TURF...Kalanasi (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}), winner of the G1 Dubai Champion S. over Montjeu (Ire) in his last start, breezed a half mile in :50 4/5 in company with stablemate Petrushka (Ire) on the turf yesterday morning. The four-

year-old broke off a length behind his workmate and finished up about the same distance in arrears. "He did just what we asked of him," trainer Sir Michael Stoute said. "He's coming up to the race in good order."

Mutamam (GB) (Darshaan {GB}) also worked, going a half in :52 2/5 on the grass.

JUVENILE...Trainer Bob Baffert saddles a trio of starters in the Juvenile. Of his entry, he said, "Three good horses, three bad posts." Point Given (Thunder Gulch) drew the rail, Arabian Light (Fly So Free) will break from post 10 and undefeated Flame Thrower (Saint Ballado) got post 12. On a more positive note, Baffert said, "Good horses always find ways to win. I've had good posts and the horses get wiped out at the break."

Noverre (Rahy), a three-quarter brother to 1991 Juvenile winner Arazi, breezed three furlongs in :38 3/5 yesterday with jockey Frankie Dettori aboard. "It was perfect," trainer David Loder said. "We didn't ask him for speed, he just stretched his legs a bit. Frankie was delighted with him. He's ready for the day." He added, "This is the second-best colt to come from Europe. The best was his brother, of course. He's very tough and he should have no problem switching to the dirt."

MILE...Arkadian Hero (Trempolino), beaten a nose in the GI Atto Mile at Woodbine in his latest try, worked an untimed half mile around the turn on the Churchill turf course yesterday morning. "The bends are a lot sharper than Woodbine, but he was hugging the inside the whole way," jockey Jamie Spencer, who was aboard for the move, said. He added, "We have a great chance if the rain stays away."

Distant Music (Distant View) was clocked going five furlongs in 1:03 2/5 around the dogs on the grass yesterday morning.

DISTAFF...Most have already awarded the Distaff victory blanket to Riboletta (Brz), but jockey Pat Day, who has two wins in the race already to his credit, gives Surfside (Seattle Slew) a chance. The three-yearold filly came back after six months off to finish second in the Raven Run S. at Keeneland Oct. 7. "I was a little disappointed in my ride on her last time," Day admitted. "I think I rode the racetrack instead of my filly. I was concerned about Roxelena getting away from me. I drew inside, and when the doors opened I put her in the race and had to keep pushing on her the whole way. We went very quick--:21, :43, 1:08 and change--then came home running and we flattened out late. I just never gave her a chance." He added, "I was hoping a hard race like that coming off a layoff wouldn't drive her out of the feed tub and set her back and it hasn't. She has moved forward. She has trained brilliantly here at Churchill Downs. She looks great, really filled out and matured this summer. It is a big step from seven-eighths to a mile and an eighth against that kind of competition, but we are optimistic she is going to give us a good effort. We know she is a quality filly." Surfside was third in last year's Juvenile Fillies.

blew out a quarter mile yesterday in preparation for the race. The three-year-old filly will remain in the U.S. after her Breeders' Cup bid, either retiring to the breeding shed or joining trainer Richard Mandella's stable. She captured the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud at two, but has been held winless in three starts this season. "We found that she bled in her three races this year," trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias said. "But we thought we could give her one more try here because she will be able to race with Lasix. That should be a big advantage."

Three-year-old **Petrushka** (**Ire**) (Unfuwain), the morning-line favorite for the "Disturf," breezed yester-day morning, going a half in :50 3/5 over a firm Churchill turf with jockey Johnny Murtagh in the irons and besting Turf candidate Kalanisi (Ire) in the process. "She's coming to the race perfectly," trainer Sir Michael Stoute said. The filly broke off in front of her older stablemate, then refused to let him by in the stretch, beating him by a little more than a length as she finished up with a final quarter in :23.

Inventing Paradise could prove a pleasant distraction from the Breeders' Cup preparations of Montjeu (Ire) for John Hammond, Supplemented this week, she looks a filly of potential based on her display last time when winning a conditions event here last month. Three days later, Amiwain took a similar contest here, and as Andre Fabre and Olivier Peslier struck gold on Sunday in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, he must be feared. Both Potaro and Greengroom are stakes winners in France already, with the former running away with the G3 Prix Eclipse at Saint-Cloud Oct.4, where Stunning was third. Although he was only fourth to Clearing (GB) last time in the G3 Horris Hill S, at Newbury, he drops in class and remains a threat. Vaillance was runner-up in the G2 Maurice Lacroix Trophy at Baden-Baden Sept. 1 to Tagshira (Ire), when he had subsequent Group scorer Sign Of Nike (GB) behind in third, and if he reproduces that form he could take a hand in the finish here.

