CLASSIC CONFRONTATION

The roller-coaster ride that has been the sophomore campaign of favored Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) concludes this afternoon with the \$4 million yearling's final start in the \$4 million Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. The winner of the GII Wood Memorial in April, the bay arrived in Louisville as the favorite for the Kentucky Derby and did not disappoint, becoming the first favorite since Spectacular Bid to wear the blanket of roses and stirring thoughts of the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed. Those dreams came crashing to the ground when Red Bullet got the better of him in the Preakness two weeks later before a foot injury while prepping for the Belmont S. sent him to the sidelines. "FuPeg" made a victorious return to the races with a remarkable 3/4-length win in the GII Jerome H. at Belmont Sept. 23 and was on track for the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, but a minor hoof problem caused him to miss the race. "The ideal campaign would be two prep races before a major race, but sometimes the schedule doesn't permit it," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "The Jerome showed he was further ahead than we anticipated. He is doing fast works again now, very similar to before the Derby." The colt is attempting to become the first three-year-old favorite to win the Classic since former Drysdale pupil A.P. Indy accomplished the feat in 1992. In fact, five of the top six choices on the morning line are three-year-olds, including Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), winner of five consecutive Group 1 events in Europe this season. Second most recently in the GI Queen Elizabeth II S. Sept. 23, he is making his first start on the main track, but is well bred for it and loves a stretch duel. "He is here because he's got tactical speed, natural ability and courage," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He is inclined to wait in front and he only does what he has to, but if he is there at the finish he will go down to his knees to win. He never lets us down." Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy), a full brother to 1999 Classic runner-up Budroyale, has been arguably the best three-year-old in the country during the second half of the year. Second in the GI Pacific Classic, the bay was an authoritative winner of the GI Super Derby and outgamed Captain Steve (Fly So Free) by a 1/2 length in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 15. He can be a factor, but will be making his third start in the span of 35 days.

Riboletta has devastated her rivals in winning her last six starts from coast-to-coast. The Brazilian Amazon ran down Beautiful Pleasure to win the GI Beldame at Belmont Oct. 16 in an impressive performance. Supplemented for \$400,000, she has been mentioned as a Horse of the Year candidate and a victory here would assure her of a number of votes. Beautiful Pleasure, seeking to become the first mare since Bayakoa to double up in the Distaff, had no answer for the top choice in the Beldame, her first start since August. The five-year-old bay has been training smartly since arriving in Kentucky, but will have to wing it from her outside post. The nation's leading sophomore filly, Jostle has yet to try her elders, but is riding a three-race skein in which she has proven adaptable to a variety of pace scenarios. Having taken the GI CCA Oaks and the GI Alabama, she was freshened and returned with an authoritative romp in the GII Cotillion at Philadelphia, her home base. European invader Crimplene, representing Pebbles' team of owner Sheikh Mohammed and trainer Clive Brittain, has been pointing for this race since the summer. "She is eating everything we give her and has been very happy here," Brittain remarked. "I'm expecting her to run very well."

In a race loaded with speed, undefeated She's A Devil Due has an advantage. The late-closing bay came from just off a moderate pace to prevail in her two-turn debut, besting Nasty Storm by a head in the GII Walmac Int'l Alcibiades at Keeneland Oct. 15. There will be much faster fractions up front this time, which could set it up for a stretch runner. Nasty Storm hung in gamely in the Alcibiades, which was also her first try at a route. The chestnut showed an affinity for this track when breaking her maiden at first asking in June, but looks for her first stakes score in a tough spot. California shipper Notable Career, first or second in all six starts, handled a mile in her latest, leading every step to take the GI Oak Leaf S. Oct. 8. Raging Fever has reeled off wins in the GII Adirondack S., GI Matron S. and the 1 1/16-mile GI Frizette S. in her last three. The dark bay added Lasix in her latest, but tries two turns for the first time here.

Breeders' Cup Best Bet...FILLY/MARE TURF

**PETRUSHKA (IRE) (Unfuwain) - Bob Fortus,
New Orleans Times-Picayune**

A true Group 1 filly, she might have a class edge. She moved smoothly in her workout Thursday, and the American turf females don't knock your socks off.

