GODOLPHIN SEARCHING FOR GOLD

Godolphin dominated proceedings on an exceptionally strong second day of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sales yesterday, paying 220,000gns for each of the three top lots. First up was a Cadeaux Genereux (GB) colt offered from Lord Carnarvon's Highclere Stud, for whom Godolphin's agent John Ferguson faced his principal opposition from Johnny McKeever of McKeever St Lawrence--acting for a patron of Brian Meehan's stable. Then came a Zafonic half brother to Pentire (GB) (Be My Guest), offered for Lord Halifax from the locally-based Side Hill Stud. This time Ferguson's opponent up to the 220,000gns mark was German agent Manfred Hofer. Ferguson had bought Pentire--now a sire in Japan and New Zealand--as a yearling at Tattersalls for 55,000gns on behalf of Mollers Racing. "This colt is a really nice athletic type and guite small--as was Pentire. He is a similar shape to Xaar (GB) [by Zafonic]," said Ferguson. The third 220,000gns yearling was Mountarmstrong Stud's Entrepreneur (GB) half-sister to the G3 Rockfel Stakes winner Name of Love (Ire) (Petardia {GB}). Mags O'Toole, accompanied by trainer Charles O'Brien, was underbidder for this filly. The purchases will come back to Stanley House in Newmarket to join trainer David Loder next spring, according to Ferguson, Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson broke the 200,000gns barrier early into proceedings when going to 210,000gns for a Fahd Salman-bred Selkirk filly out of the staying mare Always Friendly (GB) (High Line {GB}), offered from Bugley Stud. She was bought for a new owner at Roger Charlton's stable. (Top 5 lots, p2)

Gross receipts for the session were ahead by 32.4 percent against the same session from a year ago while the average of 37,454gns represented a 38.7-percent increase from last year. The session median was also up by a healthy 30.8 percent. Through two days of the five-day sale, gross receipts are up by 28.9 percent and the average has jumped by 40.3 percent. The middle session of the sale kicks off this morning at 9:30 a.m.


SINNDAR RETIRED

The Aga Khan's Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge--Sinntara {Ire}, by Lashkari {GB}), the only horse to have won the G1 Epsom and Irish Derbies and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, has been retired to Gilltown Stud in Ireland, it was announced yesterday. The colt was also the winner of the G1 National S. at The Curragh last September, making him a winner four times at the highest level. He raced eight times, and was beaten only once, in the Listed Ballysax S. at Leopardstown Apr. 16, when giving away seven pounds to Grand Finale (Ire). It was after this race that his jockey Johnny Murtagh famously confided that he would never be beaten on him again. Alongside his famous victories, he was also successful in the G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown May 14, and G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 10 in his Classic year. He won the Epsom Derby by a length from Sakhee, June 10, before trouncing the Irish Derby field at The Curragh July 2. In winning the Arc, the bay colt recorded the second-fastest time in the history of the race. His lifetime earnings amount to Ir£2,174,489. "We're very much looking forward to having him here," said Pat Downes, manager at Gilltown Stud. "He was obviously a very, very good horse--a Group 1 winner at two and a dual Derby and Arc winner at three. Not only do we race horses, we breed them as well so he's a very exciting addition. There have been a lot of people waiting to hear the news and I have no doubt he will be a big hit with breeders." He will join 1999 Horse of the Year Daylami (Ire) and Darshaan (GB) at Gilltown, and his fee will be Ir£30,000, Oct. 1 terms.

KEENELAND LOWERS COMMISSIONS, ADDS

NEW SALE During its semi-annual Board of Directors meeting yesterday afternoon, Keeneland approved a reduction in its sales commissions from five to 4 1/2 percent and also approved a new two-day yearling sale to be held in October. The reduction in commissions will begin with the January Horses of All Ages Sale. The board also announced the creation of an "Industry Reinvestment Fund", which will channel one-quarter of one percent of its commissions towards the goal of increasing the number of Thoroughbred buyers. The October Yearling Sale will be held in conjunction with the Fall meeting at Keeneland with an expected 750 yearlings to be catalogued, including RNAs and outs from the July, September and Saratoga Sales.

