GOLD CUP GREATNESS

Tracy Farmer's **Albert The Great** (Go For Gin) put on a front-running tour-de-force to register a surprisingly easy six-length victory in yesterday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup on a sunsplashed afternoon at Belmont Park. The victory, which catapulted the sophomore to millionaire status, was achieved over an accomplished group of seven, including three Grade I winners and divisional leader **Lemon Drop Kid** (Kingmambo) and stamps the Nick Zito pupil a legitimate threat three weeks and a few hundred miles down the road at the Breeders' Cup Nov. 4. Winless in his first four starts, Zito added blinkers and 'Albert' responded with a four-length winning streak, halted when the colt finished a lackluster seventh in the GII Jim Dandy Aug. 5. Undeterred, the \$85,000 yearling purchase showed back up in the GI Travers three weeks later and was outgamed by Unshaded, losing by an excruciating head. He most recently cut out fast fractions when finishing third behind Fusaichi Pegasus in the GII Jerome Sept. 23, after which Zito criticized jockey Jorge Chavez for going out too fast. Drawn inside, Albert The Great disputed the pace with **Gander** (Cormorant) and **Skimming** (Nureyev) pinned to his outside for the opening half mile, as **Behrens** (Pleasant Colony) and 4-5 favorite Lemon Drop Kid, who exchanged bumps at the start, raced in the rear. Albert The Great began to draw clear of Gander when roused turning for home and closed with a powerful final quarter mile in 24.7 seconds to score the mild upset at 5.50-1. Gander stayed on well for second, while **Vision and Verse** (Storm Cat) took the photo for the show. Lemon Drop Kid had little rally in the stretch and finished fifth, six lengths ahead of Behrens. "He was going nice and easy, he was nice and relaxed," Chavez commented. "I knew I made a mistake last time and I told (trainer) Nick (Zito) that. I'm glad he gave me the chance to stay on him." Jockey Edgar Prado aboard the race favorite explained his trip. "Behrens slammed us at the gate and we lost all momentum. Rather than rush up, I just decided to sit in the back of the pack. He's a much better horse than he showed. He'll make amends in the Breeders' Cup." (*Gold Cup chart p2*)

EURO INVASION IN TORONTO

It's not exactly the Beatles, but this afternoon's GI Canadian International at Woodbine features its own "Fab Five" from across the Atlantic. Leading the invasion is **Daliapour** (Sadler's Wells), second in both the English and Irish Derbies last year. The four-year-old defeated GI Man O' War hero Fantastic Light to take the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 9 before finishing third behind Montjeu (Ire) and Fantastic Light in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. July 29. The Aga Khan homebred most recently finished a weakening fourth over soft turf in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden Sept. 3. **Lycitus** (Lycius), three-for-five lifetime, was victorious in the G3 Prix du Lys at Chantilly June 28 and most recently finished 10 lengths back in fifth in the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 10 behind Arc winner Sinnidar. **Mutafaweq** (Silver Hawk), two-for-six at this distance, took the 1 1/2-mile G1 Deutschland Preis in July, but disappointed as the favorite in the Grosser Preis von Baden, tiring to be eighth after being bumped at the break. In his latest outing, the \$310,000 Saratoga yearling finished third in the G1 Irish St. Leger at The Curragh Sept. 16. Consistent **Murghem** (Common Grounds {GB}) has been first or second in nine of 11 starts this year, winning the G2 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury Aug. 19 before finishing fourth in the G3 Stockholm Cup International last time out Sept. 10. The fivesome is completed by **Caitano** (GB) (Niniski), winless in seven starts this year, but second to Fantastic Light in the Dubai Sheema Classic in March. (*Previews cont. p11*)

Whether Riboletta runs in the Breeders' Cup or not, there's no doubt who the Eclipse Award winner for top older mare will be. The Brazilian-bred mare picked up her seventh straight graded-stakes win on the dirt, overpowering last year's Beldame and Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Beautiful Pleasure with a stretch run that carried her to an easy victory in a time just three ticks off Secretariat's track record of 1:45 2/5. After crushing the competition in California, the big bay headed to New York and ran away with the GI Ruffian S. Sept. 16. The odds-on choice off the effort, she sat second as Beautiful Pleasure set sail through a half in :46 and three-quarters in 1:09 1/5. But the pace took its toll and last year's champ had no answer when Riboletta came at her and then strode on past en route to another easy score. "She was awesome," jockey Chris McCarron said. "She feels so strong underneath you. She kept tugging me and when I finally let her go, she took off." As for a tilt at the Breeders' Cup, owner Aaron Jones said, "I've already been needled with the \$800,000 [the fee for supplementing to the Classic] question. We might run [GI Spinster winner] Plenty of Light in the Distaff and we might run Riboletta with the boys. At this point, I think it's a rather remote decision to make. I don't think we'll make up our mind until the last minute." But he added, "If she ran against the colts, I think she'd have a better than even chance." The mare will stay in training next year. As for the runner-up, trainer John Ward Jr. said, "Our mare is ready for the Breeders' Cup. This was the best prep she could have had."

