BOUTRON BREAKS THROUGH

Boutron (Exit To Nowhere) had performed well enough to secure minor placings in group company, but that all changed Tuesday as the colt came from just off the pace to win the G3 Prix Daphnis at Chantilly. A model of consistency, the bay was only once out of the frame in his previous 12 starts to date. The runner-up in both the G2 Prix Greffulhes at Longchamp Apr. 23 and the G3 Prix de Guiche at the same course May 18, Boutron finished a creditable fourth behind Beat Hollow (GB) in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris June 25. Here he showed his customary gameness to get the better of **Crystal d'Ass** (Northern Crystal {GB}) and claim his most important stakes success. Held up in third on the outside early as Crystal d'Ass set out to make the running, Boutron was the only one capable of going with the leader as they quickened in the straight. Grabbing the lead with a furlong and a half remaining, he battled well to shrug off the stubborn challenge of the runner-up and asserted in the closing stages to take the prize.

SCHUYLerville OPENS SPA SEASON

Racing returns to Saratoga Racecourse today and the 132nd opening day card is highlighted by the GII Schuylerville S. for two-year-old fillies dashing six furlongs. Trainer Mark Hennig will saddle two of his talented juvenile filly trio. **Gold Mover** (Gold Fever), undefeated in three starts, bested the boys to win the May 29 GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup in her second start and returned to win the July 8 GIII Debutante, both at Churchill. Her speedy stablemate **With Ability** (A.P. Indy), unbeaten in two outings, is coming off a seven-length romp in the June 8 Fashion S. Hennig's third unbeaten two-year-old filly is **Raging Fever** (Storm Cat), an 11 1/4-length winner of the July 2 Astoria S. "I want to keep With Ability and Raging Fever apart for as long as I can," Hennig explained of the decision to keep the latter in the barn today. "Gold Mover's style isn't going to hinder the other fillies because she can come from off the pace." Canadian invader **Caught Out** (Smart Strike) ships south of the border after two winning efforts at Woodbine. She has recorded two bullet works since winning the My Dear S. June 24. "She's a filly that wants to run on," said trainer Roger Attfield. "She's got enough class to win sprinting, but she's not a sprinter."

RED BULLET OUT OF HASKELL Red Bullet (Unbred) is out of Monmouth Park's GI Haskell Invitational. Trainer Joe Orseno said yesterday that the Preakness winner, who has been plagued by ulcers and a virus since finishing third as the odds-on favorite in the July 9 GI Dwyer S. at Belmont Park, is on the road to recovery, but will not be ready to run in time for the Aug. 6 Haskell. Orseno blamed the virus, and not the stomach problems, for Red Bullet's defection. "A lot of horses have ulcers and they run with them," he said. "Red Bullet is a tough horse and I think he could have run through his ulcers, but he also has had a viral infection and he is still a little under the weather. We were finally able to pinpoint the virus [Monday] and, after treating it with the right medication for just one day, he is much better. He trained better [Tuesday] than he has since the Preakness, but the infection has to run its course--you can't rush him." Red Bullet is scheduled to ship from Belmont to Saratoga Saturday, with future plans undecided. **More Than Ready** (Southern Halo), the likely favorite for the Haskell despite the fact that he has never won a race of any kind around two turns, worked five furlongs in 1:03 over the Saratoga training track yesterday morning. "He went well and he came back in good shape," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We'll probably breeze him again a week from today."

INCURABLE OPTIMIST TO ARGENTINA Incurable Optimist (Cure the Blues--Miss Turlington, by Seattle Slew) will stand the 2000 Southern Hemisphere breeding season in Argentina at Pablo and Victoria Duggan's Haras el Paraiso. The New York champion won four of six starts, including the 1998 GIII Generous S. and the GIII Pilgrim S. and earned \$271,309. The four-year-old was undefeated on the turf. He stood his first season at stud this year at Highcliff Farm in New York for \$2,500. His stud fee in Argentina has not been disclosed.

As a racehorse, Marquetry was a very versatile type. A Grade I winner on both dirt and turf he captured seven stakes events, including the GI Hollywood Gold Cup H., GI Eddie Read H. and GI Meadowlands Cup H. Those victories came at distances between nine and 10 furlongs--a route in American terms--but Marquetry also owned sufficient speed to equal the course record for 6 1/2 furlongs on turf at Santa Anita. Marquetry is also a three-quarters brother to Spain Lane (by Seeking the Gold), one of the best sprint fillies of her generation in Europe, so perhaps it isn't so surprising that, to date, speed seems to be Marquetry's strong suit as a sire.