A five-time winner from her seven starts, Petrushka looks for her fourth consecutive Group/Grade I score. After handing fellow three-year-old fillies a drubbing in the G1 Irish Oaks over a firm turf at The Curragh in July, the eye-catching chestnut beat older distaffers in both the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix de l'Opera. She is a deserving favorite and has the added advantage of a jockey who is batting .500 in Breeders' Cup competition. Johnny Murtagh rode Ridgewood Pearl (GB) to victory in the 1995 Mile. Tranquility Lake is a perfect three-for-three on the year, most recently taking the field from gate to wire to win the GI Yellow Ribbon S. at Santa Anita Oct. 7. She would give jockey Eddie Delahoussaye his first Breeders' Cup wins since he booted home the winners of the Distaff and Sprint in 1993, and his eighth overall. Catella, first or second in five of six tries at this distance, has been up against the boys in every start this year. The four-year-old filly finished just a length and a half behind GI Canadian International hero Mutafaweq when third in the G1 Deutschland Preis in July, captured the G1 Grosser Erdgas-Preis in August and finished second, beating Turf candidate Fruits of Love a head, in the G1 Grosser Preis Von Baden Sept. 3. She rallied for third in her most recent outing, the G1 Preis von Europa. Jockey Kent Desormeaux picks up the mount here.

It's not quite Affirmed and Alydar, not yet at least, but California-based Flame Thrower and Street Cry have locked horns in two compelling events. Undefeated Flame Thrower got just the better of the Godolphin rival first at Del Mar and then in the GII Norfolk at Santa Anita Oct. 7, as Street Cry looked poised to go by his foe while on the outside, but the flaxen-maned colt dug in and prevailed by a neck. Stronach Stable's Macho Uno was third by a neck in the GI Hopeful in just his second career outing and shipped up to Woodbine for his most recent effort. The 1/2 brother to 1998 Classic hero Awesome Again won the Oct. 9 GI Grey Breeders' Cup by seven lengths. A P Valentine lived up to his high expectations when he got through along the rail to win the GI Champagne at Belmont Oct. 14 and may be ready to take the next step.

Kalanisi, tested by two narrow losses to Giant's Causeway over the summer, took his game to the next level with a courageous victory over Montjeu in the G1 Champion S. Oct. 14. Though he has yet to try 1 1/2 miles, he seems capable of giving owner H. H. Aga Khan a second Turf victory to go with Lashkari's inaugural run. Montjeu's reputation came back to earth after being beaten in the Arc, but he gave a good account of himself at Newmarket. The splashily marked Ciro is unbeaten since coming to America. A multiple Group 1 winner in France, he displayed an excellent late burst of speed to take the GI Secretariat and the GIII Lawrence Realization at Belmont Sept. 24.

CAN RIBOLETTA OVERCOME THE JINX?
by Vincent P. D'Angelo

The Breeders' Cup returns to Churchill Downs this Saturday for the fifth time. In 16 previous runnings, with the exception of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Juvenile Fillies, the Breeders' Cup races have been a surprising disappointment for the Raise a Native sire line.

With so many sons and grandsons--Alydar, Exclusive Native, Fappiano, Mr. Prospector, Seeking the Gold, etc.--one would expect the Raise a Native sire line to have dominated Breeders' Cup Day. However, a review of the facts uncovers a different result. While the Juvenile and Juvenile Fillies have provided Raise a Native's line with nine wins in 32 runnings, the line holds only an eight-for-81 record in the other five (now six) races.

The Classic and Sprint each have three winners from 16 editions. Not surprisingly, of the 37 Breeders' Cup races run on turf, only Da Hoss was successful for the Raise a Native sire line. But the race with the story to tell is the Distaff.

The Breeders' Cup Distaff usually decides the female divisional honors. In 1998, Gary Stevens guided Escena around Churchill Downs, controlling the pace and saving just enough energy to hold off the late surge of Banshee Breeze by a nose. The race brought a divisional championship to both.

In 1999, Beautiful Pleasure was left alone on the lead and was strong enough at the finish to hold off the late run of Banshee Breeze, who fell a neck short.

Surprisingly, the victories by Escena and Beautiful Pleasure extended a winless streak in the race for Raise a Native-line fillies and mares. And for the most part, the Raise a Native-line distaffers were legitimate contenders, including a few beaten favorites and second choices. Since its inaugural running at Hollywood Park in 1984, a Raise a Native-line female has competed in all but three years. The list of Raise a Native fillies that have been unsuccessful in the event may surprise you.

