THE "NOW" HORSE

All year, we've been waiting for someone to step up and claim the 2000 Horse of the Year title. After dueling European champion Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) to a neck defeat in the \$4,770,000 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs, it looks like Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy) is the man of the hour. "I think he should be under consideration for Horse of the Year," trainer Jay Robbins said, then added, "But more important to me is that a Calbred has won a Breeders' Cup." The long-legged bay is far from your ordinary Cal-bred. Unraced at two after suffering stress fracture to his left tibia, Tiznow was off the board for the only time in his life in his six-furlong debut back in April, missed by a neck when stretched to two turns for the first time, then blew away a field of maidens at Hollywood May 31. Sent off at 10-1 in the GIII Affirmed H. July 1, he continued his progresion up the ladder, beating subsequent GI Haskell Invitational H. winner Dixie Union by a neck. The colt was second to Captain Steve (Fly So Free) in the GI Swaps S. and second to Skimming in the GI Pacific Classic, but broke through with his first Grade I win in the Super Derby and added a victory over Captain Steve in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita Oct. 15. The Classic was his third race in the span of 35 days, but he was up to the task, cruising along on the front end with Albert The Great (Go for Gin) through a half in :47 2/5, six furlongs in 1:12 and a mile in 1:36 before bracing for the challenge of "The Iron Giant." Those two hooked up at the top of the lane and gave it everything they had every step to the wire, but the photo showed it was Tiznow who proved just that much the better. "This is the most exciting thing that has happened to me since my daughter was born 24 years ago," said owner Michael Cooper, who supplemented his Classic runner for \$360,000. "The decision to supplement was easy--the horse earned the money. Jay and the crew all gave me the thumbs up." Looking ahead, Cooper added, "He will run next year, and hopefully defend his title." Jockey Chris McCarron, earning a fourth Classic score, said, "This is a thrill of a lifetime, it never gets old."

Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), who retires after finishing first or second in all 13 starts, had to be blindfolded to get into the gate, but came out running and was gallant in defeat. "I thought I was going to win it, but [Chris McCarron] just had a little more horse," said his jockey, Mick Kinane. "I'm so proud of my colt. He's just an amazing horse." Supplemental entry Captain Steve (Fly So Free), who broke from the rail and was uncharacteristically far off the pace after being steadied on the first turn, moved up while saving ground on the final bend and, after angling out for running room, got up for third. "He ran his race," trainer Bob Baffert said, adding, "Now he's eligible for next year's Breeders' Cup." GI Kentucky Derby victor Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), the 6-5 favorite, could have put Horse of the Year in his pocket with a big race in the Classic, but never fired, finishing sixth. "He got banged around a little bit and there wasn't as much pace as we thought there would be," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "He didn't settle as well as he should have. He finally relaxed at the wrong point." Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), the 6-1 second choice, settled in fourth early, but came up empty in the stretch and finished fifth.

Accounting for the biggest upset on the day, the Breeders' Cup opener saw 55-1 Spain light up the tote board as she snapped the six-race winning streak of probable champion Riboletta (Roi Normand). The Brazilian-bred, who is still odds-on to take an Eclipse Award after capping her skein with an impressive twolength tally in the GI Beldame S. Oct. 14, was sent off at 2-5, but was never in the hunt. Floated wide on both turns, she came up empty in the stretch and finished seventh. "I don't know what happened," jockey Chris McCarron said. "I've been her pilot all year and she's never been like this. She just didn't pull at all." Trainer Eduardo Inda blamed the racing surface, saying, "The track was too hard, not like it's been all week, and we got carried very wide, too." But it was Team Lukas that stole the show. Surfside, making her second start after a six-month layoff, went right to the front and opened up on the field while setting fractions of :46 1/5 and 1:10 2/5. Spain, winning for the fourth time in seven starts since transferring to the D. Wayne Lukas stable, was content to sit just off her stablemate down the backstretch. She drove between horses as they raced into the final bend and slipped up the rail in the stretch to take over at the three-sixteenths pole and edge clear, adding a Breeders' Cup victory to wins in the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks and GIII Turfway Park Breeders' Cup S. and a second in the GI Spinster S. last time out. "We're thrilled," said Lukas, who picked up his 16th Breeders' Cup trophy, and his fourth in the Distaff. "They've both trained so well this week. It's hard to ignore Surfside with her pedigree and all, but all week long we said it would be hard to separate them."

