#### SLEW SIZZLES AT SARATOGA FINALE

Because he had to undergo surgery to fuse two vertebrae in his spine, Seattle Slew covered only a limited book of mares this year. But the 26-year-old is still going strong in the sales ring. A Seattle Slew colt out of Omi (Wild Again), named Distinction, had the distinction of being the sales topper at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Yearling Sales, which ended last night. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Double Diamond Farm, the dark bay brought a final bid of \$4.2 million from David Shimmon, who will race the colt in partnership with Bill Bianco. The price was a near-record for the sale, second only to the Northern Dancer colt who brought \$4.6 million in 1984. "That was a lot more than we expected to pay, but there was never any doubt that we wanted to own this colt," Shimmon, who also spent \$1.4 million for the session's second-highest priced colt, said. This marks the third straight year that Taylor Made has accounted for the Saratoga sales topper, and this colt was the most expensive yearling the company has ever sold. "We thought, if we had a chance to top the sale, this would be the horse," Duncan Taylor said. "We knew all along that the right people wanted him."

#### Melnyk Wins Phone-Bidding War

Eugene Melnyk, calling in from Barbados, outbattled D. Wayne Lukas, who was on the phone with an unidentified buyer, to grab the top-selling filly at Saratoga last night. With Dan Kenny acting as agent, Melnyk went to \$1.8 million to buy a filly by Hennessy from the Dinwiddie Farm consignment. The yearling's third dam is the great Special Account, a sister to champion racemare and broodmare Numbered Account who herself produced two stakes winners. "The pedigree, obviously, was the attraction," Kenny said. "She's from a great Phipps family and she stood out so much we couldn't quite analyze what her price would be. She was the prize of the sale in our eyes."

#### Another Classic Winner?

Laddie Dance and partner Jeanne Vance, perhaps looking for another Belmont Stakes winner, purchased a colt by Kingmambo from the Lane's End consignment for \$900,000. "We thought he looked like a chestnut Lemon Drop Kid," Dance said. "He has a lot of bone and he's a real nice horse. We plan on retiring Lemon Drop Kid [at the end of the season], so we're looking for a replacement and this one fit the bill."

#### Saratoga Concludes with Record Average

The 2000 Saratoga Sales set one new standard, with the 137 yearlings sold averaging a record \$305,847; and tied last year's record for overall median at \$190,000. "We brought the right horses to the right market niche and you can see where the demand is," Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief Jr. said. Added President Walt Robertston, "This has got to be a good sale to recruit off of--it has got to give the consignors confidence to bring their horses next year." (Stats, p2)

DARLEY SETS UP HIGH-RISE IN JAPAN High-Rise (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}--High Tern {Ire}, by High Line {GB}), winner of the 1998 G1 Vodafone Derby and this year's Dubai City of Gold, will be sent to Japan, where he will stand for Darley Stud. Owned by Sheikh Mohammed Obaid, the five-year-old horse, who was retired in June following a last-place finish in the GI Manhattan H. at Belmont, will stand at Lex Company for a fee of ¥1.2 million. "He'll have every chance of succeeding at Lex Company and we hope he will do as well as Darley's first stallion in Japan, the leading first-season sire, Carnegie (Ire)," said Darley spokesman John Ferguson.

TAMARISK BACK IN TRAINING Tamarisk (Ire) (Green Desert), winner of the 1998 G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup, has returned to training in the care of American conditioner Elliott Walden, according to *Racing Post*. After finishing off the board in a 1998 Keeneland allowance in his lone U.S. outing, the five-year-old Irishbred was retired, but proved infertile at stud.

HALL OF FAME H. REGRADED The American Graded Stakes Committee has reinstated the Grade II status of Monday's National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame H. at Saratoga. The race was downgraded and run as a Grade III race after it was taken off the turf.

#### AN EMERGING MARKET By Frank Carlson

While the two Koreas work toward becoming one country, officials from South Korea's Korean Racing Association are at work building a Thoroughbred industry.

To continue its policy of improving the breeding and training of Korean racehorses, the KRA opened the Jeju Stud Farm and training center in 1995. Designed as one of the most modern facilities of its kind anywhere in the world, the stud farm and training center is on roughly 500 acres. The objectives of the operation are to offer advice and support on the breeding and rearing of young stock to local horsemen; to provide the breeders access to high-quality stallions; and to train Korean horsemen in stud farm management and the breaking and training of young horses for racing.

