#### ALL THE RAGE

Edward P. Evans' unbeaten Raging Fever (Storm Cat) skipped through the slop in yesterday's GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga, crossing the line in front by nearly 10 lengths. After scoring by six lengths in her debut, the dark bay romped home by 11 1/4 lengths with little prompting in the the Astoria S. at Belmont July 2, and was sent off as the crowd's choice here. With Jerry Bailey subbing in the irons for injured regular rider John Velazquez, she shadowed impressive maiden winner Grandma Lu (Salt Lake) through a quarter in :22, but shook free from that rival shortly thereafter and held a clear lead after a :45 2/5 half. At the top of the stretch, the homebred filly bid farewell to the field and extended her advantage under a hand ride. "She was much the best here," Bailey said. "There's nothing much more I can say." Trainer Mark Hennig was relieved to see the fleet filly temper her speed a bit. "The plan all along was to let Grandma Lu do what she wanted and try to stalk her a little bit," Hennig said. "Jerry [Bailey] said he thought he could have pulled her off the other filly a little bit, but he didn't want to get too far behind in this kind of condition." 2-1 second choice Tricky Elaine (Grindstone) ducked in sharply from her rail post and dropped back, losing touch with the field.

This race may offer Kutub the chance to make amends for his relatively disappointing efforts since storming away with the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp Apr. 9. He was second in the G1 Prix Lupin May 14 at the same course before finishing over eight lengths adrift of Holding Court (GB) in a fourth-place effort in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly June 4. He was sent off a warm favourite for both contests. Godolphin's Best of the Bests was fourth in the Epsom Derby June 10, beaten 10 lengths by Sinndar (Ire). Although he did not live up to expectations next time when fourth, beaten five lengths, by Beat Hollow (GB) in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp June 25, he has been given a break which may benefit him. Circus Dance had Kutub behind him when third in the Chantilly Classic, and, as he is still lightly raced and open to improvement, he could prove to be the one to beat here.

Considering that Boundary commanded a fee of only \$7,500 when he began his stallion career alongside his sire Danzig at Claiborne in 1995, this very fast performer has been given some outstanding opportunities. For example, the mares in foal to Boundary which featured in the Claiborne/Nicole Perry Gorman dispersal at Keeneland's 1998 January Sale included Limit, a stakeswinning member of the Special family which made \$2.5 million and Department, a half-sister to Slew o'Gold which realised \$1 million.

Boundary was again in the news at Keeneland last September when one of his yearling sons drew a bid of \$1.65 million from Demi O'Byrne. This youngster was out of Yarn, an extremely well-connected Mr Prospector mare who had already been represented by the very speedy Tale of the Cat.

Yarn's son, named Minardi, has wasted little time in justifying his purchase. On only his second appearance, he quickened impressively to win the G1 Phoenix S. by five lengths from the four-time winner Superstar Leo, with another Group winner, Dora Carrington, third. Incidentally, the ease of his win reflects very well on two other juvenile colts. Minardi had been beaten five lengths by Rumpold, a son of Mister Baileys, at Ascot on his debut, and Minardi had appeared to be Aidan O'Brien's second string for the Phoenix until lameness forced the withdrawal of Freud, a full brother to Giant''s Causeway.

Boundary looks to be making a breakthrough. Another of his European juveniles, Santolina, recently finished

fourth in the G3 Princess Margaret S. and Boundary also has a couple of notable American representatives this year. Conserve, a four-year-old colt from his first crop, followed up his win in the GII Maker's Mark Mile with another GII victory on turf in the Firecracker Breeders' Cup H. Then there's Boundary's three-year-old daughter Roxelana, who looked special when she took the GIII La Troienne S. by nearly 12 lengths in May--so special that she then started favorite for the GI Acorn S., where she finished third. Other members of these crops include She's Classy (rated 115 on the 1999 Experimental Free Handicap) and her fellow Graded-placed winners Solar Bound, Barrier, Brave Gun and Beach Flag (in Japan).

Boundary was bred by the partnership of Claiborne and the late William Haggin Perry and established himself as a very smart performer in the colors of Perry's widow. As one might expect, Boundary has a very illustrious pedigree. His first four dams--Edge, Ponte Vecchio, Terentia and Romanita--were all well above average and Boundary also looked a very good prospect when he won his first two starts in the April and May of his three-year-old season.

Unfortunately, Boundary wasn't able to race again until January and didn't make his stakes debut until the end of May 1994, when he extended his unbeaten run to five with his win in the GIII Roseben H. Another very good win came his way in the GIII A Phenomenon H., when he took advantage of a three-pound concession from Cherokee Run to beat him a half length. That, though, proved to be his last appearance after only eight starts, and he clearly wasn't easy to train.

The pedigree of Minardi's dam, Yarn, displays the same depth of quality as Boundary's. Yarn's sister Preach became a GI winner in the Frizette S. and looks set to become a very familiar name as the dam of Claiborne's highly promising Pulpit. Minardi's second dam, Narrate, was one of four Graded stakes winners produced by Nijinsky's daughter State and his fourth dam, Monarchy, was a full sister to Round Table. The presence of Nijinsky in his pedigree means that Minardi is inbred 3x5 to Northern Dancer and this seems to be one of the ways to get the best out of Boundary--Conserve is inbred 3x3, while She's Classy, Barrier and Solar Bound are inbred 3x4. Roxelana, on the other hand, is inbred 3x4 to Damascus.

