KING'S BEST TO DARLEY

Classic winner King's Best (Kingmambo--Allegretta {GB}, by Lombard {Ger}), who suffered a condylar fracture of the right front cannon bone during the July 2 G1 Irish Derby, has been purchased by Darley and will stand stud at Kildangan Stud in Ireland next season. His stud fee has not yet been set. A Listed winner at two, the half brother to Arc winner Urban Sea posted a 3 1/2-length victory in the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket in his second outing this season before being injured in the Irish Derby. Currently Timeform's top-rated three-year-old in Europe, King's Best retires with three wins from six starts and earnings of £210,348. "We are delighted--King's Best is a brilliant miler, with a guite exceptional pedigree," Kildangan Stud's Joe Osborne said. "He is also a wonderful-looking horse, handsome and athletic. He is one of the world's most valuable stallion prospects."

MORVEN STUD TO DISPERSE AT KEENELAND

John Kluge's Morven Stud will disperse its broodmares and foals at Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale. Russell Jones, co-owner of Walnut Green Bloodstock and general manager of Morven Stud, will serve as agent for the 19 broodmares, 16 foals and one filly in training on Sunday, Nov. 5. Ten yearlings will also be sold at Keeneland in September. Included in the November sale are Grade I winner Double Wedge (Northern Baby), in foal to Lear Fan, and her Coronado's Quest filly, and graded winner Electric Society (Ire) (Law Society), in foal to Deputy Minister, and her Danzig colt--a full brother to the \$1.1 million yearling who sold at Keeneland on Tuesday. Also available will be multiple stakes winners Mingling Glances (Woodman), Too Cool To Fool (Foolish Pleasure), in foal to Danzig, and her filly by Kris S. Jones said the 85-year-old Kluge's decision to disperse was based on "estate planning."

FILLIES TOP FASIG'S FIRST SESSION

Taking a page from their Keeneland July counterparts. fillies brought the top three prices at the first session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Selected Yearlings Sale yesterday. Leading the way was Hip 174, by freshman sire Lord Carson out of multiple stakes winner Lanzada, who sold for \$350,000 to John Moynihan, agent. "I really felt like she was one of the best fillies in the sale, but there are still plenty to choose from," remarked Moynihan. "She really looks good. I can't believe I just bought a horse for \$350,000." The bay filly, a half sister to multiple stakes winner Lord Zada, was consigned by Ravensway, agent. Moynihan also purchased the second highest-priced yearling, Hip 232--a chestnut filly by Meadowlake--for \$290,000. From the consignment of Highclere, her dam is a half sister to graded stakes winner Time to Explode. Selling for \$285,000 was Hip 272, a Saint Ballado filly from the multiple stakes winner Special Test. Consigned by Taylor Made, she went home with Eugene Melnyk. Top price for colts at the session was \$250,000, shared by a pair of youngsters. Kentucky Derby winner and freshman sire Grindstone sired Hip 11, a colt from the family of stakes winners Citadeed and Paragallo's Hope. Offered by Dixiana Farm as agent, he was purchased by Ben Glass, agent for Gary and Mary West. "We think he is a great colt and you can't argue with his family history," Glass said. "It's always a risk when you buy at auction, but we think this one will be successful." Also selling for \$250,000 was a colt by freshman sire Forest Wildcat, purchased by Douglas E. Cauthen, agent. Produced from the stakes-placed mare Carrie's Prospect, he was consigned by Peter Sheppell Thoroughbreds. The average for the first session remained on par with last year--\$72,561 for 2000 and \$72,658 for 1999--despite selling more yearlings.

RECORD KEENELAND SALE

Keeneland's July Selected Yearling Sale recorded the highest average price per horse in the history of the auction at \$621,015. The two-day sale, which saw 130 horses go through the ring, surpassed last year's average by more than \$39,000 and grossed \$80,732,000 overall. Leading buyer at the sale was Satish Sanan's Padua Stables, which purchased 12 yearlings for \$14,440,000, including both the top filly and colt. Leading sire by average was the late Mr. Prospector, with seven yearlings going for an average of \$1,477,143.

MARKET MUSINGS

Before we talk about the disappointing 34 percent buy-back rate at Fasig yesterday, can I just go on record as saying I really like those painted and decorated fiberglass horses that are standing around Lexington. I think it's a great idea; I've thought for a long time that Lexington undersells itself as the 'thoroughbred horse breeding and sales capital of the universe,' and these horses are clearly proving a successful--and tactile-tourist attraction. Now, a few of what the English refer to, with their noses a little elevated, as 'our European partners' did say to me that they found the horses a bit tacky. But a couple of Irish fellows I know said it to me, and, considering the collection of gnomes I've seen outside a house in Dublin which would put anything we have in Arkansas to shame, well, I think it's a bit rich, coming from them. So there.

