IRON GIANT

Any number of superlatives cannot begin to describe the phenomenon that is Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), who battled his way to yet another Group 1 score in yesterday's G1 Champagne Lanson Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood yesterday. Runner up in both the English and Irish 2000 Guineas in May, the Aidan O'Brien pupil at last gained his first sophomore Group 1 when successful in the St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 20, and followed up in courageous style to secure the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown July 8. That he could produce the goods at the highest level for the fifth time in less than three months to take this race with grim determination shows just how tough he is and he did so with his biggest winning margin in that time period. The "Giant" was settled in a handy third as Aljabr (Storm Cat) led from another Ballydoyle inmate, the slow starting Manhattan (GB) (Fairy King) with Medicean (GB) (Machiavellian) and Dansili (GB) (Danehill) ridden with patience in midfield. As the field stretched to the quarter-mile marker, Giant's Causeway was already under pressure, but bullied his way to the front as Dansili loomed on the outside, travelling best of all. The latter joined Giant's Causeway at the eighth pole and may have actually hit the front. If he did so it was only a fleeting brush, as Giant's Causeway regained the lead almost immediately and, with Michael Kinane in the drive position, he ran on resolutely to the line to win going away. "He just doesn't know the meaning of defeat and seems to get better and better," exclaimed winning owner Michael Tabor. "For me, today was his easiest win. If he had run a bad race, then people might have said we had gone to the well once too often, but we would not have run if we thought that would be the case. I guess he has now got confidence in his own ability and he seems to thrive on racing. The [G1] Juddmonte International [about 10 furlongs, York, Aug. 22] is next, although John Magnier joked that we might need to find another race in between." O'Brien further outlined the chestnut's schedule. "York has always been planned as his next race, and then we will go on to the Breeders' Cup Classic [Nov. 4]. He is by Storm Cat, so he is bred to be a dirt horse. He really is very, very special and we would be happy to take on Dubai Millennium (GB) if we meet in the Breeders' Cup." (Sussex Chart p2)

AN HONORABLE REPEAT

Second favorite Bourbon Belle (Storm Boot) made light work of the GIII Honorable Miss H. yesterday afternoon at Saratoga, successfuly defending her title in stakesrecord equalling time. At her very best on the front end, the millionaire mare parlayed her 3 1/4-length victory last year into an excruciating defeat by a nose in the GI Ballerina before ending the year on a four-race winning skein. The chestnut was winless in her first four starts of 2000, but ended that streak with a 2 1/4-length score in Prairie Meadows' Saylorville S. two back and was most recently second in the GIII Princess Rooney H. at Calder July 15. Sent to the front from the nine hole, jockey Willie Martinez guided Bourbon Belle through fractions of :22, :44 4/5 and :56 3/5 and cruised through the final furlong to the easy win. Favored Country Hideaway (Seeking the Gold) broke through the gate before the race and was a lackluster fifth. Said winning trainer Pete Salmen III, "The biggest worry I had about her was that she runs in an egg bar shoe. When she went :22, I knew the rest of them would be in trouble." Salmen indicated that the GI Ballerina at seven furlongs Aug. 27 is next for the winner. Shug McGaughey, trainer of the favorite, said, "I don't know why she did it," speaking of the incident at the gate. "but something was bothering her today."

A turf sprint specialist, Debby d'Or made her final 1999 start in this race, finishing fifth by six lengths. Campaigned mainly on the infield in 2000, the five-yearold was third in Keeneland's Stravinsky S. in April before being nosed out of a win in the May 4 Mamzelle S. at Churchill Downs. The winner of three straight minor stakes over the Monmouth Park lawn, the dark bay most recently won the off-the-turf John McSorley S. at the Jersey Shore July 16. Looking for the first graded stakes win of her career, Debby d'Or won the break and set fractions of :21 4/5, :44 4/5 and :57 while being pursued by Steal A Heart (Crafty Prospector) and Katz Me If You Can. Never given a breather, she began to inch clear of the field leaving the eighth pole and drew clear to her most important victory to date. "She had a terrible trip last year," winning trainer Dan Switzer said. "She stumbled at the start, then got rank and ran off with the rider. Today she was more relaxed. She rated well and (jockey) Shane (Sellers) did a wonderful job." The conditioner indicated that he will consider the GI Ballerina at seven furlongs here Aug. 27 as the next start for the mare.

Without quite matching the course-record time set last year by Ekraar, No Excuse Needed still posted an exhilirating last-to-first performance to score in good style from a field of useful juveniles. Aptly named, No Excuse Needed came into the race as the undefeated winner of one race, a maiden at Sandown July 8, and showed the benefit of that experience to win going away. The action started as the field were being loaded into the stalls when Bonnard reared up with such ferocity that jockey Mick Kinane was thrown backwards from his mount. Kinane was soon back in the plate and the pair where best away as the race got under way proper. The well-backed favourite Chianti (Ire) (Danehill) was soon at the head of affaairs, tracked by Atmospheric (Irish River (Fr)) and Baaridd (GB) (Halling) as Bonnard was reserved in midpack with Shaard and No Excuse Needed in rear. Bonnard was ridden along from the three-furlong marker and made his bid approaching the final guarter mile. Meanwhile, No Excuse Needed and Shaard had made progress from the rear, with the former's momentum carrying him into the lead at the distance. Johnny Murtagh, aboard No Excuse Needed, rode out his mount all the way to the line to record his seventh British victory of the season and fourth recent stakes success for trainer Sir Michael Stoute. Bonnard kept on well in the closing stages to take second place ahead of Shaard and performed admirably given his prerace antics. Winning trainer Stoute explained, "He travelled really well today and I think the Sandown run pulled him together. That day, (jockey) Pat (Eddery) said he was really travelling, but when he got to the front he wasn't doing that much. Because of that we held him up a little bit longer in this company and I thought Johnny gave him a great ride. I felt from three out that he would come and win."

