MONTJEU CHAMPION-BOUND

Trainer John Hammond was satisfied enough with Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in his work yesterday morning to give his colt the green light for Saturday's G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket. Another factor convincing the four-year-old's connections to run was the significant rain at Newmarket Monday, which turned the going to the slow side. Fourth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 1 last time out, Montjeu will be ridden in the Champion S. by Michael Kinane. The six-time Group 1 winner is quoted the 5-4 favorite by William Hill.

RECORD FIRST DAY AT TATTERSALLS

The 2000 Tattersalls October Yearling Sales began in Newmarket on a high note yesterday, posting first day records for average and median. A total of 239 yearlings were offered, with 189 selling for a gross of 3,603,000gns, up 21 percent from last year's first session. The average increased 25 percent to 19,063gns, while the median soared an impressive 30 percent to 15,000gns. The day's high price of 125,000gns was paid for a colt by Selkirk--Pearl Kite (Silver Hawk). Consigned by Lavington Stud, the bay was purchased by agent John Warren, with Anthony Stroud as the underbidder. "He was the colt of the day without a doubt," said Warren. "I liked the pedigree on paper even before I saw the horse because of the Silver Hawk connection, having bought Silver Wisp, Silver Wizard and Silver Wedge as yearlings. I took a view about him as I thought he was a particularly nice individual and he probably should have been in here on a different day. There are a number of options for him although the likeliest is that he will race for either the Highclere syndicate or the Royal Ascot Racing Club." Warren also got yesterday's second top lot when paying 72,000gns for a colt by Zilzal--Thea (Marju {Ire}), sold by New England Stud for Highclere. WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Holy Bull was one undoubtedly one of the most talented runners of the last quarter of the 20th century. When he retired to stud, however, he presented something of a puzzle for breeders, as for all his undoubted brilliance as a racehorse, he had a pedigree which was some considerable way off the beaten track, in commercial terms at least. In male line, he was a representative of Rough 'n Tumble, but through the regional sires Minnesota Mac and Great Above (out of Dr. Fager's half-sister Ta Wee), rather than through Rough 'n Tumble's best son Dr. Fager (a member of the same crop as Minnesota Mac). Holy Bull's dam, Sharon Brown, a daughter of Al Hattab out of a Grey Dawn II mare, also bred the stakes winning Crafty Prospector mare, Winnie D., but otherwise the Holy Bull's family is distinctly light in the black type department.

Of course, all of the above becomes rather academic once a horse has runners, and performance and pedigree have taken a back seat to the progeny test. Well, Holy Bull now has three crops of runners, and we are happy to report that he has made rather promising start, and in the light of the current round of stud fee increases, his 2000 fee of \$25,000 live foal certainly looks good value.

Holy Bull's first crop (foals of 1996) has now produced five stakes winners. These are led by Confessional, who took the GI Frizette S. at two, and this year captured the GIII Royal North H.; Hollywood Picture, winner of the GIII Santa Ysabel S., and Crash Course, a stakes-winning and graded-stakes placed colt who set a new course record for a mile at Monmouth.

His second crop, current three-year-olds, have been less prolific, but they do include the stakes winning colts Turnofthecentury, winner of GII National Museum Racing Hall of Fame H. and Bravo Bull. With regard to Holy Bull's third crop, currently two-year-olds, the Columbus Day weekend turned out to be a major one. His son, Macho Uno, beaten only a neck in the GI Hopeful S. on his previous outing, took his record to two wins in three starts with a seven-length romp in the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. and another son, Tru Bull, sprinted six furlongs in 1:08 4/5 to score at Keeneland.

Macho Uno now heads for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and should he succeed there, he will credit his dam, Primal Force, with the unique achievement of producing two Breeders' Cup winners, as she is already dam of the 1998 GI Breeders' Cup Classic victor Awesome Again.

Whatever Macho Uno's fate at Churchill Downs, Primal Force has certainly repaid the \$95,000 which it cost Frank Stronach's Adena Springs to purchase her at the 1992 Keeneland January Sales. With Awesome Again and Macho Uno from four foals to live, it looks as it Primal Force is delivering on the unrealized potential she showed in her days on the track. There the daughter of Blushing Groom and the stakes-winning Mr. Prospector mare, Prime Prospect, carried the colors of Mrs. Bertram Firestone to win four races by a combined total of 30 lengths, running six furlongs at Belmont Park in 1:09.8 and seven furlongs at the same track in 1:22, before soundness problems derailed her career.

