GOODWOOD REBELLION

Prior to yesterday's G2 J P Morgan Goodwood Cup, **Royal Rebel (Ire)** (Robellino) had done most of his best racing in Ireland, where he won the May 24 Listed Saval Beg S. and was second in the July 1 G3 Curragh Cup at The Curragh and the July 22 Listed Challenge S. at Leopardstown. But the four-year-old found English success, winning by a half length at Goodwood. He raced in third early yesterday as **Persian Punch (Ire)** (Persian Heights {GB}) assumed his customary front-running position. Entering the straight, jockey Mick Kinane, on Royal Rebel, was surrounded on either side by **Far Cry (Ire)** (Pharly {Fr}) and **Rainbow High (GB)** (Rainbow Quest {USA}). Far Cry battled to the front, but Royal Rebel had a little more to give in the closing stages, forging ahead with 50 yards to race and holding on to deny Martin Pipe's gelding. Mark Johnston said, "He did it in real gutsy style, but he had an absolutely perfect ride from Mick Kinane, as he can be a very lazy horse. Today he travelled well all the way and he saved the final push until inside the final furlong, with the visor making him that bit gamier and able to respond. He's only a four-year-old and that's young for a stayer, so, touch wood he stays sound, we can keep coming back." Kinane added, "He's a tough individual and he travelled sweetly, but he's only as good as what's around him, as he needs something to fight with. He has the ability to do anything--it just depends on what mood he's in."

RICHMOND TO ENDLESS SUMMER

Endless Summer (GB) (Zafonic) provided trainer John Gosden with his second straight success in the G2 Richmond S. when he pulled off to a one-length victory at Goodwood yesterday. Last year, Gosden won the race with Bachir, who went on to become the first horse to win both the French and Irish 2000 Guineas. Endless Summer, an impressive Newbury maiden winner, was a solid favourite yesterday and he made a successful step up in grade to give his trainer his 40th winner from Manton, his new base. Held up in mid-division on the outside of the field early, he was brought to challenge pacesetter **Pyrus** (Mr. Prospector) past halfway. He caught the leader with over a furlong remaining, produced a strong run to go clear and was kept up to his work to keep a safe distance. Gosden commented, "He's a really pleasant horse to train, as he has a great temperament, and he's very willing. He has a ton of speed, and he's a nice, progressive horse. He's very powerful and very well made, being a very early, real two-year-old, and here he had to race on the outside, with daylight all the way. He hit the front a bit soon if anything, and idled a bit, but he quickened up nicely when asked. He'll go to the [G1] Prix Morny [Deauville Aug. 20]." Endless Summer is quoted at 20-1 for next year's G1 2000 Guineas with Victor Chandler.

With only one previous racecourse start to his name, a second in a conditions event over this course and distance July 11, Crystal Castle belied his relative lack of experience to win a competitive race in good style. In doing so, he signaled himself as a colt of some potential and one to note in future juvenile pattern events. He broke best of all on the outside, but was restrained in third by Cash Asmussen as the Italian-trained challenger Euribor led from Lunasalt. Euribor came under pressure entering the final quarter mile as Crystal Castle moved into top gear. Asmussen sat with plenty of horse under him when he hit the front at the distance and rode his mount with vigour throughout the final furlong to assert his obvious superiority. Euribor kept on well once headed and showed brave determination to make sure Crystal Castle didn't have an easy time of it. Lunasalt threatened briefly at the distance but was unable to match the finishing pace of the first two.

YANKEE VICTOR LOSES ARLINGTON WIN The recently retired Yankee Victor (Saint Ballado) was stripped of his final career win in the June 25 GIII Hanshin H. at Arlington International, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. The four-year-old was disqualified from his 3 3/4-length victory by Arlington stewards Wednesday after he tested positive for the muscle relaxer methocarbamol. Runner-up **Bright Valour** (Wild Again) was made the official winner of the race and awarded the \$60,000 first-place purse. Trainer Carlos Morales was suspended 30 days for the positive drug test, but is expected to appeal the ban. Yankee Victory, winner of the GI Met Mile, will stand at Airdrie Stud in Midway, Kentucky, next season.

She was then tested twice at G3 level, finishing fifth in the Prix Vanteaux at Longchamp Apr. 30, and most recently when second to Zarkiya (Ire) in the Prix Sandringham at Chantilly June 4. She displayed natural progression here to take her first stake with a comfortable victory, having enough in reserve to be eased down close to home. The Overbrook Farm homebred broke on even terms and was reserved in midfield in company with Castiya. Penny's Gold made smooth headway once into the two-furlong straight and challenged for the lead on the outside at the distance. She quickened impressively soon after, grabbed the lead with 150 yards to run and kept on strongly in the closing stages for a cozy win.

Mother's "real and undaunted interest in steeplechasing is a spur and a blessing to all of us engaged in it."

Her light blue and buff-striped silks were immensely successful in the 1960s and 1970s, a golden time for the Royal racing interests. Her partnership with the training legends Peter Cazalet and Fulke Walwyn saw Makaldar second in the 1967 Champion Hurdle; and Game Spirit complete a memorable Cheltenham festival double in 1975, along with Sunyboy.

There are other names, too, such as Gay Record (who provided her 200th winner), Double Star, The Rip, Inch Arran and Isle Of Man. Her Special Cargo won the 1984 Whitbread Gold Cup against a competitive field in 1984, another supreme highlight.

Her favourite horse, The Argonaut, however, achieved less exalted heights, but in 1990 he won the Grand Military Gold Cup, one of five successes at Sandown. The following year, when under the care of Cath Walwyn, he took the Prince of Wales Cup Chase at Fakenham. He was the last of the 150 winners trained by the late Walwyn for the Queen Mother. The old fellow is now 22, but he still had the time to take part in his owner's pageant on July 19.

Looking to the future, the Queen Mother has an exciting young chaser to look forward to in Easter Ross, trained in Lambourn by Nicky Henderson.

In terms of jockeyship the Queen Mother could always rely on Bill Smith and David Mould, who between them rode more than half her winners. She also fulfils the role of patron for the Injured Jockeys' Fund, which she has done since 1971 with enthusiasm.

In November last year the Queen Mother was confirmed the 'First Lady of British Racing' by Sir Peter O'Sullevan, when she was honoured at the Sir Peter O'Sullevan annual award dinner for her lifetime contribution to the sport.

Said Sullevan at the time: "Her Majesty's affection for, and knowledgeable and appreciation of, the horse have inspired her dedication to the sport she loves, and her consistent presence at the racecourse has helped immeasurably to raise the profile of horseracing."

There is no greater tribute.



WRITERS UP

A ROYAL REFLECTION

The Queen Mother is 100 today. The most famous 100-year-old in Britain, she was at Ascot for 'Diamond Day' last Saturday, where the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., one of the greatest events in the flat racing calendar, was the feature race, but the Queen Mother's heart will forever be closer to the winter sport of national hunt.

It all started with the purchase of her first jumper in 1949, on the suggestion of Anthony Mildmay. After Mildmay passed away, she bought Manicou, a French-bred who soon went on to King George VI Chase glory.

But perhaps her most extraordinary memory resides with Dick Francis' sprawling slip 50 yards from victory on Devon Loch in the 1956 Grand National, an aberration that remains a controversy to this day.

Francis wrote in his autobiography that the Queen
