## SNEAK PREVIEW

With five graded stakes worth \$3 million in purses, tomorrow's card at Belmont Park offers a sneak preview of the Breeders' Cup. Headlining the event is the \$1 million GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, where 4-5 **Lemon Drop Kid** (Kingmambo) meets 2-1 **Behrens** (Pleasant Colony) for the sixth time. In five previous match-ups, "The Kid" has prevailed four times, including the last three; he comes into the Gold Cup off consecutive wins in the GII Brooklyn H., GII Suburban H., GI Whitney H. and GI Woodward S. "He's done everything a man could want a horse to do," Hall of Fame trainer Scotty Schulhofer said. "Blinkers [added before the Brooklyn] have focused him and he has developed into a man. He belongs in the big leagues. In my mind, he is Horse of the Year and if he wins Saturday and doesn't get it, there is no justice." He added, "He couldn't be doing any better." Behrens, beaten a head in the Woodward, looks for his first win since taking the GI Gulfstream Park H. back in February. "I still think he is one of the top older horses in the country," trainer Jim Bond said. "I still believe in him, even if some people have written him off...believe me, he still wouldn't be in training if I didn't think he could do it." (*Fields, p2 & 3*)

## DOUBLE THE PLEASURE?

**Beautiful Pleasure** (Maudlin), who won the GI Beldame S. last year en route to her victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, will be back to try and make it two in a row in the \$750,000 event. But she will be up against a tougher-than-nails rival in **Riboletta (Brz)** (Roi Normand). The South American import is the 4-5 morning-line favorite after a facile victory in the GI Ruffian S., her sixth consecutive stakes win on the dirt and her fifth career Grade I score. Trainer Eduardo Inda considers the Ruffian the best race Riboletta has run. "She really liked the track," he said. As for tactics for the Beldame, Inda said, "Chris [McCarron] is a very good rider. He knows pace, and when the gates open, he's the boss. It should be a very good race. Both mares are very good."

## RECORDS FALL AT TATTERSALLS OCTOBER

Buyers at Tattersalls yesterday fueled the most phenomenal single day's trading in the history of the October Yearling Sales when all previous records were annihilated. Yesterday's session saw 39 yearlings make six-figure sums, compared to 19 in the entire sale 12 months ago; with two days to go, there have been a total of 56 six-figure transactions. Last year's records for turnover, average and median were surpassed respectively by 84 percent, 96 percent and 110 percent. The individual October price of 430,000gns for a Woodman filly, set in 1997, was broken twice. It was passed first midway through the morning when Charlie Gordon-Watson, standing with the Coolmore team of Paul Shanahan, John Magnier and Demi O'Byrne, paid 440,000gns for a Cadeaux Genereux (GB) half-brother to first-season sire Atraf (GB). The underbidder was Angus Gold, racing manager to Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum, in whose colours Atraf won the Cork & Orrery S. "All I can say is that he is for a client new to racing in England and he will be trained in this country but I don't know where," said Gordon-Watson. "It was nice to get him, as I had been underbidder a couple of times beforehand." The colt was consigned from Richard and Tessa Watson's Manor Farm Stud in Rutland. The record lasted about 11 hours until a French-bred Darshaan (GB) colt offered from Brendan Hayes's Knocktoran Stud came into the ring three lots from the end. Anthony Stroud, acting for Hong Kong owner/trainer Ivan Allan, eventually got the better of a long duel at 450,000gns with Larry Stratton, acting for Miss Ying Shen--a Chinese owner with a large string of horses in France. "He was one of the nicest horses I have seen at the sale," said Stroud. "He will be trained here initially, although I am not sure where, and then it is up to Ivan what he does with him." The session started on a high when John Ferguson, acting for Godolphin, paid 350,000gns for the second lot in the ring--a Singspiel (Ire) colt consigned from Bugley Stud for Prince Fahd Salman. "He is a wonderful advertisement for his sire as an extremely athletic colt out of a top two-year-old," said Ferguson. While Godolphin had led the spending on Tuesday, it was Sheikh Mohammed's brother Hamdan who flew the Maktoum flag as top buyer yesterday. **Top Five Colts & Fillies, Stats, p2**

**TUZLA RETIRED** Top turf miler Tuzla (Fr) (Panoramic {GB}--Turkeina {Fr}, by Kautokeino {Fr}) has been re-tired and may be bred to Kingmambo, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. Winner of the G1 Ramona H., the bay defeated males in the GII San Francisco Breeders' Cup Mile and was beaten just a neck by Silic (Fr) in the '99 G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Gulfstream Park. Owned by Stonerside, the six-year-old sustained an injury in her final start, a fourth-place finish in the GIII Churchill Downs Distaff H. in May. She retires with 12 wins from 26 starts and earnings of \$1,332,620.