Macho Uno himself has a rather outcross pedigree, although his sire has a double of *Mahmoud, and his dam has a double of *Nasrullah (out of Mumtaz Begum, a three-guarters sister to Mahmoud). There is also an interesting connection between Al Hattab (broodmare sire of Holy Bull) and Macho Uno's own maternal grandsire, Blushing Groom. Al Hattab is out of a mare by the superb English sprinter Abernant, and his third dam is by Abernant's relative, Fair Trial. When we turn to Blushing Groom, we find that he has Tudor Minstrel, a genetic relative to both Abernant and Fair Trial. Although we don't see it often in North American pedigrees various plays on Abernant, Fair Trial and Tudor Minstrel appear in a legion of good European performers. Incidentally, Abernant, Fair Trial and Tudor Minstrel, all go back to Mumtaz Mahal or her half-sister Lady Juror, and all have either Pharos or his brother Fairway. This further reinforces the previously mentioned strains of Nasrullah (by a son of Pharos out of a daughter of Mumtaz Mahal) and Mahmoud (out of another daughter of Mumtaz Mahal) in the pedigree.

Solid Start at Tattersalls October

After average percentage increases in the 'forties at Houghton and Goffs the last two weeks, expectations-and apprehensions--were high for yesterday's opening day of Tattersalls' October yearling sales. Tuesday is, by design, the sale's weakest day--it averaged 15,242 guineas last year, only 60 percent of the overall sale's average. So if the level of demand witnessed at Goffs last week was going to weaken, it was more likely to show up at the lower end of this sale.

No problem. With 189 sold (a pretty reliable 79 percent clearance rate), the average rose 25 percent to 19,063 guineas, and the median gained 30 percent, from 11,500 guineas last year to 15,000 guineas yesterday. If today's session is up 25 percent over last year's corresponding session, it will average 30,000 guineas. That's the number to look for today.

Profit Margin Narrowing

We can see a lot in the relative ROI/Stud fee figures comparing this year's September sale to last year's. First of all, the 'Average x Real Stud Fee' multiple (comparing the average to the stud fees actually paid) dropped 23 percent, from 5.03 in the 1999 September sale to 3.88 this year's. Alarmingly, the 'Median x Real Stud Fee' multiple not only dropped 22 percent (from 2.57), it also dropped all the way down to 2.00. That means the median price of yearlings sold was only double the actual stud fee paid. The only stallions that make money selling yearlings at double the median are those standing for \$100,000 +. If you breed to a \$20,000 stallion, you lose money selling a yearling for double the stud fee.

Moreover, these statistics give us a pretty reliable picture of the stud fee rise. The stud fee is roughly 40 percent of the expense component of producing a yearling (higher for higher stud fees). It's a fair estimate from these figures that stud fees were 50 percent higher in 2000 than they were in 1997. They will rise again for 2001. Even at 2000 stud fee levels, the yearling market must now advance by another 20 percent just to sustain current (2000) levels of profitability--and the figures show 2000 was, essentially, already 25 percent less profitable than 1999. It was harder to make money selling a yearling in 2000 than in 1999, and it's likely to be harder still next year.

IN EXCESS COLT TOPS BARRETTS OPENER

A California-bred colt by In Excess (Ire) attracted a final bid of \$105,000 to top the select session of the Barretts October Yearling Sale held Monday evening in Pomona, California. The colt, who is from the family of 1989 Del Mar Oaks winner Stylish Star, was consigned to the sale by Berkeley Bloodstock Services as agent and was purchased by Jack Carava. The Southern California-based trainer also purchased a Smokester colt three lots later for \$80,000. Pinhooking specialist Becky Thomas went to \$85,000 for the second highest-priced lot of the session, a bay filly by champion older horse Bertrando which was consigned by River Edge Farm, Inc., agent. Overall gross receipts were ahead of last year's select session, however the average tumbled by nearly 30 percent and the median was down by 40 percent. "I think we're coming into the race as good as we could expect," remarked trainer Tom Amoss. Sultan al Kabeer's Agol Lack (Gulch) was scheduled to clear quarantine at Aqueduct yesterday afternoon and shipped to Belmont Park to continue his preparations for Saturday's \$1 million Gl Jockey Club Gold Cup. "He's won his last two starts in France and they were both Group races," said Emmanuel de Seroux, Sultan al Kabeer's racing manager. "He's an improving horse and there are not many opportunities for him. He's by Gulch out of a Seattle Slew mare which says dirt all over. We always intended to run him on the dirt and now's the time."

