TATTERSALLS OCTOBER STARTS TODAY

The first of 1,020 yearlings catalogued for the Tattersalls October Sale goes under the hammer at 9:30 this morning with the Newmarket auction house hoping that the buoyant trade seen a fortnight ago at the Houghton Sale will carry on over the next five days. Jimmy George, the Tattersalls marketing manager, said yesterday, "The feedback we have had suggests that this is the best-ever October yearling catalogue. After the spectacular success of the Houghton Sale and the strength seen through the whole of the Northern Hemisphere to date this year, we're looking forward to a lively week's trading." The October Sale will provide a truer reflection of the state of the market than the Houghton. Well-related youngsters include lot 823, a Barathea (Ire) half-sister to last year's 1.7 million guineas Houghton topper Beckett (Ire) (Fairy King), winner of this year's G1 National S. She is from the Ballygallon Stud consignment, as is lot 890, a Spectrum (Ire) half-brother to the G1 Prix du Moulin winner Indian Lodge (Ire) (Grand Lodge). Corduff Stud offers lot 648, a pinhooked Definite Article (GB) half-brother to G1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner Pipalong (Ire) (Pips Pride (GB)), who was bought for Ir£38,000 at Goffs last fall, while lot 916, a Revoque (Ire) colt from Yeomanstown Stud, has enjoyed a major pedigree update since the publication of the catalogue. His half-brother Bad As I Wanna Be (Ire) (Common Grounds (GB)) won the G1 Prix Morny. Champion sire Sadler's Wells has four offerings including lot 704, a Kentucky-bred colt out of Shalabia (GB) (Fast Topaze), bought for \$210,000 at Keeneland November by Alec South and consigned at Tattersalls by Round Hill Stud as agent. The sale continues through Saturday, beginning at 9:30 a.m. each day. On Thursday and Friday, generally the two strongest days, the sale takes a break for racing and resumes at 5 p.m. each evening.

FUSAICHI PEGASUS OUT OF GOLD CUP

GI Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), who came back after a four-month break to win the GII Jerome H. Sept. 23, will miss a scheduled start in Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup after injuring his left front foot. "He had grabbed himself playing a couple of days ago," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "We galloped him [Sunday] and there was a speck of blood. He will skip the race--better safe than sorry." The three-year-old is still being pointed for the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. "We ran in the Jerome to give us plenty of time in case of a minor setback," Drysdale said. "This is all within the realm of the plan and why we started early. In the scheme of things, it's not too bad. We'll give him two or three days off and ship to Kentucky on the 16th as scheduled."

With Fusaichi Pegasus out of the race, GI Pacific Classic winner **Skimming** (Nureyev) will make his next start in the Gold Cup. The Derby winner's regular pilot, Kent Desormeaux, will replace Garrett Gomez aboard the Bobby Frankel trainee.

CHAMPAGNE S.-GI, \$500,000, 2yo, 1 1/16m

A P Valentine (A.P. Indy), a maiden winner in his second start Sept. 23, worked five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 over the Belmont main track yesterday morning. "I've been very high on him," trainer Nick Zito said. "There's something about this horse--I just get scared. He has every credential to be one of the best horses I've trained, if not the best. That is saying an awful lot."

A Saratoga maiden winner on his debut July 26, Macho Uno jumped right into Grade I company for his second start and was not disgraced, missing by a neck behind the dead-heating City Zip and Yonaguska in the Hopeful S. Sept. 2. The odds-on choice facing only three rivals here, the gray colt shadowed pacesetter Speed Gun (Demaloot Demashoot) through moderate fractions, took command at the top of the lane and galloped away to an impressive score. "He was in a perfect spot at all time," winning jockey Jerry Bailey said. "The race unfolded the way I thought it might on paper. For a lightly raced colt, he has exceptional ability." Added trainer Joe Orseno, "He came to me with some high expectations from [Frank Stronach's farm manager] Danny Vella and he has lived up to everything he told me. He's going forward every race and this was the race to put him in the right direction for the Breeders' Cup. We're looking forward to it."