Of course, his first crop included champion sprinter Artax (now back in training), who reverted to sprints after showing good form in middle-distance contests at three. Marquetry's third crop includes Max's Pal, a four-time stakes winner this year, and one of the best three-year-old sprinters on the East Coast. Now, in the shape of the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship winner Squirtle Squirt, it appears that Marquetry has an exceptionally fast two-year-old. Squirtle Squirt is out of a mare by up-and-coming broodmare sire Lost Code; this cross also produced Try N Express, a member of Marquetry's second crop and winner of the Great Arizona Futurity Shoot Out, one of the earliest juvenile stakes races of the year.

The combination of Marquetry and Lost Code gives linebreeding to *Turn-To along with a strain of *Ambiorix, a half brother to Turn-To's dam *Source Sucree. It also gives a combination of the rather similarly bred Native Dancer sons Raise a Native (great-grandsire of Marquetry) and Restless Native, something which has frequently worked well for Lost Code as a sire.

AUGUST MEETINGS

They all get underway a week or so before August these days, but plenty of race goers and racing professionals alike aren't complaining. August means Saratoga, Del Mar, and Deauville. What's not to like? A few intrepid heroes--mostly bloodstock agents--pride themselves on hitting both beaches and the Spa. Most of us have to content ourselves with the occasional glimpse of only one.

For those who will miss the opening weekends at their favorite August port of call, Ascot stages the mighty important G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. over 1 1/2 miles this Saturday. John Hammond, Montjeu's French-based, English-born trainer, has thrown down the gauntlet to all and sundry, declaring that Montjeu (c, 4, Sadler's Wells) will run, whether the ground is soft, which he clearly relishes, or firm. His only loss, in last year's Prix Lupin, came on good-to-firm, but last time out he cantered over three rivals on good-to-firm in the G1 GP de Saint-Cloud. His trainer, as savvy a customer as you'd need to find in the training ranks, clearly isn't worried about the going, and if he's right, which he usually is, the 8-13 quoted now about him winning will be a gift.

Besides, the weather report is iffy. It was soft at Chantilly yesterday, and last night it was hosing it down in Normandy. It's currently good-to-firm at Ascot, but if that rain keeps moving north, it'll be soft by Saturday. Besides Montjeu, the big beneficiary in that case will be Henry Cecil's charge, Shiva (m, 5, Hector Protector), who finished a good third in the 10-furlong Eclipse on good-to-firm, and who moves up about eight pounds on soft.

She's not the only one, either. Godolphin's Kayf Tara (h, 6, Sadler's Wells) won the 2 1/2-mile Ascot Gold Cup on good-to-firm in his last start, but is another who likes it soft. It's even true of the second favourite, Coronation Cup winner Daliapour (c, 4, Sadler's Wells). Ever notice how many Sadler's Wells's there are in these Group 1 staying races? A coincidence?

Sales By the Sea and Spa...

But I digress. I was talking about August, and, not surprisingly, there is a yearling sale attached to each relevant race meeting. Of the \$70 million grossed by the three sales combined last year, Del Mar, with \$4 million, was by far the smallest. Yet their \$36,798 average was a 65-percent gain on 1998. When you consider this is a sale that just about went out of existence a few years back, you can see what I mean. There has been a serious revival in the California breeding industry, initiated by John and Betty Mabee and General Meeting but being built upon by the likes of In Excess and Bertrando. The Del Mar sale--for which, by the way, I haven't been sent a catalogue, so I can't comment upon it in any detail--is going to be a big growth industry for at least the next five years.

Saratoga (August 8-10) has made a mighty recovery from the doldrums of the early 'Nineties, and got back to a \$261,456 average on almost \$39 million in sales last year. They're surely hoping for more gains, notwithstanding the selectivity evidenced by buyers in Kentucky.

But the sale I really expect fireworks from is the Agence Francaise's annual Deauville yearling sale (August 19-23). It's a bit like a French version of the September sale. The first two days (Saturday-Sunday) are 'select,' the third day (Monday) is like September Book 2, and the final two days are the 'open' section. The sale has been naturally growing in popularity anyway, and 1998 sale graduates include top 2000 European three-year-old King's Best, and the record filly Melikah, a FF10 million yearling who has placed in two Oaks. Both are owned by the Maktoum family and associates, so it's a good bet they'll be at the table, ready and willing to take on the Magnier-Tabor team. I'll even tell you this year's saletopper, for nothing more than the price of a subscription to this newspaper. That will be hip number 39, a Diesis filly out of Alegretta, by Lombard. She's a half sister to King's Best and Arc winner Urban Sea, dam of Melikah. The family couldn't be hotter, and she's by a top sire, and one who Sheikh Mohammed, as it happens, has had a great deal of success with.

