KEENELAND BONANZA

If you blinked at any time during last night's final session of the Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale in Lexington, Kentucky, you likely missed the sale of a seven-figure yearling. A total of 14 horses sold for over \$1 million last night, but it was a daughter of legendary sire Mr. Prospector who led the seven-figure brigade with a \$3.6 million price tag. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Mr. & Mrs. John C. Mabee, hip number 185 is out of the mare Molly Girl (Seattle Slew), a full sister to General Meeting. Satish Sanan's Padua Stables outbid Aaron Jones to take home the sale-topping bay, the second-highest priced Keeneland July filly of all time. "This could be another [Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner] Cash Run," Sanan said of the \$3.6million filly. "We hope that she will be another Cash Run." Just moments before making the sale-topping purchase, Sanan warmed up with a \$3.3 million bid on hip number 179, a son of Gone West out of multiple Grade I winner Lakeway (Seattle Slew). "We love the game and we are committed to the game," explained Sanan after the bidding frenzy had died down. "We are in it for the long run. You can't always stay at the top. You're going to have your ups and downs. And, you're going to have to weather the storm. We've weathered the storm better than anyone." The underbidder on the dark bay was California trainer Bob Hess, who opened bidding on the colt at \$1 million. "You know when the bidding starts at \$1 million, that it is going to go up from there," Sanan said. "He's a tough guy," he added of Hess. Sanan's trainer and advisor D. Wayne Lukas added of the colt, "I liked everything about him. You have to like him to have stayed in there so long. It's surprising that we have had to pay so much for the ones we want. I just wish that Mr. Hess wouldn't have shown up." The Gone West yearling was consigned by Eaton Sales Agency. Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne purchased the third \$3-million yearling of the evening. He went to \$3.4 million to bring hip number 201 to Coolmore Stud. The dark bay, the third-highest priced filly in sale history, is by Storm Cat out of champion Serena's Song (Rahy). The underbidder on the filly was Richard Santulli and his Jayeff B Stables.

Mr. Prospector Colt Brings \$2.45 Million...

With the memory of Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector)'s Kentucky Derby win fresh in buyers minds, the late Mr. Prospector had a big night last night. Not only was he represented by the sale-topping filly, but his son out of Fineza (Lypheor {GB}) was the second-highest priced colt of the session at \$2.45 million. Consigned by Arthur and Stacev Hancock's Stone Farm, the dark bay was purchased by Robert and Janice McNair. "I thought he would sell for three or four million," admitted Robert McNair. "I am totally delighted, couldn't be happier. He's got a great hip and he's very well balanced. He has a real nice neck and head and I like the way he moves. He's got a nice personality. It's hard to find anything wrong with him." The Hancocks consigned Fusaichi Pegasus to this sale two years ago, when he brought a record \$4 million. "I wish I didn't have to sell him," said Arthur Hancock. "But I have to make a living and that's the business that I'm in. I'm crazy about the colt. He's a lot like Fusaichi Pegasus--he's by Mr. Prospector and he acts like Fusaichi Pegasus." The colt is a half brother to graded stakes winners Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister) and Golden Gear (Gulch).

Saint Ballado Colt Tops Afternoon Session...

A colt by Saint Ballado fetched \$1.4 million to top Tuesday afternoon's second session of the July Sale. The dark bay yearling, out of Jettin Diplomacy (Roman Diplomat), was consigned by Hartwell Farm, Agent I and was purchased by John Ferguson on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum. "He is a lovely athletic individual," Ferguson said of the session-topping colt. "He's by a very promising young stallion. He's very lovely." During the second session, the gross was down 40.7 percent from last year. The average was down 36.4 percent and the median was down 37.5 percent.

The Wrap-Up...

Tuesday night's session average of \$855,444 is believed to be a Keeneland sales record. A total of 24 horses reached seven figures, eclipsing last year's million-dollar total of 20. For the two-day, three-session auction, the gross was up 5.1 percent over last year's corresponding figure. During Tuesday night's session, the gross was up 23.4 percent, the average was up 28.9 percent and the median was up 12.5 percent. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland director of sales, commented, "We're very pleased with the market. We thank consignors and buyers for continuing to have faith in the sale. It was an amazing sale." Of the auction's popularity, he added, "It's consistently the best sale in the world by Grade I winners. I would have been pleased if we met the same numbers as last year, so I was very pleased."

FASIG-TIPTON JULY SALE OPENS TODAY

If Monday's opening session of the July Sale at Keeneland is any indication, Fasig-Tipton in Lexington could be in for quite a couple of days when it opens its Kentucky Selected Yearlings Sale today at the Newtown Paddocks. Sale sessions will begin Wednesday and Thursday at 10 a.m. On Wednesday, hip numbers 1-216 are part of the new sire showcase. Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson is expecting the bidding and the buying to be fast and furious right from the start on Wednesday morning. He said, "A good horse has never been worth more. Racing is good, the economy is good, and there are so many outlets for horses to earn money. Basically, the economy is just really good right now." Fasig-Tipton's yearling sale continues to grow. Robertson added, "We've got 100 more than last year at this time." Preakness winner Louis Quatorze's first foals are vearlings of 2000. He will be represented at this sale by hip number four, a bay filly out of the Raise a Man mare Raisin Goldie. Others to watch include a dark bay colt (Hip 11) by Kentucky Derby winner Grindstone. Lady's Comin Home (Hip 13) could also fetch a good price. She is the daughter of Kentucky Derby runner-up Captain Bodgit, Additionally, watch for hip number 118, a bay colt by Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Unbridled's Song, hip number 133, a chestnut colt by Belmont S. winner Editor's Note, and a bay filly (Hip 184) by Forest Wildcat. Among the first day yearlings for sale at Fasig-Tipton will be hip number 237, a roan colt by Horse of the Year Holy Bull, hip number 254, a chestnut filly by Lord Avie, and hip number 261, a bay colt by Salt Lake, the sire of five crops, 16 stakes winners and 184 overall winners with earnings of more than \$11 million.