But for two epic battles with Giant's Causeway, Kalanisi (Ire) would already be hailed as a Group 1 winner. The task laid before him yesterday was not an easy one given a large field and the presence of Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who was trying to redeem his reputation following a fourth-place effort in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The race was a muddling affair as Lermontov (Alleged) set the pace from Slickly (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and Shiva (Jpn) (Hector Protector) as Kalanisi and Montjeu were reserved in midpack. Shiva led from halfway, but was headed by Slickly with three furlongs to go and it was at that point that Kalanisi and Montjeu made progress through the pack with the former's momentum carrying him into the lead at the quarter-mile marker. Montjeu found space on the rail, leading briefly, and the pair hooked up for a final furlong duel. Both were forcefully ridden with Kalanisi pulling out extra inside the last fifty yards to secure the win. Distant Music ran on well inside the final quarter mile to fill the show, but was clearly third best on the day. "There was a slight moment of concern when Montjeu came there, but I knew our fellow was in great shape," winning trainer Sir Michael Stoute commented. "It is not often a preparation goes so well as his has done. He's only had five races this season and I wouldn't mind having another fling with him, perhaps at the G1 Japan Cup or the Breeders' Cup, but I will have to discuss it with His Highness The Aga Khan first." Jockey Johnny Murtagh, winner of nine G1 races this year, was also thrilled with the result. "He deserved that win and full credit must go to Sir Michael Stoute for keeping him sweet all year. He dug deep when Montjeu came to him and he ran all the way to the line." Of Montjeu, trainer John Hammond commented, "(Montjeu) is a wonderful horse and we have had some great days with him. We all thought he would do it when he hit the front, but it wasn't to be. He is obviously slightly past his best and in Kalanisi he met a horse who is right at the top of his form. It is now very doubtful that he will go for the Breeders' Cup, but his owners must be congratulated for keeping him in training and campaigning him aggressively."

Plenty of Light rode the golden rail to a stunning first Grade I victory, the first of two on the day for owners Aaron and Marie Jones. Undefeated in her first four career starts, culminating in a 6 1/2-length score in the OBS Championship S. in March, the Florida-bred bay was then purchased by her current connections for a reported seven-figure price. She resurfaced in August, finishing third in the Gill Duchess S. at Woodbine, then set a fast pace before losing by a nose to Critical Eye in the GI Gazelle H. at Belmont Sept. 9. Breaking from the outside post, the second choice set a moderate pace of :46 and 1:10 while well in hand under jockey Garrett Gomez. Urged on in the stretch, she held sway by 3 1/2 lengths over fellow sophomore Spain. Heritage of Gold (Gold Legend), the 3-5 chalk, was never in the running and finished a dull fourth. "She came out running, and I just sat on her and tried to keep her going," said Gomez, who also won the Gill Phoenix Breeders' Cup aboard Five Star Day. "With a big filly like her, she's not really going to quicken for you in the lane, so I just tried to keep her momentum. She started to get a little tired on me at the three-eighths [pole], but I just kept encouraging her." Meanwhile, favored Heritage of Gold was registering her second subpar performance, having finished a retreating third, placed second in the GI Personal Ensign last out. "She just didn't feel comfortable today," said jockey Shane Sellers. "She really seemed to have trouble with the turns today and her action was really a little too high. When she does that, it aggravates her and it really tires her out." Added trainer Tom Amoss, "I really don't know what we'll do next. We need to go back and figure out what is going on. There might be a reasonable explanation, but we need to see."

A.P. Valentine, with no more than a maiden win under his belt, squeezed through a hole on the rail to give trainer Nick Zito his third straight Champagne victory. Zito, who scored with The Groom Is Red two years ago and Greenwood Lake last season, had called this horse the best he has ever trained and he might not be exaggerating. The handsome bay, who earned his first win in his second start, going seven furlongs over this track Sept. 23, was rated just behind the leaders while saving ground early, found a seam to run through as they came to the eighth pole and burst through to win going away. "I was pretty much confident throughout the race," jockey Jorge Chavez said. "My plan was to go outside at the top of the stretch, but I never got there. I had to go back inside, and thankfully, [Point Given] drifted out a bit and gave me some room to come through. When I got into my horse, he just took off for the wire. He's something special to win a race like this in his third start."

