DERBY WINNER DETHRONES THE CHAMP

Last year, Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) captured the French and Irish Derbies, then used the G2 Prix Niel as his springboard to victory in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. He was odds-on to add a second Arc to his impressive resume at Longchamp yesterday, but this year's Epsom and Irish Derby and Prix Niel winner Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge) turned the dream that he could beat the champ into reality to take his greatest prize, besting Egyptband (Dixieland Band) by 1 1/2 lengths. Sinndar came into the public consciousness only when he passed the post first at 7-1 in the G1 Epsom Derby, but he followed that effort with a tremendous display in the G1 Irish Derby July 16, where he galloped clear to win by an astounding nine lengths. Rested over the summer, he was brought back to turn the Sept. 10 Prix Niel into a procession. Given the perfect lead by stablemate Raypour (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), he came with an impressive turn of speed to post an eightlength score. Here he was produced to give his trainer and jockey their first Arcs, and his owner his second renewal, after Akiyda in 1982. Sent off the 8-5 second choice, he broke well, but jockey Johnny Murtagh must have had his heart in his mouth as pacemaker Raypour struggled to get to the front. Raypour managed to make the lead, however, and after a furlong Sinndar was sitting happily in second. Montjeu, looking for his fifth straight after wins in the May 28 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, July 2 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, July 29 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. and Sept. 10 G2 Prix Foy, was wide on the track, but travelling well in seventh. Volvoreta (GB) (Suave Dancer) was settled on the rail in fourth, while Egyptband trailed. Montjeu appeared to lose his balance slightly entering the 'false straight,' at which point Michael Kinane switched him inside, but he was five lengths off the pace still set by Raypour. As they approached the turn into the straight, Sinndar took over, and in a few strides he was clear and quickening away. Back in the field Montjeu had raced into third between Volvoreta and Hightori (Fr) (Vettori {Ire}), but he did not have his patented late kick. The only danger looked to be Egyptband, who was flying on the outside, but the winner pulled out more in the final 100 yards to grab his piece of history, becoming the first horse ever to complete the Epsom Derby, Irish Derby and Arc triple. Montjeu could find no more in the final furlong and lost third place to the game Volvoreta.

VICTORY SPEECH

Jockey Johnny Murtagh, winning his very first Arc, said after the race, "This has to be the thrill of a lifetime. The Arc de Triomphe is the greatest race in the world and to win it with Sinndar makes it the most wonderful day in my life. Before the race I told everyone, 'come to Longchamp to see Sinndar, he is unbeatable.' He is a great champion." Owner/breeder His Highness The Aga Khan was equally ecstatic. "No horse has won English and Irish Derbies and then this race--I think he's an exceptional horse. I do not want to compare him with other great winners that I've had, but he is among the very best with a horse like Shergar." He added, "A few days before the Arc John Hammond stated how difficult it is to keep a horse at his best, in Group 1 races throughout the season. John Oxx did it with Sinndar and this is his work. I am also full of admiration for Johnny Murtagh--together they have done a fantastic job." As for the future, the Aga Khan said, "Sinndar will not run again this season and we will discuss his future shortly. He will go to stud, and it will be at Gilltown in Ireland, but we don't know when."

Amonita showed real speed at the finish to take this contest and place herself at the top of the class for juvenile fillies in 2000. Beaten first time in the Listed Prix Yacowlef at Deauville Aug. 1 by subsequent G1 Prix de la Salamandre third Wooden Doll, she then won in style over this course Sept. 10. Here she stepped up in class, but looked tailor-made for the company, rewarding her connections' leap of faith to give her firstseason sire his most important success to date. Held up in the rear early as Prove (GB) (Danehill), on the rail, and Ascension (Ire) (Night Shift) cut out the running, she was keen but covered up, and Thierry Jarnet had her settled near enough to produce a challenge. The filly was caught in traffic at a vital point in the final quarter of a mile, but finally found a gap between a tiring Ascension and Karasta and her burst of speed took her to the front with 200 yards remaining. From there she quickly settled the race with a decisive final flourish. Ladbrokes reacted by establishing her at odds of 10-1 for next year's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, behind the 8-1 market leader Regal Rose (GB). A delighted Pascal Bary, winning this race for the second time after saddling Aljabr's dam Sierra Madre to take it in 1993, said,"I thought she had a great chance and she proved me right. She will now be put away for the season and will come back next year with the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) in mind first."

