STORM CAT TOPS SEDATE SECOND SESSION

It was solid if unsensational session at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sales last night--not one lot reached seven figures, but the average rose seven percent over Day 2 of the 1999 sale. A colt by the everpopular Storm Cat out of Beacci (Alydar) topped the second day of the sale, bringing \$775,000 from Demi O'Byrne. From the Lane's End consignment, the bay is a half-brother to graded-stakes winner Rare Rock (Danzig Connection). A colt by Capote out of Angel Kisses (Private Account) brought the second-highest price on the night, attracting a final bid of \$750,000 from Padua Stables, Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, the bay is by a Team Lukas graduate and out of a full sister to Corporate Report, who won the GI Travers for trainer D. Wayne Lukas in 1991. Lukas, who will train this yearling as well, said, "He was the one we were after tonight. He was our number one selection and we are tickled to get him." As for the Lukas family history in the colt's pedigree, the Hall of Fame horseman said, "That factors into our interest, but the individual has to live up to his billing." The top-selling filly last night was a daughter of Deputy Minister out of Bally Five (Miswaki), consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Summer Wind Farm. A full sister to MGSW Yarrow Brae, the chestnut was purchased by Dapple Bloodstock, agent, for \$535,000. Dapple Bloodstock is owned by Mike Akers of Lexington, who puts together racing partnerships as well. Overall, five of last night's 10 best sellers were among the first 13 through the ring. "We didn't have a break-out horse tonight, but hopefully we'll have a few tomorrow," Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson said. "We started out strong tonight--the first 20 horses were strong physical types and everyone was on them. We knew we were going to start out stronger than we would finish." The Saratoga sale finishes tonight, with bidding on the final session beginning at 8 p.m.

ALJABR RETIRED Godolphin's top miler Aljabr (Storm Cat--Sierra Madre {Fr} {Baillamont}) has been retired and will stand at Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell Farm in Kentucky for the 2001 breeding season, according to the Dubai-based operation's website. The gray colt is the third Godolphin star in two weeks to conclude his career, following the retirement of both Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold) and Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells). Undefeated and winner of the G1 Prix de la Salamandre at two, Aljabr was aimed at the GI Kentucky Derby last season, but was withdrawn on the eve of that race and returned to England, where he took the G1 Champagne Lanson Sussex S. at Goodwood. The four-year-old opened 2000 with a victory in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S., but raced below form when fourth in the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot and fifth in defense of his Sussex title Aug. 2. Produced from the multiple Group 1 winner Sierra Madre, he retires with five victories from nine starts and £374,201 in earnings.

PEGASUS PASSES VET Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) has successfully passed his veterinary examination and the deal which will see him stand at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky next year has been finalized. Coolmore purchased a controlling interest in the three-year-old for a price reported to be approximately \$70 million; their partners in the deal are the Yoshida brothers of Shadai Farm. Fusao Sekiguchi, who saw his colors carried to victory in the Kentucky Derby, will continue to decide the course of the colt's racing career. It is expected the Derby winner will race once or twice before making a final appearance in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

*Intidab finished first, but was DQ'ed to second. Intidab, who beat Eclipse winner Artax to take this race last year when it was known as the A Phenomenon, was back to defend his title and looked to be successful, but had the win taken away by the stewards. The dark bay ended 1999 with a win in the Eillo S. at Gulfstream Park over Breeders' Cup weekend and captured the GII True North H. at Belmont in his second outing the season. Coming off a fourth-place finish in the GI DeFrancis Dash July 15, the veteran was sent off the second choice. Rated off fast early fractions, he closed to grab the lead at the top of the lane and battled 8-5 choice Successful Appeal down the lane to finish a head in front, but had drifted in under the right-handed whip to bump the favorite and was disqualified and placed second. "This horse sulks when he gets hit, but I popped him once when he had trouble changing leads," Intidab's jockey, Robbie Davis, said. "That's when he came in. There was a little contact before the wire, but the call could have gone either way." Successful Appeal, winner of the GII Kentucky Cup Sprint last year before running fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, came back to take a June 30 allowance test at Belmont and was making his second start off the layoff. "He wasn't really pushed to the max in his last race, so this was a big test," his trainer, John Kimmel, said. "I feel very happy and fortunate to be the winner." The winner could go next in the GII Forego H. at Saratoga Aug. 30

or the GI Vosburgh at Belmont Sept. 23.

