SEPTEMBER SPECTACULAR

On a day when seven-figure price tags were commonplace and frenzied bidding the norm, a colt by Storm Cat set off the biggest fireworks when he sold for a record \$6.8 million at yesterday's second session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. It was the highest price ever for a Keeneland September yearling and the highest price paid for a yearling in North America since Seattle Dancer (\$13.1 million) and Laa Etaab (\$7 million) sold in 1985. The chestnut colt, consigned by Lane's End as agent, was purchased by Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne for Coolmore Stud. The yearling is out of Hum Along (Fappiano) and is a three-quarters brother to 1996 champion two-year-old filly Storm Song (Summer Squall). "I knew that he would make a good price," admitted O'Byrne. "Going in, we expected that he would be higher than the top horse last year." Last year's Keeneland September topper was a \$3.9 million Kris S. colt. O'Byrne indicated the Coolmore team was willing to go even higher than the \$6.8-million bid. Bloodstock agent John Ferguson, acting on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum, was the underbidder on the record colt. Ferguson said, "Obviously, we both had him rated very, very high. They just had him rated one bid higher than we did." Lane's End owner William Farish added, "He's one of the best we've ever raised and obviously we're thrilled with the price." When asked to compare the sale of yesterday's yearling to the sale of Seattle Dancer, who he co-owned, Farish said, "There is one big difference between now and back then when we had the big sales. Then, we really only had two buyers. Now we have so many people that are interested and able to play at that end of the game."

World-Record Fillies

Two fillies reached the \$4-million plateau yesterday and hip number 632's final price of \$4.4 million is a world record for a yearling filly. The daughter of Storm Cat and MG1SW East of the Moon (Private Account) was purchased by Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate from the consignment of Lane's End, agent. The dark bay filly wrested the world record from hip number 589, a filly by Theatrical--Claxton's Slew (Seattle Slew), who brought a then-record bid of \$4 million from John Ferguson Bloodstock for Sheikh Mohammed.

The \$4-million yearling is a half sister to champion Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}). "In our opinion, she was the best individual filly in the sale," said Ferguson. "It is our goal to win the big races. Sheikh Mohammed and Godolphin thrive on competition and to be successful in the United States, we have to purchase fillies like this one."

\$5.3M Kingmambo Colt

Although he missed out on the \$6.8-million yearling, Sheikh Mohammed was able to secure the day's second highest price, a colt by Kingmambo--Battle Creek Girl (His Majesty), for \$5.3 million. "I like him better [than the topper]," the Sheikh admitted. "Much better." Ferguson added, "He's a lovely colt; a grand individual. He's the type of horse than can race on either side [of the Atlantic]." The colt, who was consigned by Lane's End, is a half brother to graded stakes winners Tricky Creek (Clever Trick) and Speed Dialer (Phone Trick) and a full brother to multiple graded stakes winner Parade Ground.

Million-Dollar Bonanza

Keeneland sold 19 yearlings for \$1 million or more during Tuesday's second session. After two days, 27 yearlings have reached seven figures at this year's sale. During last year's entire auction, Keeneland sold 23 yearlings for \$1 million or more. Lane's End consigned 10 of the 19 million-dollar babies. "What a day," said W.B. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland's Director of Sales. "It was a great day. We sold a lot of good horses for a lot of money. The consignors have brought us some outstanding horses and the buyers are looking to buy them. The top end of the market is very, very strong." The 13-day sale continues today at 10 a.m.

WORLD CUP CARD WORTH OVER \$15 MILLION

The Dubai World Cup Committee announced yesterday increases in two of the seven races on the Dubai World Cup card, making the March 24, 2001 program worth \$15,250,000. The purse of the Godolphin Mile (8f, dirt) was increased from \$250,000 to \$1 million while the Golden Shaheen (6f, dirt), won last year by Big Jag, had its purse doubled to \$2 million. Both of the races have been awarded Group 3 status for 2001. The World Cup, with a purse of \$6 million, remains the richest race in the world. "The Dubai World Cup is the benchmark for international racing and we have simply raised the bay by increasing the international lure for all races on the program," Dubai World Cup Committee Chairman Les Benton told *Thoroughbred Times Online*.

KALDOUN DEAD Kaldoun (Fr) (Caro {Ire}), a leading French sire in the 1990s, was euthanized last Friday at Haras d'Etreham near Bayeux, France, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. The 25-year-old stallion was pensioned earlier this year. Racing for The Aga Khan, Kaldoun was multiple group placed in France in 1978 and 1980. He is the sire of Group/ Grade 1 winners Occupandiste (Ire), See You Soon (Fr), La Koumia (Fr), Mercalle (Fr) and Spadoun (Fr). Kaldoun sired 320 winners and the earners of over \$24 million.

A son of Roberto out of the His Majesty mare, Andover Way, the stallion Dynaformer is closely related to two other talent sons of Roberto, Brian's Time and Sunshine Forever. Brian's Time (out of Kelley's Time, who was by His Majesty's brother, Graustark, out of the third dam of Dynaformer), earned Grade I victories in the GI Pegasus H. and GI Florida Derby and has gone on to be an outstanding success as a sire in Japan. Sunshine Forever, out of a sister to the dam of Brian's Time, earned honors as champion turf horse of 1988, but was a disappointment at stud in this country and was banished to Japan in 1995.

