HONG KONG INT'L ENTRIES RELEASED

A strong list of foreign entries has been released for the Dec. 17 Hong Kong International Races. Of the 305 individual overseas nominees from a record 16 countries entered for the four races, 57 are Group/Grade I winners. Among the entries for the Hong Kong Cup are Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), defending champion Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}), Mutafaweq (Silver Hawk), Fantastic Light (Rahy), Manndar (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) and Val's Prince (Eternal Prince). Among possible starters in the Hong Kong Mile are Australasia's Horse of the Year Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}), Testa Rossa (Aus) (Perugino), Arkadian Hero (Trempolino), Bertolini (Danzig), Ladies Din (Din's Dancer), Hap (Theatrical {Ire}), Black Hawk (GB) (Nureyev), Aristotle (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). In the Hong Kong Vase entries are Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Fruits of Love (Hansel), Air Shakur (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and John's Call (Lord at War {Arg}). Among the Hong Kong Sprint possibles are Namid (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), Nuclear Debate (Geiger Counter), Agnes World (Danzig), Reraise (Danzatore), Kona Gold (Java Gold) and Five Star Day (Carson City). The closing date for Hong Kong entries is Nov. 28.

DANCINGINMYDREAMS ON THE MEND

Dancinginmydreams (Seeking the Gold), who suffered a shattered right hind pastern during the GI Frizette S. at Belmont Park last Saturday, is doing well at the New Bolton Center at the University of Pennsylvania, The Blood-Horse on-line reports. The two-year-old filly underwent a lengthy surgery Saturday night. "She came through the surgery fine, she came out of the anesthesia and woke up in the swimming pool fine and she has accepted the brace they put on her leg," Buzzy Tenney, assistant to trainer Shug McGaughey, told The Blood-Horse. "There will be more surgeries down the road, but we're all optimistic. It's remarkable what they are able to do in veterinary medicine nowadays--eight or 10 years ago, they might not have been able to save her at all." The bay, second by a head in the GI Matron S. in her second career start, is a full sister to champion Heavenly Prize.

A TROPHY FOR TAMBURLAINE?

Those who witnessed the explosive burst of Tamburlaine (Ire) (Royal Academy) past halfway in his Newmarket maiden will not forget it easily, so impressively did he put away a competitive field in that Sept. 26 test, and he has sound claims to the winner's share of the purse in today's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster. Before breaking his maiden, the colt was a neck second to the current G1 English 2000 Guineas ante-post favourite Nayef in the Haynes, Hanson & Clark Conditions S. at Newbury Sept. 15. Aidan O'Brien, whose Aristotle (Ire) took this race last year, will be looking to Giant's Causeway's brother Freud (Storm Cat, among his three runners, to make up for the absence of Hemingway (Ire), who was withdrawn earlier in the week. Freud, beaten a half length when second in a maiden race at The Curragh in July, finished fifth behind Tobougg (Ire) in the Oct. 14 G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in his second start. His jockey, Jamie Spencer, said after the Dewhurst that those that finished in front would not beat him again, so he arrives here with expectations high. Also from Ballydoyle is Darwin (Ire) (Danehill), who did not recreate the impression of his Curragh maiden win when sixth in the G1 National S. at the same course Sept. 17. He was lame after that effort, but if he is back on song he could be a lively threat. Grandera (Ire) (Grand Lodge), an impressive winner in a Warwick maiden on his second start, found only King Charlemagne too strong in the G3 Somerville Tattersalls S. at Newmarket Sept. 29 and looks ready for this grade.

Surfside Preps for Distaff

Overbrook Farm's **Surfside** (Seattle Slew) worked five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 at Churchill Downs yesterday morning as she gets ready for the \$2 million Distaff. The three-year-old filly was second in the Raven Run S. at Keeneland Oct. 11 in her first start since running fifth in the GI Santa Anita Derby in April. Third in the Juvenile Fillies last year, the daughter of 1994 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Flanders was sidelined for surgery to remove chips from her ankles.

Stronach Babies Stretch Their Legs

Frank Stronach's Breeders' Cup Juvenile candidate Macho Uno (Holy Bull) breezed over the Churchill main track yesterday morning. The winner of the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine last time out, the colt went five-eighths in 1:00 4/5. He is a half brother to 1998 Classic winner Awesome Again. Juvenile Fillies hopeful Top of the League (Lite The Fuse), undefeated in two starts after taking the Manayunk S. at Philadelphia Park Oct. 7, went an easy five furlongs in 1:03 with jockey Mike Smith aboard.