TRIPPI TO VINERY Dogwood Stable's top three-year-old sprinter Trippi (End Sweep--Jealous Appeal, by Valid Appeal), scheduled to run through November, 2001, will stand at Vinery Kentucky at the conclusion of his racing career, it was announced yesterday. According to a press release, Dogwood will sell "a significant portion" of the colt to Vinery Kentucky, but will retain control until his retirement. Trippi has won six of his eight starts, including the GIII Swale S., GIII Flamingo S., GII Riva Ridge S. and GII Tom Fool S. over older horses. Third in the Aug. 4 GIII Amsterdam S. last time out, he is being pointed for the GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 26.

DIXIE UNION TO TRAVERS Dixie Union (Dixieland Band), winner of the Aug. 6 GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park, will make his next start in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 26, but will continue to train at Monmouth for another week. "It's quiet at Monmouth and he's doing well there," trainer Dick Mandella said. "I think he'll recover better and he'll get a better start on his training there. There's a lot less traffic on the racetrack. He'll train at Monmouth for about a week before we send him to Saratoga. It's a good place for him to get back on track."

PADUA OPENS FLORIDA STALLION DIVISION

Padua Stables will open its Florida stallion division in 2001 with a roster that will include Yes It's True (Is It True--Clever Monique, by Clever Trick), a Grade I-winning sprinter with more than \$1 million in earnings; Dance Master (Gone West--Nijinsky's Lover, by *Nijinsky II), a Grade II winner at two; and Sasha's Prospect (Mr. Prospector--Missy's Mirage, by Stop the Music), who was purchased for \$2.3 million as a yearling. Yes It's True will stand for a fee of \$7,500, live foal, and Sasha's Prospect's fee is private. Dance Master's stud fee will be set upon his retirement. "We have made significant commitments to building our racing stable and infrastructure for our breeding operations," a statement from Padua owners Anne and Satish Sanan read. "Our goal is to become the leading breeding operation in Florida in terms of quality, both horse and service. We are committed to help raise the quality of stallions in Florida and continue to become more competitive with Kentucky."

FINAL MELLON CONSIGNMENT SET FOR KEENELAND SEPTEMBER The final dispersal of the estate of the late Paul Mellon, which will be consigned by Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services, will be offered at the 2000 Keeneland September Sale. The eight vearlings in the consignment include a colt by Pulpit out of Key Witness (Key to the Mint), making him a half brother to Grade I winners Key Contender and You'd Be Surprised; a filly by Red Ransom out of stakes winner Way of the World (Dance of Life); and a filly by Seeking the Gold out of graded-stakes winner Coronation Cup (Chief's Crown). The trio are scheduled to sell Sept. 12. Mellon, a four-time Eclipse Award winner and the breeder of 98 stakes winners, raced six champions under his Rokeby Stable colors. He captured the Kentucky Derby with Sea Hero and the Epsom Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with Mill Reef, becoming the only owner in history to win all three events.

TRF AUCTION RAISES OVER \$350,000 The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's Second Annual Saratoga Gala raised more than \$350,000 through its auction of "experiences" and stallion season options at the Saratoga Golf and Polo Club in Saratoga Springs Monday night. The sales topper, an option to breed to Saint Ballado donated by Aaron and Marie Jones and Taylor Made Farm, sold for \$45,000 to entertainer and Thoroughbred enthusiast David Cassidy. A live foal season to champion sprinter Artax, who is back in training after covering a book of mares this spring but will head to Taylor Made Farm after this year's Breeders' Cup Sprint, sold for \$33,000. Artax was vanned over from his barn on the Saratoga backstretch to watch his 2001 season be auctioned. John Oxley purchased the season, which was donated by Paraneck Stable. The auction of experiences was topped by Ken Ellenberg's final bid of \$20,000 for a trip to the 2000 Triple Crown. A trip to the 2001 Dubai World Cup brought \$19,000 from Peter Wilmott. Cobra Farm's Betty Baldwin Bizantz paid \$10,000 for the opportunity have a character in Pulitzer Prize winner Jane Smiley's next novel named for her, and a walk-on part on Law and Order: Special Victims Unit brought \$7,000 from Faye Schmidt. "We were very pleased with the level of generosity in the donations we received and in the bidding," said TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "It's great to see everyone so excited to support this important cause and have so much fun in the process."
