Japan will field two challengers for the Breeders' Cup, Agnes World (Danzig) and Maltese Superb (With Approval). They are scheduled to arrive Oct. 30, and will quarantine at Keeneland before heading to Churchill Downs. Agnes World, winner of the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket, will be entered in the Sprint, while Maltese Superb, heroine of the G3 Flower Cup at Nakayama, will try her hand at the Filly and Mare Turf.

Perfect Plum showed her liking for these easy conditions when accounting for 16 rivals in the Blaydon Race at Newcastle Aug. 28, Europe's richest nursery. She was then tried in the G3 May Hill S. at Doncaster Sept. 7, but could finish only ninth to Karasta (Ire) there. Here she claimed her first stakes success on the heavy ground that appears to aid her in this class. Taken into second position early by jockey George Duffield, she tracked Lunevision (Fr) (Solid Illusion) until the turn into the straight, at which point she was asked to stretch. She lengthened well to steal a length and a half advantage, staying on well despite drifting right across Linea d'Ombra and Lady Lahar (GB) (Fraam {GB}) in the final stages of the race. Ascension, giving five pounds away to the winner, was held up in last by jockey Cash Asmussen, and although she had an impossible task in the straight, the way she quickened to reach a clear second suggests she is capable of better.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

On the basis of her two most recent efforts it would appear that Riboletta might be one of the best mares to race in this country for many years. Winner of three out of four races in her native Brazil as a three-year-old, including the G1 Grande Premio Diana, Riboletta lost her way a little when running in North America last season, with only an allowance win and a third in the GII Bayakoa H. from six starts. Since she hit form early this year, Riboletta has been unstoppable, winning seven straight graded stakes, five of them Grade I.

After amply demonstrating her talents on the West Coast, Riboletta treated New Yorkers to a sensational display in the GI Ruffian H., winning by 7 1/2 lengths in a time less than a second off the track record for eight and a half furlongs. Last weekend Riboletta made a second New York appearance, and was equally impressive in defeating last year's champion older mare, Beautiful Pleasure, by two lengths in a time which was just three tenths of a second of Secretariat's track record.

Although she was foaled in Brazil, Riboletta has a pedigree which is mostly forged from North American and French strains. Her sire, Roi Normand, was by twice leading sire Exclusive Native out of the talented French-raced Luthier filly, Luth de Saron. Foaled in North America, Roi Normand was stakes placed at three and four in France, before returning at five, to capture the GI Sunset H. and GIII Ark-La-Tex H. in his native land. Sent to stand at the Haras Santa Ana do Rio Grande in Brazil (also breeders of Riboletta), Roi Normand has sired several major winners, including Riboletta's brother, Super Power (Brz), a Group 1 winner in Brazil this year.

Riboletta's dam, Joy Valley, a stakes winner in Brazil, is a daughter of Ghadeer (Lyphard--Swanilda {Fr}, by Habitat, who earned Group 3 honors in Italy before being exported to Brazil. Riboletta's granddam, Belle Valley, was a Group 1 winner in Brazil, but she was out of the French-bred My Valley, by *Val de Loir. In turn My Valley had as her fourth dam the brilliant French mare Mistress Ford (by Blanford), undefeated in six starts at two and winner of the Prix de Diane (French Oaks) and Prix Vermeille at three. This family has something of a knack of producing outstanding females: My Valley's granddam, Fast Beauty, is also third dam of Hurry Harriet II, who upset the Queen of the French Turf, Allez France, in the 1973 Champion S. at Newmarket

