CLASSIC ... Prince Sultan al Kabeer's Agol Lack (Gulch), first on the preference list for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs, was found to be running a temperature Tuesday morning and will not participate in the

race...Classic hopeful Vision and Verse (Storm Cat) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 yesterday morning, which trainer Bill Mott referred to as "super." The fouryear-old colt was third in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in his last out. "We gave him a lead horse and he swallowed the lead horse approaching the quarter pole," Mott said. "We got him coming home in :23 3/5. This is the best he's worked since we brought him back [from a four-month layoff]."

TURF... Far from the hustle and bustle of the Twin Spires, dual Grade I winner John's Call (Lord At War (Arg)) worked five furlongs in 1:00 at Atlanta Hall Farm in Monkton, Maryland. "He looked great," commented trainer Tommy Voss...Subtle Power (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), having drawn into the Turf following defections from the main field, went four furlongs on the turf, dogs up, in :50 2/5...Williams News (Alleged) breezed five furlongs vesterday in 1:01 with Marlon St. Julien in the irons. Canadian Patrick Husbands has the call Saturday. "He's very strong, very aggressive in his works," trainer Tom Amoss said of the Canadian International runnerup. "It's pretty unusual for a horse that goes out and works fast early to run marathons in the afternoon. You have to take a little out of him in his works because it makes it easier for the rider to get him to relax in the afternoon."

JUVENILE... A P Valentine (A.P. Indy), one of the top choices for Saturday's Juvenile, breezed four furlongs in :53. "This horse could have worked in :59 one day this week, but what is the point," asked trainer Nick Zito. "He did just what he needed to do at this point. Convention says you want to see all these :47s on the work line, but this horse doesn't train like that."

Mongoose (Broad Brush), second in the preferred list for the Juvenile, worked a half in a sharp :47 3/5. "He's the best two-year-old I've ever had," commented trainer Bill Mott after the move.

DISTAFF... Heritage of Gold (Gold Legend) worked five furlongs on the turf around the dogs in a leisurely 1:06 2/5 under regular rider Shane Sellers. Trainer Tom Amoss, who saddled the five-year-old to a respectable third-place finish in last year's Distaff, blames a tough training regimen for the mare's recent decline in form. "If you look back at her form, all her works have been strong, black-letter works," said the conditioner, who will also saddle Williams News in the Turf. "Our opinion is that maybe that tough training has caught up with her. There are two ways you can look at today's work," he continued. "You can look at it and think she worked slow, or you can look at what the trainer and stable are trying to accomplish. In this case, we accomplished everything we wanted today."

Overbrook Farm's Surfside (Seattle Slew) completed her pre-race preparations with an open gallop down the Churchill main track. The sophomore filly, whose dam Flanders won a stirring renewal of the Juvenile Fillies over this track in 1994, is looking to improve on her second-place finish in Keeneland's Raven Run S. Oct. 11, her first start in six months. "She has matured and the time off over the summer makes her dangerous," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "She's touting us pretty strong right now." Surfside will be partnered by Pat Day, who has ridden her in each of her 11 starts to date.

JUVENILE FILLIES... There were a pair of defections from the race yesterday, as undefeated Manayunk S. winner Top Of The League (Lite the Fuse) injured a leg during her morning gallop. The filly, owned by Stronach Stables, was the last of three on the preference list. "If she didn't make it to the Breeders' Cup, we were going to run her here on Friday in the Pocahontas," said trainer Joe Orseno. "She hurt herself this morning. It doesn't look to be too serious, but we're waiting to get word from the veterinarian." Two Item Limit (Twining) drew into the main body of the field with the declaration Tuesday of Jetin Excess, but will not run at Churchill. She will instead run in the GIII Tempted S. at Aqueduct Sunday afternoon. Caressing (Honour and Glory) earned a bullet for her five-eighths work, stopping the clock in :58 3/5.

MILE... Trainer Bill Mott has twice been second in the Breeders' Cup Mile, but will try to register his first win in the race when he sends out a pair of talented horses Saturday. Lightly raced four-year-old Hap (Theatrical {Ire}), the winner of the GII Bernard Baruch H. and GII Fourstardave at Saratoga this summer, breezed four grassy furlongs in :49 3/5 around the dogs. Stablemate King Cugat (Kingmambo), a two-time stakes winner over the local grass course this past spring, also covered his half mile in :49 3/5. "He makes it look easy," Mott said. "He makes it look like he's doing nothing and then you look at your stopwatch. I was very happy with his work." Jerry Bailey retains the mount on King Cugat, while Chris McCarron has been tapped to ride Hap.