The overall sale leapt from FF101 million in gross in 1996 to FF160 million last year, then edged up another 10 percent, to FF176 million in 1999. The two select days last year saw 115 yearlings sell for a gross of FF109 million, and an average of just under FF950,000--about \$135,000 at current rates. I look for good gains at this sale, and also on the Monday, which has 180 catalogued this year (112 sold in '99).

Team Germany...

There have been plenty of big-race wins scored by German families and stallions this year, but skeptics like myself have wondered whether the overall standard of good German form is up to that of their top horses and sires. A couple of results in England last weekend provided positive indicators. Godolphin-owned Auenklang, by the top German sprint sire Big Shuffle (a son of Super Concorde, himself the other good sire by Seattle Slew's short-lived sire, Bold Reasoning), blitzed a representative field in a six-furlong Listed race at Newbury on Saturday, and a German-trained Rainbow Quest filly, from a German family, won a 12-furlong Listed race for fillies and mares at Newmarket.

ZZZZZ...

Sleeper Stallion of the Week Award goes to Emarati, a placed son of Danzig who is a half brother to the dams of Zilzal and Polish Precedent (also by Danzig), out of the Bold Lad (USA) mare Bold Example, a daughter of 'blue hen' Lady Be Good--also the family of Intikhab and Wavering Monarch, for example. Emarati has been around a fair while--his first foals were born in 1991--but has steadily held his own against much better company, and maybe just had his best ever weekend, in his best ever year. On Saturday, the unbeaten Emarati two-year-old colt Patsy's Double, stretched his string to three in the seven-furlong Donnington Castle conditions race, usually a good race. Another two-year-old colt, Threedezzz, ran third in the ultra-competitive five-furlong Weatherby's Super Sprint and the three-year-old colt Sunderland won a Group 3, 6 1/2-furlong sprint in Berlin--at the immediate expense of a Big Shuffle colt. That all reads quite well.

Squirtle Squirt's dam Lost the Code was a tough and speedy performer in her own right, winning 13 of 60 starts and \$180,496, with all of her victories coming in sprint events. She also has an interesting pedigree with the sisters Pocahontas and Cherokee Rose (Lost the Code's fourth dam) appearing 6x5x4. In addition, her dam's pedigree also gives Squirtle Squirt a third cross of Turn-To, and linebreeding to Never Bend and Tim Tam.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Lost Code also appears as broodmare sire of another weekend stakes winner, Cedar Knolls (f, 3, Broad Brush-Codetogo, by Lost Code), who took the Dearly Precious S. at Monmouth Park. Cedar Knolls has an unusual pedigree as she is inbred 2x4 to Ack Ack (sire of Broad Brush, broodmare sire of Lost Code). Interestingly, Broad Brush and Lost Code are bred on reverse Ack Ack/Ribot crosses, and Cedar Knolls also has four crosses of Ack Ack's broodmare sire Turn-To.

It is rare that one finds a cross as ubiquitous as the Sadler's Wells/Never Bend combination (which gives linebreeding to the excellent mare, Lalun, dam of both Never Bend and of Sadler's Wells' maternal grandsire, Bold Reason). The latest example to capture a major race is Craftsmanship (Jpn) (h, 5, French Glory {Ire}--Working Girl {Jpn}, by Pas de Seul {GB}). He is by the GI Rothmans International victor French Glory, a son of Sadler's Wells, out of a mare by a grandson of Never Bend.

We had another example of the successful combination of genetic relatives by Northern Dancer when Three Wonders (c, 3, Storm Cat--Wood of Binn, by Woodman) captured the Gill Kent Breeders' Cup S. at the weekend. Three Wonders has his Northern Dancer strains via Storm Cat's sire Storm Bird and the very similarly bred The Minstrel, who appears as sire of Peterhof, who in turn is responsible for Three Wonders' second dam. While on the subject of this pedigree, we can also note that Woodman looks as if he could be turning into a useful broodmare sire, which is no surprise given his pedigree.

