SECOND SUSSEX SUCCESS FOR ALJABR?

The G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot always offers a vital clue to Goodwood's G1 Champagne Lanson Sussex S. Among the many horses to parlay a prominent placing at Ascot into success at Goodwood is Aljabr (Storm Cat), who will seek his second straight win in the race today. Last year, the colt ended a fouryear domination of the Sussex by older horses when he held off Docksider in a thrilling tussle. He had previously been second at Royal Ascot, a position which Valentino (GB) (Nureyev) filled in the race June 20 of this year. Valentino appeared on his way to victory at Ascot with 100 yards to race, but was collared by the extremely tough Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). The runner-up went to Chantilly last Tuesday for the G3 Prix Daphnis, but was withdrawn due to the ever-softening ground. The conditions at Goodwood are similar to the ones he saw at Ascot. Since Ascot, Giant's Causeway went on to win the July 8 G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown over two furlongs further, and the fact that he had a hard race there, combined with a drop back in trip, may count against him here. Another horse who tackled the St James' Palace S. was third-placed Medicean (GB) (Machiavellian), who has since been unplaced against handicappers in the John Smiths Cup at York, but he was badly drawn that day, and he will be suited by the fast conditions here. Of the older brigade, Royal Ascot's G2 Queen Anne S. runner-up, Dansili (Danehill) will ship from France for Andre Fabre. Kalanisi (Ire), who beat him that day (June 20), has since boosted that form when running Giant's Causeway to a head in the Coral-Eclipse S., so he must be respected.

A TIP OF THE CAP

The G3 Peugeot Gordon S. at Goodwood is traditionally seen as a trial for the G1 Doncaster St Leger and yesterday's last-gasp winner Millenary (GB) (Rainbow Quest) looks certain to head for the world's oldest Classic when it is renewed Sept. 9. After breaking his maiden at Newbury in mid-April, Millenary stepped up to Group class to capture the May 9 G3 Chester Vase. Shipped to France for the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 4, he could manage only an eighth-place finish behind fellow English challenger Holding Court (GB). Settled at the back of the field as Give the Slip (GB) (Slip Anchor (GB)) set a good pace. Millenary was still last as the field entered the long downhill straight. Although quickening well at the half-mile mark, he looked to have no chance of playing a part in the finish when well-fancied Air Marshall (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) came to take the lead from Give the Slip a furlong and a half out. Air Marshall looked set for victory, but jockey Richard Quinn conjured a great finish out of Millenary, who got up on the line to win by a whisker. It was the 145th Goodwood victory for trainer John Dunlop, who said, "Millenary's a nice type of horse and I'm very pleased with him. He had a good break after the French Derby and he needed every yard here today. He might run in the [G2] Great Voltigeur S. at York [Aug. 22] or go for a trial over the Leger trip of a mile and three-quarters. He stays very well."

When Eastern Purple and Cassandra Go ran fifth and sixth respectively in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 20, the latter was receiving three pounds in weight and was beaten a head by her rival. On this occasion, the filly was receiving eight pounds and reversed the form by a whisker. After the Ascot race, the pair took rather contrasting routes. Eastern Purple visiting the vet to be gelded, while Cassandra Go was runner-up in the Listed Stanley Racing Summer S. at York July 14. They ran in contrasting fashions here. Cassandra Go set the early pace, while Eastern Purple raced well in rear. Favored Rudi's Pet, last year's winner, made a tardy start, but was rushed to the front, overhauling Cassandra Go after only an eighth of a mile. Those forcing tactics may have cost the favourite the race as he was caught in the final strides by both Cassandra Go and Eastern Purple, who produced a dramatic finish, with the outcome appearing to initially favor the gelding until the photo-finish showed that Cassandra Go had won her first group event. Her owner Trevor Stewart said, "We were hopeful before the race because she's been running well all year, showing a lot of pace. She had everything in her favour, but we also needed some luck, Irish luck." Winning rider Michael Roberts admitted that he thought Eastern Purple had gained the day. "It was heads up and heads down and I thought the other horse had won. But this filly is very brave and really stuck her head out on the line," he said.

WHITNEY H.-GI, \$750,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m Overseas warrior Running Stag (Cozzene) returned Saturday morning for another tilt at American runners in Sunday's GI Whitney H. The six-year-old, winner of the GII MassCap at Suffolk June 3, tired to sixth behind Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo) in the GII Brooklyn H. June 11. "The heat got him that day," commented trainer Phil Mitchell. "The short rest, combined with the sudden, rapid rise in temperature, didn't help him. I think that [the timing] was a mistake." Running Stag will not be heading back to his English base, but rather will be campaigned in the U.S. for the rest of the season. "He's here for the rest of the year," Mitchell said. "The Arlington Million [Aug. 19] is next for him." Others tabbed for the Whitney are Behrens (Pleasant Colony), Cat Thief (Storm Cat), David (Mt. Livermore), Golden Missile (A.P. Indy) and Lemon Drop Kid.

