4 miles.

Rob's Spirit should stay further, too, which makes him a possible for some of the fall's rich turf prizes, provided he continues on the upgrade.

Winglet gained her most important success in the GII Princess S. over 8 1/2 furlongs on only her third start. This win represented one of the first dividends earned by Allen Paulson from his substantial investment at the Nelson Bunker Hunt dispersal in 1988. Paulson bought five of the 10 mares which sold for \$500,000 or more and among them were the \$1.1-million Dahlia, who later produced Theatrical's Grade I winner Dahlia's Dreamer, and Paloma Blanca, who went on to produce Theatrical's triple Grade III winner Apolda. Paulson also paid \$1,050,000 for the Bold Bidder mare Highest Trump, who produced Winglet shortly afterwards.

Hunt had himself paid a sales-topping \$2.5 million for Highest Trump at Keeneland in January, 1984. Her price owed a lot to her being in foal to Northern Dancer (already sire of her Irish Derby third Dance Bid), but also to Highest Trump's excellent looks and racing record. She had shown a lot of speed as a juvenile, when she trotted up by four lengths in the G3 Queen Mary S., and she later took third place in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. Highest Trump also had the attraction of being a descendant of Myrtlewood, dam of the famous mares Crepe Myrtle, Miss Dogwood and Durazna (the champion fourth dam of Winglet).

Another of Highest Trump's descendants, Bahri, was also in the news last week. Bahri, who is out of Highest Trump's Nijinsky filly Wasnah, was represented by two impressive winners at Newmarket's prestigious July meeting. Firstly Alshakr, a filly from his first crop, showed a clean pair of heels to her classy opponents in the G2 Falmouth S. and then his two-year-old daughter Khulan trotted up in a hot maiden race.

"I think she is premier league," commented Khulan's trainer John Dunlop, who also sent out Bahri's son Sakhee to finish an excellent second in the Derby.

Because Bahri's very eye-catching start has been centred in Europe, European breeders are busily speculating about whether he will be transferred to England. Once again, only time will tell.

MIRKO MARCIALIS KILLED IN FALL

Promising young Italian jockey Mirko Marcialis was killed as a result of injuries sustained in a fall at Varese, near Milan, Sunday evening. The 19-year-old was riding the Luciano D'Auria-trained four-year-old colt **Sir Robin (Ity)** (Distant Relative {Ire}) in the fourth race of the evening meeting when the pair were squeezed for room and fell heavily. Fellow jockeys Walter Gambarota and Ivan Rossi also fell from their mounts but escaped without serious injury, as Marcialis lay unconscious. Having been examined by the track doctor, Marcialis was rushed to the local hospital where he failed to recover from his injuries. Marcialis started his career only two years ago and was considered one of Italy's brightest prospects, riding as second-choice jockey for D'Auria behind Italian champion Mirco Demuro. Marcialis had his first ride at Varese in November 1997 and won his first race the following month. Of his 627 career rides, he had 79 wins and 228 places with earnings of L1,099,000,000. As a mark of respect, the remaining races at Varese were abandoned as was the last race at Napoli, once news of the accident had filtered through.

Trainer Henry Cecil has been arrested on suspicion of drink-driving after an accident involving two pedestrians in Ashley, Cambridgeshire, on Sunday. Cecil was in a blue Mercedes which was alleged to have clipped Leonard and Joan Hurrell, causing minor injuries. The pair were taken to West Suffolk Hospital in Bury St Edmunds. Cecil, breath-tested at the scene, was arrested and then released to appear at Cambridge Police Station Aug. 15.

SPRINGSTEEN FOR SALE

Springsteen (Aus) (Danehill {USA}) is being offered for sale by public tender by the liquidator of the late Michael Bastion's racing company Killarney Pastoral. The lightly raced and extremely promising half brother to proven stallion Marauding (NZ) is considered to be worth at least A\$1 million. Bastion operated Gideon Investments as well as Killarney Pastoral before his death in March. Killarney has a one-third share in Springsteen, a \$500,000 Easter yearling purchase, and it is believed the colt's other owners, Michael Tabor and John Magnier's wife Susan, are keen to retain the colt. The three-year-old was catalogued in the Adelaide Magic Millions sale two months ago but was withdrawn. He underwent knee surgery on both forelegs in mid-June and is unlikely to return to the racetrack until at least late September. Prepared by Peter Hayes, Springsteen won the Listed Oaklands Plate second-up in mid-April and at his third outing he won the Listed Alcohol-Go easy at Morphettville. Tenders for Springsteen close on July 21.