Dynaformer, wasn't quite as good as Brian's Time and Sunshine Forever, but he did capture three stakes events including the GII Jersey Derby and GII Discovery H. Still, when he retired to stud to stand at a bargain basement fee at Nathan Fox's Wafare Farm, the odds must have been more in favor of his stud career following the fate of Sunshine Forever (who the 17.0 hh Dynaformer more closely physically resembled than Brian's Time, who stood a full hand shorter) than Brian's Time.

However, Dynaformer made the most of his opportunities and his first crop of 47 foals included five stakes winners, among them Blumin Affair who won the GIII San Diego H. and also placed second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S., and the GIII Monrovia H. and GIII Senorita Breeders' Cup H. heroine Rabiadella. Subsequently, the Dynaformer syndicate took the decision to move the horse to Three Chimneys Farm, and continued success has seen his stud fee rise to \$30,000.

Dynaformer has now sired 26 stakes winners from his first seven crops, and also has recent undefeated juvenile stakes winner Baptize in his eighth crop. His latest star is Critical Eye, who joined Vergennes as a second Grade I winner for her sire, with a surprise win in Saturday's GI Gazelle H. Coincidentally, Critical Eye completes something of a full circle for her sire, as she is out of a mare by the Dr. Fager stallion, Dr. Blum, and the two leaders from his first crop were the previously mentioned Blumin Affair (out of mare by Dr. Blum) and Rabiadella (out of a mare by Dr. Fager).

It is rather intriguing to note that Blumin Affair and Critical Eye are two of the only three graded stakes winners out of Dr. Blum mares, and that Blumin Affair, Critical Eye and Rabiadella are the only graded stakes winners bred on the Roberto/Dr. Fager cross. In fact of the eight unrestricted stakes winners by Roberto-line stallions out of Dr. Fager-line mares, three are by Dynaformer, one by his close relative Sunshine Forever and two more by another close relative, Darby Creek Road.

Besides Roberto, who doesn't generally appear to have an affinity with Dr. Fager, the common factor in the pedigrees of Dynaformer and his relatives is the mare, On the Trail. Although there aren't any specifically definable relationships, she does have a rather similar background to that of Dr. Fager with Sir Gallahad III (where Dr. Fager has his brother Bull Dog) and the "old American" triumvirate of Fair Play/Rock Sand, Domino and Ben Brush, so perhaps something is happening there. There has certainly long been an affinity between Roberto and In Reality (out of a mare by Dr. Fager's sire, Rough 'n Tumble). It should certainly be worth continuing to try Dynaformer with mares carrying Dr. Fager and reverse the process and breeding mares carrying On the Trail to stallions carrying Dr. Fager.

KEENELAND: HISTORY IN THE MAKING

Yesterday's session was, without any doubt, one of the greatest single sale sessions in Thoroughbred history. Certainly not anytime in the last 15 years have seven yearlings sold for more than \$3,000,000 in a single session. The seven, by the way, were basically all bought by three buying groups--two to Demi O'Byrne, two to Padua and partners, and three to John Ferguson or Shadwell for the Maktoum family.

Lane's End: King of the World...

Most remarkably, though, six of the seven came from the Lane's End consignment, including two fillies who, within an hour of each other, are believed to have broken the world record for a yearling filly. They certainly broke the Keeneland record, we could confirm that last night--first the Theatrical half sister to Escena and full sister to Humbel, then the Storm Cat filly out of Kingmambo's Classic-winning half sister, East of the Moon. Buyers: John Ferguson, Shadwell.

The tale of the tape for the second session of the titanic September yearling sale says 225 sold for \$94,590,000, and averaged \$420,400 yesterday--gross up 36 percent, average up 53 percent with 11 percent fewer sold (26 percent buy-backs yesterday). That makes the Book 1 gross \$162,142,000 with 443 sold (lowest number ever in the select sessions), for a whopping average of \$366,009: gross up 35 percent, average up 43 percent. So that means in two years the gross has increased by 80 percent, and the average has more than doubled. Gulp.

Put Your Seat Belts on...

It's a wild ride, you see, but often there aren't as many people in that part of the train as we think there are. Just as always, all is not as it may appear to be. Yesterday one consignor had a huge sale--45 horses, just under \$45.7 million; yes, that's an average of over \$1 million. Lane's End sold 20 percent of the horses in

yesterday's session, but they took home 48 percent of the money. The other 180 horses sold yesterday averaged \$271,628. Last year's Tuesday session averaged \$274,516. Add in the one Shadwell (record yearling filly) purchase, and two buyers--John Ferguson/ Shadwell and Demi O'Byrne--bought 27 yearlings and spent over \$40 million (average \$1,489,630). The 198 yearlings they didn't buy averaged \$274,596.