The KRA also oversees the Seoul Racecourse, which opened in September 1989. A total of 94 days of racing, mostly on weekends, are conducted each year.

Off-track betting is offered at 24 OTB branches, which are concentrated in Seoul and its vicinity.

It is predicted that the revenue from racing in South Korea will grow to \$90 billion a year by 2005.

With that in mind, the KRA has established a breeding program with the goal of supplying horses for Seoul's growing racing business. The state-owned program has expanded from eight mares in 1981 to the most recent count of 791.

In 1987, the KRA recogned the need to provide stallions with internationally recognized pedigrees and race records for the growing band of broodmares and imported the first two stallions from Australia, Kingsview and Baptize.

Now the program is buying graded-stakes winners from the United States and shipping them to the island of Cheju, a tourist haven wedged between Japan and Korea in the East China Sea.

GI Champagne S. winner The Groom is Red and multiple graded-stakes winners Sharp Appeal and Social Charter are the latest acquisitions.

Richard Cross, of Narvick International, negotiated the deal on The Groom is Red.

"An official from the Korean Racing Association and two vets came with a list of 60 possible stallions they wanted to see," Cross said. "They worked their way across the country and they were very selective.

"It's my understanding that the government makes all the stallions they've bought available to the breeders. The owners with the mares submit their names and stallions are assigned. The problem seems to be the owners don't want to buy good mares because they don't know who they will be sent to. The program is developing and it seems they have to work out the lottery system."

But the KRA is moving in the right direction.



BOLD FORBES DEAD AT 27 Bold Forbes (Irish Castle--Comely Nell, by Commodore M.), who was the oldest living Kentucky Derby winner, was euthanized Wednesday at the Kentucky Horse Park near Lexington, Kentucky. He was 27. The horse was humanely destroyed because of kidney failure and complications from gastroenteritis, according to a news release from the Horse Park. Bred in Kentucky by Eaton Farms Inc. and Red Bull Stable, Bold Forbes was champion two-year-old of 1975 in Puerto Rico before being shipped to the United States and placed under the care of trainer Lazaro Barrera. After his 1976 Kentucky Derby triumph over 2-5 favorite Honest Pleasure, Bold Forbes finished third in the Preakness S., but went on to an impressive wire-towire victory in the Belmont S. He compiled a record of 13 wins in 18 career starts with earnings of \$546,536. Retired to Arthur Hancock's Stone Farm following his three-year-old season, Bold Forbes sired 304 winners and 30 stakes winners from 13 crops, including 1986 Kentucky Oaks winner Tiffany Lass, Bold Apparel (Fr), Air Forbes Won and Irish Actor. Bold Forbes had been stabled at the Horse Park's Hall of Champions alongside John Henry and Cigar since being retired from stud duty in April 1991. He was buried at the Park near three-time Horse of the Year Forego. "Bold Forbes has made a significant contribution to Thoroughbred racing and breeding, for which we will always be grateful," Hancock told the Blood-Horse. "Thousands have enjoyed his winning personality and will remember him fondly with the respect he so aptly earned."

It was the colt's first published work since contracting a viral infection that contributed to a third-place finish in the GII Dwyer July 9 and knocked him out of last Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational. "He's almost over the virus. He looked super galloping out. He wasn't blowing at all," trainer Joe Orseno said. "Obviously we were disappointed that we had to skip the Haskell, but I have plenty of time to get him ready for the Travers."

#### **Arlington Boosts Purses:**

Arlington International Racecourse will raise overnight purses by 25 percent, effective Aug. 12 and for the remainder of the Summer Festival of Racing which ends Sept. 4. Through the first 20 days of the 41-day Festival, daily purses have averaged \$255,090, compared to \$217,297 per day prior to the festival's July 12 opening. "We are extremely pleased by the favorable response to the Summer Festival concept by horsemen and the wagering public, both on track and at all of our simulcast outlets," said Frank Gabriel, Arlington's vice president of racing and operations. "A 25 percent increase in total wagering per day on Arlington races since the start of the Festival, compared to the first 43 days of our meet, is proof that the interest in Illinois racing is growing rapidly."
