MORE THAN READY FOR A GRADE ONE

More Than Ready (Southern Halo) has been installed the 5-2 morning line favorite as he shoots for his first Grade I success in Sunday's \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. The dark bay, winner in his seasonal debut of the seven-furlong GII Hutcheson at Gulfstream in January, will try to become the seventh consecutive favorite to win the Haskell. "I don't really go for that favorite stuff," owner Jim Scatuorchio commented. "The oddsmaker could have picked two or three horses. But if you want to give it to us because we're the favorite, I'd be happy to take the purse right now." More Than Ready will be fitted with blinkers for the first time on Sunday and will break from post position number two. One competitor who will attract his share of support is GI Swaps winner Captain Steve (Fly So Free), who ships in from California for trainer Bob Baffert. Following his fourth-place effort in the Preakness, the chestnut got a bit of a breather and has won his last two races, but will be making his third start in the span of 34 days. "He came out of the Swaps well and shipped well," said Baffert, who ran second in 1997 with Anet and third last year with Forestry. "I'm glad to be back with a horse who is doing so well." Jockey Corey Nakatani, bad thumb and all, is scheduled to ride the 3-1 chance. The pair breaks from the three hole. Dixie Union (Dixieland Band) has the look of a live longshot for trainer Richard Mandella. The winner of the GII Norfolk in his first two-turn effort last October, the dark bay was injured during his fifth-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He comes into this effort off three solid starts this season and retains the services of regular rider Alex Solis. A 6-1 shot on the morning line. Dixie Union will start from post position number eight.

SPA VETERANS REMATCH IN WHITNEY

The top two finishers from the July 4 GII Suburban H., Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo) and Behrens (Pleasant Colony) lock horns again in Sunday's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga. The "Kid" is two for four at the Spa, including a 3/4-length victory in last year's Travers and comes into this race with a chance to become the King of the Mountain in the East Coast handicap ranks. Trainer Scotty Schulhofer, who added blinkers two back, credits the four-year-old's improvement to a jock switch. "Edgar Prado has made a big difference and the blinkers got him focused," said Schulhofer, who won back-toback Whitneys with Colonial Affair and Unaccounted For in 1994 and 1995. Favored at 9-5, the four-year-old breaks from the rail. Behrens has had his share of heartbreak at Saratoga, finishing second by a nose in the 1997 Travers and a memorable second by the same margin to Victory Gallop in last year's Whitney. The dark bay is the 5-2 third choice to make amends and will have a new rider for the first time in 15 starts dating to early 1998. "I keep picking up the paper and seeing (jockey Jerry) Bailey winning stakes," trainer H. James Bond commented. "He wanted a chance to ride him and it's tough to let someone else get him." Golden Missile (A.P. Indy) is the nation's top horse according to the NTRA Thoroughbred poll and rides a two-race winning streak into tomorrow's race. Third at 75-1 in last year's Breeders' Cup Classic, the chestnut is much improved this year, according to trainer Joe Orseno. "He's changed alot as a five-year-old," he said. "He's put more flesh on and he's trained more forwardly. I'm excited about the possibility of winning three in a row." The Whitney is the final leg of the NTRA Champions on FOX series and will be televised live nationally on the FOX network from 5 to 6 p.m. EDT Sunday.

FRED HOOPER DEAD AT 102 Florida horse owner and breeder Fred Hooper, who won the 1945 Kentucky Derby with his very first Thoroughbred purchase, died in his sleep early Friday morning in Miami. He was 102 years old. In 1943, Hooper spent \$10,200 on a yearling, a horse he named Hoop Jr, who also won the Wood Memorial in his three-year-old season. Hooper is widely credited with bringing Central American jockeys Laffit Pincay, Jr., Braulio Baeza and Jorge Velasquez to ride in the United States and was in attendance for a January tribute at Santa Anita to honor Pincay for breaking Bill Shoemaker's all-time record for number of wins by a jockey. Hooper developed one of the nation's most prominent breeding operations at his farm in Florida; over 100 horses bred at the farm went on to win stakes races, chief among them the 1970s multiple filly/mare champion Susan's Girl and 1985 Champion Sprinter Precisionist. Among his other prominent runners were Copelan, Olympia, Crozier and Diplomatic Jet. A founding member of the American Thoroughbred Owners Association, Hooper was awarded the Eclipse for outstanding breeder in 1975 and 1982 and an Eclipse Award of Merit in 1991. His death comes one day after it was announced that a dispersal of his bloodstock would be held at the Ocala Sale in October.

Personal First, winner of a pair of minor Kentucky stakes last year, was second in the GIII Holy Bull S. in his sophomore debut, 11th in the GI Fountain of Youth and fifth to Trippi in the Mar. 11 GIII Swale S. before earning a rest. Off the board in a pair of Churchill starts this spring, the bay celebrated a return to form with a 7 1/2-length blowout at Ellis Park July 13. Disco Rico was sent to the front and was joined after half a furlong by Trippi on the outside while Personal First was taken to the inside. Disco Rico circled wide into the stretch and Trippi began to flounder in the middle of the track, but by that time, jockey Pat Day had Personal First in high gear along the wood, overtook a game Disco Rico approaching the sixteenth pole and drew clear for his first graded-stakes success. "He's started to come back around," commented winning trainer David Paulus, who was saddling his first winner from as many tries at Saratoga. "He got sick in Florida and bled in the Fountain of Youth. We tried to take him off the lead, but it seems like you have to let him do what he has to do." The winner heads next for the GI King's Bishop here Aug. 26. Odds-on favorite Trippi stuggled home third. Said jockey Jerry Bailey, "He just ran a sub-par race today. You can't run these burner races every time."

