PETRUSHKA PREVAILS AT YORK

Irish Oaks heroine **Petrushka** (Ire) (Unfuwain) produced a fine run to defeat Henry Cecil's brace of Epsom Oaks winners in yesterday's G1 Aston Upthorpe Yorkshire Oaks. Having finished fourth to **Love Divine** (GB) (Diesis {GB}) in the G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom June 9, the *TDN Dark Horse* gained some measure of compensation when successful in the G1 Irish equivalent at The Curragh July 16. She finally put matters to rights yesterday by gaining revenge on her Epsom conqueror in emphatic style to provide trainer Sir Michael Stoute with his sixth winner of the race. Another pleasing feature of the race was the return to form of last year's winner **Ramruma** (Diesis {GB}), who never gave up to finish third. **Ramruma** went straight to the front and set a genuine pace from last year's runner up **Ela Athena** (GB) (Ezzoud {Ire}) and **Love Divine** as **Petrushka** was ridden with both patience and confidence in fifth. As the field turned for home, **Ela Athena** began to send out distress signals and **Ramruma** tried to kick on for glory. **Love Divine** and **Petrushka** cruised into staking positions at the three-furlong marker with both travelling smoothly. **Love Divine** challenged and led at the quarter-mile marker, but she was immediately tackled and passed by **Petrushka** who quickened to hold a commanding advantage at the distance. With Johnny Murtagh ably deputising for the long term absentee Kieren Fallon, **Petrushka** was ridden out to maintain a healthy buffer zone. "She was more relaxed than she was at The Curragh," Murtagh explained. "Love Divine was travelling well, but I always thought I had a couple of lengths up my sleeve." **Love Divine** lost no caste in defeat and ran on well to claim second ahead of stablemate **Ramruma**. "It was amazing to see her do it like that and to do it so well," said Highclere spokesman Tim Jones. "You can never be confident, but her preparation since the Irish Oaks has gone extremely smoothly and she hasn't put a foot wrong. It was nice to put the record straight with **Love Divine**." Of future plans, Highclere Racing's managing director Harry Herbert added, "Coming here, the favourite was to go for the Champion S. [G1, Newmarket, Oct. 14] next, followed by the Breeders' Cup Distaff [G1, Churchill Downs, Nov.4]. The Arc [G1, Longchamp, Oct. 1] was considered, but going for these two races instead gives her a nice break between races. If all the shareholders agree, then she could be kept in training for next year and then be aimed at the Arc."

SEVEN ANSWER THE CLASSIC CHALLENGE

A field of seven, highlighted by the defending race champion and 9-5 morning line favorite **General Challenge** (General Meeting), will face the starter for Saturday's 10th running of the G1 Pacific Classic. The chestnut homebred, second to **Early Pioneer** in the G1 Hollywood Gold Cup in his most recent effort July 9, will break from post position number two, as he attempts to give owners John and Betty Mabee their third victory in the Classic. The legendary **Best Pal** won the inaugural Pacific Classic in 1991. Stablemate **River Keen** (Keen {GB}), winner of two Grade I events on the East Coast last season, is no better than the 15-1 outsider in Saturday's race and will break from the rail. "I hate to have my two horses together," said trainer Bob Baffert. "I would rather they had been in the middle. We're just happy to be in the race and the horses are doing well," he added. **Skimming** (Nureyev), the 5-2 second favorite, will attempt to give Juddmonte Farms their third Classic victory, following **Tinners Way** in 1994 and 1995. The eight-length winner of the GIII San Diego H. Aug. 6, **Skimming** will be joined in the starting gate by stablemate **Euchre** (Personal Flag), hero of Hollywood Park's GII Bel Air H. July 15. Last year's G1 Super Derby winner **Ecton Park** (Forty Niner) is the lone East Coast shipper for trainer Elliott Walden and was third, beaten 1 1/2 lengths behind **Sir Bear** and **Skimming** in the GIII Cornhusker H. in Iowa July 5. **Tiznow** (Cee's Tizzy) is the only three-year-old in the field and has been installed a 5-1 chance from post four. The full brother to **Budroyale** finished a neck to the good of G1 Haskell winner **Dixie Union** in the GIII Affirmed H. and was second to **Captain Steve** in the G1 Swaps in his most recent start. Last year's GII Pegasus winner **Forty One Carats** (Tactical Advantage) rounds out the septet.

