EIGHT SET FOR KING GEORGE

A field of eight will go postward in Saturday's G1 King George VII & Queen Elizabeth II Diamond S. at Ascot. Trainer Mark Johnston's Fruits Of Love (Hansel), currently at 10-1, is reported on target for the race by his trainer despite an injury scare. The back-to-back winner of the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot injured his hock while swimming at the weekend, but he has recovered sufficiently to make the race. "We've been out exercising this morning, and we are much happier with him," Johnston said. "The swelling has gone down and there is a bit of heat in the leg but he seems a lot better in himself. I am still worried because I would hate to see him beaten because of such a minor defect." Jockey John Reid, who would have partnered the injured Kayf Tara (see story p. 2), has been switched to Fantastic Light (Rahy), Godolphin's sole representative. The colt is quoted at 10-1 by Corals. Although Henry Cecil's Shiva (Jpn) (Hector Protector), a 9-1 chance with the firm, has been left in the race, jockey Richard Quinn was pessimistic about the permanently dry conditions. "It's disappointing because every big meeting this year has been the same story--fast ground," Quinn said. "She really excels in the soft ground, but she hasn't had those conditions since she impressively won the [G3] Brigadier Gerard S. [Sandown May 30]. Last time in the [G1] Eclipse S., it was too dry, and she was interfered with, which was disappointing." Gerard Butler's Compton Ace (GB) (Pharly (Fr)) and Richard Hannon's Gold Academy (Ire) (Royal Academy) were withdrawn yesterday, while Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) remains the solid favourite at 7-4 on for his first English start.

City Zip (Carson City) rallied past 1-2 favorite Yonaguska (Cherokee Run) in the stretch of yesterday's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga to collect his second straight graded stakes victory. The chestnut colt had finished second behind Gold Mover, who took the GII Schuylerville Wednesday, in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. at Churchill before shipping to New York to the barn of new trainer Linda Rice. Third behind Yonaguska in the Flash S. June 9, he flashed his speed when winning the GIII Tremont July 3 over The Goo (Meadowlake) and Scorpion (Seattle Slew). Breaking from the rail here, he secured a good spot as Dancing Missile (Canaveral) ripped off an opening quarter in :21. As Yonaguska seized command at the top of the stretch, City Zip came off the rail and motored past the favorite, opening up in the final sixteenth. Scorpion, well back early, closed well for the show spot. "Having the rail forced me to use him on the pace early," jockey Jose Santos said of the winner. "Moving toward the far turn, I decided to give him a little break and took back. When I sent him again at the quarter pole, he started flying and I knew at the three-sixteenths pole that we would win it." The first two will likely meet again in the Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S.

KAYF TARA RETIRED Leading stayer Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) has been retired by Godolphin after a recurrence of the suspensory ligament injury that ruled him out of last year's Melbourne Cup. He had been expected to line up in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot tomorrow, but the injury has meant an end to his career. Simon Crisford said yesterday, "He has been a wonderful flag-bearer for Godolphin and proved himself one of the great stayers. He showed great consistency and versatility during his career. His class meant he won two G1 Ascot Gold Cups over a trip that was not ideal."

DEMURO TO RIDE IN STATES Leading Italian jockey Mirco Demuro will beging riding at Calder Race Course in Miami, Florida, beginning next Friday, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The 21-year-old spent time on the grounds this past week, but is returning to France for the mount on **Rolly Polly (Ire)** (Mukaddamah) in the G2 Prix Robert Papin tomorrow. Plans call for Demuro to spend about one month in the U.S., before returning to Italy when racing starts back up in September.

OCEANPORT RETAINS GRADED STATUS After deciding at a July 21 meeting to strip the off-the-turf Oceanport H. of its graded status, the American Graded Stakes Committee Wednesday reversed that decision and has reinstated the Grade III status of the race. The race, run July 15 at Monmouth Park, was won by North East Bound.



