TEN TO TANGO IN FOREGO

A field of 10 sprinters will line up for today's GII Forego H. at Saratoga. The field is headed by the speedy trio of **Richter Scale** (Habitony), **Intidab** (Phone Trick) and **Successful Appeal** (Valid Appeal). Beaten only once in his last six starts, Richter Scale was a dull sixth in the May 29 GI Met Mile before rebounding with a 1 3/4-length victory in the July 15 GI DeFrancis Memorial Dash in his last trip to the post. The six-year-old is winless in two starts at the Spa. Intidab outbattled Successful Appeal by a head in the Aug. 9 GII A G Vanderbilt H., but was disqualified and placed second. The seven-year-old won the GII A Phenomenon over this track last summer. Successful Appeal, fifth in last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint, was making only his second start of the year when the stewards awarded him the Vanderbilt win. Canadian invader **One Way Love** (Regal Classic) takes a four-race win streak into the Forego. The five-year-old is unbeaten at 6 1/2 furlongs. **Bright Valour** (Wild Again) has compiled a three-for-four record at this distance. The colt won the Dr. Fager H. at Arlington in June before running second to Yankee Victor in the GIII Hanshin H. After a poor beginning, he finished a good fourth in the July 22 GII Washington Park H. last time out.

BERNARDON BEST AT BADEN BADEN

Bernardon (Ger) (Suave Dancer) drove to the lead in deep stretch to earn the first group stakes win of his career in yesterday's G3 Darley-Oettingen-Rennen at Baden Baden, Germany. The winner of a pair of Listed races at Dusseldorf in April and July last year, the four-year-old colt was a short head second to Kalatos (Ger) in the G3 Laurent-Perrier-Meile May 28 and third behind Slip Stream in the G2 Berlin Brandenburg Trophy at Hoppegarten July 9. He was beaten one-and-a-half lengths by Power Flame in the G3 Jaguar-Meile Cologne July 30 in his most recent trip to the post, but here he turned the tables on that rival. Racing prominently in behind pacesetter **Banyumanik (Ire)** (Perugino), Bernardon came up the center of the straight, while **Proudwings (Ger)** (Dashing Blade {GB}) challenged on the inside as the long-time leader faded inside of two furlongs to run. Starting his bid from the furlong pole, Bernardon hit the front with 150 yards remaining, and from there he kept on well for a deserving success.

Germany's leading sprint race should see **Areion** and the three-year-old **Sunderland** vie for favouritism with the latter receiving two kilos. Each has won a Group race this season with **Areion** successful in the G3 Holsten-Trophy at Hamburg July 1, and **Sunderland** victorious in the G3 Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten July 22. Both hold a solid chance and are reported to have worked well in recent days. **Arc Royal** and **Barrow Creek** are outsiders capable of springing a surprise and each has the ability to make a claim for a place. **Skip** needs to prove the value of his victory in the G3 Benazet-Rennen at this track June 2, and if confirming that form he possesses the necessary class to mount a strong challenge for honours. **Super Lover** was placed in the Benazet-Rennen and has an outside chance, as does the vastly improved **Kaka**.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

One of the fears for the breed that we see frequently expressed is that the dominance of a few strains will do harm by dramatically decreasing genetic variation. An historic perspective, however, informs us that this type of situation has actually pertained right back to the foundation of the Thoroughbred. In fact, all Thoroughbreds trace back in direct male line to one of three "founding fathers," Eclipse, Matchem and Herod, and through these to just three stallions of Eastern blood, The Godolphin Arab, The Byerly Turk and The Darley Arabian.

So, despite ultimately representing just three male lines, the Thoroughbred has flourished for over 300 years. What in fact happens is that, over the course of time, lines fragment in terms of physical type and aptitude, so that a horse will often be a representative of a near ancestor in name only. Thus, while we may not have a diversity of names in male lines, a diversity of type and aptitude is retained.

If we wish to observe the process in our own era we have only to look at the development of the Mr. Prospector line as represented by **Unshaded**, winner this weekend of the GI Travers S. **Unshaded** is a great grandson of Mr. Prospector, via **Fappiano** and **Unbridled**. Although by Mr. Prospector, **Fappiano** was far more reminiscent physically of his maternal grandsire, **Dr. Fager**. He displayed brilliance at up to a mile, the distance of his most prestigious victory, the GI Metropolitan H. However, through sons such as **Unbridled** (out of a mare by French Derby victor ***Le Fabuleux**); **Quiet American** (out of a mare by **Dr. Fager**, and closely inbred to both that horse and to **Fappiano's** third dam, **Cequillo**), sire of GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. victor, **Real Quiet**; and **Cryptoclearance**, sire of GI Belmont S. hero **Victory Gallop**, the **Fappiano** line has become one of the strongest influences for classic stamina in current North American breeding (incidentally, another **Fappiano** son, **Roy**, has sired many top-class stayers in South America). *Cont. p. 4*

