TATTERSALLS HOUGHTON STARTS TODAY

The Houghton Sales begin at Tattersalls in Newmarket at 5:30 p.m. this evening with hopes high that the phenomenal trade at Keeneland September can continue across the Atlantic at Europe's yearling showpiece event. Edmond Mahony, the Tattersalls chairman, said, "I would have to be quite positive. The catalogue is one of the best we've put together, maybe a little smaller than some other years, but I think the better for that. There has been a lot of interest in the catalogue, particularly in the fillies--there seem to be a lot of people looking for fillies." The three-session sale has its smallest catalogue of recent years, with 210 lots entered, but is certainly not low on quality; three major ownerbreeders--Wafic Said, Prince Fahd Salman and the estate of the late Lord Howard de Walden--become significant vendors for the first time. Said's draft, offered from Lord Lloyd-Webber's Watership Down Stud, includes lot 32, the colt Shami (GB) (Rainbow Quest) who is the first foal of the G1 English 1000 Guineas winner Bosra Sham (Woodman). Also from the Watership Down draft, this time a homebred, is lot 54, a colt out of Darara (GB) (Top Ville {GB}) who is one of 26 catalogued by champion sire Sadler's Wells. Another Sadler's Wells sure to attract attention is lot 105, Sorcerous (GB), a halfbrother to Grand Lodge (Chief's Crown), the sire of this year's G1 Epsom and Irish Derby winner Sinndar (Ire). He is offered for the Howard de Walden family's Plantation Stud by Bloomsbury Stud. Lot 119, another by Sadler's Wells, makes his third sales ring appearance in 10 months. His \$1.4 million price tag from Maurice Miller made him top-priced weanling at Keeneland last November; he went back to the same ring in July, but was led out unsold at \$1.45 million. The half-brother to two European Pattern winners is consigned by Voute Sales. With very few well-bred mares currently coming up for sale in Europe, many breeders will be looking to the future, buying fillies with pedigrees. Lot 159, from the first crop of Benny The Dip (Silver Hawk), will have paddock value whatever her racecourse achievements as she is a half-sister to seven black-type winners, including Emperor Jones (Danzig) and Bakharoff (The Minstrel), while similar comments apply to the only Storm Cat listed (lot 141), the first foal of the G1 Spinaway S. winner Oath (Known Fact). The sale continues tomorrow at 3 p.m. and concludes Thursday when the final session starts at 5:30 p.m.

GIANT'S CAUSEWAY TO COOLMORE

Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), the "Iron Horse," will be retired at the end of this year and will stand at Coolmore Stud in Ireland in 2001. Although the six-time Group 1 winner is on target for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs, and possibly Newmarket's G1 Champion S. Oct. 14, he will not race as a four-year-old. His swan song in the Classic may see him face Fusaichi Pegasus, who is set for stud duties next year at Coolmore's Ashford base in Kentucky. Overall, Giant's Causeway has nine wins and three seconds from 12 starts for earnings of £1,563,263. His stud fee has yet to be announced.

FILLIES CLASH IN CHEVELEY PARK

Although she has only won a maiden, Regal Rose (GB) (Danehill) carried with her a substantial home reputation when she won at Ascot in July and she is expected to enhance that reputation in the G1 Shadwell Stud Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket this afternoon. She takes the step forward alongside Enthused (Seeking the Gold) as representatives of the all-conquering Sir Michael Stoute stable. Impressive in her debut, Regal Rose since has been quoted as low as 12-1 for next year's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. She will have to conquer more experienced fillies here, including her stablemate, who has on her resume wins in the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot July 29 and the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 24. Enthused has set the standard with those two successes, but if Khulan (Bahri), third in the Lowther, has improved, she will surely figure. John Dunlop's filly had brushed aside Mujado (Ire) by 3 1/2 lengths on her debut in a Newmarket maiden; the runner-up went on to get within 3/4 of a length of Regal Rose at Ascot. Aidan O'Brien allows Sequoyah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) the chance to build on her impressive success in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh Sept. 3. The runner-up and sixth in that test were third and fourth, respectively, in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot Saturday, giving the form a solid appearance. Whichever filly claims this race, however, it will almost certainly ensure ante-post favouritism for next year's 1000 Guineas, although no winner has gone on to take that Classic since Sayyedati (GB) in 1992. RAMRUMA RETIRED Last year's G1 Epsom Oaks winner Ramruma (Diesis {GB}--Princess Of Man {Ire}, by Green God {GB}) has been retired after finishing third in the Listed Harvest S. at Ascot Sunday. Five-for-six last season, the Kentucky-bred filly also captured the G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Yorkshire Oaks and finished second against colts in the G1 St. Leger at Doncaster. But the four-year-old pulled a muscle early in her 2000 campaign and started just three times. Her best effort was a third-place finish behind Petrushka (Ire) in this year's Yorkshire Oaks. Ramruma retires with five wins, two seconds and two thirds from 10 starts for earnings of \$827,949. Breeding plans have not yet been finalized.