SKYWALKER FILLY TOPS BARRETTS FINALE

Barretts October Yearling Sale ended vesterday with the top bid of \$40,000 coming from Rick Taylor for lot 277, a daughter of multi-millionaire Skywalker out of Princely Girl (Princely Native). Consigned by Havens Bloodstock Agency, Inc., the filly was one of 315 lots sold from 442 yearlings offered. The sale saw a 10.1-percent increase in gross, to \$2,702,800 from last year's \$2,455,000, but a marked drop in average and median prices. Decreasing by 33.4 percent, the average fell to \$8,580 from 1999's \$12,878, while the median showed a 30percent decline to \$4,200 from last year's \$6,000. Achieving the next best price was hip 290, a filly purchased by El Ojo de Agua Racing Stables for \$34,000. By For Really, out of Queen Vic (Victorious), the half sister to Bay Meadow Oaks winner Fire Sale Queen (In Excess (Ire)) was consigned by Mary Knight, agent. Rounding out the top three lots was hip 321, a Lil Tyler colt bought by Curt and Lila Lanning for \$28,000. Consigned by Madera Thoroughbreds LLC, agent, he is out of the multiple-stakes winning mare, Score and Tell (Score Twenty Four).

NOE OUT, SCHWARTZ IN AT NYRA New York Racing Association Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer Kenny Noe Jr. yesterday announced his resignation from NYRA following a six-year tenure. He will stay on as a member of its board and Executive Committee. Prominent horse owner and breeder Barry K. Schwartz was immediately elected NYRA chairman. "I have always felt that an individual should know when to step aside," Noe said. "I have some health problems which I hope are only minor and I do not feel that I can give the number of hours that need to be given to the job." Schwartz is the chairman, CEO and co-founder of Calvin Klein, Inc. and is active in numerous horse-related organizations, including The Jockey Club, and is a member of the Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association. "The racing industry is facing a challenging time and New York has some unusual circumstances that require wise decisions and strong management," Schwartz said. "I love this sport, am devoted to it and will do everything I can to

KUMARI CONTINENT RETIRED After sustaining an injury in Monday's GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H., GII Hollywood Oaks winner Kumari Continent (Kris S.--Rajmata, by Known Fact) has been retired, according to the *Daily Racing Form*. The three-year-old filly was diagnosed with a condylar fracture in her right hind leg following a last place finish in the six-horse field, but will not require surgery. The runner-up in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GII Honeymoon H., retires with a lifetime record of 8-3-3-0 and earnings of \$263,590, and will be bred to Gone West next season.

Runner-up in last year's GI Matron S. and GI Frizette S., Darling My Darling won her first start of the season a Gulfstream allowance event in February. In her most recent outing, the John Ward trainee ran eighth behind Finder's Fee in Belmont's GI Acorn S. June 9, before heading to the sidelines for almost four months. Returning with this success, the Kentucky-bred settled in third to track the dueling leaders, Surfside and Roxelana (Boundary). After covering six furlongs in 1:08.20, the frontrunners tired and jockey Mike Smith sent Darling My Darling to the lead; she went on to win in stakesrecord time. "We've just been waiting for her to put it all together," said Ward. "I think she showed today, against some super horses, what she is capable of doing." He added, "No Breeders' Cup. This is her first real crack out of the box." Multiple Grade I stakes winner Surfside held on to finish second. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas will send her onto the Breeders' Cup Distaff. "That was the plan going in and that's the plan coming out. She had to battle both of those fillies out there today and she put one of them away and just ran out of gas for the other one," he said.

Jockey Tracy Hebert was removed as the rider of A Real Zipper in yesterday's first race at Keeneland, by order of the stewards. Soon after entering the track, horse and jockey were returned to the paddock. Jockey Tony D'Amico was named on the mount. "We issued the order to remove him (Hebert) as the rider," commented Bernard Hettel, the Executive Director and Chief Steward for the Kentucky Racing Commission, while offering no explanation for the change.