At Belmont Park, Affirmed Success (Affirmed), second by a neck in the GII Kelso H. last time out, went four furlongs in :47 4/5 over a firm inner turf. The sixyear-old will try the Mile; he was 12th in the Sprint last year and sixth in that event in 1998...GI Beverly D. S. winner Snow Polina (Trempolino), prepping for the Filly and Mare Turf, went five furlongs in a rapid :58 4/5 on the Belmont inner turf. The chestnut was second by a head in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational H. last time out...the 1998 Breeders' Cup Sprint winner and champion sprinter Reraise (Danzatore) went five furlongs in 1:01 4/5 at Hollywood Park. Beaten only once in eight career starts, the five-year-old gelding has not been out since winning the Oakland H. at Golden Gate Fields in May of 1999.

HONG KONG JOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP The International Jockeys' Championship will take place on Dec. 13 at Hong Kong's Happy Valley Racecourse. Among the jockeys expected to participate in the event are Frankie Dettori, Mick Kinane, Johnny Murtagh, Olivier Peslier, Yutaka Take and Robbie Fradd. Dettori edged out Kieran Fallon and Peslier for last year's title. For the first time, jockeys competing at the IJC races will be automatically licensed to ride at the Hong Kong International meeting on Dec. 17. The winning jockey will receive a trophy and HK\$200,000. The runner-up will receive HK\$100,000.

Three-for-four in France, including a Group 3 victory in his European finale, Jokerman was the winner of the GIII Generous S. at Hollywood last November in his U.S. debut. Given a 3 1/2-month break after that effort, the bay came back trying dirt in the GIII El Camino Real Derby and finished eighth, then disappeared for another 6 1/2 months. Back on the grass after the layoff, the \$26,000 KEESEP yearling closed from just off the pace to be second in the Sept. 30 GIII Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Derby last time out and should benefit from that tightener. David Copperfield apparently didn't care for the Del Mar course when a distant 10th in the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 10, but had captured the GIII Cinema H. at Hollywood in June and rebounded to finish second in the restricted In Excess S. at Santa Anita Oct. 4. The speedy dark bay, purchased for \$2.6 million from the 505 dispersal at Barretts in July, will be joined on the front end by L'effaceur, who led every step to win an allowance on the Del Mar turf Sept. 1 and made it two in a row with a front-running victory in the Pomona Derby on the dirt at Fairplex last time out Sept. 30.

When Clearing first appeared at Salisbury in late June in a maiden on good-to-firm ground, he finished sandwiched in between Priors Lodge (Ire) (Grand Lodge) and Potaro (Ire) (Catrail). He was beaten again in his next maiden, but graduated easily on the soft at Chester last time. With those prevailing conditions facing him once again here, he managed to comprehensively reverse the Salisbury form, showing his liking for the easier going to establish himself as a stakes winner at the first time of asking. Held up in mid-division early as Potaro and Prizeman shared the lead, he was always travelling well alongside the newcomer Frenchman's Bay. Past halfway, as Prizeman took command, he was brought with a smooth run on the near side, which took him to the front with a furlong remaining. As Frenchman's Bay failed to pick up after looking the main danger, Prizeman plugged on in second, but the race was over as Clearing produced a strong finish to take the prize. "He has a great temperament, and he's a lovely little horse who has improved a lot," said trainer John Gosden. "He's won his race well and took full command in the last furlong--he wants a mile now."

Danehurst is out of a three-parts sister to Classicplaced Dazzle (GB), who produced a tremendous turn of foot to win the 1996 G2 Cherry Hinton S. going six furlongs at Newmarket. This filly has inherited the family's inherent speed, by the looks of it, producing an emphatic performance on her first try at stakes level. She was making a major jump from her last start on the all-weather surface of Wolverhampton, where she broke the juvenile course record. The favourite here, she justified her connections' faith in style. Always prominent as Fromsong and Red Millennium shared the lead, she was kept to the outside, quickened with two furlongs remaining and quickly put paid to Red Millennium's challenge, drawing away with enthusiasm. A delighted trainer Sir Mark Prescott said, "She didn't show a lot in the winter, but she was very well in May, then rattled up her knee and needed a breather." He added, "I would imagine she'll go back to Cheveley Park Stud now and run fairly late next summer, as there's very little for three-year-old sprinting fillies early in the year."

JAIL TERM FOR J.T. LUNDY Former Calumet Farm President J.T. Lundy was sentenced to 54 months in prison Thursday on charges of bribery, conspiracy and fraud. Lundy and Calumet's former Chief Financial Officer Gary Matthews, who was sentenced to 21 months, were convicted of the charges last February. Lundy and Matthews were also ordered to repay more than \$20.4 million each in defaulted loans to the Federal Deposit Insurance Company, which took over the First City National Bank when that institution failed because of the Calumet loans. Prosecutors had asked for a stiffer sentence for Lundy, alleging that he was responsible for the death of Alydar, who broke his leg and had to be euthanized in November of 1990, just months before Calumet declared bankruptcy. Lundy was accused of having the stallion killed for the \$36 million in insurance money, but U.S. District Judge Sim Lake said there was not enough evidence to impose a longer jail term. "There is some physical evidence, and circumstances surrounding the event are suspicious, but I cannot conclude he is responsible [for Alydar's death]," Lake said.