Maintaining her unbeaten streak, Raging Fever roared home an impressive winner here, but all eyes were on the top of the stretch as the winner crossed the finish line. Dancinginmydreams (Seeking the Gold), the full sister to champion Heavenly Prize who was sent off the 6-5 favorite after finishing second by head in the GI Matron S. last time out, broke down as the field came out of the turn and was pulled up just past the quarter pole. "She suffered a comminuted--which means many pieces--fracture of the ...long pastern bone of the right hind leg," Dr. Neil Cleary, chief examining veterinarian at Belmont Park, said. The fracture did not puncture the skin and the filly was sent to the New Bolton Center in Pennsylvania for surgery. The injury took the focus away from what was impressive victory for Raging Fever. The dark bay, 9 1/4-length winner of the Gil Adirondack S. in the Saratoga slop Aug. 14, stretched out to a mile for the Matron and, after opening a daylight lead in the stretch, just held on to take the photo. Rated just off front-running Stormy Pick (Storm Creek) through the early fractions, the 15-10 second choice swept to the front at the top of the lane and drew clear. "The Matron was a good learning experience for her," trainer Mark Hennig said. "She had never really been asked before in the stretch. I thought giving her that wake-up call would encourage her a little more today." As for the Breeders' Cup, Hennig said, "We're looking forward to it. We want to get down there and see how she handles the racetrack." Trainer Nick Zito, who sent out runner-up Out of Sync and third-placed Western Justice as a prep for later success, said the Breeders' Cup was a possibility for both.

The winner of a York maiden Aug. 30, Tobougg stepped up off that effort to win the G1 Prix de la Salamandre at Longchamp Sept. 16, an effort which vaulted him to the forefront of the ante-post betting for next year's Classics. Pacemaker Cashel Palace (Ire) (Lure) was sent to the lead, as Noverre and Tempest were held up in rear, but the frontrunner could not maintain the pace and was headed by Mozart (Ire) (Danehill) and Tobougg approaching the final quarter mile.

Tobougg went into the outright lead approaching the final furlong and was headed briefly at the eighth pole by Mozart, but he quickened smartly and asserted on the rise to the finish to secure the win. Noverre was deprived of racing room at a crucial point, but ran on nonetheless to claim second place in the dying strides and he will now point to the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Trainer Mick Channon was upbeat after the race. "He is still learning, but he has so much speed he can be ridden from the front or can come from off the pace. I have no doubt that he will get ten furlongs in the future as he is so relaxed but only time will tell if he stays twelve furlongs. He is a class act and is really a trainer's dream." The winner is a general 6-1 second favourite for next season's G1 2000 Guineas.

Five Star Day turned in an electrifying performance on the front end, crossing the line just .12 off the track record. One of the nation's top three-year-old sprinters last season, the chestnut did not draw in to the Breeders' Cup Sprint, but won the Thirty Sews H. at Gulfstream that weekend instead and followed that up with a victory in the GIII Vernon Underwood at Hollywood Dec. 5. He was caught near the wire in the seven-furlong GI Malibu S. Dec. 26, and was given some time off after that fourth-place finish. Returning to the races Aug. 28, he dueled early and tired, finishing second behind Old Topper in a Del Mar allowance. Breaking swiftly from post three, he threw down an opening quarter of :21 3/5 and continued to lead through a half in :44 4/5. Defying the challenge of Istintaj and Bet On Sunshine, he kicked clear in the stretch for the comfortable tally. "His (Five Star Day's) performance, in my own words, was awesome," commented winning rider Garrett Gomez. "I rode him last year and I've been working him in the mornings and he's been doing fairly well for us, the this performance was out of the world."

IT'S A WRAP The astounding 2000 October Yearling Sales closed at Tattersalls in Newmarket yesterday lunchtime with an incredible set of figures. There were 73 six-figure lots, compared to 19 last year. The sale average was up 62 percent, the median by 37 percent and aggregate by 49 percent and the record price for an October yearling was broken twice. Saturday morning's session was predictably lower-key with just one six-figure offering. That was an In The Wings (Ire) colt bred by Bobby McAlpine and offered through Goldford Stud, the Cheshire nursery that dominates the National Hunt consigning world. Charlie Gordon-Watson, the week's leading buyer, went to 130,000gns to see off Sam Bullard for the colt. "He is for a new owner with Sir Mark Prescott," said Gordon-Watson. "We have been trying to buy all week and after we had no luck on Thursday, we decided to wait until today rather than go for anything on Friday." Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony was thrilled with the week. "We have been delighted with this week's trading. Way back in March we wrote to our vendors indicating that we were aiming to upgrade the Thursday and Friday sessions. This may have seemed a tall order after five consecutive record-breaking October Yearling Sales, but the response from vendors in producing an international catalogue was fantastic and over and above anything we could have expected. Overseas buyers have been enormously active at all levels, from the Greeks and Yugoslavs at the lower end, to the French, Germans, Italians and Scandinavians in the middle, while the feature at the top end has been the unprecedented demand from Hong Kong connections." Mahony felt the sale highlighted the health of the British horse racing industry. He added, "Above all this year's sale has been driven by the strength and depth of the domestic British and Irish demands. So many people in all sectors of the racing and breeding industry work tirelessly to promote racing, and this week has shown us that there is a genuine demand to participate in the sport worldwide."
