INTERNATIONAL GIANT

Proving his quality once again, Magnier and Tabor's **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat) battled his way home in the G1 Juddmonte International S. yesterday at York. This undoubted superstar recorded his fourth G1 success in 63 days in a manner which befits his iron will and yet again he tempted his supporters into thinking this would be the occasion that he may be undone. True to the well rehearsed script, he allowed his main rival, **Kalanisi (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}), the honour of enjoying a fleeting brush with the lead before striking like a coiled snake as the line approached to become the first horse to record victories in the G1 St James's Palace S., G1 Coral-Eclipse, G1 Sussex S. and G1 International. Stablemate **Shoal Creek (Ire)** (Fairy King) was sent straight to the front to set the pace, with Michael Kinane keeping **Giant's Causeway** close up in second as Pat Eddery employed a watching brief in third aboard **Kalanisi**. The chestnut with the rakish blaze strode into the lead with 2 1/2 furlongs to go, while Eddery had **Kalanisi** make his bid down the centre of the track so as not to engage in a close battle with the renowned dueller and challenged for the lead at the quarter-mile marker. The tactic looked to have paid off as **Kalanisi** hit the front at the distance, but he began to drift towards **Giant's Causeway** with 150 yards to go. The was to be his undoing as the **Giant** continued to give his utmost and, with a target to aim at in the closing stages, Kinane guided his mount back into the lead in the last strides for a memorable win, a repeat of their epic finish in the G1 Coral-Eclipse. The pair finished well clear of the remainder with **Lear Spear** (Lear Fan) just getting third. Winning trainer Aidan O'Brien said, "What he does is play with the other horses in that he lets them come to him, but then he changes his legs and goes away again. Mick didn't see **Kalanisi** until fifty yards to go, but he knew he had to let him [**Giant's Causeway**] see **Kalanisi**. It doesn't matter what trip he goes at because, with his style of running, it depends on horses coming to him. We are only getting to the tip of the iceberg with him and he just toys with Mick. The main target is the Breeders' Cup, but the Queen Elizabeth II S. [Ascot, Sept. 23] would fit nicely into his schedule." Kinane added, "He loves a fight and he's not happy unless he is scrapping. You'll never get to the bottom of him because he is so tough and so hard." *Chart p2*

SELECT SIX FOR YORKSHIRE OAKS

Today's G1 Aston Upthorpe Yorkshire Oaks will feature a clash between Epsom Oaks winners for the first time since 1983 when trainer Henry Cecil sends out his pair of **Diesis** (GB) fillies, the four-year-old **Ramruma** and the three-year-old **Love Divine** (GB). As a show of class, this renewal is the highlight of the week at York. Sir Michael Stoute has won this race five times since 1978, and he offers a tour de force of talent this year in his attempt to extend that record. **Petrushka (Ire)** (Unfuwain) failed to live up to early expectations when third in the G1 1000 Guineas Newmarket May 7, and fourth in the G1 Epsom Oaks (June 9), the latter of which was won by her chief rival here, **Love Divine**. Her brilliant performance in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 16 at last provided connections with the justification for the high praise that has always followed her. If she hits that level of form again, she will give Henry Cecil's filly more to think about than at Epsom. That trainer has also mastered this race in his illustrious past, taking four renewals, including the last two. In 1999, he sent **Ramruma** to victory here after success in the Epsom Classic, and although she lines up again, the chestnut was very disappointing when last in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket May 5. She has had problems, but she is evidently well again, and if she is approaching her form of last year when she took the G1 Epsom, Irish and Yorkshire Oaks, she must be respected. However, the talented but unlucky **Love Divine** is the choice of stable jockey Richard Quinn, and she looks the more likely of the duo to capture this contest. She has been absent since suffering from mucus in her lungs, a problem which has plagued her in the spring and summer, but she is well again now and demands respect. Stoute also runs **The Queen's Interlude** (GB) (Sadler's Wells), who needs to improve on her win in the Deauville's G2 Prix de Pomone July 30. Michael Jarvis' G3 Lancashire Oaks (Haydock July 8) winner **Ela Athena** (GB) (Ezzoud {Ire}), who was runner-up to **Ramruma** in this last year, will be more at home over this trip, having chased home **Crimplene** (Ire) over an inadequate extended nine furlongs in the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood Aug. 5. **Miletrian** (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) took the G2 Ribblesdale at Royal Ascot June 22, but was no match for **Petrushka** when sixth to that filly at The Curragh. *Field, More Previews p3*