STUD FEE SPIRAL

It's begun. Well, it's been underway for a while really, and especially in the 2000 breeding season. It's not surprising, really; since the recovery began, in 1993, and accelerated in 1995, it's now the eighth straight year of rising prices in the horse business. There were record grosses at the 1999 September sale and November sale, and this September sale, which gets underway in 12 days' time, is sure to set the all-time record gross for a yearling sale. So it's not surprising that the stud fee spiral is underway.

Here are a few numbers being bandied about (nothing official, of course).

Storm Cat--\$400,000 for next year, from \$300,000 this year.

Seeking the Gold--seasons priced well over \$200,000 NG, maybe as much as \$250,000.

Fusaichi Pegasus--probable \$200,000 stud fee on a \$60-something-million price tag.

Lemon Drop Kid--reported \$30-million syndication, \$750,000 a share, plus a kick if he gets Horse of the Year.

Big numbers.

I guess what's surprising, really, is how few stallions there are, relatively speaking, who are actually involved in this dangerous upward spiral. It does create a lot of relative value, if such a concept is even valid in these conditions. Share price to stud fee multiples are also off the graph. Almost, like P/E-to-earnings ratios in tech stocks, as if the whole ratio is in the process of being redefined. It used to be four-to-one, maybe five-to-one; now, on many syndicated sires, seven-to-one is the ratio. All right, there are every-other-year bonuses, and there may be Southern Hemisphere income, but even so...

Partially, no doubt, this share-to-season ratio has come about because of the scarcity of credible syndicated stallions as operations like Coolmore and the Arabs have avoided syndication. But, in any case, these kinds of numbers feel dangerous. Are we in for a replay of the crash of '86, or will the market successfully redefine itself and manage to sustain record prosperity?

Increased book sizes and competition just a little further down the scale (certainly the \$10,000 stallion, possibly as high as \$40,000-\$50,000) have conspired to keep stud fees at this level very competitive. For those who are interested only in playing at the top level, the ticket prices are just getting more and more expensive. But for the vast majority, as we're no doubt going to see in the September sale (and then in stud fees), there is a lot of competition for the buyers' dollars. That serves to suppress the increases to some extent.

The September Sale...

I remember, when I was a kid growing up in Wichita, Kansas, I used to hear these ads on the radio--Monster Marathon Truck Rally, Ark Valley Raceway. So I've taken a vow. This year, I shall not use the words 'monster' or 'marathon' in reference to the September sale. They may be accurate, but they are stale, hackneyed cliches. So...The September Sale. What can we say?

Last year's September sale set a new all-time record for a yearling sale gross, \$233 million--up 37 percent from \$169 million in 1998. Book 1--the two select days--averaged \$256,665 last year. It's unlikely we'll see that sort of increase, but with two more days, it will be a big surprise if a new yearling sale record gross isn't reached.

As has been discussed in the context of the July sale, the presence of yearlings by Top Ten sires in the September sale is a big factor in the sale's success. I reckon there are 189 yearlings by top 10 sires catalogued this year, and it works out to one of every four yearlings in Book 1 being by sires the caliber of Mr. Prospector, Danzig, Nureyev, Storm Cat, A.P. Indy, Unbridled, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Deputy Minister, and Kingmambo. Sire Power. Big Factor.

A staggering 44 stallions have 30 or more yearlings in the September sale, and another 50 stallions have 20-29 each. That's 2,800 yearlings (60 percent of the catalogue) by 94 stallions, which again tells us something about big books, and the centralization of sire power, even as the total number of yearlings offered in September continue to increase. To a large extent, it's still the same category of sires.

A GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner who also had the speed to defeat champion sprinter Housebuster over seven furlongs, Unbridled sired Unbridled's Song and Grindstone (a Kentucky Derby winner) in his first crop, and Banshee Breeze and Manistique in his third. It is the 1997 crop, however, which has really marked his coming of age, as it contains Anees (last season's top two-year-old, but sidelined this year by injury), Red Bullet, winner of this year's GI Preakness S., graded stakes winner Wheelaway and Unshaded.