SPRINT... Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold) tuned up for the Sprint with a half in :48, the co-fastest time of the morning. "It was fantastic--she worked good and did everything on the bridle," said trainer Bill Mott. Of Dream Supreme's chances of becoming the fourth filly to win the Sprint, Mott added, "With the pace scenario and the way she runs, we're optimistic. It's a good race with a lot of speed. The more speed, the better. She's a good seven-eighths filly and with a good pace scenario, she could do well."...Five Star Day (Carson City) turned in :35 1/5 for his three-furlong drill...Valiant Halory (Valiant Nature) went a half in :50 3/5.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES



It is hard to believe that Affirmed's dramatic battles with Alydar took place almost a quarter of a century ago. The pair was rarely separated by more than inches in their meetings on the racetrack, but at stud their paths guickly diverged. Alydar enjoyed a meteoric career before his controversial death in November 1990. Affirmed, overshadowed by his rival in those early years, is still at stud, and 2001 will be his 21st season as a stallion. Affirmed was never as flamboyant as Alydar on the track, but he almost always got there in the end, and that seems to be the way it is going to be at stud. Alydar's total of stakes winners now rests at 77, and Affirmed, who has been chipping away at Alydar's lead over the years now has 73 stakes winners (both figures based on totals given in the recent Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sales). The quality of Affirmed's offspring doesn't appear to be diminishing with age--he had Grade I winners Mossflower and Affirmed Success in his 1994 crop, Grade I winner Quiet Resolve in his 1995 crop, and at least four stakes winners, including graded scorer Positive Gal in his 1996--so it appears that, with a minimum of his current two-year-olds, yearlings, weanlings and a crop in utero to run, he will eventually overtake his old rival.

Affirmed's latest stakes winner is Tippity Witch, a three-year-old filly who gained a first black-type triumph when taking the GIII Martha Washington S. at Laurel Park on Sunday. Tippity Witch is a daughter of the stakes-winning EI Gran Senor mare Senora Tippy. She is therefore another example of Affirmed's affinity for a wide variety of Northern Dancer strains, Affirmed siring at least 17 unrestricted stakes winners out of Northern Dancer-line mares, including champion Flawlessly, Canadian champions Peteski and Charlie Barley, and other Grade I winners Regal State and Mossflower (the cross has also worked well in reverse, and there are already somewhere approaching 30 unrestricted stakes winners by Northern Dancer line-sires out of daughters of Affirmed). *Pedigree perspectives cont. p. 4*

FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



Momentous week on tap...the racing season begins to wind up with a flourish in what's sure to be a fantastic Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs on Saturday. It's a strong European contingent, headed by Sir M. Stoute's pair of favorites Petrushka and Kalanisi. He doesn't have a runner in the Mile, and everybody wants to make future Three Chimneys stallion War Chant the favorite. Of the Europeans, I like Distant Music if the rain stays away and Indian Lodge if it softens up. In the F/M Turf, Petrushka is a banker if she gets decent ground and runs her race...and I'll take any European in the Turf-Kalanisi (never been 12f), Montjeu (buries them if he gets it soft and runs his best race), even Mutamam and Fantastic Light...what a great card.

Then we have the record-breaking Keeneland November sale getting underway (with a cameo appearance from Fasig) on Sunday. The opening day of Book 2 coincides with a little matter of the American Presidential election. Remind me to exhort eligibles to vote in my column Tuesday morning, because this is a biggie...and no column from me on Wednesday. The racing industry's leading psephologist, Tattersalls' Martin Mitchell, and myself will be up counting votes Tuesday night... most important to some of you, no alcohol served on Tuesday until the polls close. The Europeans hate that, but there you are, we can't have them buying drinks and votes, can we?