**INTIDAB OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP** Shadwell Farm's Intidab (Phone Trick--Alqwani, by Mr. Prospector), who was pointing for the G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint, cracked a sesamoid in his left hind leg while breezing over the Belmont Park main track yesterday morning and will be retired, *Thoroughbred Times* on-line reports. The seven-year-old will not require surgery to repair the injury. "It's not bad, all the tendons and ligaments are OK," Shadwell Vice President and General Manager Rick Nichols told *Thoroughbred Times*. "It's one of those injuries where, with a little time off, he could resume training. With his age, he has done enough to earn a spot over there in the stud barn." The winner of the GII A Phenomenon H. last year and the GII True North H. this season, Intidab ended his career with back-to-back second-place finishes. He finished first in the GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H., but was disqualified and placed second, then missed by a length in his final outing, the GII Forego H. at Saratoga Aug. 30. The dark bay retires with seven wins, 12 seconds and five thirds from 36 starts for a bankroll of \$531,221. He will stand at Shadwell, near Lexington, next season for a fee of \$12,500. Also heading to Shadwell for 2001 are homebreds Elnadim (Danzig--Elle Seule, by Exclusive Native) and Shawaf (Mr. Prospector--Shadayid, by Shadeed), it was reported. In Britain, Elnadim was the highweighted three-year-old sprinter in 1997 and the highweighted older sprinter in 1998. He numbered the G1 Darley July Cup and G2 Racial Diadem S. among his five victories from 15 starts. The six-year-old earned \$314,575, and will stand for \$15,000. Six-year-old Shawaf, out of 1990 champion two-year-old of 1990, won two of 13 starts and \$63,250. His stud fee has been set at \$5,000.

**PUERTO MADERO RETIRED** Millionaire Puerto Madero (Chi) (Gallantsky--Paty Game {Chi}, by Saratoga Game) has been retired and will enter stud in 2001 at Walmac International near Lexington, Kentucky, it was announced yesterday. He will stand for \$5,000, live foal. A multiple Group 1 winner at three in his native Chile, the bay horse captured his North American debut in 1998 before finishing second to Horse of the Year Skip Away in the G1 Hollywood Gold Cup and the GIII MassCap. After winning the GIII Native Diver H. to close out 1998, he took the G1 Donn H. at Gulfstream in January 1999. In 2000, he finished third in the G1 Santa Anita H. and fourth in the G1 Dubai World Cup, and retires with over \$1.3 million in earnings. By the Nijinsky II stallion Gallantsky, Puerto Madero is a full brother to Chilean Group 1 winner Chantilly (Chi). "We are optimistic that his race record and the Northern Dancer sire line indicate a solid investment at \$5,000, live foal," said Walmac's John T. L. Jones, Jr.

### OCTOBER SALE BLASTS OFF

After the third--and best--day of the Tattersalls October sale saw the gross and average near enough double from the corresponding day last year, the sale totals have rung up staggering gains. Already the gross for the three days (23.9-million guineas) exceeds last year's record five-day October total (21.5-million guineas). Compared to last year's three-day total of 15.8-million guineas, the gross is up 51 percent so far, though 8 percent fewer yearlings have sold. The average is up a massive 61 percent, from 25,486gns after three days last year to 41,779gns after three days this year. Moreover, that three-day average of 25,486gns was within 1 percent of the eventual overall sale average, which was 25,688gns.

They've had 56 six-figure yearlings in the first three days; there were 19 in the whole sale last year.

In the wake of 40-plus percent rises in average at Houghton and Goffs, the feeling seemed to be that a rise to a 30,000gns average would be satisfactory, and sales officials privately played down the possibility of a 35,000gns average, which would have been in line with the first two sales, because of the October Sale's greater numbers. Now it looks like a 40,000gns average is on the cards. Boom.

It is difficult to quantify the marked improvement in the October offering, but it has certainly not hurt that Tattersalls has been successful in siphoning off what were previously bottom-end October yearlings into later sales, which have become more important adjuncts to the Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale the last week of this month, and the December sales. There is definitely a better concentration of pedigrees in the October Sale; in that sense it is becoming somewhat like Keeneland's September Sale...the October Sale is becoming the September Sale of Europe. That does account for a certain proportion of the percentage increase.

In a market which is so broadly rising--or falling, as has happened in the past and will no doubt happen in the future--sire trends may not be the most significant.