SHEIKH MOHAMMED DUCKS MONTJEU

It wasn't 10 minutes after Montjeu annihilated Fantastic Light and Daliapour (winner of both his starts this year, including the G1 Coronation Cup) that word began to filter through that Dubai Millennium and Montjeu probably would not meet at 10 furlongs in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown on Sept. 9. It seems Godolphin chose this moment to announce that Dubai Millennium's program leading up to the Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs will consist of two races over a mile, the Jacques le Marois at Deauville on Aug. 13 and the Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in late September--both races which he already won last year, as a three-vear-old.

Even if the decision to take Dubai Millennium back to a mile had been made some time back, and it was just an unfortunate piece of timing that it came to light on Saturday, it seems to me an extraordinary decision, and I hope Sheikh Mohammed, who has proven time and again that he is a great sportsman who relishes competition, will consider reversing it. I say extraordinary for two reasons. One, because the conditions of the race would appear to favor Dubai Millennium, and two, because these two horses are so far superior to their competition that a meeting between them on neutral ground would qualify as the Race of the Century. And it's only the century's first year!

Delightful Distance...

I concede that the Irish Champion S. is not the ultimate goal for each horse. It's a Group 1 prep race. Dubai Millennium, unbeaten in two starts this year at 10 furlongs, in both cases annihilating Group 1 fields, would use this on the way to the Breeders' Cup Classic, where Sheikh Mohammed expects him to confirm his Dubai World Cup form and prove himself a champion at 10 furlongs on both grass and dirt. Montjeu would use the race--John Hammond clearly likes 10-furlong races in Ireland as serious prep races--as a springboard to trying to win consecutive Arcs. And no good anybody

saying they don't want their champion to have a hard race, and bottom them, before their 'ultimate objective'; there are only three weeks between the Irish Champion S. and the Arc, while there are eight weeks between the Leopardstown race and Churchill Downs.

So on two counts, best distance (so far this year, anyway) and spacing of races, conditions in Ireland would favor Dubai Millennium. Yet it is John Hammond and Michael Tabor who are willing to run, and Sheikh Mohammed who is not. Bad call.

The Arab Influence...

Let me make one thing as clear as crystal. I have been a consistent admirer, and advocate, of the Arab influence in international racing and breeding during the nearly two decades they have been involved, and that I have been observing and reporting on this sport, and their massive involvement in it. Unlike some, I think their influence has been almost entirely positive--though sometimes challenging, and uncomfortable. I believe the Maktoum family, and other Arab interests like Prince Khaled Abdullah, propped up European racing big-time during a very difficult period between 1985-95, and in fact probably were singlehandedly responsible for saving thousands of jobs, and creating thousands more.

With the birth of Godolphin five years or so ago, Sheikh Mohammed is pioneering a new era of international racing, which is now almost shaping into a major Asian/Southern Hemisphere racing circuit, including Australia, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, and Dubai World Cup day. Yes, it hurts established European trainers who understandably don't like developing horses only to lose them to Godolphin. Yes, it challenges the existing international racing structures and threatens the status quo and The Jockey Clubs. Good!

But for all the politics, all the economics, all the implications, when you come down to it, horse racing--like everything else--has an essence. The essence of horse racing is for two great champions to meet on the field of battle, and for one to emerge triumphant. The Godolphin party line after the King George seemed to be that Montjeu would be brushed aside like a fly, that he's not worth bothering with. Dubai Millennium The Untouchable has his program, and that's that. Cont. p. 5

Spain was highly tried at two, finishing behind champion two-year-old Chilukki when second in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. and third in the GI Oak Leaf S. She also took second in the Las Virgenes S. (G1) at the beginning of this season, but her resume lacked a stakes victory. This oversight was corrected on Saturday, when Spain captured the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks, in commanding style by nearly four lengths.

Spain, who passed through the Keeneland September Yearling Sales for only \$25,000 (although she is raced by her breeder, The Thoroughbred Corp.) is out of the stakes winning Royal and Regal mare, Drina. There is no black-type in the second dam, but the third dam Shujinsky is a sister to the graded stakes winning Nijinsky II colt, Manzotti, and the fifth dam, Sister Shu, is a sister to the outstanding mares Shuvee and Nalee.

Spain is one of three stakes winning fillies from the first Northern Hemisphere crop sired by champion three-year-old Thunder Gulch. It's interesting to note that *Vaguely Noble, who is responsible for Spain's broodmare sire, Regal and Royal, is also in the third generation of Thunder Gulch's other graded stakes winning daughter C'Est L'Amour. Vaguely Noble is a grandson of Her Majesty The Queen's excellent colt Aureole, and this may play an important part in the pedigrees of Spain and C'Est L'Amour. Aureole is a product of one of the most successful English nicks of the mid-20th century, that of Hyperion over mares by Donatello II. That same cross produced Sir Winston Churchill's formidable front-runner High Hat,

who appears in Thunder Gulch's pedigree through his son High Line (sire of Thunder Gulch's granddam Shoot a Line {GB}). Thus, Spain and C'Est L'Amour have the three-parts related High Hat and Aureole 5x5. This combination isn't seen very often in North America, but it has frequently worked well in Europe and Australia. The fact that the Aureole strain is coming in through Vaguely Noble is also noteworthy. Vaguely Noble is by a grandson of Hyperion out of a mare by Nearco, and through his maternal grandsire Storm Bird, Thunder Gulch has Nearctic, who is bred on a reverse Nearco/Hyperion cross.