Mistress Ford was the outstanding daughter of Blandford and it's worth noting that Riboletta is also linebred to one of Blandford's finest sons, the great French racehorse, Brantome. There is also a clever genetic relationship between Zitza, the third dam of Riboletta's sire, Roi Normand, and Sweet and Lovely, granddam of Riboletta's broodmare sire, Ghadeer. Zitza is by a son of Djebel, and her dam is by a son of Fair Copy out of a mare by Deux Pour Cent. Sweet And Lovely's sire is by a son of Deux Pour Cent out of a Fair Copy mare, and her dam is by a son of Djebel. Zitza and Sweet and Lovely are 4x4 in Riboletta's pedigree, so perhaps combining this pair has something to with Riboletta's ability.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The up and coming filly, She's A Devil Due (f, 2, Devil His Due--Fapulous Star, by Fappiano) took her record to four wins in four starts with a game score in the GII Walmac International Alcibiades S. A daughter of the underrated young sire, Devil His Due, She's A Devil Due has a rather clever pedigree. Devil His Due is out of a mare by Raise a Cup. In turn, Raise a Cup is by Raise a Native of a mare by Nashua, a cross which also produced Mr. Prospector, grandsire of She's A Devil Due's dam. Thus She's A Devil Due has the three-parts related Raise a Cup and Mr. Prospector 3x3, so it looks as if breeding mares carrying Mr. Prospector to Devil His Due is a course which could pay dividends. TAKING STOCK OF THE SALES

It was a feverish three weeks of yearling sales in Britain and Ireland, capped off by Tattersalls' October Sale registering a 49 percent gain in turnover and a 62 percent jump in average. The yearling sales aren't over yet in Europe, either: Deauville's October sale finishes today, then there's another at Doncaster, two more days back in Newmarket during their Autumn (Horses-in-Training) Sale, and there's even two days at the beginning of the December Sale. But the main yearling sales are now finished, and the market now turns its attention to the broodmare and foal sales which get underway in Kentucky in just two weeks' time.

When we review the nine major yearling sales included in the figures provided to us by *Racing Update*, the relentless upward trend of the yearling sales the last couple of years is evident. Converting the figures to U.S. dollars and adding it all up, at the corresponding 1998 sales 5,702 yearlings grossed \$425.5-million, and averaged \$74,624--pretty respectable figures which already represented big increases from the market bottom in 1992, and the market turnaround beginning in 1995.

This year, the number of yearlings sold in the corresponding sales had increased only marginally, by six percent to 6,027. But around \$75-million in aggregate value, and more than \$10,000 in average, has been added each year. The 2000 sales covered grossed \$579.6-million, and averaged \$96,181. These are huge advances: the gross increased 36 percent--over \$150-million--in two years, and the average increased by about \$21,500, or 29 percent. Over six thousand cases, that's a meaningful sample.

Especially in light of the big increases--and the strength in depth--at the European sales, the dominance of the Keeneland September sale is striking. Even as the overall yearling market has grown by 30 percent over the last two years, the September Sale's market share has increased. In 1998, the September Sale gross of \$169.8-million constituted 40 percent of the nine-sale market. Last year, its gross of just under \$233-million was 46 percent of the market, and this year its \$290-million gross constituted exactly 50 percent of the yearling market. Of course, the numbers are all huge--the 3,309 sold there were 55 percent of all yearlings sold in the nine sales.


What Does It Mean for Stud Fees ...

It may all mean something different for past stud fees paid, as opposed to future ones. A broad two-year market gain probably means that stud fee rises up till now have largely been financially justified, certainly much more so than had the market surge stalled at 1998 levels. But the same now holds true. As TDN's new ROI vs. stud fee figure showed at the end of the September sale, 2000 median prices were only 2.00 times 2000 stud fees. Any further increases for 2001 only amplify the challenge for the yearling market to sustain its current growth rateshould the yearling market stall, profitability will fall. It has to continue growing in order to sustain current levels of profitability.

Another factor which affects the stud fee picture is undoubtedly the doubling of stallions' book sizes, pioneered by Coolmore, which is now standard industry practice. Take the Top 12 stallions, or whatever the number is, out of this equation--they're a different tier of the market, all by themselves. Them aside, the number of stallions with 100+ books, and 80+ foal crops, has proliferated dramatically. The competition for mares is so intense that a stallion pegged too high, or shunned by the market for whatever reason, good or bad, is in danger of being swallowed up by the tide if he's 'only' got a crop of 40 foals. Unfortunately, it also means further dilution of class mares--already decimated by the decline of top-level homebred racing outfits, and therefore families, plus the export of so many top mares back to Europe, or to Japan. Sometimes a bright young thing covering 100 mares is getting a lot of moderate prospects: the sheer numbers, on top of everything else, further dilute the quality.