There is a huge demand for good individuals (which, especially in America, vet) with recognizable pedigrees, and there tends to be a very broad spectrum (excuse the pun) of prices for each sire. Take Spectrum. He's had yearlings sell from 2,000 to 200,000- plus in the last three weeks, and that's absolutely typical. He's sold quite well, really--the buyers clearly like the way he's started out, and it looked to me like he got better pedigrees in his second crop than most second-year sires do. I'll bet the fact the he's an outcross to Northern Dancer has something to do with it.

What seems most significant about the sire information we're seeing is the wide range of prices, just about no matter who the sire is. That indicates a market moving broadly in one direction or the other. Clearly this one is still going up. Right now it's going up about as fast as anytime during the headlong rush of the last two years. The yearling market has gone up at a dizzying rate--it's gone up so much that it has now just about justified the stud fee increases up till now. Not the next round of stud fee increases--the last round, up to the year 2000.

What seems a bit strange about this surge in European yearling prices is that it is not tied to purse money, it is not tied to resale values (the agents say it's harder than ever to find racehorses to buy privately), and it's clearly not just professionals 'trading dollars.' We've always known there are differences between the European outlook on racing and the American. In America, horses stand in the ring when they're being sold; in Europe, they walk round it, signifying a difference in the way the two sides judge yearlings. Europeans have told us for years that their racing is more of a sport and less of a business; being American, I've always had a little trouble buying that argument. Maybe they're right.

Buyers yesterday were probably unaware that the Dow dropped another 300 points, and is now hovering just above 10,000. Oil prices are threatening to spike again. The Middle East is threatening to explode. Instability threatens everywhere. Yet the horse market--specifically the European horse market--is booming. Has that much new wealth simply been created since 1992 that even a 10-percent drop from all-time highs in other markets does not put a significant dent in the kind of money available, and necessary, to be driving European yearling demand--and therefore prices--to record levels?

## WRITERS UP

### NEW MAN AT NYRA HELM

By Bill Finley

Barry K. Schwartz, a prominent owner and breeder and the CEO and co-founder of Calvin Klein, Inc, was elected Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the New York Racing Association Wednesday. Schwartz succeeds Kenny Noe Jr. and takes over at an important time as New York racing faces several challenges in the years ahead, most notably the attempted purchase of New York City OTB. Schwartz, 58, spoke with the media yesterday at Belmont, fielding a wide range of questions.

Q) Do you consider the OTB situation one of the major challenges you'll have to deal with?

A) When I joined the Board five years ago, the first thing I ever said at a Board meeting was just that, that I felt the single biggest challenge facing our Board was to buy OTB. We've been trying to do it for five years now. There's nothing more important to racing in this state than combining OTB with NYRA.

Q) Whatever happens with the sale of OTB, is this something you believe will happen quickly?

A) We don't really know. We can't control the process. The City started out asking for expressions of interest and said only those people making substantial offers would be considered for the second round. We went through the whole process, they wound up with 10 people, and, now, for the next round they say they're putting it up for sale to the whole world. We don't even know if they're serious. We've been so close to making a deal in the past, were the NYRA committee had an agreement from the City and they changed their minds. So, to put a time table on it, I don't have a clue.

Q) With on-track attendance and handle continuing to decline, what can you do to bring people back to the track?

A) That's the jackpot question. In the 18 months after we went on in-home television, on-track handle and on-track attendance each dropped approximately 25%. OTB has been the big benefactor. They picked up 20,000 telephone accounts, basically because our customers could stay home, watch television and make a bet with OTB. It was probably a poor decision on our part. If we owned OTB, it wouldn't matter because if you own OTB it doesn't matter where the fan is betting. It was a very poor decision. That was a major, major hit. I remember always talking about the hardcore 6,000 at Aqueduct, which became the hardcore 5,000. Since they started showing the races on television it became the hardcore 3,000. I'm as guilty as anyone else. I've got a horse running in the winter and I'm faced with the choice of trudging out there in the snow or watching the race on television. It's a tough situation. We'll have a lot of discussions, we'll strategize and try to figure out what we can do. Certainly we've created a great park-like atmosphere in Saratoga and the crowds have been phenomenal. We have the facility here to do the same sort of thing.

Q) With your duties at Calvin Klein, how will you find the time to also serve as the Chairman of the NYRA Board?