SUNLINE EYES EMIRATES BONUS Australasia's champion Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun (GB)), one of seven horses currently tied for the lead in the Emirates World Racing Series Championship after winning the G1 Cox Plate, could go for the series bonus of \$1 million in the G1 Hong Kong International Cup Dec. 17. The mare was originally entered in the Hong Kong Mile, but her connections decided to add her as a late entry to the Cup as well, the final race in the Championship. "I favour the Mile, but if the Emirates Series is still wide open after the Breeders' Cup, we may decide to go for the Championship and the bonus," trainer Trevor McKee said. "This late entry at least gives us the option to decide after the weekend." Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) and Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), running in the Breeders' Cup Classic and Turf respectively, are also tied for the series lead and if either wins tomorrow, it would mean the best Sunline could do is tie with a win in Hong Kong.

NEW PRESIDENT FOR GULFSTREAM? Within the next couple of days, the Frank Stronach/Magna Entertainment's employment merry-go-round will take another spin when Gulfstream Park announces its third president in less than eight months. It's expected that Scott Savin, currently executive director of the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, will be named the third president of the South Florida track this year, following Doug Donn and David Romanik. The 40-year-old Savin, who is also currently the president of the Florida HBPA, has been in horse racing most of his life, first finding his way to the track with his grandfather Butch Savin, owner of Mr. Prospector. According to reliable sources, David Romanik, currently Gulfstream's president, will remain as legal council for Magna Entertainment. Donn, whose family owned Gulfstream for more than 40 years, also figures in the mix, although future duties have yet to be determined.

BUCK POND BUYS BERNSTEIN Buck Pond Farm in Versailles, Kentucky has acquired Bernstein (Storm Cat-La Affirmed {Affirmed}), and is syndicating the three-year-old. The colt, a \$925,000 weanling purchase, will make his final career start in Sunday's GIII River City H. at Churchill Downs. Two-for-three during his juvenile season in Ireland, the bay captured the G3 Railway S. in 1999 and the 2000 G3 Concorde S. in his final Irish outing Oct. 1. He has won four of seven starts for earnings of \$167,112, and will stand for \$10,000 in 2001.

ZAMINDAR TO MARABLUE FARM Group winner Zamindar (Gone West--Zaizafon {The Minstrel}), whose first crop are yearlings of 2000, will move to Marablue Farm in Ocala, Florida for the 2001 breeding season. A full brother to champion Zafonic, the six-year-old captured the G3 Prix de Cabourg and placed in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix de la Salamandre at two. Overall, he had two wins, two seconds and a third in seven starts while earning \$159,418. Thirteen of Zamindar's yearlings sold in England last month, averaging \$65,000. "Zamindar is a big, strong, well-balanced horse," Marablue Manager Christine Jones said. "He will have 60 two-year-olds racing next year which are being placed with some of the finest trainers in Europe. Word is that they should be as fast and precocious as their sire." The property of Juddmonte Farms, the stallion previously stood at England's Banstead Manor Stud. His 2001 stud fee has been set at \$5,000, live foal.

Two Stallions Join Clermont Farm Roster:

Clermont Farm in Germantown, New York will add two stallions to the roster for 2001. Carry The Colors (Roanoke--Miss Cover Girl {Oh Say}) set a track record at Aqueduct, going a mile and 70 yards in 1:38.92, four-fifths faster than the old mark. The four-year-old will stand for a fee of \$3,500, live foal. Brushed On (Broad Brush--Monoprint {Conquistador Cielo}), who was placed in seven stakes, including a second in the GIII Gravesend H. and a third in the GIII Bold Ruler H., had 10 wins, eight seconds and seven thirds from his 37 starts, bankrolling \$393,313. The five-year-old's 2001 fee has been set at \$2,000, live foal.

WRITERS UP

BRINGING YOU THE BREEDERS' CUPBy John R. Gaines

The precipitating event that led me to create the Breeders' Cup was the telecast of the first Arlington Million from Chicago in 1981. The late Pete Axthelm was head commentator for the telecast and before the race, he narrated what I regarded as a scandalous portrayal of Thoroughbred Racing as dominated by illegal drugs.