Observatory has improved markedly at three, having followed a second to Shibboleth in the Listed King Charles II S. June 3 with an impressive performance when taking the G3 Jersey S, at Royal Ascot June 21. Here he carried a penalty for that win, but made light of that to confirm form with Three Points, who was fourth that day, and claim his second stakes success. As Mitcham (Ire) (Hamas {Ire}) and Three Points tore off in front, Kevin Darley had his colt settled in third early. The pace carried on relentlessly, while the field was becoming strung out, but Observatory was picking up well and closing the gap on Three Points up the straight. As the leader ploughed on without quickening again, Observatory had more to give and, with 200 yards remaining, hit the front and started to go away. From there he was kept up to his work to win comfortably, in a time which was a tribute to the furious pace throughout. Trainer John Gosden said, "He's by Distant View so he has lots of speed, but this horse really travels. The horse in front really took off, and it was a cruelly run race, but he saw out the stiff seven furlongs well, as he did last time at Ascot, and he's crying out for a mile now. All being well he'll go for the G2 Celebration Mile here (Aug. 26)."

From her price tag of Ir£3,200 to her two stakes wins to her electric turn of foot, Misty Eyed is a dream come true. Seventh in the G3 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 22, she rebounded to take the Listed Dragon S. Sandown July 9 last time by an impressive 2 1/2 lengths. She was even more impressive here in her most important success yet. Held up at the back early as Shoeshine Boy (Ire) (Prince Sabo {GB}) and Red Millennium (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) cut out the early running, she was produced with her run past halfway, but still had considerable ground to make up and a wall of horses to maneuver. Quickening to join the leaders with over a furlong remaining, she quickened again when in front to go clear of her toiling rivals and leave the result beyond doubt. Trainer Nerys Dutfield said, "I'm delighted. Delighted for the owners, the horse and Lee (Newman). It means more to us than anything I can possibly say, and she's come out of this with flying colours. She is a fairytale--a super, super filly."

Clive Brittain has handled some top-class fillies in his time, most memorably Pebbles (GB), but in Crimplene he may have a racehorse who deserves the same accolades poured on the 1985 Breeders' Cup Turf winner. Like Pebbles, Crimplene is a no-nonsense individual with the class to dispense of her rivals over a mile, while all the time suggesting in her style of running that she can get better over further. That thought will strike a chord of fear into the connections of her rivals here, for she did not look to be stopping over the mile in the G2 Henkel-Rennen (German 1000 Guineas) at Dusseldorf May 7, or the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 28, or the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 23. Brittain is of the opinion that she will benefit from the extra two furlongs in this, and it is interesting that he took her out of the G1 Sussex S. run on Wednesday over the mile here. Lady Upstage is a filly who has progressed throughout the year, having followed a fifth in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 9 with a fine performance when taking the G2 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh July 1. The fourth that day, Ela Athena, has since won the G3 Lancashire Oaks July 8, the form of which looks solid, with two stakes winners having emerged since. However, that was over a trip two furlongs further and the step back in distance may not suit her entirely. Gerard Butler's Princess Ellen has twice chased Crimplene home, and last time at Royal Ascot she never looked likely to diminish the healthy advantage that the winner had built up in a race she simply dominated. She is nevertheless a quality filly who has been runner-up in two Group 1 events, including the G1 1000 Guineas May 7.

The winner of his first four career starts, Brave Quest shipped to Thistledown for the GII Ohio Derby in his last and led late before getting caught at the wire by Haskell bound Milwaukee Brew. "I thought he ran a great race in Ohio," said trainer John Ward's wife and assitant trainer Donna. "He was really wide and kept fighting all the way to the finish." Purchased for \$950,000 as a two-year-old, the bay figures to sit behind the pace and come with one run. Unshaded, who scored his most impressive victory to date in the GII Lexington S. at Keeneland, was a late-running second to Postponed in the GII Peter Pan two back. Supplemented for \$150,000 to the Belmont, the Carl Nafzger trainee rallied seven wide into the pedestrian pace to finish a creditable third. Albert The Great hasn't lost in four starts since breaking his maiden Apr. 22, which coincided with the addition of blinkers by trainer Nick Zito. The winner of consecutive Belmont allowance efforts, the bay led past every pole of the GII Dwyer S., defeating Haskell favorite More Than Ready and Red Bullet July 9.

Uncharted Haven (GB) tallied one win from four starts for trainer Jean de Roualle in France and made her stateside debut a winning one, coming from off the pace to take a Hollywood allowance test by three lengths May 24. Automated has never been in better form and has won three of her last four efforts, all sprinting over the Hollywood turf. A much improved filly since the addition of blinkers in March, the homebred has made only one other start at today's trip, finishing a close-up fourth in a Santa Anita maiden Mar. 11.

Triple Crown Productions has announced that post times for the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont, will be pushed back one half hour to 6:04 p.m. beginning next year. The change coincides with a new fiveyear television contract with NBC Sports, which will produce 90-minute broadcasts May 5, May 19 and June 9. The change is being effected in an attempt to maximize a national television audience. The Triple Crown has faced competition in the past while televised on ABC from National Basketball Association playoff games, which are broadcast by NBC. The Triple Crown races of 2001 will be directly followed by basketball. "The races that make up the historic Triple Crown are coming off a string of spectacular years and the new post time should help expose these great races to new audiences and continue their momentum for years to come," said Tom Meeker, president of Triple Crown Productions and Churchill Downs Inc.