Never off the board in her six previous appearances at this track, Smooth Player was coming off a solid second-place finish vs. state-breds in the Solana Beach H. at Del Mar Sept. 3. Switching to the main track, the versatile Cal-bred miss shadowed the front runners through six furlongs in 1:10 1/5, came with a threewide bid as they entered the stretch and drew clear under an Eddie Delahoussaye drive to add this to her success in the GII Hollywood Oaks last summer. "Everything went perfect today," Delahoussaye said. "We had a clean trip and when the time came, she just kicked on. She's a good, honest horse." Looking ahead, trainer Dan Hendricks said, "We're looking at races Breeders' Cup week, but we're not going to look at the Breeders' Cup. We're going to look at some alternatives. We'll try to spot her where it's best for her, time-wise, race-wise and distance-wise." He added, "I'd say we'll run her next year. She's sound as a bell, so there's no reason to stop. She's actually a thin, light-weight filly that should mature." The 15-10 favorite, Bordelaise, trailed early after being steadied going into the first turn, then finished well to get third.

Lady Dora cruised to a seven-length score in her second turf try, a Delaware allowance test Aug. 7, but ran a distant third in her latest, the Sept. 4 GIII Boiling Springs H. at the Meadowlands. Overlooked at the windows off that effort, the bay had just two horses beat through the opening six furlongs, but flashed impressive late foot, closing to take the lead in deep stretch and outfinished De Aar for the victory. "I knew she would be coming from off the pace," jockey John Velazquez said. "By the three-eighths pole I really had her going and she just exploded from the five-sixteenths pole home." Added trainer Michael Matz, "She's a fun filly to race. She tries hard every time." As for the future, Matz said, "We'll rest her until Florida. The owners are there for the season and they can enjoy her more."

Experience has taught me that most stallions are only as good as the mares they are mated to, so an inexpensive stallion, covering unexceptional mares, faces a battle if he is to rise above the ordinary. Some stallions succeed in doing so, though, a fine example being the Three Chimneys-based Dynaformer.

This son of Roberto spent his first five years as a stallion at Wafare Farm at a fee of only \$5,000, with his prospects appearing to be rather compromised by his size--he stands 17 hands--and by his form on the race-track, which fell some way below top class. He can't have been helped by Classform's 1988 Annual, which began his commentary with the following unflattering assessment: "A moderately useful, decidedly one-paced animal, Dynaformer was simply not good enough to compete with the best of his generation."

To drive another nail into his coffin, Dynaformer was rated only 104, compared to Risen Star's 130 and Forty Niner's 128, even though he had won the GII Jersey Derby and GII Discovery H. Not surprisingly, the compilers of the Blood-Horse Free Handicaps took a much kinder view of his achievements. They considered him worthy of a figure of 116, compared to Risen Star's 127 and Forty Niner's 126, and even rated him at 112 among the turf horses as a four-year-old, when a stakes win eluded him. Dynaformer's record as a stallion certainly suggests that the Blood-Horse handicappers were nearer the mark.

Dynaformer also had the attraction of being a representative of the famous Roberto-Golden Trail cross, which had already produced the successful stallion Darby Creek Road as well as Dynaformer's top-class contemporaries Sunshine Forever and Brian's Time (the latter now a notable stallion in Japan).

Dynaformer wasted little time in establishing his potential, siring a first crop which contained Rabiadella, a Grade III winner at three, and Blumin Affair, runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and third in the GI Kentucky Derby. Altogether his five crops sired at \$5,000 produced a creditable total of seven Graded winners, including Vergennes (GI Hollywood Derby) and Voyagers Quest (conqueror of the classic winners Benny The Dip and Silver Patriarch in the G3 Thresher Classic Trial).

Blumin Affair's fine effort at Churchill Downs was followed a few months later by Dynaformer's transfer to Three Chimneys, where his fee was increased to \$15,000 for 1995. Dynaformer's fee has risen steadily higher, reaching \$30,000 in 1999, and it is therefore fair to expect a similar rise in Dynaformer's results.

I'm pleased to say that he is beginning to prove that his early successes were no fluke. His 1996 crop, sired at a fee of \$15,000, contained Beat All, a good third in the 1999 Derby, and his 1997 crop, sired at a fee of \$17,500, has recently produced the Grade I-winning fillies Critical Eye (Gazelle H.) and Collect The Cash (Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup). Dynaformer's 1997 fillies also include New Story, runner-up in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. Now the stakes performers are beginning to flow from Dynaformer's 1998 crop, sired at a fee of \$20,000, with the unbeaten Baptize now an unbeaten winner of two stakes races on turf.

