BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

PEGASUS FLIES INTO CHURCHILL

GI Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) returned to the site of his greatest victory vesterday afternoon, arriving at Churchill Downs following his flight from New York. The three-yearold was accompanied on the trip by exercise rider Andy Durnin, who said, "It was great...very uneventful. He was very quiet--almost asleep all the way. He was very relaxed." Durnin added that, while the colt can still be a handful, he is not as tough to ride now as he was during the Triple Crown campaign. "He's a more mature horse," Durnin said, adding, "But you know, I've still got to be hanging on. There's nothing to say that he can't go out jumping and broncing and rearing like he used to. If he's feeling good, he might just go ahead and do it anyway. But, generally, he's not so much of a rebel any more."

TEAM LUKAS UPDATE

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said yesterday that GI Belmont S. winner Commendable (Gone West) would not be heading to the Classic, but instead will be readied for the Strub Series at Santa Anita. Two-year-old Scorpion (Seattle Slew), however, will get a shot in the Juvenile despite a disappointing ninth-place finish in the GI Champagne S. Lukas said the colt displaced his soft palate in that race.

SPRINT CANDIDATES WORK

Trippi (End Sweep) and More Than Ready (Southern Halo), first and second, respectively, in the GI Vosburgh S. last time out, worked at Belmont Park for trainer Todd Pletcher Sunday morning. Trippi went an easy half in :51 over the Belmont main track, while stablemate More Than Ready went five furlongs in a handy 1:00 1/5 over the same surface.

Storm Cat's son Giant's Causeway has broken nearly as many hearts as Warren Beatty, thanks to his combative style of racing: after allowing his rivals to edge ahead, seemingly on their way to glory, he launches a stirring counter-attack which nearly always leaves his rivals' dreams in shatters.

Kalanisi has been doubly unfortunate to have suffered this fate in two Group 1 events, the Coral-Eclipse and Juddmonte International, on both occasions going down by a head after leading in the final furlong. Considering that the four-year-old's rider received suspensions for using his whip with excessive frequency in both these races, Kalanisi's spirit could well have been broken. Fortunately, the colt proved as ready as always to do his very best when he raced for the first time since those defeats in the G1 Dubai Champion S., and he needed all his enthusiasm to get the better of Montjeu.

Kalanisi represents another belated triumph for his sire, the Mill Reef horse Doyoun, who was a member of the Aga Khan's stallion team for 10 years until his sale to Turkey after the 1998 covering season. The Aga had every right to expect a lot of Doyoun when he retired at a fee of IR£20,000. For a start, this winner of the 2000 Guineas had the rare distinction of being a Classic winner produced by a mating between two Classic winner produced by a mating between two Classic winners. His sire Mill Reef numbered the Derby among his many major triumphs, while his dam, Dumka, had won the French 1000 Guineas before embarking on a sensational broodmare career which produced six stakes winners.

The fact that Doyoun had proved himself to be one of Mill Reef's faster sons seemed likely to be an asset in his bid to buck a trend which had seen most of Mill Reef's staying sons prove disappointing stallions (with the marked exception of Shirley Heights). I kept faith with Doyoun, often thinking I could see promise in his results, especially when his second crop produced the Group winners Manntari (G1 National S.), Adaiyka and Dalara. Unfortunately, there were no Group winners in either his third or fourth crops and I eventually came to share the widely held belief that his promise was going to go largely unfulfilled.

Doyoun has since thumbed his nose at his critics, starting his redemption by siring the excellent Daylami in his fifth crop. His next crop contained Takarian, a Group 3 winner in Ireland who became a Grade III and Grade II winner in the U.S., and there were three Group winners --Rafayda, Manndar and Kalanisi--in his seventh. As Manndar has already won two Grade I's on turf this year, Kalanisi is the fourth Group 1-winning son for Doyoun. One significant aspect of Doyoun's record is that all eight of his Group winners were bred by the Aga Khan--a fact which both reflects the expertise of His Highness' breeding operation and the lack of support which Doyoun received from other breeders.

The Aga Khan owes some of his success with Doyoun to inbreeding to Nasrullah and the doubling up in Kalanisi's pedigree takes the form of 3x4 inbreeding to Nasrullah's son Never Bend, through Never Bend's best sons Mill Reef and Riverman. This inbreeding can certainly take some of the credit, because Kalanisi is the first foal of a non-winning mare, Kalamba (by Green Dancer). However, Kalanisi's second dam, Riverman's daughter Kareena, was a courageous and tough stakes performer at around a mile and bred Kerita, a very good seven-furlong specialist. This hasn't been one of the Aga Khan's foremost families, but it is in Kalanisi's favour that this is the family which produced Kaldoun, a smart racehorse who developed into a champion stallion.

Kalanisi's racing days aren't over yet, though, and he could run in the Breeders' Cup Turf--a race which ought to suit him, judging by the American successes of Daylami, Manndar and Takarian.

BREEDERS' CUP PREVIEW RATINGS JUMP The

cvernight rating for the NBC telecast of the Breeders' Cup Preview card from Belmont Park was up 25 percent over last year's figure, *The Blood-Horse* on-line reports. The program, which televised the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, GI Beldame and GI Champagne from 4:30-6 p.m. EDT, drew a 1.5 rating, representing viewership in approximately 2.7 million households, and a 4-percent share of the viewing market, as compared to a 1.2 rating and a 3-percent share last year, when the telecast was shown from 2:30-4 p.m.