A) I've given that plenty of thought. Kenny spoke to me about this initially in March and I've done a lot of soul searching between then and now and I've spoken to a lot of people, including other members of the NYRA Board, about this. I told them my plan is was to spend half my time here and half my time in the city, three days here, three days there. But I'm always available by phone and, frankly, I spend days at a time in my office in New York without ever leaving my office. Whatever I do is done by telephone, by fax or through my secretary. Communications today is so different than it was years ago. I'm not going to be a chairman like Kenny. Kenny was brought in here to do a job. It was a very hands on position. He worked seven days a week for six years. I made it very clear that wasn't going to be my role. That's what Terry (Meyocks) is here for. Terry is the president and chief operating officer. He runs the racetrack on a day to day basis.

Q) Terry Meyocks has always been considered a close associate of Kenny Noe's. Is his job safe?

A) He doesn't need a vote of confidence. The only way this could work is with someone like Terry. That's how it works at Calvin Klein. I've got a president and chief operating officer who run that business day in and day out. Most all the direct reports go to him and then he reports to me. That's how this organization runs as well. He's been doing this for years and he does a fine job.

Q) How do you feel about winter racing?

A) That's a tough question. Again, OTB is a big part of the issue. If we closed down during the winter months, they would tap all our customers and we would get nothing for it. If the status quo remains, I can't see any changes. Sure, I'm in favor of taking a break in the winter. It was great in the old days when we had a two month break. Right now, that's not economically possible. It would be possible if we owned OTB. If we ever get any closer to owning OTB, I could really elaborate on what I think could happen.

Q) In your view, does the organization need someone to act both as the Chairman of the Board and the CEO, which Kenny Noe has been doing.

A) Before Kenny, the Chairman was not the type of executive Kenny was. There were a set of circumstances that warranted this under Kenny's regime. When he came here six years ago, NYRA was bleeding. They were mired in red ink. The losses were getting larger each year. He turned the entire organization around. He needed both the CEO and chairmanship titles to do what he needed to do and do it quickly and do it without any interference from anyone else. At the time it was the right decision. Purses have risen dramatically in that period of time. Revenue has risen dramatically and the organization is in far better financial shape than it ever was. Our Board is very sorry to see him leave; they gave him a standing ovation and I've never seen that before.

**SALES SLOW AT INGLIS BREEZE-UP** The fifth annual Inglis Australian Two-Year-Old Breeze Up Sale lacked only one thing--buyers--but although only 57 lots from 109 offered found new owners, the average price was up 29 percent from last year's, rising to A\$43,333 from A\$33,563. Buyers from Hong Kong and Singapore attended the one-day sale at Inglis' Newmarket headquarters yesterday, but the usual bench of local trainers was virtually absent from the sale. "The sale was better than I thought it might be, but not as good as I thought it would be a month ago," said Managing Director Reg Inglis. "I would have hoped we would have had more of a local bench, but having said that I am pleased with the result and it will be held again next year." Arthur and Harry Mitchell's Yarraman Park Stud accounted for the top two lots with lot 148, a Rory's Jester (Aus) colt out of Zero Celsius (USA) (It's Freezing {USA}) knocking down to Les Young's Doncaster Bloodstock for A\$210,000. "The Rory's Jester is a lovely, big strong horse, very mature, very powerful, he looks every inch what you expect from a Rory's Jester," Young said. The colt, an A\$85,000 Easter yearling, clocked :10.32 in his gallop and Young revealed he was purchased as the first thoroughbred foray of an unnamed Dubai buyer. "He has had success here with equestrian horses and he is involved with Sheikh Mohammed and the royal family racing horses over there, but this is his first venture here." He added, "I like the breeze-up concept very much; it fills a gap between the end of the season's yearling sales and the start of the next. There are always people who want to buy horses. If it is done the right way, if you buy specifically for this sale or breed something that is late-maturing and get it ready for this sale, it could be quite good." Young purchased five horses in total for A\$370,000. Buyers let horses at the upper end of the market slide with lot 41, a Danehill (USA) colt, passing in at A\$95,000 after being initially passed in at Easter for A\$100,000. Likewise, lot 87, a Woodman (USA) colt from Australian Oaks winning mare Northwood Plume (Aus) (Military Plume {NZ}), was passed in at A\$190,000, A\$10,000 short of the reserve, after being passed in for A\$175,000 at Easter. But nice types by less fashionable sires brought good results with lot 81, a colt by Bin Ajwaad (Ire) and out of My First Star (Ire) (Caerleon {USA}) that was a A\$27,500 yearling purchase, fetched A\$70,000; and lot 125, an Ashkalani (Ire) colt initially sold as an Inglis Classic yearling for A\$35,000, went under the hammer for A\$130,000.