To The Victory had been knocking on the door of graded-stakes company of late and ran a good second in the G3 Mermaid S. July 9. The bay had an awkward beginning but recovered nicely to assume command early. The race favorite led into the homestretch and was just able to withstand a late run from Eidai Queen, who came from the back of the pack to miss narrowly. "I cannot believe such a filly has not captured graded-race success before," remarked winning jockey Shinji Fujita. "It was not a clear break, but once she started having her spirit, she never gave up and I just pushed her in the final stretch." The G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup at Kyotoon Nov. 12 is the next major goal for the winner.

#### WALTER GREENMAN DIES

Trainer Walter Greenman died Sunday at his home in San Diego after a year-long battle with cancer. He was 60. Greenman, nicknamed "The Silver Fox" for his shock of gray hair, had trained for over 40 years. Born on July 4, 1940, he started out as a jockey at 16 in Arizona, but turned to training at Turf Paradise in 1959. At the urging of "Donut King" Verne Winchell, Greenman shifted his base to Northern California in 1969, becoming one of the leading trainers at Bay Meadows and Golden Gate. He moved to Southern California in the early '90's, training such stakes winners as Admise, Country Garden, Hidden Lake, Pacificbounty, Pinfloron and Savinio. Greenman underwent surgery last August for a brain tumor, but returned to the track a few days later, saddling Such Charisma in the Pacific Classic. The Del Mar Thoroughbred Club will hold a memorial service in the paddock Friday morning following training hours, with track chaplain Ted Bear, a part owner of Pacificbounty and a longtime friend of Greenman, officiating. Greenman is survived by his wife, Jeannie: two daughters, Debra and Donna; and a son, Dean. Dean Greenman has served as his father's assistant for many years.

#### SAINT BALLADO COLT TOPS PREFERRED

SALE A colt by Saint Ballado out of the unraced mare Astarte (Deputy Minister) brought a final bid of \$240,000 to top Sunday's Saratoga Preferred Yearling Sales in upstate New York. Consigned to the sale by Sugar Maple Farm, the ticket was signed by Buzz Chace, acting as agent. Named Lord Ofthe Thunder, the colt is out of a half sister to Honky Tonk Tune (Cure the Blues), Canadian champion two-year-old filly of 1994 and multiple stakes winner of over \$300,000. Chace was also the buyer of the session's second highestpriced offering, hip number 381, a filly from the second crop of A. P Jet. Out of Final Accord (D'Accord), the filly is a half sister to a pair of black-type performers, including Try N Sue (Sir Harry Lewis), multiple stakes winner in New York-bred company and third in the 1998 GIII Florida Oaks. She was hammered down for a winning bid of \$200,000. Overall, a total of 82 horses were sold for gross receipts of \$3,420,700 for an average of \$41,716, while 43 lots were reported as not sold. The gross was ahead by 22 percent against the corresponding figure from 1999, while the average rose by nearly 15 percent.

"She was just galloping along," said Peter Hutton, Baffert's assistant who was aboard for the breeze. "If I took her off the bridle, she would probably go in :56. She's doing great." "Might and Powers don't come along every five minutes and we have to look after him. I have my heart in my mouth every time I see him gallop and I say a few prayers along the way."

#### **SUNLINE TO MOONEE VALLEY**

Trainer Trevor McKee has announced that multiple Group 1 winner Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) will return from a 15-week layoff in Saturday's G1 Manikata S. at Moonee Valley. The five-year-old mare had been expected to start against Might and Power (NZ) in the Warwick S. the same day, but the Australian Jockey Club's decision to move the race from the overworked Warwick Farm track came too late for McKee.

### "DARK HORSE" REPORT

#### **DARK HORSES UPDATE**

by Tom Frary

The TDN dark horses have gone from strength to strength since the last mention was made in June. At the forefront now stand subsequent Classic winners Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain {USA}) and Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). The former turned around the Epsom Oaks form at The Curragh July 16 when taking the G1 Irish Oaks in stunning style, with another dark horse, Kalypso Katie (Ire) (Fairy King {USA}), who had finished in front of Sir Michael Stoute's filly when runner-up at Epsom, in fifth place. Samum was equally impressive when a five-length winner of the G1 BMW Deutsches Derby Hamburg July 2, where the runner-up Subiaco (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) sealed a one-two for the dark horses. The winner could be a force to be reckoned with in any European middledistance event in the autumn. Henry Cecil's Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) followed his third placing behind Sinndar (Ire) in the G1 Epsom Derby June 10 with a Group 1 success in the Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp June 25. The colt will hopefully be back in action in the autumn, where he can build on his efforts so far in the highest company. July was certainly a fruitful month for the dark horses, with Sir Michael Stoute's Interlude (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) rounding it off by winning the G2 Prix de Pomone at Deauville July 30. She may now head to York's Ebor meeting next week to take on stablemate Petrushka in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, with her longterm target being the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 9. Success at Deauville continued with Hidalguia (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) this month, with the filly getting in on the winning act by taking the G3 Prix de Psyche Aug. 5. On Sunday, Indian Ruby (Ger) Selkirk (USA)) carried on the relentlessly consistent form of the dark horses by finishing a length-and-a-half second to Wild Side (Ger) in the G2 Europachampionat Hoppegarten. Freddie Head will be hoping that Kutub (Ire) (In The Wings (GB) can get back to winning ways in today's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville, following his fourth in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 4. Romanylei (Ire) (Blues Traveller {Ire}) took her own slice of the limelight with success in the opening race at Saturday's Shergar Cup meeting, and she looks the current pick of the Irish list. With a total of three Classics, four Group 1s, and 15 stakes successes already in the bag, the latter part of the season can only be awaited with keen interest. It is worth remembering that two of the greatest horses of recent times, Montjeu (Ire) and Dubai Millennium (GB), made up the list of 1999, and that tells a tale all of its own.
