## A.P. INDY DOMINATES SEPTEMBER OPENER

A daughter of A.P. Indy out of GSW Radu Cool (Carnivalay) brought \$2.15 million during Monday's opening session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale to become the highest-priced filly in the history of the event. Consigned by Narvick International, agent for 505 Farms and the estate of Marshall Naify, the bay is from the female family of European Horse of the Year Balanchine. Fiona Craig signed the ticket for the filly and refused to name her client, but the sales slip was signed for Ireland's Moyglare Stud Farm. The price tops the old record, set last year when Demi O'Byrne purchased a Storm Cat filly from Lane's End for \$2 million. The top colt yesterday was by a son of A.P. Indy. The dark bay, from the first crop of Pulpit out of champion Epitome (Summing), brought a bid of \$2.3 million from John Ferguson, acting as agent for Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum. From the Jonabell Farm, Inc. consignment, the colt is a half brother to SW Danjur (Dayjur). "He is an exceptional individual," said Ferguson. "We thought he would make a good price. He's an outstanding individual and in this market you have to pay for those kind." A.P. Indy continued his dominance of Day 1 with the second highest-priced colt, out of champion and MGISW Queena (Mr. Prospector). The chestnut, from the Middlebrook Farm consignment, was purchased by Frank Stronach for \$2.2 million. He is a half brother to Brahms (Danzig), who was twice placed in Group 1 races last season at two. "If you want to be in the stallion business, you have to lay out the money," said Stronach. "We were willing to go. We haven't bid on any of the others, so obviously we thought that he was one of the best. He'll go to Florida and Danny Vella. We'll do the training down there at our farm and then we'll decide what to do with him." Overall, the opening session saw a 31.4-percent increase in average and a 25-percent increase in median. The 13-day sale continues today, with bidding beginning at 10 a.m.

**AT THE SALES WITH...**

It was a bit slow to get going--the first of 37 half-million dollar-plus horses (which was about one in every six sold yesterday) didn't go through until hip 34--and the buy-back rate never did improve, singing along at a 29-percent rate for the session as a whole. But once it did get going, yesterday's opening session of the titanic (yes, that's the word, and it doesn't start with the letter 'm') Keeneland September sale just kept rolling. By the time the juggernaut slowed for a breather, the gross was up 32 percent over last year and the average up 31 percent, to \$309,872. Mind you, Monday's corresponding session last year was 15 percent weaker than Tuesday's; if the same is true this year--and it may be--these percentage gains may be sustained in today's session. If the two sessions are closer together this year, the percentage gain will drop some. Either way--even given the high buy-back rate which translates into disappointed sellers of those horses who didn't make the cut--it's an impressive performance. The Book One average is on course to be double the average in 1997, and nearly triple that in 1995. The gross will have doubled since then.

It was A.P. Indy day yesterday at the sale. There were three \$2 million-plus yearlings in yesterday's session (one last year): two were by A.P. Indy and the other--the actual sales topper at \$2.3-million, appropriately to John Ferguson, the session's leading buyer (10 colts and three fillies for \$9,380,000)--is from the first crop of A.P. Indy's son, Pulpit. So that's a popular brand name.

Not surprisingly, A.P. Indy was the session's leading sire, with six yearlings averaging \$1,158,333. Storm Cat finished a very respectable second, with eight averaging \$815,625. Six of the eight brought \$500,000+, including the session's fourth- and fifth-highest priced horses, at \$1.8- and \$1.75-million. Pulpit wound up third, his five averaging \$665,000, which of course made him leading first-season sire.

Two other stallions who had pretty good days were Deputy Minister (11 averaged \$513,182) and Gone West (eight averaged \$434,375). Look for Gone West to have an even bigger day today. Among the stallions who didn't have such a good day was Seeking the Gold: he had eight colts catalogued yesterday. Six went through the ring, and only two sold.