The upshot is that stud fees below the Top12 level may not rise much for 2001, as Coolmore's American arm, Ashford Stud, once again demonstrated when they released their 2001 stud fees last week, what it is necessary to do in order to remain competitive in the business of attracting books of 100+ mares. Just as last year, their message is--don't raise prices. Among their 14 standing both seasons, more declined (five) than advanced (three); six stayed the same. The stallion owners' success in doubling book sizes may create a narrow window of opportunity for breeders, in that, at most levels, next year's stud fee rises may not--for once--singlehandedly wipe out this year's yearling sale gains.

Porter Pedigree Shorts cont.

Glen Hill Farm have reaped the benefit of some clever inbreeding over the years, and there is another nice pattern in the pedigree of their first time stakes winner Four Plus Four (f, 3, Major Impact--Lonely Girl, by Relaunch), who took the Carmel H. at Bay Meadows at the weekend. Four Plus Four's sire, Major Impact, is out of a mare by In Reality, also sire of Four Plus Four's broodmare sire, Relaunch, so Four Plus Four has In Reality 3x3 in the center of the pedigree. The dam, Lonely Girl, a stakes-winning sister to Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine, One Dreamer, has the three-parts related Foggy Note and Lead Time 2x3 in her pedigree.

One of our favorite patterns, that of inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire, continues to appear in all sorts of strange places. One of the latest is in the pedigree of Rocky North (f, 3, Rocky Mountain--Far North Port, by Far North), winner of the Delta Lady H. at Calder. Rocky North is a daughter of the Alydar stallion, Rocky Mountain, a \$1,800,000 yearling but a modest performer who had just a maiden win and minor stakes place to advertise him when he went to stud. Rocky North is out of the stakes winning Issues 'n Answers, a daughter of Jacinto, and since Rocky North's granddam is also by Jacinto, she has Jacinto 3x3 with one strain appearing as broodmare sire of the sire.

VALID DOROTHY TOPS OBS TUESDAY The stakes-placed mare Valid Dorothy (Valid Appeal--One for Dorothy, by Gate Dancer) brought a bid of \$125,000 from Group X to top Tuesday's session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Fall Mixed Sale. Offered from the consignment of Peacock Ridge (Becky Boyd), agent, the four-year-old chestnut is carrying her first foal by GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Awesome Again (Deputy Minister). Secondhighest price on the day was the nine-year-old mare Miss Applause (Fappiano--Musique Royale, by Northern Dancer), dam of the stakes-winning two-year-old Corporate Shuffle (Diablo) this year. In foal to Siphon (Brz), whose first foals are yearlings of 2000, she was consigned by Lakland LLC, agent, and was purchased by Brylynn Farm, Inc. The top-priced weanling was Hip 575, a Florida-bred daughter of leading freshman sire Storm Creek (Storm Cat). Purchased by Buzz Chace as agent for Paraneck, she was consigned by Sugar Hill Farm, agent for McMaster Farm. The average of this second preferred session was up slightly to \$21,055 from 1999's \$19,374. The sale continues with the final preferred session today, followed by open sessions Thursday and Friday. Bidding begins at 10:30 a.m. daily. Statistics p2

Trainer Dale Romans reported the five-year-old mare sustained a slab fracture in her left front knee. She had been expected to make the final start of her career in the GII Churchill Downs Distaff on the Breeders' Cup undercard. Instead, Roza Robata underwent surgery Monday to repair the fracture. "[Dr. Larry Bramlage] said that she'd be fine and could probably come back and compete at the same level if we ever wanted to race her again," said Romans. "It was sad to see her go vesterday, but she was fun to have." Roza Robata won this year's GIII Pimlico Distaff H. and the 1998 GIII Honeybee S. She was also third in this year's GI Hempstead H. and GI Go for Wand H. and was on the board in seven other graded events. Roza Robata retires with eight wins and 14 placings in 34 starts for earnings of \$732,780.