Caressing in all likelihood earned the Freshman Sire title for Honour and Glory with this professional victory and stamped herself as a leading candidate for the Eclipse. The dark bay filly had been training under the Twin Spires since April, and signaled her readiness for this million-dollar affair with a bullet move of :58 3/5 on Halloween, but was sent off as the longest shot on the board despite the Churchill factor. Breaking from post seven, she tucked in towards the rail and saved ground as Thunder Bertie (Thunder Gulch) showed the way, followed closely by Nasty Storm (Gulch), Notable Career (Avenue of Flags) and Raging Fever (Storm Cat). Three lengths back through a half in :46 2/5, she picked up the beat and angled out six wide as the field headed into the stretch. Caressing came through between rivals to grab the lead with an eighth of a mile remaining and bravely held off the late challenges of Platinum Tiara and She's a Devil Due. "I did not think this was an upset," exclaimed owner Carl F. Pollard. "It's a dream come true [to win in front of the hometown crowd]." After breaking her maiden in her second start, the \$180,000 KEESEP yearling romped by seven lengths in the Bassinet S. at River Downs Sept. 2, then rallied for second in the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie Sept. 30, her first try at two turns. She will be freshened now for a spring campaign. "I'm an accountant and don't know much about horses," Pollard confessed. "Mike Ryan buys for me. I usually give him an order for the Keeneland sale for two or three fillies with enough pedigree that if we get lucky, they'll make good broodmares. I never saw her until she walked into my barn."

War Chant, showing an explosive turn of foot, parlayed a perfectly timed ride by Gary Stevens to take the Mile. Breaking from post 11 with a short run to the first turn, the handsome bay settled into stride at the back of the pack as 42-1 North East Bound cut out the early fractions. Checked slightly at the top of the stretch, the crowd's slight choice switched out for racing room and appeared to graze heels with second-choice King Cugat (Kingmambo). Unaffected, he was 5 1/2 lengths back at the stretch call, but found another gear and swept by the field in a matter of strides to catch a determined North East Bound in the shadow of the wire as Dansili rushed up the rail for the show spot. Said Stevens, "I was further back than I wanted, but I had confidence that he would run them down in the lane. I was flying. I never hit the accelerator until we hit the furlong pole." Victorious in his Ione start at two, War Chant glided onto the Triple Crown trail with a triumph in the GII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita Mar. 4. The bay colt saw his unbeaten record dashed when second to The Deputy (Ire) in the GI Santa Anita Derby, then finished ninth as stablemate Fusaichi Pegasus took the GI Kentucky Derby in May. Diagnosed with a shoulder injury following that effort, he was given the summer off and returned to serious training in September with an eye toward the Breeders' Cup. He made his first foray onto the turf in the GII Oak Tree Breeders' Mile Oct. 14 and unleashed a late run which saw him win by 1 1/4 lengths. War Chant's victory gave his sire Danzig an unprecedented fifth Breeders' Cup victory and third Mile, following Lure ('92 & '93). Hollywood Wildcat (also owned by Irving and Marjorie Cowan) joins Personal Ensign as the only Breeders' Cup heroines to produce Breeders' Cup winners.

For Team Kona Gold, the third time was indeed the charm. Third to loose-on-the lead Reraise in the 1998 Sprint at Churchill Downs, the six-year-old bobbled at the outset of last year's event, then rallied late, but finished second to Artax, who was in the process of setting a track and Breeders' Cup record. This season has seen the gelding win four of his five starts and three straight, including the GII Potrero Grande Breeders' Cup, the GII Bing Crosby Breeders' Cup H. and most recently a three-length success in the GII Ancient Title Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita Oct. 14. Caller One (Phone Trick) set early fractions of :20 4/5 for the quarter and :43 2/5 for the half, but as the field reached the top of the stretch, jockey Alex Solis aboard the race favorite had his mount poised four deep for a winning move. The gelding went up to confront the front runner leaving the eighth pole, took command inside the final sixteenth and held off a furious late rally from Honest Lady to give his trainer and jockey their first Breeders' Cup victories while setting a track and Sprint record. For Solis, redemption was certainly sweet. "Thank God I got the monkey off my back," Solis said, after being shut out in his first 31 Breeders' Cup rides, despite a number of close calls. "I'm so proud of this horse. I've been on him since he was a two-year-old. He's like a son." Added trainer Bruce Headley, "The difference has been seasoning. And Alex Solis rode him to perfection. He is such an honest hard-trying horse. He galloped this morning and came back bucking and kicking, so I knew then."