HOME RUN DERBY

After last night's home run derby--14 seven-figure horses, including two between \$2-\$3 million, and three over \$3 million--plenty of sale observers said it didn't matter if the July sale had just 100 horses if every session could be like that. Whether last night's \$855,000 average was the record for a session we weren't quite sure, but it was certainly the strongest single session since the night Seattle Dancer sold for \$13.1 million in 1985.

Sixty yearlings went through the ring last night, and one out of every four (including one buy-back) brought final bids of \$1-million or more. Really, it was just like watching heavyweight sluggers take batting practice: one after another they just stepped up to the plate, swung for the fences, and watched as the ball sailed into the upper deck, if not clean out of the park.

For the whole sale, 24 yearlings sold for \$1 million or more, against 20 last year and 15 in 1998. There were another 28 which sold for between \$500,000-\$1 million, so the overall number of yearlings sold for \$500,000 or more actually dropped slightly, to 52 this year from 56 the last two years. The number of expensive quality Keeneland July yearlings hasn't changed much, but they're getting more expensive.

The Big Four...

Four buyers dominated this year's sale. Among them they bought 40 yearlings (31percent of those sold), and spent over \$43 million--over half the sale's gross. Not surprisingly, they accounted for 16, two-thirds, of the seven-figure yearlings.

These four buyers: Padua Stables (accompanied by Wayne Lukas), John Ferguson for Godolphin, Demi O'Byrne for the Coolmore team, and Aaron Jones, averaged over \$1 million for 29 colts and 11 fillies. They collectively dominated proceedings to the point that the other 90 yearlings, including eight more which brought \$1 million plus, averaged just over \$400,000--less than half the average notched up by the four big buyers.

No Place Like Keeneland in July...

Is there still a place for the July sale? That was a question making the rounds beforehand. Pretty resounding yes, is the answer to that. The pavilion was once again crowded with tourists (worse Monday night than Tuesday), the buzz was a little bit electric, and the top yearlings by the top sires brought really big money.

Young Guns...

Among the younger stallions, Unbridled's Song (first two-year-olds) and Pulpit (first yearlings) took a definite edge over the Coolmore pair of Hennessy and Spinning World, for the moment at least. For Keeneland July, Unbridled's Song had four sell, of five through the ring, for an average of \$671,250. Hennessy's two which sold averaged \$565,000, but another five didn't sell. Of the two leading first-year sires, Pulpit had a \$1,450,000 colt sell to Adena Springs, and averaged \$550,833 with six selling, of seven offered. Spinning World didn't have a breakout horse at this sale, but went seven-for-nine sold, and averaged \$242,857.

A Keeneland Tradition...

It was a stunning evening in the stellar history of the world's greatest horse sale. I've been coming to the Keeneland sales for more than 20 years, and, no doubt about it, this was one of the best. Expect a big sale at Fasig-Tipton today and tomorrow, too. But one of the sale's great figures, certainly for the 20 years I've been coming and for more than 20 years before that, was missing from this year's sale. Keeneland's chief auctioneer, Tom Caldwell, is at home in Oregon. Cris told me it's the first July sale Tom's missed in 43 years. Tom has been a huge figure in the Keeneland sales for as long as I've been in the game. In my guise as the announcer for the Washington sales for nearly 20 years I've had the privilege of working in the stand with Tom on several occasions, and it's been one of the highlights, personally, of my career in the horse business. Tom, I know I speak for hundreds of your friends and admirers at Keeneland who want to say how much we've learned from you, and to thank you so much for all you've been and done for so many of us throughout your career.

No other farm had as many stallions ranked among the top 25 stallions by average at Keeneland July

FOX MAY DROP NTRA SERIES The future of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's "Champions on Fox" series may be in doubt, according to a report in Thoroughbred Times. The NTRA's two-year contract with Fox-TV expires after the 2000 series finale in the Aug. 6 GI Whitney H. Fox recently signed an eight-year contract to televise NASCAR auto races starting next year and the network is currently in negotiations with Major League Baseball for future national broadcast rights. "We have the appetite for everything, we just don't have stomach to fit it all in," Bill Brown, senior producer at Fox Sports told the Times. "The bottom line is, if everything falls into place, we'll have some windows early in the year, but not later in the summer when we would have to conclude the [racing] series." NTRA commissioner Tim Smith said, "We've looked preliminarily at what some alternatives might be. But we have not actively initiated any discussion with other networks and won't until we determine where we are with Fox."

HOFMEISTER SUES BAFFERT George Hofmeister has filed suit against trainer Bob Baffert over the racing status of Kentucky Derby winner Real Quiet (Quiet American), according to The Blood Horse. Real Quiet's owner Mike Pegram sold the colt to Hofmeister in March, 1998 for \$1.1 million and five stallion shares. It was agreed Hofmeister would obtain the colt once his racing career was over or on Dec. 1, 2000, whichever came first. The suit alleges that Hofmeister was told in January that the colt was fit to race, but when he was retired and sent to Vinery in February, three veterinarians from Hagyard-Davidson-McGee and Rood and Riddle determined that Real Quiet "had been unable to race, due to severe injuries to both front legs for long prior to Jan. 28." Pegram and Hofmeister have agreed to arbitration over the matter. When asked for comment by the Associated Press, Baffert called the suit, "frivolous." Real Quiet covered 103 mares this season at Vinery.