Jockey Johnny Murtagh was roundly criticised for being too easy on Air Marshall when he was beaten a short head in the G3 Peugeot Gordon S. at Goodwood Aug. 1, but his tactics were impeccable this time and his mount is now 5-1 favourite with most bookmakers for the G1 Rothmans Royals St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 9 after this clear-cut victory, in which he easily reversed the form of the Listed July Trophy at Haydock July 8 when beaten a head by Marienbard. Air Marshall's stable companion Dalampour was the reluctant leader from Subtle Power (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and French Fellow (Ire) (Suave Dancer) and set a pedestrian pace until quickening at the half-mile point, where the field closed. Murtagh switched Air Marshall towards the outside two furlongs out, found a perfect split and quickened impressively into the lead and went clear, coming home a comfortable winner from Marienbard, who got up to catch Dalampour on the line for second. "He was always going well," said Murtagh. "Nothing else picked up in front, so I had to ease to the outside and he quickened up really well. I should have won at Goodwood, but I went too soon. Today has made up for that misjudgement. The extra two and a half furlongs of the St Leger will be no problem for him and he's got the speed to go with it too." Air Marshall was trainer Sir Michael Stoute's fourth winner of this event and he said of his two colts, "There was no gallop and Dalampour was forced to make the running and may have been unlucky. Air Marshall shouldn't be inconvenienced by the extra distance of the St Leger and he will go there. But we're planning a four-year-old career for Dalampour and my advice is not to rush in and back him for the Leger just yet."

There must be something in the water at Mark Johnston's Kingsley House yard as Royal Rebel provided the stable with yet another stakes win in typically gritty fashion. Having shown an aptitude for a fight when successful in the G2 Goodwood Cup Aug. 3, he once again showed true battling qualities to oust Rainbow High in a dour struggle for the prize. The race began in earnest once the field entered the long straight as Royal Rebel was roused along with a half mile to go. Rainbow High eased into the lead at the quarter-mile marker as Ski Run challenged on the outside looking dangerous, with Royal Rebel responding to each and every one of Michael Kinane's questions. Ski Run's chance was lost at the furlong marker as her saddle slipped with Frankie Dettori having to endure a high speed bareback ride. The action at the head of affairs was a duel between Rainbow High and a gallant Royal Rebel, whose tenacity and determination saw him gain the upper hand in the dying strides for a minimum margin success. Though Dettori's first thought was one of self-preservation, he nonetheless still had the presence of mind to give Ski Run some necessary encouragement close home to retain a deserved third place.

With Aidan O'Brien's Hemingway (Ire) showing the stable's wellbeing by winning on the first day of this three-day festival, the unraced Juniper is relied upon in an attempt to emulate Mull Of Kintyre's win for Ballydoyle in this event last year. French Empire is another making his debut here with Miami-based trainer Franck Mourier using this race as preparation for the valuable sales-related race at next month's St Leger meeting at Doncaster. The home challenge is headed by Hurricane Floyd and Media Mogul. The former was second to Saratov (GB) on his debut and broke his maiden in impressive style beating some useful individuals, including Bannister, at Newmarket Aug. 5. Media Mogul took the step up to Group company in his stride and was unlucky in defeat when just outbattled by Noverre in the G3 July S. at Newmarket July 12.

FROM THE DESK OF...

DEAUVILLE ... UP THE LADDER

It wasn't so much a question of fireworks during Deauville's first three days, Saturday through Monday (finishes today), more one of strong, steady trade. The Saturday/Sunday evening sessions after the races have always been the sale's headline sessions, but Monday's third, day-long session has been steadily improving, and that showed the biggest improvement of all this year.

At the end of the first two sessions, Saturday/Sunday, the totals for this year showed 103 sold, gross FF126,650,000, average FF1,229,612; pretty good figures--gross up 29 percent, average up 16 percent from last year, with twelve fewer sold. Monday more than made up that difference, though: 141 sold, 29 more than in last year's session, with the gross up 60 percent, to FF64-million, and the average up 25 percent, to FF455,035. Last year's sale, with a gross of FF179.8-million, missed 1985's all-time record (FF180,850,000) by just over 1-million francs. By close of business Monday, that record was gone: the first three sessions this year grossed FF190,810,000. The whole sale should gross around \$30-million, which we can safely say completes Deauville's ascendancy into the Northern Hemisphere major yearling sale catalogue. They get to go first among the major European sales, and, as of now, what happens there definitely counts.

FORM LINES ... 3YO'S, GRASS

I preach a lot about form, and last week there were a couple of results which had big implications for followers of form. First, let's look at the result of the G1 Secretariat S., three-year-olds, 10f grass, on the Arlington Million card. The race was won by *Ciro*, a Woodman colt out of Hector Protector and Bosra Sham's half-sister, the Nijinsky mare Gioconda. *Ciro* came and collared King Cugat, America's best three-year-old grass colt, winner of his last three, with 4 1/2 lengths to the third. The form had a solid look about it--Andy Beyer told me that King Cugat went into the race off a 106--a very good figure for a three-year-old on the grass--and that *Ciro* probably ran around a 109, running just two ticks off Chester House's time in the Arlington Million.

