DUBAI WORLD CUP SET FOR 2001

The Emirates Racing Association has announced that next year's G1 Dubai World Cup will be run at Nad al Sheba Mar. 24. The \$6 million event headlines a seven-race program, all group races. Also on the World Cup card are the \$2 million G3 UAE Derby, \$2 million G2 Dubai Duty Free, \$2 million G2 Dubai Sheema Classic, \$1 million G3 Dubai Golden Shaheen and \$250,000 G3 Godolphin Mile.

Craftsmanship, a winner of two minor events at three, collected his first stakes win last summer, but was well beaten in his first graded try, the July 9 G3 Tanabata Sho at Tokyo, and was sent off the 14th choice among 16 runners here. The bay settled in mid-pack early, delivered an impressive rally in the lane and held off the late challenge of Osumi Taikan for the upset to give his sire his first graded winner. Favored Admire Cozzene (Jpn) (Cozzene), juvenile champion of 1998, sidelined by injury for 19 months, was a disappointing sixth.

Am I alone in finding it hard to believe that Kris S. now ranks among the more senior citizens of Kentucky's stallion fraternity and that he will be 24 by the time the next breeding season rolls around?

Perhaps Kris S. doesn't seem to have been around as long as some of his contemporaries, such as Danzig and Nureyev, simply because he neither raced nor bred any mares as a four-year-old and then struggled for support in his early years at stud. Remember, his first four seasons yielded less than 100 named foals. These difficult early years meant that Kris S. was already 11 years old by the time he made his first major breakthrough in 1988 through the Grade I-winning efforts of Evening Kris and Stocks Up. And he was already 17 years old by the time he covered his first mares in Kentucky in 1994.

Kris S.'s move from Florida the previous summer could hardly have been better timed. He hit the headlines within months of his arrival in Kentucky thanks to a tremendous double on Breeders' Cup day initiated by Hollywood Wildcat in the Distaff and completed impressively by Brocco in the Juvenile. Now Kris S. and Brocco have notched up a notable double between them, with Brocco responsible for Jostle, winner of the GI CCA Oaks on the same day that Kris S.'s daughter Kumari Continent took the GII Hollywood Oaks.

Kris S. and Brocco have something else in common--their size. Kris S., a typically big product of the Hail To Reason male line, stands around 17 hands and so does Brocco.

Despite their size, both showed plenty of ability at two. Brocco was a \$215,000 purchase at Barretts' March Sale and his only defeat in four starts at two came when he found Valiant Nature too strong in the Hollywood Futurity. Brocco seemed to be progressing well when he defeated Tabasco Cat to take the Santa Anita Derby, but a slow start hampered his bid to add the Kentucky Derby to his spoils. In the circumstances he did well to finish fourth. The same couldn't be said of his last-place finish at Del Mar four months later in what proved to be Brocco's next--and last--appearance.

Brocco's stallion career has been a rather complicated affair. He commenced stallion duties at Lane's End Farm at a fee of \$15,000 in 1995 before shuttling to Arrowfield in Australia. This process was repeated in 1996 and 1997, but it was then announced that Brocco would stay in Australia in 1998. He spent this year's Northern Hemisphere season at Shadai Farm in Japan.

Jostle is easily his best representative in the U.S., where she has now won a Grade I, two Grade IIs and a Grade III, but Brocco has a similarly impressive Grade 1-winning daughter in Australia in the shape of Miss Pennymoney, who proved fast enough to take the highly competitive Newmarket H. over six furlongs.

Jostle's front-running display in the CCA Oaks established that she stays well, probably a bit better than might be expected of a filly whose first three dams are by Drone, Ack Ack and In Reality. However, other daughters of Drone have also produced some very notable winners at 1 1/4 miles or beyond, including the Kentucky Derby winners Grindstone and Charismatic and the Arc hero Dancing Brave.

The presence of In Reality in Jostle's pedigree is another example of the affinity that this stallion's descendants have for the Roberto line. Indeed, Kumari Continent's dam Rajmata is by Known Fact, which makes her a granddaughter of In Reality. It can't have been too hard to choose a son of Roberto as a mate for Rajmata because Known Fact had himself enjoyed great success with Roberto's daughters, notably siring the Group 1 winners Warning and So Factual.

Roberto himself sired three stakes winners from four foals out of In Reality mares, including Real Shadai and Major Impact, so this is a tried and tested route.

Sidelined for over a year, the Pennsylvania-bred returned July 1 and, saddled by trainer Wendy Kinnamon, won by six lengths at a mile and sixteenth in his last outing. Rated toward the front of the pack in this race, the bettors' 3-1 second choice gradually made his way to the lead and mustered up enough speed in the stretch to just assure the win, succeeding by a neck over fast-finishing Inevitably Private (Private Talk). Lifetime Record: 3-2-0-0, \$34,440.