With Kayf Tara (GB)'s brilliant staying career prematurely ended by injury, the stage is set for any number of pretenders to fill the void. Far Cry is the obvious pick on form, having been beaten only a head by Europe's champion staver in the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 22. Martin Pipe's standard bearer is a versatile dual purpose gelding who has shown an aptitude for a battle in the past, most notably when securing two major handicaps last year. He was successful in the Queen's Prize at Kempton and the Northumberland Plate at Newcastle, and also won the 18 furlong G3 Doncaster Cup for good measure. He has the beating of San Sebastian and Persian Punch on Gold Cup form and will start as the likely favourite. Three Cheers is something of an enigmatic character, but has finished out of the first two in only one of his last five starts. He has raced twice this year, comfortably winning the Listed Prix du Carrousel at Maisons-Laffitte June 9 and finishing second in the marathon Queen Alexandra S. (a class B conditions event) at Royal Ascot June 23. He finished second to Kayf Tara in this last year and was fourth to Double Trigger (Ire) in 1998. He has shown ability to act on this unique course and has a strong chance to double his group race tally.

A more than useful guide to future aspirations is highlighted by the fortunes of last year's winner Bachir, who went on to secure both French and Irish equivalents of the 2000 Guineas this season. Pyrus, who missed last weekend's G2 Prix Robert Papin on account of the soft ground, will bid to add another foreign group race to trainer Aidan O'Brien's ever-lengthening portfolio. He has a solid chance based on his win in the Listed Marble Hill S. at The Curragh May 27, his only start to date. Endless Summer represents last year's winning trainer, John Gosden, and takes a healthy step up from the class of his only start to date. He impressed many observers when readily accounting for a field of useful sorts on his debut at Newbury July 21, and has the potential to go on to better things. The consistent Pan Jammer is a useful vardstick who overturned previous form with Ballydoyle's Pirate Of Penzance to win the G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 16, and has place claims at least. Dominus has shown plenty of ability in three runs to date and the form of those races has a rock solid look. He is another with place claims and it would be unwise to dismiss his chance.

YANKEE VICTOR TO AIRDRIE STUD Yankee Victor (Saint Ballado--Highest Carol, by Caro {Ire}), winner of this year's GI Metropolitan H., will enter stud in 2001 at Mr. and Mrs. Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky. His fee was announced at \$15,000 live foal. Yankee Victor was in the midst of an impressive four-year-old campaign in which he won his final four starts--all at one mile--before being retired because of injury. In addition to his 4 3/4-length win in the Met Mile, he also took the GIII Westchester H. and the GIII Hanshin H. He compiled a record of nine wins from 19 starts and earnings of \$893,806. "It's our belief that the best American sires have been superior at a mile and Yankee Victor certainly has been that," Jones said.

SALT LAKE WILL NOT SHUTTLE Walmac International stallion Salt Lake will miss this year's Southern Hemisphere breeding season while he continues to recover from a bout with colic. The 11-year-old was in quarantine and preparing for the trip to Australia when he was taken to the Rood and Riddle clinic near Lexington. Farm representative Kerry Cauthen told Blood-Horse Online, "There was no surgery performed and he's back on the farm recovering. Since he broke quarantine, he'd have to miss the start of the breeding season. It was decided that it was in the best interest to keep him here."



For 55 days of racing, daily purses averaged \$448,938, an increase of 4.6 percent against 1999, while the average per overnight was \$39,134, a 3.5-percent rise from last year's figure. "This was the highest Belmont Spring ever in all categories, except racing days and number of races," said New York Racing Association Racing Secretary and Handicapper Mike Lakow. "We believe we have put in the effort to make our races more attractive, not only at Belmont Park, but at Saratoga and Aqueduct."

Triple Group 1 winner Redoute's Choice helped his sire Danehill snatch the overall sires' premiership back from Zabeel in the 1999-2000 season. Three time Australian champion sire Danehill reclaimed the sires' premiership with 188 runners for 108 winners and 15 individual stakes winners for earnings of A\$7,842,310. Danehill's only other Group 1 winner for the season was Victoria Derby winner Blackfriars, while Zabeel, who relied on Hill of Grace, Grand Echezeaux and Sky Heights at Group 1 level, was A\$566,808 short of Danehill's tally. Zabeel had 150 runners for 61 winners and nine stakes winners for earnings of A\$7,275,510. Others in the top 10 were Snippets, Danzero, Scenic, Canny Lad, Zeditave, Grand Lodge and Rogan Josh's sire Old Spice.

Leading second-crop sire Danzero beat emerging star Grand Lodge with 70 runners for 27 winners and four individual stakes winners for earnings of A\$3,819,454. The only shuttle sire to make an impact on the first crop sire list was Thunder Gulch, who came in third behind Flying Spur and Brave Warrior. Brave filly Belle du Jour's Golden Slipper win helped Dehere to the top sire of two-year-olds title ahead of Danehill, while Zeditave was third, ahead of Flying Spur and Brave Warrior. The legacy of legendary sires of days gone past was evident in the broodmare sires list, where Bletchingly topped the table ahead of *Sir Tristram, with Marscay in third spot. Bletchingly was broodmare sire of 263 runners for 125 winners and nine stakes winners for earnings of A\$5,170,844.