I was infuriated because the sport that I knew and loved had been described in a manner that was unrecognizable to me. I began to ask myself how the positive culture of our sport could be presented in a way that was truthful, interesting, and compelling.

In the final analysis, Racing has only one thing to offer: Who has the best horse. This question has fascinated Man over the centuries, whether Mongol nomads, Bedouins of the desert, Japanese samurai, English aristocrats, French royalty, Australian gamblers, or American sportsmen.

Of course, different horses are bred to do different things---to sprint, to stay, to run middle distances, on either turf or dirt, including both inexperienced 2-year-olds and veterans of the handicap division. A true championship event was needed to determine who owns the fastest horse in all these categories.

By the time the first Breeders' Cup was run in 1984 at Hollywood Park, we had begun to promote the event as the Super Bowl of Thoroughbred Breeding and Racing. Until the races were actually contested, no one would know whether we had succeeded.

As soon as that first day was complete, we knew we had a smash hit. Every race on that first program attracted outstanding American runners, with enough high-quality foreign horses competing favorably to establish the Breeders' Cup as a genuine international championship.

The fundamental accomplishment of the Breeders' Cup is that we have institutionalized Racing's value system, and Championship Day has become the pivotal event in determining North America's year-end Eclipse Award winners in each division.

Without a doubt, the Breeders' Cup has been accepted by the sport as the single premier day of racing in the world. The Breeders' Cup has also led the movement toward substantial purse increases in top races around the globe.

Only three races with purses of \$1 million or more had ever been run prior to 1984. Now, the annual world-wide total of million-dollar-plus purses has risen above 20 and is topped by the Dubai World Cup, which will offer a total of \$6 million next year. This exponential increase would not have occurred without the paradigm created by the Breeders' Cup.

These accomplishments have fulfilled many of the original aspirations of the Breeders' Cup. Unfortunately, other aspects of the reception accorded Championship Day have been less satisfactory. For one thing, the event has not sufficiently animated non-racing sports fans. In truth, the event has been very poorly marketed to the general public. Our television ratings could not be more disappointing. They are at the level of Putt-Putt Golf and Beach Volleyball.

Of course, there are many excuses for these indifferent ratings, ranging from a proliferation of sports and entertainment events, to an exponential increase in the number of cable channels, to a declining interest in sports broadcasts in general. More important in my view, is that, until the advent of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, promotion of our sport has lacked a coherent national vision.

In this regard, the recent merger of the Breeders' Cup with the NTRA is a giant step in the right direction. The Breeders' Cup brings a strong financial statement to the fledgling NTRA, and the NTRA brings a strong, effective, and totally professional approach to promotion of the sport.

The Breeders' Cup has created new dreams, new drama, and new heroes for Racing. All of these priceless assets may finally be in the hands of marketing professionals who know what to do with them.

The merger between the Breeders' Cup and the NTRA also can further tap into one of the greatest intangible benefits available to Racing. Over the years, the sport has made few concerted efforts to capture the contributions of the many men and women of tremendous accomplishment and intellect who populate the ranks of Thoroughbred owners and breeders.

Back in 1982, the first meeting of the 16-member steering committee that led to formation of the Breeders' Cup was held at my home on Gainesway Farm outside Lexington, Kentucky. Before the meeting officially opened, I made the statement that we were going to do business in a fish bowl for the benefit of all concerned. I said that every person who contributes one dollar to the Breeders' Cup should be given a full financial report and that we would publish our financial statements annually in trade journals. There were "Amens" all around.

Eighteen years later, there has never been a public disclosure of the financial statements of the Breeders' Cup. This pattern has followed an unfortunate tradition of our sport. Supposed pillars of Racing and Breeding such as the Breeders' Cup, the Jockey Club, and the Keeneland Association all govern through the consent of the governed. Yet, for whatever reason, the decision-making processes and financial statements of these institutions are held close to the vest. This kind of insular thinking is not in the best interests of either these institutions or the industry as a whole. Without accountability, there can be no long-term progress.

In 1996, an early steering committee for the NTRA met in my current home in Gratz Park in Lexington. From that meeting eventually emanated our sport's first major democratically-elected organization with rotating terms of office and complete finan-

cial disclosure.

The recently announced plans of 22 racetracks to withdraw from the NTRA has been widely reported without due reference to context. Although the virtue of cooperation between Racing's various segments was ultimately established by the Breeders' Cup, the industry did not reach that lasting consensus without considerable debate and acrimony.