What's significant about this? *Ciro*'s best win this year came in the G1 Prix Lupin in which he upset favorite Kutub in what reads now like a very solid performance. *Ciro* was then drowned--like everybody else--by Holding Court in the French Derby; frontrunning stayer, at the top of his game, simply galloped his rivals into the ground. Then *Ciro* finished third, beaten 10 lengths, to *Sinndar* in the Irish Derby. It would be wildly optimistic to say that *Ciro* was even within five lengths of horses like *Sinndar* and the remarkable *Giant's Causeway*, who yesterday won his fourth straight Gr. 1 after being beaten in two 2000 Guineas. The point is, if *Ciro* can beat the best American grass three-year-old, why aren't there more Group 1 horses coming over and plundering American prize money? There's some evidence that sound, high-class European racehorses move up a Group in America. *Ciro* is yet more evidence.

FORM LINES...EUROPEAN 2-YEAR-OLDS

Two-year-old form is always the most difficult to unravel, not least because it evolves rapidly, and not necessarily in race sequence. There have recently been a few interesting developments on the European two-year-old front, which I suspect have implications for the future, and which may not yet have been fully appreciated. Here's what I mean.

There have been two G1 six-furlong races run this month which suggest the two-year-old form up till now may have little long-term significance. The first of these was the Gr. 1 Heinz 57 Phoenix S., run a couple of weeks ago in Ireland. This was won by the Aidan O'Brien Boundary colt, *Minardi*, who ran away by five lengths from previous Group-winning fillies *Superstar Leo* and *Dora Carrington*. There was some suggestion the form should not be taken at face value, but two Group winners finished second and third, and were beaten five lengths.

Then there was last weekend's G1 Prix Morny at Deauville. Here, the Brian Meehan-trained Common Grounds colt *Bad As I Wanna Be* (please, Mr. Allbritton--that's almost as bad as *Benny the Dip*) ran off and hid by six lengths, with previous Group winners second, third and fourth. He does have a terrible name, but he looked a very fast colt to me. In those two races, the winners of the Norfolk, the *Cherry Hinton*, the

Richmond, the July S. and the Robert Papin were comprehensively beaten. Therefore, the two best two-year-olds in Europe, as of now, are Minardi and Bad As I Wanna Be.

That's pending today's Gimcrack, and especially tomorrow's Lowther. There Enthused, a really impressive winner of the Princess Margaret S. after having been narrowly beaten by Dora Carrington in the Cherry Hinton, meets Khulan, an impressive Newmarket July maiden winner by Bahri, trained by John Dunlop for Sheikh Hamdan. You can definitely throw the winner of that in the mix.

And four interesting form lines from seven-furlong races, two involving first-year sires: (1) last Saturday, at Sandown, King's Ironbridge, from the first crop by Sadler's Wells' son, King's Theatre. He won the G3 Solario S. over the Machiavellian colt, Storming Home, with hot favorite Vacamonte nowhere. (2) Yesterday, at York--a good win for Hemingway, the half-brother to Second Empire from Spectrum's first crop. Another Machiavellian colt, Eminence, second, with the previously well-thought of Saratov (had won his last two) firmly put in his place, six lengths away in third. Spectrum and King's Theatre join Celtic Swing, Halling, and Pennekamp on the growing list of very promising-looking European first-crop stallions. (3) Though it did not itself look that hot a contest, Friday's Washington Singer S. (Listed) was won by the hot favorite, Highclere Thoroughbred's Prizeman, a colt by Prized, would you believe. The disappointing second favorite, Swing Band, could only finish fourth. Significantly, Swing Band had been narrowly beaten by Saratov--well beaten yesterday at York, remember--in their previous race. So that form looks devalued. (4) Goodwood, August 2. Lots of reputations dented in the G3 Champagne Vintage S., won in impressive fashion by yet another Machiavellian colt, No Excuse Needed, trained by Michael Stoute for Sheikh Maktoum. That's the third time in this dispatch Machiavellian's name has come up. Please note. Beaten that day: Bonnard (previously third to Vacamonte at Newmarket), a credible second; Baaridd (previously second to Celtic Silence at Royal Ascot), a well-beaten fifth; Chianti, previously two-for-two, faded to sixth after setting too fast a pace.

So add No Excuse Needed to my list of Previously Unheralded First-Time August Group winners I rate Europe's top two-year-olds. There are three on my list right now: Minardi, Bad As I Wanna Be, No Excuse Needed. You didn't know their names before they won their respective races, but odds are you're going to hear their names a lot more from now on. And probably Thursday's Lowther winner. For now. Keep eyes open. Form developing quickly.