Working over the Oklahoma turf course, GIII Poker H. victor, Affirmed Success (Affirmed) breezed four furlongs in :48 4/5 yesterday morning. Debuting on the turf in the Poker, the Albert Fried Jr. gelding has his sights set on the \$1 million Atto Mile (Sept. 10) at Woodbine and later the Breeders' Cup Mile (Nov. 4). In the mean time, where and if he races before then is undetermined. "Today's work was super," trainer Richard Schosberg said. Cat Thief (Storm Cat), winner of the 1999 Breeders' Cup Classic, clocked in at 1:28 2/5 for seven furlongs this morning. Jockey Tim Doocy became only the 37th rider in history to eclipse the 4,000-win mark when he piloted Seaside Hero to victory in yesterday's third race at Arlington International. NTRA Forms Regulation Task Force:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has formed a Task Force on Regulation. The committee will be chaired by Thoroughbred owner and breeder Robert McNair. The task force will study the impact of economic regulation including taxation on the horse racing industry and will identify areas for reduction or improvement of such regulation. Also on the task force will be Doug Donn, chairman of Gulfstream Park, Mark Fleder, director of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, Rick Hiles, president of the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, Robert Kaminski, chairman of Lone Star Park, F. Jack Liebau, president of Bay Meadows, Scot Mordell, CEO of Arlington International and John van de Kamp, president of the Thoroughbred Owners of California. The Horserace Betting Levy Board has confirmed that the decision to allow rails bookmakers at British race-courses to have boards facing into Members' Enclosures will be implemented on January 1, 2001. Eoghan J O'Neill is no stranger to headlines, despite the fact that he has only trained in his own right this year. O'Neill made the news afer the bizarre series of events in February concerning the Ballydoyle horse Aristotle (Ire). Businessman Jonathan Charles claimed to have passed into his hands for £8 million, and said he would be sending the colt to the young trainer. All untrue, of course, but the experience, which would rightfully have set back any trainer starting out, has left no scars on the Irishman, who trains at Machell Place in Newmarket. Now, O'Neill has been making the headlines himself, and this time its the right stuff.

Machell Place is a charming and traditional establishment set back from the Old Station Road by the historic Clock Tower, and for O'Neill it is home. It is a long way from Dublin, where he was born, and what it represents is equally distant from the direction that his studies would have taken him. Having a Masters in Business Studies does come in handy, however, and his approach is very much grounded in hard reality.

"I want to offer a proper quality service," he said.
"Having a stable full of racehorses is like having a class full of schoolkids, and the owners are parents. We have a parent-teacher meeting every week. The quality of service is very important. I'm not in it for the honour and the glory, and I don't put horses where they don't fit. This is my living."

O'Neill has experience in all kinds of enterprise, too. From riding out at Robert Collet's during his studies to six months at Belmont Park as a freelance exercise rider, he has the knowledge of the animal from close-quarters. Add to that a spell at Sir Mark Prescott's Heath House Stables and some time at John Gosden's Stanley House operation in the last decade and there is a formula for success appearing.

"I got a kick out of riding horses, and a lot of money, too, and it beat stacking shelves, like a lot of students do in their holidays," O'Neill said. "The time with Sir Mark was tough, but fair. It was a real great place to learn. His strength is the ability to measure a horse's ability and put it in the right place. Going to John Gosden's was a totally different experience, as it's a bigger operation, with real blue-bloods, and it's nice to see numbers being trained--when you have numbers you have problems."

There are only a handful of horses trained at Machell Place at the moment, but that could change. Things like stakes success tend to do that. O'Neill earned his first stakes success in Germany last Sunday when Yorba Linda (Ire), a five-year-old mare who was cast as a sprinter by Jim Bolger in her earlier days, stormed up the straight at Dusseldorf, over a distance just short of a mile, to claim the Listed Preis der WGZ Beteiligungsgesellschaft. She is also in foal to Dr Fong (USA). O'Neill says of his early success, "It is quite an achievement to train a Listed winner in your first season, and I just want to train nice horses for nice people, keep trying and getting results somewhere."

One beneficiary of O'Neill's talent is John Martin, owner of the likes of Jim And Tonic (Fr) and Lady Of Chad (Ire). He has two juveniles in training here, and according to their handler, they are "nice horses which will win races."

It's simple. This is how it works. "It's like going to a certain restaurant," O'Neill said. "If you like the food you are not all that keen to change. It'll be the same here if I'm successful. All you can ask is that you get a chance."