Namid has finally arrived at the stage that trainer John Oxx envisaged earlier in his career. Having always had faith in his colt, Oxx had to be patient, awaiting him to recover from problems and race to his true potential. The four-year-old started the season with a fine third to Giant's Causeway in the G3 Gladness S., then got to winning ways. He captured the Listed Cork S. May 8 and the G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh May 27, but came out of that test with a knee problem. The bay underwent surgery, but returned to win the G3 Flying Five at Leopardstown Sept. 9 for his third straight. Here he came in for a beautiful ride from Johhny Murtagh, who left nothing to chance. Held up in mid-division early as Perryston View (GB) (Primo Dominie {GB}) and then Pipalong (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}) took the field along, he was moved up as the pace increased and Superstar Leo drove for home. For a moment it looked as if the twoyear-old had stolen it, but Namid rushed past to grab the lead with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and quickly went clear. For Oxx, it was vindication. "It has always been in my mind that he could be champion sprinter, but he's had to overcome lots of problems," he said. "He started very well this year and we were very hopeful for him, but he had a little knee chip and he had to have it removed, so we had to rush him back. Luckily he came back around in time. Oxx added, "This might have been Namid's last race--he'll make a very nice sprinter stallion." The runner-up will head to the U.S., where she will be trained in New York by Phil Johnson.

Petrushka overcame the ominous outside draw to give Johnny Murtagh a memorable Abbaye/Arc/Opera triple, and to secure her place amongst the best middle-distance fillies in Europe. The memory of her rather lacklustre third in the G1 1000 Guineas S. at Newmarket May 7, and seemingly unlucky fourth in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 9, are distant now, as she has rampaged her way through three Group 1 races. She destroyed the G1 Irish Oaks field at The Curragh July 16 by five-and-ahalf lengths before reversing Epsom form with Love Divine (GB) in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 23. She handled the shorter distance here and thereby booked her ticket to Churchill Downs for the Breeders' Cup. The favourite broke well and settled in mid-division behind the pacemaker Hannabarbera (Fr) (Darshaan (GB)). Entering the straight, Reve D'Oscar (Fr) was asked to get serious by Frankie Dettori, and she got on top of Lady Upstage (Ire) (Alzao) with 100 yards remaining, but Murtagh had his filly in full flight on the outside. Petrushka guickened, and guickened again, and inside the final 50 yards she got on top of the game runner-up to win the prize. Trainer Sir Michael Stoute said, "Dubai has certainly been mentioned, but we'll see how she comes out of this race. If we're happy we'll ship her to Churchill now, but Dubai is very much on the agenda. The fact that she is staying in training as a four-year-old shows that she has a programme ahead of her."

Third in this race in 1999 and beaten a neck into second by Tajoun (Fr) (General Holme) last year, San Sebastian returned to avenge that defeat and win his first Group 1 race at the ripe age of six. Perhaps his best previous effort came when fourth to Kayf Tara (GB) in the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 22. He was third in his next start, the G2 Goodwood Cup Aug. 3, before disappointing when sixth last time in the G3 Doncaster Cup Sept. 7. Here he reversed form with those two horses and for once established himself above them with a spirited performance. Moved up early to race prominently behind Persian Punch, he did allow that horse a lead of at least five lengths for most of the way, but picked up the pace entering the straight and closed the advantage. Furiously driven towards the line, he got his head in front in the final 50 yards to deny the equally tough runner-up. A delighted jockey Davy Bonilla said, "I had the most perfect trip. When I asked my horse he responded well and when I gave him a breather half way down the straight, he had something left in the tank to quicken again and win safely. I am delighted. This is my second Group 1 win in one week for Mr. Dunlop, and I have to thank him for that." San Sebastian stopped the clock at 4:14.10 and established a new course and race record. He went 37 seconds faster than last year--run on heavy ground--and 2.3 seconds faster than Chief Contender in 1997.