The organization of the NTRA and all its ramifications--political, economic, promotional, and philosophical--are infinitely more complex. They are also more difficult to administer to the full satisfaction of the myriad interests whose fragmentation has rendered our sport helpless in the real world.

The kind of aberrations now being witnessed by the NTRA are, in fact, to be expected. There is ice on the wings of the industry's version of Air Force One, but we are not grounded. These flight delays can be eliminated with the rational good will of all parties.

Objective marketing studies show that Racing, with proper promotion, can easily double the size of current pari-mutuel wagering. Hard evidence of this statement is why powerful new partners, led by IBM and Rupert Murdoch, have chosen to invest in our sport's dramatic growth potential.

For these reasons, I am confident that we will discover the common sense to speak in a common voice to promote the common good, so once again the Sport of Kings can reclaim its Turf as the King of Sports.

Thoroughbred breeder and owner John R. Gaines, 71, established Gainesway Farm, originated the Kentucky Horse Park, founded the Breeders' Cup, and was instrumental in formation of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. He lives in active retirement in Lexington, Ky.

Peslier always had the measure of his rivals, and despite the menacing forward move of Turbotiere and Laurent Huart before the final turn, Kathmandu had more to give as they entered the straight. Rather than weakening from the front, Kathmandu pushed further clear and extended away for a convincing score.

CECIL FINED, BANNED FROM DRIVING

Magistrates at Ely, near Newmarket, yesterday fined trainer Henry Cecil £3,000, and handed out a ban from driving for five years after convicting him of a second drink-driving offence within 10 years. It was relayed that Cecil struck two elderly people walking along a road with his Mercedes, although he initially denied that he was driving, blaming a friend who was in the car with him. Magistrate Sue Thompson told Cecil that he had shown "complete disregard for the safety of other road users." She added: "We do feel that this is too serious to be dealt with by only a financial penalty. We have taken into account the time of day, the fact that you collided with two pedestrians and the fact that this is your second drink-driving offence within 10 years." Aidan Tevlin, prosecuting, told the court: "Initially he [Cecil] denied being the driver of the vehicle, saying it was his friend who was driving. His (Cecil's) breath smelled strongly of alcohol. His eyes were glazed over. He was unsteady on his feet." Tests showed that Cecil had 88 micrograms of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath, above the legal limit of 35mg. The following day Cecil attended a police station and admitted the offence, said Mr Tevlin.

Kaapstad Way (NZ) (Kaapstad {NZ}) is an easing favourite for Tuesday's Melbourne Cup, with trainer Chris Woods warning the gelding won't take his place in the field unless Melbourne's wet weather eases. Wood has already pencilled in the G2 Sandown Classic (2400m) on November 11 for Kaapstad Way, beaten a length by Diatribe in the Caulfield Cup (2400m) 13 days ago. Kaapstad Way floundered at his only outing in 20 starts on heavy going when beaten 11 lengths in the G2 Craiglee Stakes (1600m) at Flemington on Sept. 9. Wood says he'll see how Flemington holds up to Saturday's mammoth Derby program before deciding whether to pay final declaration on Saturday night.

ALL EYES ON ENZELI?

Jockey Greg Hall, rider of Enzeli (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}) remained coy after partnering the Melbourne Cup equal topweight at Flemington, where the import relished a solid hit-out over 1400m. "Too early to tell," Hall declared. "What you've got to remember is that these horses are trained very differently. They are lovely animals to ride, just so relaxed. I'm going to come again on Saturday morning. He is a nice enough horse, but I mean that is the first time he has been out to do anything serious," said Hall, who recently returned from Dubai. "Being relaxed in any race, let alone a Melbourne Cup, is a big plus."

EURO INVADER NOTES

John Hammond's Mont Rocher (Fr) (Caerleon {USA}) will miss the G1 Fosters Melbourne Cup at Flemington on Tuesday, as connections confirmed that the race is no longer being considered. He will go to Saturday's G1 Louis Vuitton Mackinnon S. (2000m) instead. While the ground has turned heavy, with no improvement expected, British trainers were yesterday pleased with their representatives' progress. Martin Pipe arrived on Wednesday to oversee the preparation of Far Cry (Ire) (Pharly {Fr}), and he was satisfied: "Things are going well and he just has to keep ticking over." Likewise, James Fanshawe was watching over G1 Irish St Leger winner Arctic Owl (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}): "I'm happy with him and hopefully things will go well."