Breeding operations of the magnitude of Juddmonte Farms tend to prefer the security of using proven stallions, but exceptions occasionally have to be made, especially when the breeding operation wants to establish one of its major winners as a stallion.

Consequently, Juddmonte lent strong support to Distant View when this son of Mr. Prospector retired to its American branch at a fee of \$10,000 in 1996. That fee reflected Juddmonte's policy of starting its stallions at sustainable fees and looked cheap in comparison with the prices being charged for some of Mr. Prospector's other unproven stallion sons.

Distant View's modest fee took into account several factors. For a start, he was pretty much an unknown quantity to many American breeders, having finished only seventh of 14 to Barathea in the 1994 Gl Breeders' Cup Mile on his only appearance in the U.S. That proved to be Distant View's final start, even though he was kept in training in 1995, so memories of his recordbreaking victory over Barathea and Grand Lodge in the G1 Sussex S. were beginning to fade by the time Distant View made his debut at stud.

One who hadn't forgotten any of Distant View's excellence was Khalid Abdullah, who had bred the colt from Seven Springs, one of two winners of the G1 Prix Morny produced by La Trinite, a smart daughter of Lyphard. Seventeen of the Juddmonte mares were entrusted to Distant View and he rewarded his owner's faith with 15 foals, two of which have developed into major winners.

Distant Music got Distant View off to a spectacular start with his win in the G1 Dewhurst S., which earned him Timeform's title of champion European juvenile. Now Observatory has taken another of England's championship tests, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., at the chief expense of the remarkable Giant's Causeway.

In sending 17 mares to an unproven stallion, Juddmonte sensibly provided him with mares of different physical types and different racing requirements and Distant View has confirmed his versatility by siring his Group 1 winners from two markedly contrasting types. Distant Music is out of a big, lengthy Nijinsky mare who won over 14 1/2 furlongs, whereas Observatory is out of a small, strong Roberto mare who was fast enoughand precocious enough—to win a Listed race over six furlongs in the July of her juvenile season.

One thing the two Group 1 winners have in common is that they are inbred 5x3 to Northern Dancer and 4x5 to Native Dancer, while Observatory is also inbred 4x4 to Nashua, 1955's Horse of the Year.

Observatory made an easy winning debut in June last year and has clearly progressed extremely well. This is no surprise in view of his pedigree.

His dam, Stellaria, shares seven of her eight great-grandparents with Polemic, another of Juddmonte's Roberto mares (Stellaria's dam Victoria Star was by Nearctic's son Northern Dancer out of Solometeor, while Polemic's dam Solartic was by Nearctic's son Briartic out of Solometeor). Polemic, like Stellaria, had the speed, precocity and class to do well over sprint distances at two, once finishing fourth in the G1 Prix Morny. Nonetheless, Polemic went on to contest classics over 1 5/16 and 1 1/2 miles at three, when she was beaten less than a length in three Group races. That elusive graded win came when she captured the California Jockey Club H. at four.

Polemic's brother Tralos was unbeaten in two races at two before developing into Group 3 winner over 1 1/2 miles.

Observatory has a stallion's pedigree--his second dam Victoria Star was by Northern Dancer out of a daughter of Solar Display, which means she was closely related to Storm Bird, a champion juvenile who was sired by Northern Dancer from a granddaughter of Solar Display.

JULIE KRONE BACK IN THE SADDLE Julie Krone will once again hold the reins of a race horse, but her return to the saddle will be aboard a standardbred, not a Thoroughbred. The Hall of Fame jockey will partner twotime Harness Horse of the Year Moni Maker as the two attempt to set a world record for a trotter under saddle in an exhibition at Lexington's Red Mile Oct. 6. The mark of 1:58.20 was set by Preferential in 1994. Moni Maker, who trotted a career-best 1:52.10 in August, competed in her last race Sept. 9, winning the \$500,000 Trot Mondial in Montreal to become the richest standarbred of all time with \$5,589,256 in earnings. She is also America's top money-winning distaffer of any breed. She has been training under saddle since her last race. Krone, who retired in April of 1999, teamed up with the mare for the first time during a morning workout last Friday at Winners International Training Center in New Jersey. "She's phenomenal," Krone said, "She's so powerful and a complete professional."