But I digress. The business at hand is yesterday's Fasig-Tipton July sale, day one--the first three-quarters of which is devoted to yearlings by first- and second-crop sires and is called the New Sire Showcase. Whether that had an effect on the surprisingly high percentage of not-solds yesterday--34 percent, over one of every three through the ring--we shall have to wait until today's 'open' select session to see. With 36 percent more horses catalogued for yesterday's session than for the corresponding session last year, both the number sold and gross were up just 10 percent, and the average was dead even. The number of buy-backs was two-and-a-half times last year's figure.

People keep asking if this market is different from that of "The 'Eighties," and, if so, how. Two things. First, it's not borrowed money, leveraged money. It may be paper money, to some extent, but it's not borrowed. And second, it's not indiscriminate. In the 'Eighties--a little bit--if you just had a horse, you got the money. Now, if you don't have the horse, you don't get the

money. At a level of the market here there is clearly a broad spectrum of people ready to buy--an issue nobody was too sure about before Keeneland on Monday, remember--here there are people clamoring to spend money, but the money is still discriminating. Interesting ... and undoubtedly significant.

Young Guns, Part Deux...

Though the numbers are still relatively small, Fasig's New Sire Showcase does provide an opportunity to see something of the first two crops of aspiring commercial sires. There are, of course, early returns from the race-course for those whose first crops are two-year-olds, so there will obviously be some kind of influence from that quarter for those sires' second crops at the sales.

At Keeneland, among this group of sires, Unbridled's Song sold better than Hennessy, both in average price and clearance rate. As the accompanying table supplied last night by *Racing Update* indicates, he maintained that advantage yesterday. Through three days of selling now, Unbridled's Song had six sold (from eight offered) for an average of \$495,333; Hennessy had just five sell from twelve through the ring for an average of \$276,400.

Of the others in this group, Forest Wildcat had nine sell of 14 offered yesterday, sustaining his impressive sales performance with an average of \$108,222, following one at Keeneland which brought \$130,000. Of those making their first appearance in the sales ring this yearling season, Gold Fever had two (of four offered) average \$107,500, and good figures were also notched up by cheaper stallions Mutakddim (two colts averaged \$80,000), Prospect Bay (a \$180,000 colt), and Mr Purple (now in California), who had three average \$68,000. *Bill Oppenheim cont. p4*

With Keeneland first-crop headliners Pulpit and Spinning World not represented at Fasig yesterday, Siphon (Brz) maintained his edge over Boston Harbor in the duel for third and fourth places among 2000 first-crop yearling sires. Six Siphon yearlings averaged \$123,333 yesterday, so including Keeneland he has now had 10 offered, eight sold, for an average of \$176,875; the three Boston Harbors offered yesterday averaged \$115,000, so he has now had seven offered, six sold, for an average of \$147,500. These two stallions both sold well last fall, too; another who could get in this group's top five is Atticus, whose only yearling sold so far brought \$400,000 at Keeneland.

Four stallions who stood for \$10,000 this year (though the two Ashford horses started higher) each had seven or more yearlings sent through the ring yesterday, and all four averaged between \$65,000-\$78,500. Victory Speech had the highest average, but did worst of the four in that only two of his seven sold. Preakness winner Louis Quatorze had six sell (from eight), which averaged \$77,167, including a \$230,000 colt. The good sprinter Smoke Glacken had eight sell from ten offered, which averaged \$71,000; Belmont winner Editor's Note went six-for-eight, averaging \$65,000. Two cheaper stallions had a noticeable result: the little-known (but unbeaten) \$5,000 Adena Springs stallion Gold Case had a \$132,000 filly sell; and the well bred Florida stallion Jules had a filly bring \$130,000. They are both by Forty Niner, as it happens.

Finding extra reserves, Kerrygold responded to Soumillon's urging and snatched the race in the dying strides.