Besides Pulpit, three other first-season sires had good days yesterday. Spinning World, who returns to Ashford in 2001 after a one-year stint in Japan, had six average \$275,833; quite a few of them are going down well, especially with the European 'judges.' Overbrook's Boston Harbor, whose first foals sold so well last November, had three average \$250,000; and the same stud's heretofore not-so-strongly touted Editor's Note had two impressive colts go through, for \$325,000 and \$300,000, respectively.

A note, too, on the two big names (well, other than Honour and Glory) with their first 2-year-olds running this year. They both held up quite well, actually, with significant numbers. Hennessy had 15 through the ring for 13 sold, and even though the first two brought only \$62,000 between them, the next one brought \$900,000, and he finished up averaging \$241,308. Unbridled's Song had 10 through the ring; the six that sold averaged \$323,333.

#### KEENELAND 2000

The new, football field-size back walking ring at Keeneland worked well yesterday. I personally love all those televisions, so you can actually be all the way out back and still know what's going on in the ring. Lots of good chat about it. It's the first really visible change under the administration of new president Nick Nicholson, but I sense the place, internally, has a whole new pace. I don't mean the pace at the sale, I mean the pace at Keeneland itself. The place is humming with activity.

With 20 years experience as the consummate industry insider, Nick came to Keeneland with the same kind of training and credentials for the job that George Bush--the senior--brought to his presidency: a career of training and preparation for this job. But the consummate insider has positively run into public view, and seems to be a real force for positive change.

An impressive two-length winner in her debut, a 7 1/2-furlong conditions event at Deauville Aug. 8, Green Minstrel retained her unbeaten record in comfortable style and secured her first pattern success in the bargain. The 11-10 favourite was rated in fourth by Olivier Peslier, who had guided her to victory at Deauville, as Winter Solstice dictated the tempo from Sizal (Fr) (Sicyos) and Polyandry. Peslier positioned his mount in second, two lengths behind Winter Solstice, from the two-furlong pole and made a concerted challenge at the distance. Green Minstrel responded with enthusiasm, grabbed the lead with 150 yards to go and ran on in pleasing fashion for a thoroughly deserved victory. Winter Solstice finished well for second, but had no answer to the winner's kick. Polyandry fared best of the remainder, keeping on at one pace for third. Winning trainer Jean-Marie Beguigne said, "She is a sweet filly to train, has lots of quality and a big heart. She has a smooth action and loves good ground. All being well, she will run in three weeks time in the one mile [G1] Prix Marcel Boussac [at Longchamp, Oct. 1]."

In these days of three-figure stallion books, it is easy to forget that the leading sires of the '80s tended to sire crops of about 40 or 50 named foals. Blushing Groom, for example, never sired more than 56 named foals in a single crop and this, combined with the health problems which plagued him from the age of 14, restricted his output to 512 named foals (compared to Mr. Prospector with over 1,000 and Riverman with over 950).

Fortunately, his restricted output did not prevent Blushing Groom from leaving a lasting legacy, as we were reminded Saturday. In the U.S., Blushing Groom's son Rahy was responsible for GI Man o'War S. winner Fantastic Light and, in England, Blushing Groom's son Rainbow Quest was represented by his second G1 St Leger winner, Millenary. For good measure the G1 Irish Champion S. developed into another showcase for the rare talents of Giant's Causeway--a colt produced by a Rahy mare.

Rainbow Quest and Rahy share more than just their sire. Rainbow Quest is out of a Group-winning daughter of Herbager, while Rahy has Herbager's influential daughter Ballade as his second dam. While they differ widely in physique and racing requirements, both have done extremely well, with mares by Northern Dancer line stallions playing major roles in their success. Fantastic Light follows Serena's Song, Exotic Wood, Tranquility Lake and Early Pioneer as Rahy's fifth Grade I winner and the fourth with a dam by a son of Northern Dancer.