MORPHINE POSITIVE FOR FRANKEL TWO horses trained by Hall of Famer Bobby Frankel have tested positive for morphine, according to The Blood-Horse on-line. Starmaniac, who won a claiming race at Hollywood Park June 10, and Mojave Moon, third in the GI Californian S. June 11, both showed traces of the banned substance in post-race tests, and those positives have been confirmed by split samples sent to the Texas Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory. The California Horse Racing Board has ordered that the purses won by the two horses be redistributed. This is not the first time Frankel has had a positive morphine test, but the Eclipse-winning conditioner was cleared of charges after proving that poppy seeds caused a 1996 positive for the drug. He expects to be exonerated once again this time. "One horse had 19 nanograms [onebillionth of a gram] and the other 95," Frankel told The Blood-Horse. "I was told that when an airline pilot flies a plane, up to 350 nanograms is considered legal. I don't understand what the hell is going on. If I'm giving something like morphine to these horses, then I'm either a real...moron or I need to be committed."

CBS SALE ON TAP The Canadian Breeders Sales Company conducts its fall sale of yearlings this afternoon, with bidding beginning at 3 p.m. at the Woodbine Sales Pavilion in Toronto. A total of 222 yearlings have been catalogued for the session. Sires represented in the catalogue include Alphabet Soup and Lit de Justice, the respective winners of the Breeders' Cup Classic and Sprint at Woodbine in 1996; Canadian champion and Classic winner Regal Classic; leading Canadian sires Ascot Knight and Bold Executive; and top two-year-old sire of 2000, Friendly Lover. Stallions represented by their first yearlings include Whiskey Wisdom, Gold Case, Gold Tribute and Tejano Run. The sale will continue Thursday afternoon at 3 p.m. with a single session of breeding stock and horses-in-training.

Rockingham Wrap-Up:

The 2000 season at Rockingham Park ended Sunday with a 3.2-percent drop in daily average attendance and a 9-percent decrease in on-track handle, but a 16.1-percent increase in simulcast wagering which in turn boosted the total handle by 6.5 percent. "We're thrilled overall," Vice President and General Manager Ed Callahan said. "The fact that the on-track handle and attendance were off slightly is more weather related than anything else. MELBOURNE ARRIVALS

Godolphin stayers All The Way (Ire) (Shirley Heights {GB}) and Evil Empire (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) are scheduled to arrive Tuesday afternoon as the first of up to seven international hopefuls aiming for the \$3 million Melbourne Cup on Nov. 7. Godolphin's Lightning Arrow (USA) (Silver Hawk {USA}) is due on Oct. 10 as the stable takes a different tack to last year, when second string runner Central Park (Ire) almost caused an upset when second to Rogan Josh (Aus) in the Cup. This year Godolphin trainer Saeed bin Suroor will send his Cup contenders out to familiarise in lead-up races with All The Way expected to run in the G1 Yalumba S. at Caulfield on Oct. 14 on his way to the Melbourne Cup, while Evil Empire may use the G2 Herbert Power S. on the same day as his lead up. The Victoria Amateur Turf Club is hopeful Mont Rocher (Fr) (Caerleon {USA}), who is scheduled to arrive here next week, will run in the \$2 million Caulfield Cup before tackling the Melbourne Cup. The Martin Pipe-trained Far Cry (Ire) (Pharly (Fr)) is 12-1 favourite for the Melbourne Cup and is expected to land here with the James Fanshawe-trained Irish St. Leger winner Arctic Owl (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}) on Oct. 17.

Magic Millions successfully targeted buyers from Malaysia and Singapore at its inaugural ready-to-run sales in Perth and Adelaide last week. MM managing director Don Hancock said, "We held the Perth sale on Tuesday and Adelaide on Thursday with the idea of trying to attract buyers from Singapore and Malavsia and we had a good representation at both sales." From 55 catalogued at the Perth sale, six were withdrawn and 49 offered with 35 sold for an aggregate of A\$757,500 and average of A\$27,357. The clearance rate was 71 percent and top price was A\$60,000 for a Key Business (Aus)--Samona colt purchased by Magic Millions on behalf of a Malaysian client. "The colt is a half brother to Horse Prosperity who won on debut in Singapore a couple of weeks ago," said Hancock. In Adelaide, 52 were catalogued and 13 withdrawn with 26 sold for an aggregate of A\$740,500 and an average of A\$28,481. Top price was A\$100,000 for a Hurricane Sky (Aus)--Hidden Power (Aus) (New Regent {USA}) colt that initially went through the Adelaide Select Sale for A\$32,000.
