MILLIE MAKES THE GRADE

Millie's Quest (Quest for Fame {GB}) is a clear path for her late run. The dark bay filly was stopped cold while making her move in the June 18 GIII Sands Point S. at Belmont Park, but angled to the outside for running room in the \$116,800 GIII Lake George S. at Saratoga yesterday afternoon and found not a straw in her path, rallying to win by a length over Shopping for Love (Not For Love). "I got in good position around the backside and just bided my time until the horses in front of me got tired," jockey John Velazquez said. "The horse in front of me was running the best, so I followed her out and ran her down in time. My horse ran super." Second in two of three starts while racing in France for trainer François Doumen, Millie's Quest closed despite a rough trip to break her maiden in her U.S. bow at Hollywood last December, but was off slowly in the Dec. 26 Blue Norther S. at Santa Anita and finished fifth. After a fourmonth break, she raced wide and ended up fourth in the Apr. 28 GIII Senorita S. at Hollywood, then moved up a spot to get third last time before breaking through with her first stakes win over a course labeled soft. "She got the footing that she loves today," said Jose Cuevas, assistant to trainer Bobby Frankel. "She's got an explosive stretch kick once she gets clear." The even-money favorite Solvig (Caerleon), coming off back-to-back graded wins, showed little and finished last.

Dansili was runner-up to Kalanisi (Ire) in the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 20, and the winner went on to be beaten a head next time by Giants Causeway in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown July 8. Aljabr is quoted at 7-2 in his bid to become the first horse to win this race twice, having held off Docksider in a thrilling contest last year. John Gosden's Valentino, who was narrowly beaten by Giant's Causeway in the G1 St James' Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 20 last time, is 5-1 to turn the tables.

As for his three-year-old, Zito said, "He's going to be better than he was in the Dwyer. I'm really excited about him."

While it would never have been fair to describe Seeking The Gold as the poor man's Forty Niner, there was a time early in their stallion careers when Seeking The Gold lived in the shadow cast by his stud companion.

When these members of Mr. Prospector's outstanding 1985 crop arrived at Claiborne, each brought an outstanding race record and impressive bloodlines. Even so, Forty Niner's services were priced at \$60,000 during his early years at stud, rising to \$70,000 in 1993, whereas Seeking The Gold's fee stood at "only" \$40,000 for his first three years before falling to \$30,000 in 1993.

The differences in their fees no doubt reflected the fact that Forty Niner had been a champion at two, whereas Seeking The Gold won a maiden on his single juvenile start. The Blood-Horse handicappers considered Forty Niner marginally the better of the two in their sophomore year, when Seeking The Gold failed by just a nose to beat him in both the Travers and Haskell Invitational H. However, a two-race four-year-old campaign had probably knocked a little of the gilt off Seeking The Gold by the time he stood his first season in 1990, a year after his arch rival.

Ten years later, I have little doubt about which is the better stallion. Even though Forty Niner headed America's domestic list in 1996, a year after his sale to Japan, I prefer Seeking The Gold. My preference is based on his ability to sire the occasional crackerjack, such as Dubai Millennium and Flanders.

Perhaps Forty Niner would also have sired an exceptional champion or two had he not been exported, but his Grade I winners have fallen a little short of that description so far. I also respect Seeking The Gold's ability to sire top performers both on dirt and turf.

The quality of Seeking The Gold's mares surely rose after he secured the freshman sire title of 1993 and was then represented by the 1994 Eclipse Award winners Heavenly Prize and Flanders. This is being reflected in the strength in depth of his graded-stakes performers over the last few years.

Seeking The Gold's ability was in evidence when Dream Supreme won Saturday's GI Test S. and another daughter, Enthused, won the G3 Princess Margaret S. in the style of a champion. This pair improved Seeking The Gold's tally of 2000 graded-stakes winners to a magnificent nine, completed by Dubai Millennium, Cash Run, Duality, Sahara Gold, Welcome Surprise, Country Hideaway and the Japanese filly Gold Tiara. He also has the smart Canadian filly Catch The Ring.

Seeking The Gold certainly received plenty of assistance in producing several of these winners. Cash Run, Dream Supreme, Enthused and Sahara Gold are all out of Grade I winners, while Dubai Millennium is out of a Group 2 winner and Welcome Surprise is out of a Broodmare of the Year.

Dream Supreme's dam, Spinning Round, was an admirably tough graded winner at two, three and four. As three of her major wins came over seven furlongs, her daughter's speed is no surprise.

These winners also represent an interesting range of inbreeding patterns. Country Hideaway is inbred 2x4 to Mr. Prospector, Welcome Surprise 3x3 to Buckpasser, Duality 4x4 to Nashua and Cash Run 4x4 to Sequence, the second dam of Mr. Prospector. Several others are out of mares by Northern Dancer line stallions, with Dubai Millennium and Dream Supreme being out of mares by Northern Dancer's small sons Shareef Dancer and Dixieland Band.

Northern Dancer also sired the second dam of Enthused, who follows Seeking The Pearl, Cape Town and Mutakddim as the fourth stakes winner sired by Seeking The Gold from daughters of Seattle Slew.

Enthused's dam, Magic of Life, cost a record \$2,500,000 as a weanling at the Newstead dispersal in 1985, when her dam Larida made \$4,000,000 and her second dam Kittiwake \$3,800,000, so the filly has every right to be top class.

CUMMINGS SLAMS RACING OFFICIALS

In one of his most robust attacks on racing administrators yet, Bart Cummings said "the last thing considered is the welfare of the horse as racing is run by the TAB." The trainer added, "Facilities for patrons may be world standard, but the conditions under which the horses must race and train now leaves a lot to be desired. Inconsistent, patchy surfaces, which throws the horse out of stride, tend to cause the Thoroughbred to lose confidence and you find a trend appearing in races of less horses swooping from the rear of the field, so often a popular race plan of the past. The tracks are so over-used the horses can't get a grip to swoop, contributing to the common cry today of leader-bias. Cummings pointed to the success of Moonee Valley which built an all-weather turf course and has been able to run meetings that ordinarily would have been cancelled. Cummings is also dismayed by a marketing push by clubs such as the Australian Jockey Club (AJC) that focuses on off-track entertainment such as bands. "Champions bring people--not gimmicks and circuses and dancing girls, and club administrators need to realise that," he said.