The fall meeting at Turfway Park in Florence, Kentucky closed Oct. 6 with a 3.4-percent increase in ontrack attendance, but a 4.5-percent drop in on-track handle. Handle from out-of-state sources jumped 5.5-percent, which led to an overall handle increase of 1.3 percent. "Our racing product was one of the best in the country this past meet," commented Turfway President Robert Elliston. "We presented a variety of on-track promotions and events aimed at attracting a new audience to the track, which we accomplished."

INGLIS BREEZE-UP SALE SET FOR TODAY

Australia's increasingly appealing exchange rate, a boutique catalogue and a fast-growing number of breeze-up success stories all bode well for the fifth annual Inglis Breeze Up Sale set for this morning at Inglis headquarters in Newmarket beginning at 11 a.m. Buyers from Singapore, Malaysia and Hong Kong, which has had 15 breeze-up winners in the past season, have assembled along with a solid local bench for the sale. Last year's results prove that a quick gallop is crucial to success; the six lots that fetched A\$100,000 or more all cracked the 11-second barrier in their 200m breeze. This year's catalogue numbers 150, but has fallen away with more than 30 withdrawals, and Inglis managing director Reg Inglis points out drug testing means two-year-olds with problems can't be treated to soldier on. This year's catalogue is liberally sprinkled with Easter and Magic Millions yearling sale graduates boasting plenty of pedigree--the hottest new sires and distaff lines heavy with black type, with mares such as triple Group 1 winner Northwood Plume, who has a colt by Woodman (USA); Group 1 winner Heavenly Body, who has an Anabaa (USA) filly; and Group 1 winner Tristram Rose, who has a Strategic (Aus) colt. Danehill's sole representative is a colt from Fleet Marguerite (USA) (Gulch {USA}), a three-quarter sister to Dalhart, to be offered by Yarraman Park Stud. "I think there is absolutely much more confidence in the sale as the horses have performed well and vendors have put forward a terrific lot of horses this year," says Inglis.

RAIN DISRUPTS CHAMPIONS DAY PLANS

While Teddy Beckett, racing manager to Prince Khalid Abdullah, lamented on the affects that the weather will have on his owner's entries for Champions' Day at Newmarket on Saturday, the rain ceased for a short while. Nevertheless, the rain (which claimed Redcar's meeting yesterday) that has fallen on Newmarket in recent days has turned the official going to soft. "The going is soft, " said Nick Lees, clerk of the course. "We only had 5mm of rain overnight, but it is still raining lightly now. The forecast for this afternoon was for it to be bright, although there is no sign of that at the moment, and the trouble is that there is the risk of rain at any time." This may lead to some re-thinking for Khalid Abdullah's G1 Dewhurst S. pair Vacamonte (USA) (Caerleon {USA}), and Endless Summer (GB) (Zafonic {USA}). "Vacamonte is in good form now and has won on good to soft but if there was a great deal more rain there would be a doubt about him running," Beckett said. "Endless Summmer really doesn't want it soft and a decision on his participation will be taken overnight." Of Distant Music (USA) (Distant View {USA}), one time G1 2000 Guineas ante-post favourite, and is scheduled to run in the G1 Champion S., Beckett said: "We wouldn't just run him for fun. We're not worried about the presence of Montjeu in the race." Sakhee (USA) (Bahri {USA}), not seen since running fourth in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown July 8, will almost certainly miss the Champion S. Angus Gold, Racing Manager to Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum, said yesterday: "It looks like the Champion will come too guick for Sakhee, although I haven't yet had a chance to confirm this with Sheikh Hamdan. Hopefully he will be back next year. He will probably stay in training." Richard Quinn will ride G1 Epsom Oaks winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis (GB)) in Saturday's 10-furlong contest, in favour of Shiva (Jpn) (Hector Protector {USA}) after a workout in Newmarket yesterday morning. Ladbrokes reacted by cutting her to 5-1 from 12-1. Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) was also cut into 11-10 from 11-8 as favourite for the contest by Corals.

Australasia's reaction to the ready-to-run concept has been somewhat cautious, with vendors battling to overcome buyer skepticism as they gain a better understanding of what is truly required at this newfangled sale.