GODOLPHIN RUNNERS TO FLORIDA Four-yearolds Worldly Manner (Riverman--Lady Pastor, by Flying Paster) and Comeonmom (Jolie's Halo--Single Blade, by Hatchet Man) have been retired from racing and will stand next season at Wycome House Stud in Florida. The pair was purchased by Godolphin after promising two-year-old campaigns in the United States and prepared for the 1999 Kentucky Derby in Dubai. Worldly Manner made his three-year-old debut in the Derby, finishing a game fourth behind Charismatic. The dark bay captured the GII Del Mar Futurity and GIII Best Pal S. The 1998 GII Remsen winner, Comeonmom missed the Derby, but ran third behind Dubai Millennium (GB) in the Maktoum Challenge at Nad al Sheba earlier this year. "They were two exceptionally fast, talented two-year-olds," said Wycombe owner Sean Kelly. "Both took high rank nationally and it's encouraging that Darley is retaining them on its world-wide roster, alongside the likes of Dubai Millennium and proven stallions Machiavellian and Quiet American."

ENTREPRENEUR COLT TOPS DEAUVILLE

SECOND DAY Taking top bid in yesterday's second session of France's Deauville October Yearling Sale was a son of G1 2000 Guineas winner Entrepreneur (GB). Out of the stakes-placed mare Freedom Flame (GB), Lot 281 was consigned by Haras d'Etreham and bought by the MAB Agency for FF510,000. The second-highest priced yearling, Lot 267, is by leading sire Rainbow Quest (USA) out of Flabbergasted (Ire). Purchased by Chantilly Bloodstock Agency for FF450,000, he was consigned by Fresnay-Le-Buffard. The session's average of FF92,167 boosted up seven percent from last year's FF85,512. With 126 yearlings sold from 182 offered, the sale saw a 12-percent increase in second-day gross, from 1999's FF10.176,000 to vesterday's FF11,613,000. Overall the sale's cumulative gross increased by 26 percent on last year's account. The final session of the three-day sale continues today at 10 a.m. and resumes at 5 p.m., after the day's races.

The five-year-old has run over distances from five furlongs to a mile and has collected this year's G3 Van Geest Criterion S. at Newmarket July 1 and G3 Hungerford S. at Newbury Aug. 18. Were he to succeed there, he would provide his trainer Luca Cumani with his second success in the Mile, following that of Barathea (Ire) in 1994. Cumani said: "He definitely goes for the Mile. I think the track will suit him and Jamie Spencer will ride."

STRONG TRADE AT DBS OCTOBER With sales all over Europe providing personal bests, yesterday's Autumn Horses In Training Sale did not disappoint with an increase of 16 percent on last year recorded. The sale offered 204 lots with 171 sold, making a total of 697,900 guineas and an average of 4,081 guineas. Top lot was number 219, Hoh Invader (Ire) (Accordion {Ire}), a brother to the top-class hurdler Dato Star (Ire), who sold for 26,000 guineas. The eight-year-old gelding was bought by N Midgley, an owner linked to trainer Anne Swinbank. Henry Beeby, managing director of Doncaster Bloodstock Sales Ltd, said: "It was a good strong trade from start to finish and we had representatives from all over the world--we are well up on last year."

FLY TO THE STARS TO STAND IN FRANCE Last year's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. winner, Fly To The Stars (GB) (Bluebird {USA}--Rise And Fall {GB}, by Mill Reef {USA}) will retire to stud at the Haras du Logis in France. The six-year-old won the G3 Prix Messidor and G2 Prix du Rond-Point in 1998, before being named 1999's highweight older horse in England at 7-9 1/2 furlongs. "Fly To The Stars was a hugely talented miler, capable of beating the best," Stud Manager Julian Ince said. "He's what many breeders are looking for: a classy Group 1 miler who was also very tough." Ending his career with a lifetime record of 19-6-4-1 and earnings of \$457,847, his fee is set at FF25,000, no foal free return.