A couple of further thoughts. Monday's median climbed from \$160,000 to \$200,000. Last year, the Tuesday median was \$147,500--lower than Monday's. This year, the Tuesday median gained 22 percent, to \$180,000--still lower than Monday's. The overall Book 1 median went up 30 percent, to \$195,000.

All that was missing were Leo and Kate...

Though still one of the most titanic sessions in the history of Thoroughbred auctions, maybe this all throws a slightly different light on yesterday's session. We've been talking for a long time about the shift from July to September, and yesterday saw the dominance of one consignor who sold six yearlings for more than \$3 million, and three buyers who bought all seven of them. This tends to confirm that what we saw yesterday, plain and simple, was what used to be called a July consignment selling in September. Fortunately for Keeneland, they run both sales.

But I don't mean to underestimate for one second what truly was one of the most spectacular sale days of all time. Lane's End themselves were clearly stunned as the total continued to mount; they never imagined they were going in there with a \$45-million consignment, I'll bet. And, to a certain extent, it was a session of sustained power: 19 yearlings brought \$1 million or more yesterday (14 last year), roughly one in every 12 listed sales, and about one of every 15 yearlings through the ring. So, yeah, it was huge. Breaking (we think) the yearling filly record twice in an hour, yeah, that's huge. Seven yearlings over \$3 million. Huge.

But elements, too, that gave plenty of observers plenty of pause for thought. The top is rocketing up. But--even after yesterday--that's a very rarefied atmosphere. Not too many of us actually breathe it.

Taken to the rail to lead after a furlong by Seb Sanders, she was settled in front as the more-fancied Sacred Song, You Are The One (GB) (Unfuwain {USA}), and Moselle were held up towards the rear. Sanders only started to go to work with two and a half furlongs remaining, where she took off to instantly widen the gap back to the chasing group. Sacred Song and Moselle emerged from the chasing group to attempt to wear down the leader, but neither could get to the winner, who was too strong.

Won last year by Kayf Tara (GB), Saturday's renewal of the G1 Jefferson Smurfit Irish St Leger at The Curragh may offer a more fair contest now that that horse has entered retirement. Godolphin have left in last year's G1 St Leger winner Mutafaweq (USA) (Silver Hawk {USA}), and the 1998 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), in an attempt to make it three consecutive successes in this race. The formidable team of John Oxx and Johnny Murtagh is likely to be represented by dual Listed winner Katiiykha (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), while Dermot Weld has left in Media Puzzle (USA) (Theatrical {Ire}). The latter was fourth in last Saturday's G1 St Leger at Doncaster, while the third there, Chimes At Midnight (USA) (Danzig {USA}), has been supplemented by Luke Comer at a cost of Ir£21,875. Other British horses to stand their ground include Mark Johnston's Yavana's Pace (Ire) (Accordion {Ire}), runner-up in last year's event, and James Fanshawe's Arctic Owl (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}), winner of the Shergar Cup Classic at Ascot last time out. John Dunlop has left in Orchestra Stall (GB) (Old Vic {GB}), but has warned that significant rain must arrive at The Curragh if the G3 Prix Gladiateur (Longchamp Sept. 5) winner is to line up. The forecast is for rain over the next few days, but the going is currently good to firm on the round course.

THE ARC: A ROUGH GUIDE -- Part 1

By Tom Frary and Sean Cronin

In 1978, Alleged (USA) denied the next generation as the last horse to win back-to-back renewals of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Not many horses have been allowed to attempt a follow-up, either as a result of injury or retirement, and those that have tried seem to have found their younger rivals too strong. Helissio (Fr)'s failure in 1997 to reproduce his masterful performance from only twelve moths previously is a glaring example. Sunday's results from "Arc Trial Day" at Longchamp were an eve-opener for many who previously had G2 Prix Fov winner Montieu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) on another plane to his youngers, but suddenly there was Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}), looking capable of anything when decimating the field in the G2 Prix Niel. Montieu used the same race last season as a springboard to the Arc and returned to Longchamp three weeks later to eclipse the bid of El Condor Pasa (USA), who had himself advertised his qualities in the Prix Foy. To the ratings, then; the first reference point for measuring how they square up.

Nigel Gray, senior handicapper at the British Horseracing Board, sees it like this. "Montjeu was rated at 135 (pounds) last year, and he hasn't had to run to that mark so far this season. Sinndar is rated at 128 (pounds), so strictly he has a little to find with Montjeu." John Oxx, trainer of Sinndar, remains optimistic. "We're hoping he's on the upgrade all the time, and it's hard to tell from (Sunday), but it looked like he would be still improving. He's improved with every start throughout his career, and we're just hoping that he's going to keep doing that. He's certainly not going backwards, and we're hoping for the best."

Ominously for connections of this year's G1 Epsom and Irish Derby winner, jockey Michael Kinane was measuring things himself on Sunday and he had Montjeu at 85 percent of his capability. That was due to a training setback which had meant a disrupted work pattern. By that precious first day of October he could be back to the full hundred, and what then? This season he is described by those that know him best as a more mature, faster individual than last year. However, the Arc is a supremely tough test, and only one success is usually reserved, even for the best of them. Allegedly.