The average at the Inglis Breeze-Up Sale has steadily crept up over the past four years, from A\$29,423 for 91 sold in '96 to A\$33,563 for 90 sold last year, and the number of handy city winners emerging from the sale hasn't gone unnoticed either. But if the bloodstock industry, by and large, has reserved its judgment, those who've embraced the sale and approached it seriously have enjoyed excellent rewards.

Widden Stud was leading vendor last year with the four fastest horses and eight sold for A\$64,000. With a professionally prepared draft of 14 this year, including juveniles by hot sires Hennessy (USA), Honour And Glory (USA), Anabaa (USA) and Flying Spur (Aus), the Hunter Valley-based stud has the second largest draft.

The largest draft, with 24 catalogued, comes from Harry Mitchell's Yarraman Park Stud at Scone, which prepares youngsters for clients including two savvy young men, brothers Ron and Rod Dufficy. The pair have hitherto been immersed in the punting end of racing, but they are making a serious impact on the breeze-up scene.

Former Fairfax racing scribe Rod moved to Hong Kong eight years ago and has enjoyed spectacular success as a form analyst, while Ron ceased riding to become the first jockey manager in Australia in 1991 with Jim Cassidy. A year later Ron's real talent was unleashed on the New South Wales airwaves and he is an extremely popular radio commentator with his "mounting yard mail," while wife Cheryl manages a stable of hot young riders such as Len Beasley.

The common theme? Winning. So it stands to reason their serious tilt at horse trading has the same emphasis.

Their first foray into breeze-up sales yielded the toppriced A\$180,000 Dehere (USA) colt for 1998 as a carefully crafted plan came to fruition--five of the eight they offered have won. The following year, they sold 13 for an average A\$72,000 including the toppriced Barathea (Ire)--Chador (Aus) filly knocked down to Bart Cummings for A\$190,000. The brothers gave A\$50,000 for her as a yearling.

"Breeze-Up sales are going to grow here. It's common sense. You get to see their action, you know if they can gallop or not, and they are already broken in.

"People have been suspicious. Why are we selling nice horses? But ready-to-run sales are huge overseas and we have yet to fully adapt. Common sense will prevail. People are taking more notice, there have been quite a few winners come out of the sale, even in recent weeks," said Sydney-based Ron Dufficy.

He emphasises gaining buyer confidence is more important at this stage than making big profits, although the brothers have landed on their feet very nicely to date.

"We really want to gain respect from buyers, who can be confident we are going to try to buy yearlings that can win races. Our objective is to sell good horses and gain buyer confidence," he said.

The brothers purchased yearlings from every major Australian sale as well as New Zealand and country sales.

"We look for a bit of athleticism, something that will develop into a nice horse. A lot of A\$100,000 to A\$200,000 yearlings come out and they can't even walk and a lot of the breeze-up horses are coming out and winning. Gaining buyer confidence is the basis for the future," Dufficy said.

Last year the brothers took home a colt by Prized (USA) after he was passed in at A\$75,000; racing as Sale Of Century (Aus), he has won two and placed in the G2 Stan Fox S. Oct. 2.

"He is heading in the right direction, he will go into the Sandown Guineas and maybe toward the AJC Derby. You could have had him for A\$90,000," said Dufficy. "We put a reserve on and if they don't reach it we race on; we set a realistic reserve we think than can earn in stakes money and he is well on the way."

The pair thought they'd come unstuck when a St. Covet (Aus) colt they'd paid NZ\$100,000 for went under the hammer for A\$60,000 at the breeze-up last year.

"We took a loss; he didn't grow and we thought we had taken a backward step, but he is proving now maybe we were right about him after all," said Dufficy of the horse named National Saint (NZ), who won three straight before placing in the G2 Ming Dynasty for a syndicate.

This year's two most talked about juveniles have the Dufficy stamp; a Rory's Jester (Aus)--Zero Celsius (USA) colt and an Anabaa (USA)--Singles Bar (Aus) filly; they clocked :10.32 and :10.87 respectively.

"The Rory's Jester is very, very smart, and the Anabaa filly is lovely," enthused Rod. "There is a question mark over the sale still, we don't really know what GST will do, we'll know more after this sale, but I am quietly confident we have got the quality here."