The first two books--Sunday-Wednesday--as usual feature the big names, and this year some of the biggest names have quite a few selling. If your pockets are deep enough, in the first two books there are, for example, 17 mares catalogued in foal to A.P. Indy and seven foals by him. There are 11 mares in foal to Storm Cat, and 11 foals by him. Kingmambo--18 mares in foal, 14 foals by him. This is big representation for top sires...of course, all those 100-plus books may be relevant here. A few other big names, these numbers just for the first two books: Deputy Minister: 16 i/f, five foals; Seeking the Gold: eight i/f, eight foals; new \$125k sire Saint

Ballado: 12 i/f, nine foals. There are also six mares catalogued in foal to Danzig, and four foals by him; three mares i/f to Nureyev, and five foals by him; and four mares i/f to Seattle Slew, and seven foals by him. Oh, and 27 mares each i/f to Theatrical (many from the Paulson Dispersal) and Hennessy.

There are 13 stallions with four or more foals catalogued from their first crops in Books 1-2, but the five stallions with 10+ catalogued hail from two farms. Ashford, of course, is one of the two, represented this year by Grand Slam (22), Tale of the Cat (18), and King of Kings (12). Two sons of Deputy Minister who stand at Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Farm also have double-digit representation, 1998 BC Classic winner Awesome Again has 11 first-crop foals in the first two books, and 1997 Belmont winner Touch Gold has 13. There are also eight each by Swain and Deputy Commander; seven each by Skip Away and Favorite Trick; five each by Arch and Souvenir Copy; and four each by Gentlemen and Banker's Gold.

Among the stallions with their first mares selling in foal, the Book 1-2 leader is Lane's End's dual '99 Classic winner Charismatic (17 i/f). Next come two Storm Cat sons from new stallion power Taylor Made, Forestry (14) and Exploit (13). There are nine in foal to Ashford's brilliant sprinter Stravinsky, and seven each for Three Chimneys' Silver Charm and Jonabell's Old Trieste.

Suppressed First-year Fees...

Fusaichi Pegasus, Lemon Drop Kid, and Giant's Causeway may be heading to stud at big fees, but the 100+ books for so many stallions I alluded to a couple of weeks ago are keeping the pressure on fees for many other promising prospects retiring next year. In Kentucky, for example, the top-class Theatrical horse Royal Anthem goes to Hopewell for the incredible bargain price of \$10,000. Last year's BC Mile winner Silic goes to Crestwood for only \$3,500; Gainesway gets the very high-class K. One King (all right, he's by Apalachee) for \$6,500; and among those retiring to Shadwell is the brilliant and impeccably bred 1997-98 European sprinter Elnadim, by Danzig, for \$15,000. I think those are all dirt cheap.

Europe's got its share, too: Montjeu at Irish 30,000gns is awfully cheap for a horse rated around 140 at his best, for starters. So is King's Best at Ir£25,000, considering he drowned Giant's Causeway (who did later win five straight Group 1s) in the English 2000. The top miler Sendawar retires in France for only FF70,000--under \$10,000 for a horse of his caliber, it's for nothing. Dual Group 1 winner Indian Lodge is only Ir£8,000, and among the bevy of Maktoum retirements, two others who really catch the eye are Lend a Hand (very good-looking Group 1 horse from 6f-1m) at Ir£5,000, and 1998 Middle Park winner Lujain, at £5,000 in England.

And a Tip of the Hat...

You remember Zafonic. I thought he was so good he couldn't miss. It wasn't quite as bad as picking J.O. Tobin to be better than Seattle Slew (yeah, I did that, in print, 20 years ago), but I really did think Zafonic would be a better sire than his contemporary Kingmambo. So much--again--for infallibility, considering Kingmambo is probably the leading young sire in the world. But, with their first crops now both five, Zafonic has finally come to life. He has no fewer than four two-year-old Group winners this year: Endless Summer (Richmond S., 2nd Middle Park, Pr Morny); Clearing (Horris Hill); Ozone Layer (Pr des Bois); and Count Dubois (Italy's Grand Criterium). Another three of his two-year-olds are stakes-placed, including Dewhurst third Tempest.

That Northern Dancer and Affirmed should work well together is not particularly surprising. It has long been established that Northern Dancer combined particularly well with the strain of Teddy, and Affirmed's dam had Teddy 4x5x5 (all through the brothers Sir Gallahad III and Bull Dog). There are also some links between the pedigree of Affirmed's sire, Exclusive Native, and Northern Dancer's dam, Natalma. Firstly, Exclusively Native is by Raise a Native, a son of Natalma's sire, Native Dancer. Secondly, Exclusive Native's dam, Exclusive, has a very similar background to Northern Dancer's granddam, Arbitrator, both having gene pools dominated by the "old American" strains of Peter Pan, Broomstick, Chicle and Rock Sand/Fairy Gold.