Unshaded is out of Shade the Flame, a stakes-placed daughter of Caucasus. Ironically, given the subject under discussion, Caucasus is by Nijinsky II, another stallion who represents something rather different from his famous sire, Northern Dancer. Unshaded's granddam, Shadycroft Girl, a minor stakes winner by Buckpasser's half brother, Bupers, also has impressive antecedents. Her dam, Pussy Toes, a daughter of Triple Crown winner Citation, is three-quarters sister to the great filly Silver Spoon, conqueror of the colts in the Santa Anita Derby and Cinema H. as well as being a winner of numerous other stakes against her own sex.

Unbridled and Nijinsky II apart, Unshaded also has linebreeding to stamina factors, the only three males to appear in both halves of his six generation pedigree being Belmont S. winners Native Dancer and Count Fleet, and the out-and-out stayer, Princequillo. The only other linebreeding in Unshaded's pedigree is to Busanda, who won the Saratoga Cup, once an historic test of stamina, and is represented here through her sons Buckpasser and Bupers. The double of Busanda (a granddaughter of *La Troienne) may well be particularly significant here as Unbridled is inbred to Aspidistra, a daughter of Busanda's close genetic relative Better Self (who is by a son of La Troienne).

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Russian Hope (Ire) (h, 5, Rock Hopper {GB}--Dievotchka {GB}, by Dancing Brave), winner of the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville at the weekend, might give us an interesting note for the future. Russian Hope is by a son of Shareef Dancer out of a mare by Dancing Brave. This is interesting since Shareef Dancer is by Northern Dancer and his dam is by a son of Sir Gaylord out of a Tom Fool mare. Dancing Brave is by a son of Northern Dancer and his broodmare sire, Drone, is by Sir Gaylord out of a Tom Fool mare, which gives him a very similar background to Shareef Dancer. This makes us wonder whether Dubai Millennium (out of a Shareef Dancer mare) might not work well with daughters of Dancing Brave.

We note a very unusual pedigree owned by **Dancing John (c, 2, Little Nureyev--Diamond Lady by Diamond Sword)**, a \$2,170 yearling who took the \$100,045 Jack Diamond Futurity. The sire, Little Nureyev (who never won a race in 19 starts), is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a mare by Stage Door Johnny out of a mare by Ribot. The dam, who never ran, is by a grandson of Northern Dancer out of a mare by Stage Door Johnny with a third dam by Ribot. As well as owning two crosses of Northern Dancer, Dancing John goes back in tail-female line to Cosmah, a half sister to Northern Dancer's dam, Natalma.

Five stallions have 50 or more catalogued. That honor roll consists of: Hennessy (54), Saint Ballado (52), Royal Academy (51), Mr. Greeley (50), and Phone Trick (50). Among freshman sires, Boston Harbor (44) and Spinning World (41) are the leaders, and 14 others have 20 or more catalogued: Alphabet Soup (20), Atticus (33), Cat's Career (22), Editor's Note (34), Geri (29), Langfuhr (35), Louis Quatorze (32), Marlin (26), Pulpit (21), Sandpit (37), Siphon (28), Sir Cat (26), Smoke Glacken (22), and Victory Speech (26). In all, 58 different first-year sires have 662 yearlings catalogued--almost a whole book.

Breeders' Cup Mile - Gr.1 winning 3/4 brother to Storm Cat

Champion sire of 49 individual stakes winners

DETTORI CLAIMS MONTJEU "UNPROVEN AT TEN FURLONGS" Leopardstown's racecourse executive is doing its level best to attract an international field for the track's flagship event, the G1 Esat Digifone Irish Champion S. Sept. 9, with the possibility of representatives from Britain, France and Germany joining their Irish counterparts. Racing manager Tom Burke said, "I have spoken to trainer Peter Schiergen about bringing **Sumitas (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) over and he said he will look at the race." Sumitas finished a gallant second to Dubai Millennium (GB) in the G1 Prince Of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 21, and could add spice to a contest already set to feature **Montjeu (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}). John Hammond's stable star may also be accompanied from France by the Andre Fabre-trained **Indian Danehill (Ire)** (Danahill {USA}), winner of this season's G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp Apr. 30. Godolphin looks set to be represented by **Best Of The Bests (Ire)** (Machiavellian {USA}), recent winner of the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville Aug. 15, of whom stable jockey Frankie Dettori said, "Best Of The Bests is going well on the gallops and he is Godolphin's best three-year-old. He will be getting weight from Montjeu so we have to be hopeful of a big run. Montjeu is not proven over ten furlongs yet and I have to be optimistic that I can win at Leopardstown." The Michael Tabor charge won last year's Prix Greffuhle at about 10 furlongs and accounted for this year's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup in his seasonal debut at 10 1/2 furlongs.