Remaining a maiden after meeting up with a couple of promising individuals on his first two starts, Bannister displayed grit and determination of the highest order here to avenge defeat at the hands of Hurricane Floyd (Ire) (Pennekamp) at Newmarket Aug. 5, and provided trainer Richard Hannon with a famous one-two. He broke smartly from the gate and soon held the call over Taras Emperor (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}) and Lost At Sea (Ire) (Exit To Nowhere) as Juniper, Hurricane Floyd and Zilch were reserved in midfield. Zilch and Juniper made smooth headway into challenging positions from halfway, the former striking the front with 1 ½ furlongs to go. Juniper was squeezed slightly for room at the distance as Zilch came under pressure, but Hurricane Floyd endured greater frustration and couldn't get a clear run. The traffic problems were no distraction to Bannister who rallied in game fashion and, with Johnny Murtagh once again excelling in the saddle, he regained the lead in the dying strides for a deserved first success. Zilch was only denied victory in the closing stages with both Juniper and Hurricane Floyd running with promise. Harry Herbert, again enjoying the delights of the winner's enclosure, said on behalf of The Royal Ascot Racing Club, "It has been very exciting for the club with a mixture of interesting horses and the facilities of the racecourse. When we looked at the card, we thought this race looked a real possibility rather than go for the (Moorestyle Convivial) maiden. We fancied reversing the form with Hurricane Floyd and to do so is fantastic and very exciting."

When hip number 44 crossed the sales ring during the Ocala Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale this past April, little did anyone know that the horse who would come to be known as Flame Thrower would be the sales topper. The chestnut trained like a good thing up to his career bow July 26 and was bet to 3-2 favoritism. He survived an inside duel that afternoon and proved 3/4 lengths the best, the top two eight lengths clear of the rest of the field. A pair of solid works since had the Bob Baffert trainee sitting on go, but the step up into graded-stakes competition is not always an easy one and Flame Thrower was dispatched the third choice in the field of seven. Beneath jockey Corey Nakatani, the colt engaged in a four-way battle for the early lead, but was able to enter the far turn with a narrow advantage. With all challenges successfully turned away, Nakatani switched his mount to the rail and he remained well clear to record his first added-money success. Even-money favored Squirtle Squirt (Marquetry) stumbled at the start and was never involved, finishing fourth. "I sent him away from there running," Nakatani commented. "The track was tight and I figured he could make the lead. He has lots of talent; lots of class." Laffit Pincay, rider of the beaten favorite, said, "He stumbled coming away from there. It cost me the lead. I was going to be first or second. It changed the whole race for me."

Nuclear Debate makes the trip from John Hammond's Chantilly stable and will start as the likely favourite. He was impressive when scorching to success in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 20, and as well as beating subsequent G1 July Cup winner Agnes World he had no less than nine of today's rivals in arrears on that occasion. **Rudi's Pet** was 20th in the King's Stand, but showed his true form when third to Cassandra Go (Ire) and **Eastern Purple** in the G3 King George S. at Goodwood Aug. 1, and he might have won but for a tardy start. If he is to be a factor, he must certainly brush up on his speed from the gate. **Perryston View** and **Watching** are natural front runners and with the prevailing track condition in his favour, the former is confidently expected to put up a bold show. He will bid to repeat his career best performance when an all-the-way winner of the G2 Temple S. at Sandown May 29. **Bernstein** is an interesting recruit to sprinting, trying the minimum distance at the highest level for the first time. He showed an aptitude for the speed game when securing the Shergar Cup Sprint in game style at Ascot Aug. 12. Former stablemate Stravinsky won this year and the Ballydoyle team merits the utmost respect once again.

Enthused, Khulan and Romantic Myth will battle for favouritism with the former the likeliest to be sent off at the shortest odds. Enthused gained compensation for her only defeat at the hands of Dora Carrington (Ire) in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket July 11 when successful in the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot July 29. Her most recent performance stamped her as a filly of immense potential and she is certainly the one to beat. Romantic Myth oozes quality, has speed to burn and is a solid alternative to the likely favourite. She was one of the most impressive winners at Royal Ascot when scorching to an easy win in the G3 Queen Mary S. June 21. She got upset in the stalls on her latest start and did remarkably well to attain sixth place in the valuable Weatherbys Super Sprint at Newbury July 22. She can be forgiven that run and is a solid alternative to the favourite and will bid to emulate the stable's Jemima (Ire) who won this last year. Khulan was a mightily impressive winner of her only start to date, a maiden at Newmarket July 13. For all that she lacks in experience is more than compensated for in the manner with which she disposed of some useful individuals on that occasion. With her stable's juveniles in good form, she is another worthy of consideration.