SOLE PROPRIETOR (c, 4, Binalong--Back At Two {MSW, \$254,550}, by Icecapade), a winner first-time out October, continued to show top form after his debut, with only one finish worse than second place. Fifth in a Charles Town allowance race Apr. 7, he was back on the track a month later to win a claiming event two races ago May 27, then changed trainers from Ronney Brown to Dale Capuano to emerge victorious again in his latest race July 4. Making it three in a row here, the bay colt pressed the early pace and slowly wore down the front-runner Bravehaus (Swedaus), running on his own terms after jockey Michael McCarthy dropped his whip to get up and win by a neck at odds of 5-2. Lone Star Meet Sets Records:

The 2000 season at Lone Star Park, which ended Sunday, saw records set for single-day attendance and single-day on-track handle. Overall, attendance was 675,321 during the 73-day meet, an average of 9,251. The average was down 1.3 percent from last year, but a record 33,805 came through the gates July 3, a new mark for the track. Total handle was \$222 million, as compared to \$243 million in 1999. The daily average of \$3 million was down 10.2 percent, due largely to a 14.3-percent decline in off-track wagering. But the Kentucky Derby day program realized a record on-track handle of \$3.3 million. Trainer Steve Asmussen set new standards for single-season wins (68) and earnings (\$1.7 million) while winning five stakes and besting runner-up Cole Norman by 34 victories. Glen Murphy led all jockeys with 62 winners, nine ahead of Donnie Meche, but Meche missed 28 of the last 30 days due to an injured right shoulder. Tom Durant topped the owner standings with 13 wins.

MONTJEU IN & LOVE ON FENCE FOR KING GEORGE

Five-time Group 1 winner **Montjeu (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) heads the 11 horses left in Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. The John Hammond-trained colt, made the 11-8 on favourite by Corals, had been removed from the firm's betting list on Saturday, due to fears that connections would sidestep the race in the face of fast ground. Nevertheless, he has been entered and is an intended runner at this stage. Ascot's Clerk Of The Course Nick Cheyne commented yesterday, "It looks a cracking race, and obviously we're delighted with the entries, but it depends on the weather between now and Thursday. The forecast is for dry weather, but increasing thundery showers on Wednesday and Thursday. I spoke to Mr Hammond this morning, and the plan is to run. It is currently good, fast ground, but there would only be a question of [Montjeu] running if the ground firmed up dramatically. We have been watering today, but it's unfortunate that there could be rain coming later in the week." Trainer Mark Johnston's **Fruits Of Love (USA)** (Hansel {USA}), currently 8-1 for the race with Corals on the strength of his back-to-back successes in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot, may yet make the frame after injuring his hock while swimming at the weekend. Johnston said yesterday, "It is a little better but that is not to say that it is anything other than a serious setback. We'll try to reduce the swelling, but he will miss a gallop which will undoubtedly affect his chance."

COURT RULES FOR BHB OVER WILLIAM HILL

The months-old court battle between William Hill and the British Horseracing Board is apparently over after the court ruled Wednesday that William Hill was not entitled to use BHB database information on its internet site without a licence. The BHB issued proceedings against William Hill in March 2000, seeking a Declaration from the Courts that it has database rights in its pre-race information and that any betting operator who displays the information on an internet site without a BHB licence is in breach of BHB rights. William Hill, whose defence related to Article 82 of the Treaty Of Rome (regarding abuse of a dominant position) was struck out, and they were ordered by the Court to pay the BHB's cost of application.

DETTORI BACK IN THE SADDLE

Frankie Dettori, who suffered a broken ankle six weeks ago in a plane crash in Newmarket, was back riding work for Godolphin Monday. In an upbeat bulletin about his imminent return to race-riding, Dettori said, "I felt like a fish out of water--everything was not quite right, but it is the start of my comeback. I would say in around 10 days I could be looking to have my first ride."

RECORD PRIZE MONEY FOR VOLTIGEUR

York Racecourse will host the richest running of the G2 Great Voltigeur S. on Aug. 22, thanks to a donation from Mr. and Mrs. John Magnier and Mr. and Mrs. Michael Tabor. The total prize fund is now £150,000, an increase of £40,000 over the purse won last year by Fantastic Light (USA). The donation marks the successes of the connections' horses Stravinsky (USA) and Mull Of Kintyre (USA) in the York Ebor meeting's G1 Nunthorpe S. and G2 Gimcrack S., respectively. They have also donated towards the Listed Galtres S., increasing the prize money for that race to £40,000--up £10,000 from last year.