Of course, in addition to being dam of Exclusive Native, Exclusive became an outstanding tap-root mare. Her descendants include Exclusive Dancer, General Assembly, Gold Fever, Out of Place, American Chance, Muhtarram, St. Hilarion, Expressive Dancer, and from the Northern Dancer sire line, group and graded stakes

winners For Kicks, Versailles Treaty, Chief Honcho and Savinio.

It is also intriguing to note that Tippity Witch's dam, Senora Tippy (a stakes winner in France and a graded stakes placed performer in the U.S.) is another black-type winning Northern Dancer line horse from the Exclusive family, Exclusive appearing as her third dam. Thus, the mating with Affirmed, which produced Tippity Witch, gives Exclusive 3x4.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We tend to take particular notice of modestly bred stakes winners with interesting inbreeding or linebreeding. Stakes winners where an apparent upgrading has been achieved are often more suggestive of the "power of the pattern" than those achieved with superior stock. We had another such example at the weekend in the shape of Grev Ballet (f. 2, Imperial Ballet {Ire}--Miss Tickled Pink, by Lot o' Gold). We would have to confess to knowing very little about the sire, but research revealed that he is an 11-year-old son of Sadler's Wells out of the fast English filly Amaranda, and that he stands at Montesacro Farm in Georgetown, KY. We suspect Imperial Ballet, who won four of seven starts while campaigning in England, has had very little opportunity at stud. He received a mate with the right pedigree, however, in the shape of the non-winning Miss Tickled Pink. Her second dam is by Lt. Stevens, a brother to Thong, the third dam of Sadler's Wells. Sadler's Wells himself has sired an earlier stakes winner out of a Lear Fan (dam by Lt. Stevens) mare, and his son, Barathea, has a graded stakes winner out of a mare by Alysheba (dam a sister to the dam of Lear Fan). A reverse of this cross has been exceptional with Lear Fan siring four stakes winners, including French champions Loup Solitaire and Verveine out of mares by Sadler's Wells' three-quarters brother, Nureyev. As we have said before, virtually any combination of relatives from the Rough Shod II/Thong family seems worth trying.

It was a good weekend for New York stallion Take Me Out, who was represented by two stakes winners. One of these, Hello Josephine (f, 2, Take Me Out--Silver Judy, by Eskimo), broke her maiden with a win in the Lady Razorback Futurity. Take Me Out is out of a mare by Tom Rolfe, and Hello Josephine's dam, Silver Judy, is by a son of Tom Rolfe's half brother Chieftain, so Hello Josephine has the celebrated mare Pocahontas 4x4 in her pedigree.

NUMBERS UP AT KEENELAND FALL Keeneland recorded gains in attendance and mutuel handle during its 16-day fall meeting which ended Saturday. The on-track attendance was 209,977, an increase of 6.5 percent over the 16-day 1999 meet figure of 197,087. It was Keeneland's most attended meeting since 216,359 fans watched the races in 1994. Ontrack wagering totaled \$19,489,103, an increase of 1.3 percent from \$19,248,453 in 1999. Average daily on-track handle was \$1,218,069, compared to \$1,203,028 a year ago. "We certainly benefited from extraordinary weather," said Keeneland president Nick Nicholson. "Attendance increased to the highest level in six years and it's particularly gratifying when mutuel hanlde increases both on track and off. Patrons responded positively to improvements in Keeneland's facilities and to competitive, quality racing." Pat Day rode 26 winners to lead the jockeys' standings for the 15th time in the last 19 falls. Bernie Flint, Elliott Walden and John T. Ward, Jr. each sent out five winners to tie as the leading trainers. The fall meeting's leading owners were John Oxley and Ken and Sarah Ramsey, each with four wins.

BARRETTS MIXED RESULTS The six-year-old mare Glen of Aherlow (Rubiano), in foal to Free House, brought a final bid of \$44,000 to top Monday's opening session of the Barretts October Mixed Sale in Pomona, California. The roan mare was consigned by Blooming Hills, Inc., agent for Plainsman Farm, and was purchased by Run for the Roses Stable. The sale concluded last night and complete results will appear in tomorrow's TDN.