Interestingly, the seeds for Dynaformer's latest Grade I successes were sewn by his first crop. It was a Dr. Blum mare which produced Blumin Affair, and it was a mare by Dr. Blum's sire, Dr. Fager, which produced Dynaformer's first Graded winner, Rabiadella. Critical Eye is also out of a Dr. Blum mare, whereas Collect The Cash has a Dr. Fager mare--the excellent producer Cricket Club--as her second dam.

MAX'S PAL TAKES MATCH CHAMPIONSHIP

Three-year-old sprinter Max's Pal (Marquetry) captured a \$150,000 bonus as the top point earner in this year's Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred Championship Racing Series. The colt, owned by Raymond Dweck and trained by Ben Perkins Jr., won five of his six series starts, including Saturday's Bergen County S. at the Meadowlands, for a total of 68 points. Dweck takes home \$100,000, while Perkins gets \$50,000. The winner of each of the five divisions in the series earns \$40,000 in owner/trainer bonuses, with the runner-up getting \$25,000 and the third-place finisher getting \$15,000.

GULFSTREAM STAKES SCHEDULE SETS

RECORD The 2001 stakes schedule at Gulfstream Park will offer a record \$5.3 million in purses. A total of 29 stakes races will be held during the 63-day meet, which runs Jan. 3 through Mar. 16. Three events on the calendar have been renamed to honor top-class horses who ran at the Hallandale, Florida track--the \$100,000 GIII Honey Fox H., formerly the Joe Namath, will be run Jan. 7; the \$100,000 GIII Skip Away H., formerly the Broward, is set for Jan. 13; and the \$100,000 Mr. Prospector H., formerly the Hallandale Beach H., will be held Jan. 15. Other changes include a \$50,000 purse boost and a distance change for the GII Bonnie Miss S. The race for three-year-old fillies, set for Mar. 16, will be run at 1 1/8 miles for a purse of \$250,000. The Feb. 25 GII Davona Dale S., the prep for the Bonnie Miss, will now be run at 1 1/16 miles. The highlight of the schedule, the \$1 million GI Florida Derby, will be run Mar. 10, and the \$500,000 GI Donn H. is set for Feb. 3.

DIKTAT TO DALHAM HALL Diktat (GB) (Warning {GB}--Arvola {GB}, by Sadler's Wells {USA}), the European champion sprinter of 1999, will retire to Darley's Dalham Hall Stud at the end of this year and is to stand the 2001 breeding season for a fee of £10,000. The winner of the G3 Jersey S. in 1998, the five-year-old was transferred to Godolphin and won four of his five starts last year, including the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville and G1 Stanley Leisure Sprint Cup back to back. Diktat began this season with a pair of starts in Japan, which yielded a second-place finish in the G1-Jpn Yasuda Kinen at Tokyo. "We're very excited to be standing him," said Liam O'Rourke, stud director at Dalham Hall. "He is an outstanding athlete and his finishing speed sets him apart. Diktat's a horse with everything going for him because he is from one of the most successful families of recent years." His dam Arvola is out of champion two-year-old Park Appeal (Ire), making her a half sister to champion miler Cape Cross.

ASCOT RACES RESCHEDULED Two pattern races which were canceled at Ascot on the last weekend as a result of a bomb threat have been rescheduled by the British Horseracing Board. The G3 Princess Royal S. will be part of an eight-race card Friday afternoon at Newmarket. The race has been reopened to nominations until noon today with final declarations by 10 a.m. Thursday. The G3 Cornwallis S. will be the highlight at Newbury Friday, Oct. 20. That race will close Saturday, Oct. 14.

NO FRUITS ON CANADIAN VINE Trainer Mark Johnston yesterday told Racing Post that Fruits of Love (USA) (Hansel {USA}) would not be making the trans-Atlantic journey to Toronto for Sunday's GI Canadian International over 12 furlongs at Woodbine. "It's heartbreaking really. I've just had a look at the race and we couldn't have a better opportunity for the horse," Johnston said. The five-year-old suffered a recurrence of a metabolic disorder which developed last month and will be forced to wait for either the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 4 or the G1 Japan Cup. "He just doesn't look well enough to travel," Johnston continued. "His blood seems to be OK, but frankly he has just lost too much condition in the treatment of this [disorder]." The winner of this year's G2 Hardwicke S. for the second year running, the bay was most recently third in the Grosser Preis von Baden Sept. 3. Fruits of Love was second in the International last year before finishing ninth in the Japan Cup.