Perfect Sting lost her perfect record for the season with a second-place finish to Tout Charmant in the GIII WinStar Galaxy S. at Keeneland Oct. 13, but turned the tables on that rival when it really counted. Sixth in this event last year, the bay reeled off four straight stakes wins to start 2000, most recently taking the GII Diana H. at Saratoga Sept. 4. The second choice to return to her winning ways, the Stronach homebred was content to let first Japanese-based longshot Maltese Superb (With Approval) and then stablemate Collect The Cash (Dynaformer) set the pace. She launched her bid while four-wide on the final bend, took command at midstretch and held off Tout Charmant to the wire. "There was more speed than I thought and I didn't think she'd go a mile and three-eighths, but she sure proved it," said jockey Jerry Bailey, who is now a perfect two-fortwo in this event and, after putting them back-to-back with a win in the Juvenile, has 11 Breeders' Cup victories overall. Petrushka (Unfuwain), the 7-5 favorite after three consecutive Group 1 wins in Europe, found herself in traffic at the top of the lane, then lacked a strong late kick. "She was never really travelling well today," jockey Johnny Murtagh said. Spanish Fern (El Gran Senor), who bolted in last year's "Disturf," was pulled up just a few strides from the gate with an injury to her left hind leg and was sent to Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital. "It could involve the bone, but we won't know until we take a radiograph," attending veterinarian Dr. Wayne McIlwraigh said. "It could be serious."

Churchill Downs has been very good to Stronach Stables. Macho Uno gave them their third Breeders' Cup winner, all of them coming under the Twin Spires, and second in a row yesterday. A half brother to 1998 Classic hero Awesome Again, the gray was the 2 1/2-length winner of his sprint debut up at Saratoga July 26 and was a rallying third in his next start behind dead-heaters City Zip (Carson City) and Yonaguska (Cherokee Run) in the GI Hopeful S. at the Spa Sept. 2. After a five-week rest, the decision was made to ship Macho Uno to Woodbine to contest the Oct. 9 GI Grey Breeders' Cup and he did not disappoint in his two-turn debut, coming from off the pace to win by seven lengths with Lasix added and thereby earning a trip to Louisville. Arabian Light (Fly So Free) sped to an early lead, with Macho Uno in fairly close attendance through moderate fractions. The pacesetter threatened to take them all the way, but the winner responded to urgings in the stretch to go to the front and, despite weaving in the final sixteenth, managed to hold off a charging Point Given for a very narrow win. "The two-turn experience played a major role in getting him to the wire today," said victorious trainer Joe Orseno. "He's a young talented colt." Favored A P Valentine (A.P. Indy) tired on the turn and was last home. His trainer, Nick Zito, was dumbfounded. "Unbelievable. I have no idea what happened. [Jockey Jorge Chavez] said it looked like he was going to have a ton of horse and he stopped," he said.

Kalanisi produced a fine late burst to post the second Turf victory for His Highness the Aga Khan, following Lashkari's win in the 1984 affair. By Doyoun, the sire of last year's victor Daylami, the dark bay had never attempted 12 furlongs, but handled the increased distance with aplomb. Taken under a snug hold by jockey John Murtagh, he secured a ground-saving position several lengths off the dawdling early fractions of :50 1/5 and 1:15 1/5, angled out as they turned for home and quickened impressively, edging out Quiet Resolve and John's Call in the final strides. "He was trapped down on the inside," said Murtagh. "But when I took him to the outside for the straight, he kept his head down and just got there." After winning the G2 Queen Anne S. over a mile at Royal Ascot, Kalanisi went down by a head in two of England's most prestigious 10-furlong events, the G1 Coral-Eclipse and the G1 Juddmonte International. He received a two-month freshening and returned Oct. 14 at Newmarket, where he outfinished Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G1 Dubai Champion S. Montieu, sent off as the favorite, was well off the pace and made a mild gain to finish seventh. "He picked up the bit turning for home, but he was left with too much to do," said jockey Mick Kinane.