McGaughey's Juveniles:

Trainer Shug McGaughey sent out a pair of youngsters for this weekend's stakes. Dancinginmydreams (Seeking the Gold) breezed four furlongs yesterday in :49 over the main track. A narrow second to Raging Fever in the GI Matron S., she is scheduled to meet that filly in Saturday's \$500,000 GI Frizette S. "She never works fast," McGaughey said. Forest Hills Outlook:

Aaron and Marie Jones' Forest Camp (Deputy Minister) will start in the \$250,000 GII Forest Hills H. on Saturday to secure a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He recently returned to action from a nine-month layoff with sharp score in the restricted Pirate's Bounty S. at Del Mar Sept. 9. "Coming back off the layoff, he wouldn't be ready for the Mile and he has no turf experience," said trainer Eduardo Inda. "The best thing for him is the Sprint." The bay colt has been training smartly at Santa Anita, including a handy five-furlong breeze in :59 2/5 on Friday...Shadwell Stable's Intidab (Phone Trick) will miss the Forest Hills and will instead train up to the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Winner of the GII True North H. in June, he has not raced since a second in the GII Forego H. at Saratoga Aug. 30. "He suffered a minor setback and missed an important work for the Forest Hills," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin.

MUHTATHIR TO STAND IN FRANCE Godolphin's Muhtathir (GB) (Elmaamul {USA}), winner of this year's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and runner-up in the 1998 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas), will stand in France next year at Alain Brandebourger's La Station d'Etalons. The son of G1 Eclipse S. and G1 Phoenix Champion S. hero Elmaamul won seven other races including last season's G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at Milan, the 1998 G2 Tripleprint Celebration Mile at Goodwood and the 1998 G3 Hungerford S. at Newbury. He is out of the G3 May Hill S. winner Majmu (USA) (Al Nasr {Fr}) and will stand at a fee of FF50,000, 1st October terms. Although he raced in the blue silks of Godolphin, Muhtathir was bred by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum, whose Irish stud manager Hubie de Burgh said, "We chose France as his base because some of his best performances were in that country and we hope he will be an asset to French breeders." Brandebourger added, "I am delighted to be standing such a good horse. The nomination price is very attractive for an easy winner of the Marois and a lot of good stallions have come from that race." In a career spanning 22 starts, Muhtathir won eight times with total earnings of FF4,227,559.

UNWORLDLY DESTROYED The exciting threeyear-old filly Unworldly (Aus) (Quest For Fame {GB}) was destroyed after breaking her near-fore fetlock joint in a gallop at Sydney's Warwick Farm Tuesday. Bred at Jack and Bob Ingham's Woodlands Stud, the Crown Lodge filly won five of her six outings, including a laststart 2 1/2 length G1 Flight S. victory which brought her earnings to A\$466,440. Unworldly, trained by John Hawkes, was to contest next week's Thousand Guineas at Caulfield. "You can wait a lifetime for a horse like her," said Woodlands Bloodstock Manager Trevor Lobb. "It's absolutely devastating. She was due to go to Melbourne (Tuesday night) and Larry (Cassidy) was riding her in her final workout before she left. She snapped a fetlock joint and unfortunately there was just nothing that could be done and she had to be put down." Unworldly beat subsequent Golden Slipper winner Belle Du Jour (Aus) (Dehere {USA}) in a barrier trial before winning her debut in December last year, and she returned to win at Rosehill in July before her only defeat, when an unlucky third in the first leg of the four-race Princess Series, the G2 Silver Shadow S. She went on to win the next three legs--the G3 Furious S., G2 Tea Rose S. and G1 Flight S.