The weekend provided another example of a notable inbreeding or pedigree pattern in the first stakes winner for a sire. This time it was Queen Carson (f, 2, Lord Carson--Kind Reception, by Secretariat), who became the first stakes winner for freshman sire Lord Carson by winning the Colleen S. at Monmouth. Queen Carson has Somethingroyal 5x3 through the half brothers Sir Gaylord and Secretariat. This method of duplicating Somethingroyal is certainly proving to be a highly successful one, as it is found within the first five generations of nearly 70 unrestricted stakes winners.

HANDLE UP AT HOLLYWOOD PARK A late-season surge in business, sparked by the GI Sempra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup, propelled Hollywood Park to increases in on-track and combined handle for the 65-day spring-summer meeting. On-track attendance, however, slipped 2.5 percent from 1999's 9,820 to 9,572. On-track handle increased 4.9 percent to \$2,223,064, up from 1999's \$2,118,823. Combined handle was up 5.9 percent to a record \$10,367,527 from \$9,794,395. Beginning with Gold Cup day, which drew 29,151 fans and a record handle of \$18.8 million, combined handle was up on 11 of the last 12 days of the meet and attendance grew. "I believe we saw people squeezing in one or two more visits late in the meeting," track president Rick Baedeker said. "The logical conclusion is they had a good experience here earlier in the season and wanted to return." Victor Espinoza, who rode 24-1 outsider Early Pioneer to victory in the Gold Cup, captured his first major riding title. The 28-year-old native of Mexico City rode 62 winners, 11 more than runner-up Corey Nakatani. Bobby Frankel saddled two winners on closing day to win his 11th Hollywood Park title with 23 winners.

Siberian Summer On the Move:

Grade I winner **Siberian Summer** (Siberian Express) has been moved to Rick Taylor's new Special T Thoroughbred Farm in Temecula, California. The gray horse has served full books of mares in each of his three seasons at stud at Valley Creek Farm in Valley Center, California. His first foals are yearlings this year. He is by the same sire as California sensation In Excess (Ire). "Siberian Summer has a sire's pedigree, is a Grade I stakes winner at Santa Anita, and he has the looks and temperament of a very good sire," said Taylor. OVERSEAS INTEREST IN MELBOURNE CUP

Racing Victoria general manager Greg Nichols is on his annual whistle-stop overseas tour to promote the spring carnival and he believes as many as 40 overseas-trained horses may be entered for the major cups and Cox Plate. Entries for the Caulfield and Melbourne cups and Cox Plate close on August 1 and Nichols expects horses from six or seven countries to be nominated. "There has been enormous interest once again and we're expecting the entries to be at least that of last year from as many countries," Nichols said. Nichols said he would get a better idea of which of the Godolphin horses would be making the trip. "I am meeting with the Godolphin group on Wednesday and although they have said they will certainly be sending horses again, we're unsure as to which to expect." It was hoped Kayf Tara, who was injured a week before the Melbourne Cup last year, when he was hot favorite, would return, but it is more likely the horse will miss Australia and instead be aimed at the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in Paris in October.

SLEEPING ON THE JOB

A nap between races cost apprentice jockey Craig Franklin a win and a five-meeting suspension at Saturday's New Plymouth race meeting. Franklin decided to take a short nap after riding in the day's sixth race as it was nearly 2 1/2 hours to his next ride in race nine. The long break was due a gap of one hour 15 minutes between races seven and eight so patrons could take in most of the All Blacks-Springboks rugby test. 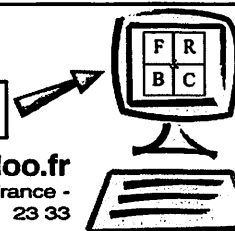

WATERHOUSE KNOCK BACK

A bid by former bookmaker Rob Waterhouse to have restrictions that prevent him from being relicensed on racetracks lifted was dismissed unanimously by the six-member NSW Thoroughbred Racing Board during a meeting on Monday, according to the Sydney *Morning-Herald*. Waterhouse, who is married to leading trainer Gai Waterhouse, was warned off for his part in the Fine Cotton ring-in substitution, which took place at Eagle Farm in 1984. Waterhouse had the ban lifted by the former 10-man TRB board in September 1998. In lifting the warning imposed by the Australian Jockey Club, the TRB put conditions on Waterhouse returning to the track which effectively stopped him from applying for a licence under the Australian rules of racing. Earlier this year, Waterhouse made a similar request to the governing body of the State's greyhound industry, which is still being dealt with at board level.