The connection goes beyond elite riders sharing a perfect moment, as Hoy's 2000 Olympic eventer Darien Powers was bred and is owned by Hit The Roof's owner-breeder, Bob Scarborough of Victoria's Wood Nook Farm. Scarborough sent his mare Good News to Maroof while the subfertile sire resided at Sir Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud and the compact chestnut was the result. Despite giving a solid Derby pointer when beaten only a head in the G2 Norman Robinson S. at Caulfield's traditional Derby lead-up at his last appearance, the David Hall trainee scarcely rated a mention before the race. Hall, who made his mark with eight winners over the '99 Melbourne carnival, fought back tears. "Everything has gone right with this horse and I am over the moon, this is a very special race," he said. Hit The Roof sat midfield with Boss edging him along the rail. At the 300-meter mark, he switched outside and put 1 1/2 lengths on favored Skalato (Aus) (Semipalatinsk), who was fourth most of the way, and Universal Prince, who powered from third last to finish second ahead of fellow backmarker Falls The Shadow.

In a race considered a crucial guide to Tuesday's Melbourne Cup, Oliver Twist shot through a narrow opening on the fence to give trainer Brian Mayfield-Smith a well-deserved victory before a record crowd of 92,000 at Flemington. The six-year-old settled fourth early and looked to have nowhere to go at the 300meter mark before jockey Greg Childs slid his mount through a tiny opening on the fence. "He was getting a beautiful run on the fence, but coming to the turn it was packing up and I couldn't get out," said Childs, who was also aboard for the victory in the G1 Underwood S. four starts back. "I took a tight rails run and burst through for a good win." Mayfield-Smith, who gave up training two seasons back to embark on a stint working with wildlife in Africa, said all Oliver Twist needed today was luck. "There was not much room, but the good thing was he persevered [on the rails] because there was no other option and that left the horse with plenty of running to finish it off, he sort of gave it to them at the finish. But this horse is remarkable, last week he ran in the Cox Plate [fourth] and 20 minutes after the race he was jumping around like an underworked spring two-year-old," said Mayfield-Smith. "All week his eyes have been like an eagle and he's been right on to it and full of himself, obviously waiting for this. He was super-fit." Well-supported Sky Heights (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) raced midfield before fading to beat only four home. "There is something wrong with him and I can't put my finger on it," said jockey Glen Boss. Crown Lodge colorbearer Freemason (Aus) (Grand Lodge {Ire}), trapped behind horses to finish three lengths away fourth, was extremely eye-catching from a Melbourne Cup point of view. "He worked home well. It was a nice Cup trial," said jockey Larry Cassidy.

Easy Rocking now has five wins and eight placings from 18 starts for prize money of A\$855,635.

KEENELAND NOVEMBER KICKS OFF TODAY

It's been called "the world's most important auction of its type in terms of total sales and average price per horse." Keeneland's remarkable and unduplicated November Breeding Stock Sale, which in 1997 became the first ever to surpass \$200 million in gross revenue, is set to begin today at the Keeneland Sales Pavilion in Lexington. The aggregate surged to more than \$317 million last year, including 29 seven-figure horses (associates and partnerships of John Magnier's Coolmore Stud purchased eight of those million-dollar sellers) and 111 that sold for \$500,000 or more. Last year's top seller was the broodmare Dance Design (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), which brought a hefty \$4.7 million for Padua Stables and Eaton Sales Agency. Magnier bought three of the top five sellers himself, including Winglet (Alydar), which was in foal to Storm Cat, for \$4.6 million. The top weanling of 1999 was a Sadler's Wells colt, named Restoration, which went for \$1.4 million. If this year's sales at Keeneland and the world over are any indication, the 2000 November Sale could be another record-breaker. Buyers will have plenty of horses to choose from, with over 5,000 hips on offer. The sale includes broodmares, broodmare prospects, weanlings, horses of other ages and stallion seasons and shares. Bidding for the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale begins today at 10 a.m. The sale continues through Nov. 18.

Dispersal Delights

The sale will feature dispersals today from Morven Stud Ltd, the Allen E. Paulson Living Trust and Robert H. and Bea Roberts. Among the Paulson dispersal are Solar Slew (Seattle Slew) (#43), the dam of Cigar in foal to Deputy Minister; Charmer's Gift (Blushing John) (#123), a half sister to Seattle Slew in foal to Theatrical (Ire); and champion Estrapade (Vaguely Noble) (#160) in foal to Hennessy.

Seasons, Anyone?