DEAUVILLE SALE CONCLUDES The Deauville August Yearling Sale concluded yesterday on a very high note, with the aggregate for the five days up 26 percent at FF222,029,000 and the average up 29 percent at FF572,240. Last year's sale was conducted over six sessions. Another remarkable statistic to emerge was the clearance rate, with the percentage of horses sold up from 75 percent in 1999 to 80 percent this year. The median price also climbed by 36 percent from FF250,000 to FF340,000. The top price on the final day of the sale was the FF500,000 paid by Kestin Babel on behalf of Sheikh Rashid al Mullah for hip 484, a colt by freshman sire Jeune Homme produced from a full sister to Grade I winner Admise (Fr). Philippe Augier, President of Agence Francaise, said, "The sale has been a great success over the five days. Fifty-four horses made over FF1 million, bought by 30 different buyers, which reflects the broadness of the market. Seventy-one horses, compared to 49 last year, were sold between FF500,000 and FF1 million in a market that has proved very international. It has been a big success for breeders and it is also worth mentioning that French-based sires have been very successful."

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Affianced (Ire) (f, 2, Erins Isle {Ire}--La Meilleure {Ire}, by Lord Gayle) showed herself to be a juvenile filly with a future with a win in the Listed Debutante Fillies S. at The Curragh this weekend. Affianced has an unusual pedigree with a 5x6 cross of Honeyway, along with Honeyway's half-sister Run Honey, the granddam of Affianced's broodmare sire Lord Gayle.

Winner of the GIII Sapling S. at Monmouth in only his second start, **Shooter (c, 2, Dehere--Defer West, by Gone West)** is a horse with an extremely interesting pedigree. Firstly, he is inbred to Secretariat, who is the broodmare sire of both Dehere and Gone West. Secondly, he has a double of Damascus, the sire of the second dam of Dehere and also of Shooter's own granddam Defer.

It appears the power of the La Troienne family linebreeding may have aided another young sire to record his first stakes winner. **Lady Andromeda (f, 2, Maria's Mon--Shadow Ram, by Ogygian)**, winner of the Everget S. at Delaware Park, is a member of the first crop of champion two-year-old Maria's Mon. Wavering Monarch, the sire of Maria's Mon, is out of a mare with close linebreeding to La Troienne through the very similarly bred Busanda and Better Self. Lady Andromeda's dam is by Ogygian, and his broodmare sire Francis S. is out of Blue-Eyed Momo, a granddaughter of La Troienne and extremely closely related to both Busanda and Better Self.

Gross session receipts were off by 18 percent against last year's figures while the average declined by 10 percent. The median was down by 14 percent, but buybacks for the session were down three percent against last year. The third of four open sessions begins this morning at 10:30 a.m.

NEW PLAN FOR MIGHT AND POWER

Having completely recovered from the injury to his near foreleg which turned out to be nothing more serious than bruising, **Might And Power (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) will have a new schedule designed to culminate in a confrontation with superstar Sunline (NZ). The seven-year-old, who apparently bumped himself in his box, will target the Tramway H. (1350m) on Saturday week in preference to the longer Chelmsford S. on the same day, with trainer Jack Denham concerned about a crossing at the Rosehill track. Owner Nick Moraitis said the gelding would have a hard hitout at Rosehill tomorrow, following his injury scare at the weekend which forced him out of the Warwick S. "He is going to carry two kilos over weight-for-age and I don't think that will be a problem," Moraitis said. "Jack does not want to take any risks at all with Might And Power and he is not happy about him going over this crossing in the 1500-metre race. He might bak at it or it might prove no problem, but Jack is not going to risk it. Might And Power will probably race in the George Main S. [G1, Randwick, Sept. 23] and then head toward the Yalumba S. at Caulfield and the Cox Plate. The Cox Plate will be the race of the century, between Might And Power and Sunline, and may the Australians win." When it was pointed out that Might And Power and Sunline are both New Zealand-bred, Moraitis quipped, "Might And Power has been naturalised. He is a fair dinkum Australian."