National Racing Licensing Starts Thursday:

The National Racing Compact will launch the National Racing License at Churchill Downs on Thursday. The NRC is an interstate compact authorized by various state legislatures to set criteria for and issue a multi-jurisdictional license for participants in racing. Membership in the organization is open to all racing states that pass the model legislation. The charter members are Delaware, Florida, Louisiana, Virginia and West Virginia. New Jersey is expected to join the compact this fall. The NRC has projected that the license will be accepted in 16 states by June, 2001. Owners will be able to apply for the national license at the NRC table located in the Recreation Building on the Churchill Downs backside during Breeders' Cup weekend. The application is also available at the NRC website www.racinglicense.com.

BBAG ENDS WITH SOLID TRADE AFTER SLOW

START The Baden-Badener Auktionsgesellschaft (BBAG) Mixed Sale picked up on the second and final day, yesterday. The top price at DM200,000 was Lot 278, the three-year-old sprinter Macina (Ire). The Listedplaced daughter of Platini (Ger) is the second foal bred from the English stakes-winning Skyliner (GB) mare Mamma's Too (GB). Consigned by Stall Tripag, the filly was purchased by Newsells Park Stud as a broodmare prospect. Another six-figure price was realized at DM100,000 for Lot 182. Gestut Auenquelle's juvenile Listed-scoring Big Shuffle (USA) filly Gondiosa (Ger) was purchased by Ronald Rauscher Bloodstock acting on behalf of Dr. C Berglar. Broodmares proved a bit tough at times, but quality had its price. French agent Jean-Pierre Deroubaix paid DM110,000 for Lot 280, the Night Shift (USA) mare Johannisnacht (Ger) in foal to the designated champion sire Monsun (Ger). The mare is a half sister to a dual champion group winner and two other stakes performers. Managing Director Axel Donnerstag was extremely pleased with the strong international participation. Both top prices were purchased by foreign interests, but other European countries were present with the Turkish interests being very active. The entire sale grossed DM3,462,500 on 1999's DM2,316,500, offering a total of 274 horses from last year's 208 offered. The sale also saw a 68-percent boost in the number of lots sold, up to 186 on 1999's 144, with the average lay at DM18,616 and the median price rising from DM8,000 the year before to DM9,250.

COCHRANE RETIRES Jockey Ray Cochrane called an end to his 26-year riding career Monday, taking the advice of doctors who warned him that another spill could leave him paralyzed, according to Racing Post online. Aboard Kahyasi (Ire) in his 1988 Irish Derby win, Cochrane survived a plane crash with fellow jockey Frankie Dettori in June and has since taken two hard falls. The 43-year-old told Racing Post's Graham Green, "Dr. (Michael) Turner (Jockey Club's medical adviser) explained that my back is severely weakened and was worried that any further impact could see me end up in a wheelchair. I must be sensible and retire." Cochrane's best career wins include the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on Selkirk (USA); My Best Valentine's (GB) victory in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp; the G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas aboard Ensconse (USA); G1 Oaks S. on Midway Lady (USA); and his ride on Taufan's Melody's (GB) in the gelding's only Group 1 win, Australia's Caulfield Cup.

QUINN CONCEDES

While Britain's courses are measuring the immediate damage done by the storm this week, one man who should be welcoming the shortage of fixtures is jockey Kevin Darley. Darley is currently on 149 winners for the season, 13 ahead of jockey Richard Quinn, his nearest pursuer. As of yesterday, the abandonment of Newmarket and Catterick left Britain with no flat fixtures and tomorrow's card at Windsor is also under threat. Clerk of the Course Chris Stickels said yesterday, "It is pretty wet and the course is unraceable at the moment due to waterlogging in various places, and the forecast is not very good for Wednesday and Thursday. We will have an inspection tomorrow morning, but I would say it is fairly unlikely that we will race." Meanwhile, today's racing at Musselburgh will survive, and while Quinn has five rides at the Scottish track, he will have to move mountains to take the jockey's championship in the final four days of the flat turf season. Quinn said yesterday, "The championship is beyond reach-there are only three days left after tomorrow. I haven't been to Musselburgh this year and I can't remember the last time I went, but I have got a job to do." While Quinn will be attempting to make as much of the quintet as he can, Darley again asserts his dominance as he has six rides on the same card.
