‘MOVER’ HANGS ON FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT

Gold Mover (Gold Fever) set sail from the rail, then withstood a strong late rally from New York bred maiden Seeking It All (A.P. Indy) to win the GII Schuylerville on opening day at Saratoga. A winner at first asking at Keeneland in April, the homebred beat the boys in the GIII Kentucky Breeders’ Cup in her next start and remained undefeated with a 2 3/4-length success in GIII Debutante S. at Churchill July 8 in her most recent effort. Caught Out (Smart Strike) ducked out at the start and bumped Miss Doolittle (Storm Cat) who in turn bumped Seeking It All, while Gold Mover set the pace along the inside. With the favorite on a clear lead, her rivals were having much more eventful trips behind her. Seeking It All, making only her second career start, was bumped again by Caught Out after angling out in upper stretch, while an eager Miss Doolittle had nowhere to run until the head of the stretch. Gold Mover was still some 2 1/2 lengths clear at the furlong marker and just held the furious rally of the New York bred for the win. Undefeated With Ability (A.P. Indy), also trained by Mark Hennig, was scratched due to a cough. The conditioner indicated that if she rebounds, she will be pointed for the GII Sorority at Monmouth Park Aug. 12. The winner could return in the GI Spinaway here Sept. 1.

The Michael Tabor colorbearer worked a bullet six furlongs at Belmont July 14 in 1:12. City Zip (Carson City) closed strongly late in a third-place finish in the Flash and rebounded to win the July 3 GIII Tremont by 2 3/4 lengths over The Goo (Meadowlake). The Goo won his Keeneland debut for Carl Deville. In two starts for trainer Nick Zito, the colt ran second in both the Flash and the Tremont.

Behrens Works Towards Whitney:

Behrens (Pleasant Colony), runner-up to Lemon Drop Kid in the GII Suburban H. July 4, worked five furlongs yesterday morning in 1:00 over the Oklahoma training track as the six-year-old eyes his next start in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 6. "He went pretty good this morning," trainer H. James Bond said. "He'll work once more before the race." The dark bay, second to Victory Gallop in last year's Whitney, will have a new jockey aloft for the first time in over two years. Jerry Bailey, who teamed with Behrens to be fifth in the 1998 Dubai World Cup, will take over riding duties from Eclipse Award-winning jockey Jorge Chavez.

On the Saratoga Worktab:

Brave Quest (Miswaki), handed his first career loss when second in the GII Ohio Derby, worked five furlongs over the main track in 1:01 and could make his next start in the GII Jim Dandy Aug. 5, according to trainer John Ward. "He couldn't get a hold of the track in Ohio and he lacked experience," Ward said. GII Louisiana Derby hero Mighty (Lord at War {Arg}), unraced since a seventh-place finish in the GI Blue Grass in April, breezed four furlongs in :50 1/5 over the training track yesterday morning. Trainer Frank Brothers indicated that he has not outlined a plan for the dark bay, but could be ready for a fall campaign.

Cassidys To Host Saratoga Charity Benefit:

KidsCharities.org, in conjunction with the New York Racing Association, will sponsor a "Family Day at The Races" on Saturday, August 12, at Saratoga Race Course. Some of the events will include the "At the Rail Pavilion", as well as the "Kids Tent" near the Big Red Spring in the paddock. The tent will feature an exhibition from the Albany River Rats hockey club and parents will have the opportunity to have their children fingerprinted at a booth sponsored by the New York State Troopers. Entertainer David Cassidy, whose wife Sue is the founder of KidsCharities.org, will host the festivities. The event will benefit the Albany Medical Center Children's Cancer Program, Yale University School of Pediatric Medicine, Belmont Child Care Association, Northeast Parent and Child Society and Sarah Ferguson's charity Chances for Children.

Duke Of Green closed out a short, but successful European campaign with a third in the Listed Premio del Dado in Milan last Oct. 3. Shipped to the West Coast, the bay made an impressive American debut when second by a length in the May 6 Gill Will Rogers H. at Hollywood Park and was a troubled runner up in the Gill Cinema H. in his last start June 10. Breaking from the 10 hole, the favorite raced three deep to the far turn while never far from the front, forged to a short lead in upper stretch and held gamely for his first stakes success. "He normally doesn't lay that close to the pace," commented winning trainer Ron McAnally, "but today he had to in order to get over and get position." The conditioner earmarked the Aug. 19 Gill LaJolla H. as a possible next step for the winner.