MARE IN FOAL TO TALE OF THE CAT TOPS

OBS DAY 2 The seven-year-old broodmare Binge (Wild Again--Find (Icecapade)), in foal to Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), brought a final bid of \$125,000 to top vesterday's second session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Fall Mixed Sale. Tale of the Cat, whose first foals are weanlings this year, was a graded-stakes winner of \$360,900. Consigned by Journeyman Bloodstock (Brent and Crystal Fernung), agent, Binge was purchased by Jim Wells. Bringing the second-highest price of the day was the 12-year-old broodmare Raise a Prince (Raise a Bid--Dynastic Gal {Dynastic}), in foal to top freshman sire Storm Creek (Storm Cat). Consigned by Emerald Pastures Farm, agent, the stakeswinning mare was purchased by Brylynn Farm, Inc. for \$110,000. The top-selling weanling yesterday was a filly from the second crop of graded-stakes winner Semoran (Phone Trick) out of Atillamona (Honest Pleasure). Consigned by Summerfield, Agent LIII, the February foal was purchased for \$65,000 by Arch Bloodstock, agent. While the gross for the first preferred session was down 35 percent as compared to 1999, when there were nearly 50-percent more horses sold, the average was only off 3 percent and the median held steady. The five-day sale continues with preferred session today and tomorrow, followed by open sessions Thurday and Friday. Bidding begins at 10:30 a.m. daily.

Silverleaf Farm Sold:

David Hutson's 625-acre Silverleaf Farm near Ocala, Florida was sold Saturday via auction. The property was originally offered in three separate parcels, with the high bids coming from three different individuals. Buyers were then given the opportunity to bid on the entire property, which attracted the best price, \$4.9 million, from an investment partnership including former Silverleaf President Bob Cromartie, Becky Thomas and Lewis Lakin. "Having just completed construction on the farm two years ago, I knew that the construction costs and the land acquisistions were nearly double the final bid," Cromartie said. "I had been interested in acquiring one of the parcels, but the combined property was an exceptional value." The partnership will meet this week to decide what to do with the property. Early plans call for the farm to be put back on the market.

EUROPEAN CUP CONTENDERS

Corals has made Saturday's G1 Dubai Champion S winner Kalanisi (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) the new 4-1 favourite for the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Churchill Downs. Runner-up Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), was reported 'fine' by trainer John Hammond after his exertions at Newmarket. "The horse is fine after Newmarket but whether he runs again we'll have to see how he is," Hammond said yesterday. "I'll discuss with the owners over the next few days whether to retire him or aim him at the Breeders' Cup Turf. I would think a decision won't be made until early next week." Meanwhile, Indian Lodge (Ire) (Grand Lodge {Ire}), impressive winner of Sunday's G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp, may head to Churchill Downs for the Mile. His trainer Amanda Perrett said yesterday, "To be quite honest we hadn't thought about America, but if it looked like there was a chance he was going to get his soft ground--if there was a deluge in Kentucky--then we would consider it. The plan was this weekend and we hadn't looked beyond it. We'll mull the Breeders' Cup option over in the next week or so before we have to make the entry."

SAGAMIX TO FRANCE The 1998 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}--Saganeca {USA}, by Sagace {Fr}) has been retired and will stand the 2001 season at Haras du Logis in France as a Darley stallion. His fee will be FF25,000. The French-bred grey capped an unbeaten three-year-old campaign with a victory in the G2 Prix Niel and a dramatic half-length triumph in the Arc. Purchased by Godolphin after the Arc, Sagamix ran third behind Montjeu in his final start in the July 2 G1 Gran Prix de Saint-Cloud. "Sagamix was a top-class racehorse, with great talent and determination," said stud manager Julian Ince. "He also has a tremendous pedigree, being the outstanding son of a hugely successful stallion. He is an absolute bargain at his fee and we hope to attract mares from all over Europe."

The filly will be trained in France by Englishman Richard Gibson, During the opening session, L'Agence Francaise sold 97 yearlings for a total of FF9,868,000 and an average of FF101,732. The average rose 19 percent over last year's opening session when 68 yearlings grossed FF5,815,000 and averaged FF85,515. Yesterday, 60 horses were reported as not sold. The three-day sale continues today at 10 a.m. and resumes at 5 p.m., after the day's races.

PROTEST AT THE CURRAGH

A demonstration is set for this morning at the offices of the Irish Turf Club to protest the body's reluctance to accept a proposal which would channel revenue from off-course betting back into Irish racing. Irish Minister for Finance Charlie McCreevy has offered the Irish racing industry a proposal which could generate a reported Ir£34 million annually and has also put forth the idea of a merger of the Irish Turf Club, the Irish Horseracing Authority and the Association of Irish Racecourses. The 150 members of the Turf Club have been unwilling to undertake discussion on the proposed merger. The protest is expected to attract representatives from all factions of the racing industry, including owners and trainers, breeders, stable lads, jockeys and breeders.