At the conclusion of today's opening session, seasons to some of the world's most popular sires will be auctioned, with portions of the proceeds going to the Grayson-Jockey Club Foundation. They include, A.P. Indy, Coronado's Quest, Deputy Minister, Dubai Millennium (GB), Fusaichi Pegasus, Kingmambo, Pulpit, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat and Unbridled.

Looking for an Eclipse Winner?

Several catalogued mares have already produced champions, such as Song of Syria (Damascus) (#336), the dam of Chilukki; and Island Jamboree (Explodent) (#542), the dam of Fiji (GB); both are in foal to Storm Cat. A full sister to Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, Blissful (Mr. Prospector) (#789) sells in foal to Deputy Minister. Tom Van Meter of Eaton Sales Agency said, "In this year's catalog, the quality of mares may not be as strong as in the past. I don't see any \$4 or \$5 million mares in there. However, the market will still be strong. The November Sales seem to be stronger when the Breeders' Cup is held at Churchill." Van Meter pointed to several key lots for Eaton, including Double Sunrise (Slew O'Gold) (#833), the dam of Sprint winner Kona Gold in foal to Woodman; and GISW Magical Allure (General Meeting) (#937) in foal to Storm Cat.

Weanling Wonders

Steve Johnson of Margaux Farm will keep a keen eye on the younger lots. He said, "There will be some great bargains for weanlings. One of the things we'll be watching is the large number of mares and weanlings by the same sire, and how that will affect sales." Making their first appearance in a sales ring are weanlings by leading sires A.P. Indy, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Gone West, Kingmambo, Nureyev, Sadler's Wells, Saint Ballado, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat and Unbridled. First-crop sires represented by weanlings include Grand Slam, Coronado's Quest and King of Kings (Ire).

FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER BEGINS Across town at Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky, Fasig-Tipton will hold its November Selected Sale at 8 p.m. this evening. The 106 catalogued lots are headlined by Beautiful Bid (Baldski) (#38), the dam of champion Beautiful Pleasure and \$2.4 million-earner Mecke. She sells on a March cover by Storm Cat. Offered as broodmare prospects are GISW Rings a Chime (Metfield) (#6) and GSW Prairie Princess (Rocky Mountain) (#102). Top juvenile Flame Thrower's half brother by Twining, a weanling out of Metromane (#84), is sure to attract attention.

CHAMPION DARLEY CLAIMS ON FINAL DAY

I've been in front since May, but I didn't feel any pressure until about two weeks ago. I didn't want to let it slip away and have been going anywhere to keep it going and ride winners. I just hope I can keep it going next year." Having ridden the very first and last winners of the 2000 turf flat season in Britain, Darley will now jet off to sunnier climbs in a bid to put a seal on the perfect season, which included dual Group 1 glory. He rides Far Cry (Ire) (Pharly {Fr}) in Tuesday's G1 Fosters Melbourne Cup at Flemington. He said, "I spoke to Mr. Pipe (the trainer) this morning and he is very happy. He said the horse is absolutely bouncing and I'm looking forward to the experience."

NUREYEV COLT A BARGAIN?

St. Petersburg (Aus) (Nureyev {USA}), a A\$700,000 Easter sales graduate who is a half brother to American MGISW Jersey Girl (USA), was sent off at 10-1 in vesterday's G3 Chivas Regal S. at Australia's Flemington racetrack, but prevailed by a half-head from 2-1 Cosset (Aus) to earn his first Group success. Bloodstock agent Henry Plumptre, who manages the three-year-old for owner Glyn Jones, a professional golfer on the European Tour, said the price paid for St. Petersburg may appear high by Australian standards, but was actually a value. "A Nureyev in England or America would fetch double what he cost," he said. Making only his fifth start, St. Petersburg was coming off a disappointing effort at Caulfield six weeks ago when he ran nearly last going 1600 meters, but Hayes said the colt had suffered a throat problem which affected his breathing in that race. Future plans have not yet been announced.

UNLUCKY OWL

While vesterday's draw for Tuesday's G1 Fosters Melbourne Cup generally benefitted the European raiders, Arctic Owl (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}) was unfortunate in being handed the wide stall 21. Meanwhile, Enzeli's trainer John Oxx, pensive on the six draw, said, "You have always got to have a little bit of luck in running and it might have been better if he had been drawn a little wider."