Following on the heels of stablemate Slickly (Fr)'s success Saturday, Kabool led all the way to give Godolphin their second Group win of the weekend. Like Slickly, Kabool was formerly trained in France, where he won the G2 Prix Huillaume d'Ornano at Deauville under the care of Nicholas Clement. Transferred to Godolphin shortly after, he has been consistent without winning, his best effort coming when third in the G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket in October. This year he had returned to finish fourth in the G3 Dubai Duty Free at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25 and in the G1 Prix Ganav here Apr. 30. Last time he was third in the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron at Deauville Aug. 12, but he returned to winning ways under a bold ride from Frankie Dettori. Intent on making all, Dettori had his mount to the fore, where he settled to lead them along. He was challenged by Crimson Tide (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the straight, then tackled by Sugarfoot (GB), but their efforts failed to land a serious blow. Finally Kingsalsa and Olivier Peslier arrived to trade punches, but Kabool dug deep, thrusting himself towards the line, and had too much for the runnerup. Simon Crisford, racing manager to Godolphin, said, "Frankie was at his best. He gave the horse the demon ride and he kept enough to turn down the favourite. Kabool is a very consistent horse who deserved to win such a race. The horse has a wonderful pedigree and will be retired to stud at the end of the season. He should prove very popular. Will he race again? It is too early to say. If he does, we don't yet know where and when it will be."

While Namid (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}), and Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain {USA}) all produced career -best performances, it was the man on board who stole the show. Holding aloft a three-finger salute in the winner's enclosure on Petrushka, the message was clear. He was clearly elated. "I feel very proud and just privileged to be here for it. I am delighted to have got three winners out if them, and they were all brilliantly prepared by Sir Michael Stoute and John Oxx. I just had to steer them in the right direction. Sinndar's victory in the Arc was obviously the best of the lot." Murtagh was also second on Karasta (Ire) (Lake Coniston (Ire)) in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp.

Giant's Causeway may not be a certain runner, but even without him the likes of Kalanisi, Greek Dance, Indian Lodge and Indian Danehill make for an extremely interesting race."

GUINEAS PICTURE BECOMING CLEARER by Tom Frary

With the performances of Regal Rose (GB) (Danehill {USA}) in last Tuesday's G1 Cheveley Park S. and Minardi (USA) (Boundary {USA}) in Thursday's G1 Middle Park S., Newmarket offered vital clues to the Classics it will host in 2001.

Regal Rose did not impress everyone in Tuesday's race, coming from off a steady early pace to win by a length from 66-1 shot Toroca (USA) (Nureyev {USA}), but she is now quoted as low as 6-1 for next year's G1 1000 Guineas with William Hill. She shares that quote with stablemate Karasta (Ire) (Lake Coniston {Ire}), who finished second as the 7-5 favorite in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp. Toroca is on offer at 20-1 with William Hill, while stablemate Sequoyah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), fifth in the Cheveley Park, is 16-1. Enthused (USA) (Seeking the Gold {USA}) was sixth, but is still 8-1 with the same firm, giving Sir Michael Stoute a stranglehold on the Classic.

That position is shared by Aidan O'Brien with regards the G1 2000 Guineas, as he has Minardi and undefeated Acomb S. winner **Hemingway** (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) as first and second favourites. Ladbrokes and William Hill make the Middle Park S. winner the 6-1 favourite for the Classic, over his stablemate, next best at 10-1. He will be hoping to emulate Rodrigo De Triano in 1992, and Known Fact in 1980, the last two colts to complete the Middle Park/Guineas double, two of only 16 colts to have done so in the last 100 years.

Tamburlaine (Ire) (Royal Academy {USA}) underlined the prospects of Marcus Tregoning's Nayef (USA) (Gulch {USA}) in a Tuesday maiden at Newmarket, as that half-brother to Nashwan (USA) and Unfuwain (USA) had beaten him last time in the Haynes, Hanson & Clark S. at Newbury Sept. 15. Nayef is on offer at a top-priced 25-1 to emulate Nashwan.

More will be unfolded at the course on Champion Day at Newmarket Oct. 14, when it hosts the G1 Dewhurst S., as well as the G2 Rockfel S., won last year by subsequent G1 1000 Guineas winner Lahan (GB) (Unfuwain {USA}).