Collectively, the Raise a Native sire line is 0-for-21 in the Distaff. So the question is, can this year's Raise a Native fillies overcome their sire line's woes in the race? In 2000, the prohibitive favorite is Riboletta. She is looking to extend her winning streak to seven. Her trip to Belmont was successful, taking first the Ruffian and then the Beldame with an impressive victory over last year's Distaff champ Beautiful Pleasure. Riboletta is likely to go off at odds-on. The only question she has to answer is her sire line's--she is by Roi Normand, who is a son of Exclusive Native (Raise a Native).

Another legitimate contender is European superstar Crimplene, a daughter of Gone West's full brother Lion Cavern. She is a three-time Group 1 winner in Europe in 2000, including a nine-furlong score in the Nassau S. at Goodwood in August. If she can handle the dirt, she looks to be very competitive. Thunder Gulch's daughter Spain has won a pair of Grade II events, including the Turfway Breeders' Cup S. at 1 1/16 miles on Kentucky Cup Day. She is multiple Grade 1-placed, but looks to take her first Grade 1 against a strong field.

However, with three highly talented runners, the 2000 Distaff could be Raise a Native's best shot to date to claim the Distaff.

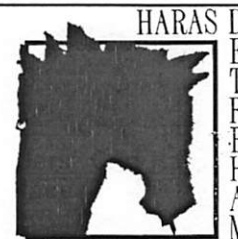

DERBY RUNNERS DENOUNCE FLEMINGTON TRACK

Trainer Bede Murray, who prepares Derby contender **Universal Prince (Aus)** (Scenic {Ire}), has declared the straight at Flemington "a cow paddock" after walking the course on Thursday afternoon following heavy rain. "There is a strip of good ground on the inside to about three or four horses off the fence," he said, "but the rest of it is a cow paddock. I can only see it creating a fast lane near the fence. Horses finishing out wide are going to be at a big disadvantage. We are here for it, so I suppose we've got to run, but it is so disappointing that the track could be unfair." VRC officials believe the track, which has received 140mm of rain in the past three weeks, will be upgraded from dead to heavy, but a chorus of criticism is growing louder with former VRC committeeman Lloyd Williams among those disappointed in the state of the track. Williams, who bought **Enzeli (Ire)** (Kahyasi {Ire}) from the Aga Khan for A\$650,000 to add to a 100-strong string of racehorses, said many of his 43 imports had broken down on hard Australian tracks. "I don't think it is possible to bring English horses out here and train them," he said, criticizing the VRC's decision to build a A\$50 million grandstand ahead of revamping the track. Prominent jockey Darren Beadman, who will partner **Reenact (Aus)** (Marscaj {Aus}) in the Derby, also launched an attack on VRC officials in his usually sedate *Sydney Morning-Herald* column today. "The Flemington track has copped a bit of flak. We've had plenty of rain, but four weeks ago when I won the Turnbull S. (on Fairway {Aus}) at Flemington the track was tired," he said, adding that working 90 horses on the course proper on heavy ground during Tuesday's Breakfast with the Stars had not helped.

MELBOURNE CUP HOPE SCHOOLS IN GATE

Martin Pipe, trainer of **Far Cry (Ire)** (Pharly {Fr}), oversaw a stalls test for his G1 Fosters Melbourne Cup hope. He said, "We did it just to refresh him. The horses here jump from the stalls pretty quick and we thought we would show him what is required." The ground remains soft, after almost an inch of rain has fallen over the last few days, but Pipe was unconcerned at this prospect. "The ground shouldn't worry him. It was really soft in England when we sent him hurdling and he handled that all right," he said.

WILLIAMS BULLISH

Australian jockey Craig Williams was his boisterous best yesterday as the build-up continues to Tuesday's G1 Fosters Melbourne Cup at Flemington. After an unforgettable year based in Britain, which brought lucrative victories at the highest level, he is set to ride James Fanshawe's **Arctic Owl (GB)** (Most Welcome {GB}). After the morning's work on the gelding, currently a 10-1 chance at Sandown, he said, "He's in great form and really fired up compared to the other day. We've got him out of holiday mode and he is firing on all cylinders at the right time. The way he feels he is in top order. As long as he's fired up and has luck on the day he can win it."