OVER RETIRED Australia's G1 Doncaster S. winner Over (Aus) (Dr. Grace {Aus}), preparing for Saturday's G1 Toorak H., suffered a tendon injury at Melbourne's Flemington racetrack yesterday, with Crown Lodge announcing he will be retired. The four-year-old colt may become the first sire son of four-time Group 1 winner Dr. Grace (NZ) (*Sir Tristram), who died following a paddock accident leaving three crops from 1993 to 1995. Over retires with eight wins and six placings from 20 starts, with three stakes wins and four stakes placings.

Anybody who witnessed the beating that Nayef (USA) (Gulch {USA}) inflicted on the field that lined up to take him on in the Listed Autumn S. at Ascot Saturday will tell you that here is a colt of esteem. He is steeped in it, in fact, from his pedigree, being by Gulch out of Height Of Fashion, dam of Nashwan (USA) and Unfuwain (USA), to his racing style. In a nutshell, he has class. He is also as low as 4-1 favourite now for next year's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, despite having not raced out of Listed company in his two outings. His half-brother Nashwan picked up the same race at Ascot as a juvenile and entered the winter with the same unblemished record. Yet in April of his Classic year he was freely available at 40-1 for the Guineas. In the end, he collected the prize at odds of 3-1, marginally less than his latest protege is in October. Yet no sooner had he passed the post on Saturday, had his initial odds of 10-1 been taken in large bets.

Punters have every right to bet on the promising rather than the proven--the percentages are better. After all, only four of the last 14 2000 Guineas winners, and four of the last 12 1000 Guineas winners, had won at the highest level at two. Even Minardi (USA) (Boundary {USA}), winner of the G1 Independent Heinz 57 Phoenix S. at Leopardstown Aug. 13 and the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket Sept. 28, has to play second fiddle. Aidan O'Brien's colt is on offer at 7-1 with William Hill, a price not likely to be greatly affected bar a brilliant display in Saturday's G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket.

Also from Ballydoyle, **Beckett (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}) is 25-1 to go on to Guineas glory despite success in the G1 National S. at The Curragh Sept. 17. There he beat stablemate **Darwin (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}), who was sent off at odds-on, as Bernstein (USA) had been a year previously. The winner of that contest was also passed over in most lists, but he was no less than Sinndar (Ire).

Although he has been beaten in his last two efforts, Brian Meehan's Bad As I Wanna Be (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}), highly impressive winner of the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 20, is unconsidered now compared to several still unknown quantities. Godolphin's purchase Rumpold (GB) (Mister Baileys {GB}), who had Minardi five lengths back in second when winning his Ascot maiden, is 14-1, yet he has not run since. Aidan O'Brien's Hemingway (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) is only 10-1, yet his best performance came in the Listed Acomb S. at York Aug. 22. The horse he beat that day, Eminence (Ire) (Machiavellian {USA}), has since refused to race in the Houghton Sales S. at Newmarket Sept. 26, yet he is shorter at 20-1 than the horse that won that race, Mozart (Ire) (Danehill {USA}). Even Vacamonte (GB) (Caerleon {USA}), who disappointed when fifth in the G3 Solario S., is as low as 20-1 ahead of his crack at Saturday's Dewhurst S. He will meet Tobougg (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) there, and this colt is already a Group One winner, having taken the G1 Prix de la Salamandre at Longchamp Sept. 16. Yet at 10-1, he is more than twice the odds of Nayef. The odds of Sir Michael Stoute's Regal Rose (GB) (Danehill {USA}), winner of the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket Sept. 26, as the 6-1 favourite for the 2001 G1 1000 Guineas with William Hill, offer some sense in that market. Yet it is possible to get 12-1 about G1 Fillies' Mile winner Crystal Music (USA) (Nureyev {USA}), as well as 20-1 about G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Sequoyah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}). Enthused (USA) (Seeking the Gold {USA}) and Karasta (Ire) (Lake Coniston {Ire}), both of whom have been tried without Regal Rose's success in Group One company, are shorter.

On Saturday we have the Dewhurst, which was once the decider, the final word. Yet the connections that greet the winner may have to accept that the people are already turning away towards something darker.