ZAFONIC COLT TOPS DEAUVILLE DAY FOUR
A bay colt by G1 2000 Guineas winner Zafonic brought FF650,000, topping all lots on the fourth day of the Deauville August Yearling Sale. From the family of G1 Budweiser Irish Derby winner Winged Love, he was purchased by France Pur Sang for 6C Racing. The sale continued to show strength, as the aggregate was up significantly by 30 percent to FF16,072,000, while the average price rose 29 percent to FF272,407. The clearance rate also remained high, with the percentage of yearlings sold at nearly 82 percent on the day. Philippe Augier, the president of Agence Francaise, was pleased, saying, "We are very satisfied that the market remains strong even when there are fewer international buyers."

The 1987 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victor Trempolino is not a horse who has spent much time in the headlines during his stallion career. He has, however, quietly been building a very respectable record as a sire, and he enjoyed an excellent couple of days at the weekend, with Arkadian Hero (h, 5, Trempolino--Careless Kitten by Caro {Ire}) capturing the G3 Hungerford S. in England on Friday, and Snow Polina taking the G1 Beverly D. S. at Arlington on Saturday.

Trempolino has now sired at least 30 stakes winners from his first nine crops, of which 15 are group/grade winners and four--Dernier Empereur, Germany, Juvenia and Snow Polina--have triumphed in Group/Grade 1 events. Trempolino began his career at Gainesway Farm in Kentucky before moving to the Haras du Mezeray in France for the most recent season. His fee for 2000 was 80,000 FF, and at that he would have to be considered very good value for European breeders.

I would imagine that Trempolino's pedigree presented something of a puzzle for American breeders when he arrived at Gainesway. As a proven mile and a half horse, he was rather atypical of his sire, Sharpen Up, who tended to get sprinters and milers (although, paradoxically, he was also responsible for French Derby winner Sanglamore and Pebbles, who took the Breeders' Cup Turf). In addition, Trempolino is out of a mare by Vice Regent's brother, Viceregal--a champion two-year-old in Canada, but a stud disappointment in Canada, France and Japan--and from a decidedly European and rather modest female line.

The fact that Trempolino is by Sharpen Up out of a Viceregal mare is rather interesting, as there seems to be something of an affinity between Sharpen Up and Viceregal and his brother Vice Regent. Vice Regent's son, Deputy Minister, sired graded stakes winners Clear Mandate and Flag Down out of Sharpen Up mares, and Diesis, a son of Sharpen Up, is responsible for Makura Diesis, a Japanese graded stakes winner who is out of a Deputy Minister mare. In German, Dashing Blade, who is out of a Sharpen Up mare, has sired Group 1 winner Noble Pearl and group winner Kabuki out of mares by Viceregal's son, Esclavo.

As we have discussed in this column before, Vice Regent's son Deputy Minister works with a wide variety of strains, perhaps throwing back to concentrations of the famous tap-root mare Queen Mary, who is in the tail-female line of both Vice Regent and Deputy Minister. Trempolino is also working with a wide variety of strains, and may be picking up on similar backgrounds. It's interesting to note that Trempolino has six crosses of the brothers Pharos and Fairway, and another four of their three-parts relative Sickle. These horses are all out of the sire Chaucer, as is Hyperion (three times in Trempolino's pedigree). What is interesting here is that Chaucer's broodmare sire, Tristan, is a three-quarters brother to Bella Donna, a mare in the tail-female line of Viceregal. Belmona, the fourth dam of Viceregal and Vice Regent, also carries a half-brother to Tristan.

Snow House, the dam of Snow Polina, was twice a stakes winner in France and is by Lyphard's son Vacarme. If the build-up of Chaucer through such as Pharos, Fairway and Hyperion is important to Trempolino, Snow House certainly makes a considerable contribution. She has eight crosses of Pharos/Fairway, one of their relative Sickle, and two of Hyperion. She also has at least three crosses of the notable English sire Solario and this might be significant, as Trempolino goes back to a half-sister to Solario, and his fifth dam, Red Flame, is bred on similar lines to that horse.

The average price this year was \$10,707, compared with last year's \$10,928 for the corresponding session. Median price was nearly level, \$7,000 for this year and \$7,100 for 1999. Held at the Ocala Breeders' Sales and Training Complex, the Open Yearling Sale continues today at 10:30 a.m. and runs through Friday.

"However, this sale represents a profitable, logical move on our part." Produced from the Pleasant Colony mare Vid Kid, Early Warning was purchased by Dogwood for \$75,000 at the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale.