OBS WRAP-UP The six-day Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Fall Mixed Sale concluded yesterday with slight dips in gross and average for the three consignorpreferred sessions (compared to two last year) as well as the two open sessions. The consignor-preferred sessions saw a 7-percent decrease in gross and a 14percent decrease in average. The open sessions, held Thursday and Friday, saw just a 1-percent drop in gross and an 11-percent reduction in average. The sale began Sunday with three major dispersals, from the Estate of Fred Hooper, Mockingbird Farm and Locust Valley/ Farnsworth Farm. Yesterday's final session was topped by a colt from the first crop of graded-stakes winner Traitor (Cryptoclearance) out of Miss Greek (Greek Sky). The weanling, consigned by Delcrest Farm, agent, was purchased for \$35,000 by Abracadabra Farms, agent.

GRAND LODGE FILLY TOPS DONCASTER OCTOBER FINALE Doncaster's October Yearling Sales finished with a buoyant final session last night which saw a record price of 35,000gns plus new highs for turnover, average and median. The handle broke the seven-figure mark for a first time, the average of 3,852gns beat the four-year-old previous best by 24 percent and the median of 2,600gns was 100gns more than the previous highest. No less than 12 yearlings beat last year's modest top price of 16,500gns and an hour into the post-racing session, Lot 581, a filly by Grand Lodge (USA) became the most expensive October Yearling Sales graduate ever when realising 35,000gns. David Minton of the BBA signed the buyer's ticket with Irish breeder and pinhooker Eddie O'Leary the underbidder. The March-born filly, offered by Richard and Sally Aston's Goldford Stud for her breeder Alan Brazier, is out of Listed winner Vax Lady (GB) (Millfontaine {GB}). Minton said, "She is for a new client of mine and will go to Mick Channon. She's by a fashionable sire and was very nice for this sale--I think she would definitely have made more at Newmarket last week." David Redvers of Tweenhills Stud landed an audacious pinhooking touch when Lot 602, a Bluebird (USA) filly he had bought a month ago at the St Leger Sales for 8,700gns, realised 23,000gns. Out of the Polar Falcon (USA) mare Willisa (GB), she was bought by John Hardiman, who will send his purchase to Nigel Tinkler. Redvers said, "I thought I could make a bit of a profit as she would really stand out at this sale, but that was a lot more than I expected." Fillies were in keen demand and another to make 23,000gns was Lot 578, a Komaite (USA) half-sister to the useful sprint handicapper Lago di Varano (GB) offered from Evelyn and Thornton Stud and purchased by trainer Alan Bailey. The bay filly is out of On the Record (GB) (Record Token {GB}). After bringing the hammer down on the final lot, Doncaster's managing director Henry Beeby said, "We have always believed in this sale and trade over the two days has proved that the right article can make every bit as much, if not more, at this sale. The big fish in the small pond theory has worked so well throughout and we firmly believe that vendors have reaped the dividend of a competitive marketplace. It was of course pleasing to break a very long-standing record price and record such an excellent advance on turnover. However the average and median prices give us most satisfaction and clearly show that this sale provides a viable alternative to our strong St Leger Yearling Sales."

SANGSTER SPONSORSHIP SET Robert Sangster has announced a sponsorship for his Swettenham Stud runners, the Racing Post reported. The threeyear deal with TS.com--an on-line ticketing and leisure booking service--will be worth £500,000. The company's logo will be carried on jockeys' silks, horses' rugs and lads' clothing for all of Swettenham's runners in the U.K., and they will be allowed to name three two-year-olds each year. "I have had seven two-year-old winners from 13 runners [this year], but it is with the foals and yearlings where the strength lies," Sangster commented. "I have got two Mr. Prospectors and 14 Sadler's Wells. It would be nice if we could see TS.com's logos on Theatre Script [USA] in the winner's enclosure at Epsom after the Derby." Sangster was referring to his son of Theatrical (Ire), who took his only start in good style at Doncaster. "We are excited about getting involved with such a successful team," said Matthew Hare, founder and managing director of TS.com. "Horse racing is a perfect market for us and provides an excellent platform to raise awareness of our product to a broad range of event organisers." Sangster has owned the winners of 27 European Classics, and has spent about a half a million pounds upgrading the gallops and boxes at Manton this year, where John Gosden trains the Swettenham runners.