The Arc-winning Rainbow Quest has yet to provide his owner Khalid Abdullah with a St Leger winner, but he has gone close to doing so with Armiger (second in 1993) and High And Low (a filly who failed only narrowly to hold off Rainbow Quest's son Nedawi two years ago). However, the Prince will have taken some satisfaction that Millenary is out of a mare by his other Arc winner, Dancing Brave, a grandson of Northern Dancer. The handful of horses aged three or more bred to this pattern includes Rainbow High, winner of the G3 Jockey Club Cup over two miles.

Winners of the St Leger usually struggle to win support from leading breeders nowadays, but Millenary could well develop into an exception. The mating which produced him was inspired by the tremendous 1995 efforts of Spectrum, a colt by Rainbow Quest out of a half-sister to Millenary's dam, Ballerina. Spectrum established himself as one of Rainbow Quest's fastest sons by winning the Irish 2000 Guineas and later added the Dubai Champion S. over 1 1/4 miles.

Spectrum's first foals are now juveniles and are busily creating a very good impression. His nine winners in Britain and Ireland feature the high-priced Hemingway, who looked a very exciting prospect when he won the Acomb S., and the promising colts Overspect, Golan, Spettro and Man of Distinction. Spectrum's Italian son Blu Air Gun is also a Listed winner.

Another bonus for Millenary is the fact that Spectrum's half-sister Ballet Shoes is now the dam of Petrushka, who staked strong claims to being the best three-year-old middle-distance filly in England by winning the Irish Oaks and Yorkshire Oaks. Millenary's second dam, the smart Dancing Shadow, is a half-sister to Sun Princess, winner of the Oaks and St Leger in 1983, and to Saddlers' Hall, runner-up in the 1991 St Leger.

This exceptional family has been largely developed by the Weinstock's Ballymacoll Stud in Ireland. It must have been galling for Lord Weinstock to see his homebred Air Marshall come off second to Millenary, as Millenary's dam Ballerina was sold by Ballymacoll for 130,000gns at the end of her racing career. However, Ballymacoll still have several members of this wonderful family, including Spectrum's two-year-old sister Drag-net.

☆ **TDN SALE ROI** ☆

Dear *TDN* Subscribers:

As we're sure you're aware, we recently introduced a new statistical feature, *Insta-Tistics*, which tracks sire averages from individual sales as well as year-to-date averages. The feature was introduced with this spring's two-year-old sales, has been published for the summer's yearling sales, and will continue to be updated throughout the sales year.

While we plan to introduce other sire statistics, including those which track both commercial and racing performance, today we debut a statistic, *The TDN Sale ROI*, to help buyers get a better feel for the ups and downs of the market. For example, we all see that a sale is up by 20 percent, but if the commensurate stud fee expense is up 15 percent, the benefit is not quite as it seems. After each sale, we will publish a ratio of the yearling prices divided by the sires' stud fees (the '98 stud fee for this year's yearlings, for example), and the yearling prices divided by the 2000 stud fee, i.e., the replacement stud fee. We will also offer the average and the median for these ratios.

We will also calculate the corresponding ratios from the prior year, giving you a meaningful comparison from year to year. Later in the week, we will debut the *TDN Stallion ROI*.

**Bill Oppenheim's Opinion...**

This new 'sale ROI' statistic--taking a sale's average and median by dividing sire's totals by 'stud fee paid' (1998 for 2000) and 'replacement stud fee' (2000 fee) --illustrates graphically how stud fees have risen in the last three years. The 2000 Keeneland July sale average was 10.18 times the stud fees paid in 1998; by 2000, those same stud fees had risen to such an extent that the sale average was only 7.70 times the 2000 fees. This means the stud fee component of the yearling production cycle has risen by almost a third (32 percent) since 1998.

As a consequence--as these figures illustrate--profitability has fallen this year even as prices have risen. Keeneland July was the exception: there the average price x stud fee aid was 10.18, whereas in 1999 the multiple had been 9.32. At the two other summer sales, the key multiple fell--9.01 to 7.75 at Fasig July, 12.91 to 11.68 at Saratoga. From 1995 through 1999, we estimate that yearling prices went up faster than stud fees, which improves profitability. These figures signal an interruption in that trend.