MEADOWLANDS ANNOUNCES STAKES

SCHEDULE Six graded events, highlighted by the \$400,000 GII Meadowlands Cup, will headline a \$3.5 million stakes schedule for the 2000 season. The 54-day meet will kick off September 4 and will run through November 18. Other featured events include the \$250,000 GII Pegasus H. for three-year-olds Oct. 27, the \$200,000 GIII Boiling Springs Breeders' Cup H. for sophomore turf fillies Sept. 4, and the \$200,000 GIII Honey Bee H. for three-year-old fillies on the main track Sept. 29. "We are pleased to offer a stakes schedule that offers horsemen a number of divisions in which to compete," said Sean Greely, racing secretary for the Meadowlands. "A stakes schedule as lucrative as this one will certainly draw the attention of horsemen all over."

MORPHINE POSITIVE FOR BAFFERT HORSE

The Bob Baffert-trained Nautical Look (Woodman) tested positive for morphine after winning the seventh race at Hollywood Park on May 3. Truesdail Laboratories reported the initial positive, which was confirmed using a split sample by Texas Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory. The California Horse Racing Board has issued a complaint against Baffert, and the stewards at Del Mar will schedule a hearing on the matter. In addition to her May 3 first-place finish, the three-year-old Nautical Look has a March 15 maiden win in six starts.

At the back of the pack for six furlongs, she finished full of run to catch favored Solar Bound in the final furlong.

6th-BEL, \$42,000, Msw, 3/up, f/m, 8.5f, 1:45 3/5, ft. UNBRIDLED WATERS (f, 3, Unbridled--Waterside {GSP, \$106,400}, by Topsider) finished off the board in her first three starts but showed improvement with the addition of blinkers in her latest effort, setting the early pace before tiring to be fourth going a mile at Belmont June 21. Bet down to even money off that effort, the bay this time rated just off the leaders, rallying to take over at the top of the stretch and drawing away to a 3 3/4-length score. Secret Status (A.P. Indy), preparing for Saturday's GI Coaching Club American Oaks, breezed six furlongs in 1:13 at Belmont Monday. LOVE AND PETRUSHKA FOR HEAD-TO-HEAD?

While G1 Epsom Oaks winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}) has been away, with the virus that affected her earlier in the year, Sir Michael Stoute's Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain {USA}) stole the limelight with a brilliant performance in the Irish verison on Sunday. Now there is a chance that both will meet in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 23. Tim Jones, spokesman for the Highclere Thoroughbred Racing Syndicate that owns Petrushka, has stated that race to be her "obvious" next target. Jones said of the Classic-winning filly, who had previously been fourth at Epsom behind Love Divine: "We have so many options, but the next obvious target would be the Yorkshire Oaks. We need to decide where we want her season to culminate and work back from there, but we have in mind two final spots, the Breeders' Cup and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe." Michael Russell, racing manager for Lordship Stud, who owns Love Divine, said: "She's back cantering and there are no worries, but also no plan at the moment, although York is not out of the question. It depends mainly on the going, and how well she's going."

MAGIC RING FILLY TAKES TOP BID AT ASCOT

Three-year-old filly Magic Sunset (GB) (Magic Ring {Ire}), winner of a claimer at Wolverhampton a week ago, topped the sale of flat-bred stock at yesterday's Ascot July Bloodstock Sales, which offered its largest catalogue in five years. Sent up from trainer lan Balding's Park House Stables at Kingsclere, she was bought by the Curragh Bloodstock Agency for 7,200 guineas. Of the 140 lots finally offered, 114 were sold for a gross of 189,790 guineas at an average of 1,665 guineas and a median of 1,150 guineas.

LEVY BOARD INCREASES SPENDING ON RACING

The publishing of the Levy Board Annual Report today shows that the Horseracing Levy Board increased its revenue spending last year for the benefit of racing by £5.3 million, an increase of 9.1 percent. Levy income from bookmakers, at £53 million, was £300,000 greater than in 1998/99, while the Tote increased their contribution substantially to £5.5 million, achieving a total of £61 million, a rise of 1.7 percent over the previous year. By drawing down the cash level of reserves maintained by the Levy Board, revenue spending on horseracing was increased to £63.1 million, compared with £57.9 million. The main increases were on prizemoney, increased by 13.9 percent to £4.1 million, and grants towards racecourse development projects, which rose by £1.1 million. The increased expenditure resulted in a deficit on the Revenue Account of £2.2 million, as opposed to the surplus of £2.6 million last year. Loan payments to racecourses in support of improvement projects increased by £4.7 million, up 57 percent, to £12.9 million. Robert Hughes, the Levy Board chairman, commented: "We decided to dip into cash balances so that we could increase our spending on behalf of racing to the highest-ever level. We are planning to achieve a new record level of spending in 2000/01, with a planned expenditure total of £68.7 million."