Storm Bird is also part of another important combination in this pedigree, as Spain's third dam is by Storm Bird's close relative Nijinsky II. So Spain, who has Storm Bird/Nijinsky II 3x5, joins the growing club of stakes winners to have either Storm Bird/Nijinsky II or Storm Bird/The Minstrel.

With respect, sir, there are a whole lot of people who have seen just as many races as you have over the last 20 years who have their doubts about that point of view. Even among handicappers and ratings experts, there doesn't seem more than a pound or two between them. If your horse is so much better than Montjeu--and racing professionals and the racing public alike are clamoring for this match-up (it's not just us moaning journalists, you know)--then risk your great champion. Accept the challenge. Revise your program. Let your great champion pick up the gaunt-let. Run him against Montjeu. In Ireland. On September 9.

BARRETTS TOPPER RECOVERING Gotham City (Saint Ballado), a \$2-million purchase at Barretts March Sale, is recovering from a life-threatening bout with colitis, according to *Daily Racing Form*. RACECOURSES TO POOL MEDIA RIGHTS An agreement has been reached with Britain's 59 racecourses to combine their media rights with the British Horseracing Board's rights to pre-race information and fixture list as an alternative to the current levy system. It has been simultaneously announced that Arena Leisure group, which owns Wolverhampton. Southwell and Lingfield, as well as three other tracks, has offered to pay £178 million to acquire all interactive media rights for the racecourses for a period of 10 years. The offer, which excludes any type of terrestrial rights and the SIS service, comes on the heels of the demise of a Channel 4-sponsored proposal made to the "Super 12" tracks. That deal would have seen £225 million paid to those tracks, with £15 million to other racecourses. At least two other offers were discussed during a special meeting of the Racecourse Association Monday night in London, but the Arena proposal attracted the most attention. RCA Chairman Angus Chrichton-Miller told Jon Lees of Racing Post, "The offer was of sufficient interest and the members wished us to pursue the offer and seek to modify and change it where it would be advantageous to racecourses and to see a deal concluded within the timescale set by Arena." Member racecourses have 14 days to respond to the RCA while a final decision whether to accept the offer must be reached by September 30. The offer is not conditional upon the agreement of each of the 59 racecourse, Arena Chief Executive Graham Parr told Racing Post. "Of course that would be the ideal," Parr said of unanimous support. "But we are prepared to go with courses which represent 80 percent of official gaming revenue and 75 percent of terrestrially televised fixtures." RCA Chairman Chrichton-Miller added that efforts will be made for his organization to work with Arena and SIS to assure the short-term future of the Racing Channel, which faces a November 4 shutdown date.

HEIGHT OF FASHION DIES Height of Fashion (Fr) (Bustino {GB}), the dam of English Guineas and Derby winner Nashwan (USA) (Blushing Groom {Fr}), died at Shadwell Stud in Kentucky. The mare was 21 years old. Herself a three-time winner in group company, Height of Fashion was the champion two-year-old filly of 1981, and was sold for a reported £1.5 million in the midst of her three-year-old season. Bred her first two seasons at stud to Northern Dancer, she produced GSW Alwasmi (USA) and MGSW Unfuwain (USA). As her third foal, Nashwan also won the G1 Coral Eclipse S. and G1 King George VII and Queen Elizabeth II Diamond S. in his three-year-old season en route to being named threeyear-old champion in England and France. Now 14 years old, Nashwan is the sire of four champions, including Swain (Ire), Wandesta (GB), One So Wonderful (GB) and Myself (GB) and stands at Shadwell Stud in Thetford, England. Height of Fashion has a three-year-old of 2000 by Riverman (USA), a two-year-old by Gulch (USA) and was in foal to A.P. Indy (USA) at the time of her death. Richard Lancaster, stud manager for the Shadwell Estate Company, told Racing Post, "The very fact that she produced Sheikh Hamdan's first homebred Derby winner, obviously set her apart and I think her legacy will be seen throughout Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell operation for many years to come."

FRIDAY RETURN FOR DETTORI It has been confirmed that jockey Frankie Dettori, injured in a plane crash at Newmarket June 1, will return to the races with the mount on Maidaan (GB) (Midyan {USA}) in Friday's G3 Theo Fennell Lennox S. at Goodwood. Dettori was out for a spin aboard Dubai Millennium yesterday morning on the gallops as the Dubai World Cup winner outworked stablemate Fly To The Stars over six furlongs. The jockey is booked to partner Dubai Millennium in his defense of G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 13.

AMERICA TO AMERICA G3 Prix Vanteaux winner America (Ire) (Arazi {USA}) will bypass Saturday's G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood and will instead ship to the U.S. to contest the GI Beverly D. at Arlington International Aug. 19. Trainer Criquette Head explained her rationale. "America won't go to Goodwood, as I think the American race looks easier than the Nassau, which is tough. After that we will have to see but at this stage no definite plans have been made." Head sent Hatoof (USA) (Irish River {Fr}) to win the \$500,000 event in 1994.