Never out of the top three in his seven previous starts, Stormy Jack had made two starts as a sophomore, both on the turf. An even third in his turf bow in a Hollywood sprint event June 25, the Cal-bred tried a route of ground on the grass for the first time and responded with a second-place finish in the California Sire S. at Hollypark July 9 in his most recent effort. Shedding the blinkers for this effort, the dark bay was settled towards the rear of the well-bunched pack behind a moderate pace set by Buster B Bimbo. Three deep into the final bend, jockey Victor Espinoza set Stormy Jack down for the drive and he closed determinedly to nip the front runner in the final jumps. Jekyll and Hyde, in traffic early, closed well up the rail for the show, while favored Whyome (Owington {GB}), boxed in at midstretch, found room late and finished an unlucky fourth. "We tried something different today. We asked him to relax," Espinoza commented. "It worked great. When I asked him to fire, he fired. He ran good."

WRITERS UP

TO THE VICTOR GO THE SPOILS

It hasn't been hard to make book on who would win any of the major-meet riding titles at Santa Anita and Hollywood Park over the last 30 years. We're talking about the two lengthy meets at the Southern California tracks each year, not their shorter meets or the seven-week season at Del Mar.

At Santa Anita and Hollywood, then, since 1970, Laffit Pincay Jr. has topped the standings 25 times, taking almost 41 percent of the 61 titles. Chris McCarron, Gary Stevens, Alex Solis and Kent Desormeaux have combined for another 26 titles. That leaves 10 scattered titles for Sandy Hawley, Corey Nakatani, Darrel McHargue, Eddie Delahoussaye, Pat Valenzuela and David Flores.

But Victor Espinoza has crashed this exclusive club. Espinoza captured the Hollywood Spring/Summer title with 62 winners, besting Nakatani by 11.

It would be mistaken to call Espinoza the clichéd "overnight sensation," because the Mexico City native, who's 28, has been riding in Southern California since 1996. But his only two titles since his arrival came at the Los Angeles County Fair meet at Pomona, when most of the top jockeys take a breather.

Combined with Espinoza's Hollywood title is his emergence as a top stakes rider. He won six stakes at the meet, including the \$1 million Semptra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup with Early Pioneer, the longest shot on the board at 24-1.

Vladimir Cerin, Early Pioneer's trainer, replaced Matt Garcia, who had done well with the horse, because he liked the way Espinoza had been riding.

"When Victor was riding in Northern California, I never paid much attention to him," Cerin said. "I thought he was just an ordinary rider.

"Then when he came down here, I looked at him as a transplant, a guy who probably should have stayed where he was. But now he's turned into a terrific rider. He's very athletic, and he's an excellent judge of pace. He's very good at seeing holes and then moving a horse through."

One of 12 children, Espinoza has brothers who were in racing--one a quarterhorse trainer and another, Jose, has gone on to ride in New York--but out of high school he never considered riding, working for a Mexico City bus company at one point.

He drifted back to the quarterhorses and then, deciding that Thoroughbreds were "more exciting," took riding lessons at a farm in Mexico.

Espinoza won 79 races in four months in Mexico City and, after become the leading apprentice at the San Francisco-area tracks in 1993-94, he continued riding there until he tried a fling in Kentucky in 1996.

It was cold in the bluegrass then, there were few mounts and Espinoza knew he had to get out. After three weeks, he called Vince DeGregory, a veteran Southern California agent who had worked six years for Pincay, among other top riders, and asked about coming back to the West Coast.

"He was just walking around back there," DeGregory said. "Then he came out here and rode the hell out of the bullring (in Pomona). He was in with riders like (David) Flores and (Martin) Pedroza, and he held his own. The big outfits weren't there, but Mel Stute was --he was the leading trainer--and his barn and others began to give Victor a lot of business."

Espinoza has moved on to another high-powered agent, Tony Matos, but DeGregory still supports him.

"The thing I like about the kid is that while he works hard, he still has a happy-go-lucky attitude," DeGregory said. "He never gets mad at anybody."

Espinoza, in honor of the Gold Cup, dyed his hair gold several days before he rode Early Pioneer to victory. Later on the card, he also won the \$300,000 Triple Bend Breeders' Cup H. with Elaborate.

"I never had a day like that," Espinoza said. "After Santa Anita this year, where I finished strong, I said I was capable of winning more. I knew being with (Matos), I had one of the best in the business. Then when you get picked to ride a horse like Early Pioneer, it helps your confidence. I don't necessarily want to be the best, but I'd like to get near the top. I don't want to be famous, but I'd like to win as much as I can."

Through July 24, Espinoza ranked ninth nationally with \$6.2 million in purses.

"Victor's very talented and he's at the top of his form right now," Matos said. "He's always been a good rider, but he never got the opportunity with the bigger stables."

Espinoza is getting his chance now, but it's not all smooth sailing.

"It's not easy being a jockey," he said. "It's hard physically, and it's very hard mentally. The jockeys here (in Southern California) are the best--many of them are near the top (nationally), but I looked at a jockey like Gary Stevens once and I said to myself, 'I can do the same thing.' If I ride hard, I can be like him."
