TWENTY-ONE CLUB

A total of 21 mares, as well as three weanlings, lit up the board to the tune of six figures at yesterday's second session of the 2000 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington. "We thought it would be strong, but we never dreamed that we could have a session where we sold over \$100,000,000," W.B. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland's director of sales, said. "We didn't think we could come close to that, quite frankly."

JEWELS OF THE BLUEGRASS

Eclipse champion **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint), in foal to Storm Cat, caused the biggest stir at the session, selling for \$4.9 million to John Magnier. A winner of four Grade I races, including the Breeders' Cup Distaff, and more than \$1.9 million, the eight-year-old's first foal is a yearling by Storm Cat. "We've been in this long enough to know that you never know for sure what is going to happen," Magnier said. "But obviously we liked the mare. Remember her race record?" David Minton and Britton House Stud were the underbidders. Next in the bidding came five-year-old **Catchascatchcan (GB)** (Pursuit of Love), in foal to Danzig. The Group 1 winner was bought for \$4.6 million by Irish bloodstock agent Eddie O'Leary, agent for Lyons Demesne, a company owned by Dr. Tony Ryan, who also owns the Irish airline Ryanair and a farm in Co. Kildaire. Broodmare prospect **Myhrr** (Mr. Prospector), an unraced three-year-old filly, attracted the third-highest bid, going for \$4.6 million to Reynolds Bell Jr., agent for Richard Santulli's Jayeff B Stables. She is a full sister to top young stallion Kingmambo. The price was a record for an unbred mare, surpassing the mark of \$4.1 million set by champion Winning Colors in 1989. "It's the type of family that you don't have the opportunity to get into very often," Bell said. "Maybe it won't ever happen again." MGISW **Squeak (GB)** (Selkirk), in foal to Storm Cat, rounded out the top four yesterday, bringing \$3.7 million from John Ferguson Bloodstock on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed. "She's a beautiful mare," said Ferguson. "She performed well on both sides of the Atlantic. She traces back to Pocahontas, which is one of the great lines, and she is in foal to a top stallion. She's really the entire package." He added, "I think she would be a lovely mare to breed to Dubai Millennium (GB), but we have not made any firm decisions." (More, p3)

TWO MORE FOR SHEIKH MOHAMMED

Nine-year-old **Caress** (Storm Cat), a multiple graded-stakes winner in foal to Coronado's Quest, kept the bidding going until it reached \$3.1 million, with John Ferguson and Sheikh Mohammed picking up another major mare. The two went to \$3 million to get the 11-year-old **Bright Tiara** (Chief's Crown), in foal to A.P. Indy. The mare, a full sister to GISW Chief Honcho, is the dam of stakes winners Gold Tiara and Queen's Park. "Everything is there," Ferguson said of Bright Tiara. "The first two runners are stakes winners and one of them is by Seeking the Gold. We obviously have a stallion by Seeking the Gold [Dubai Millennium] and she might fit him perfectly."

TROUT TAKES FIVE

While John Ferguson got three of the six-figure mares Monday, he was outdone by Lisa Troutt, who brought home five, including **Career Collection** (General Meeting). Troutt, bidding on behalf of WinStar Farm, went to \$1.9 million for the five-year-old mare, in foal to Gone West. A two-time graded-stakes winner, the bay was second in the 1997 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "She fits exactly what we're trying to buy," said Rich Decker, president of WinStar. "We're looking for younger mares with good race records. We think there is enough pedigree here, too." He added, "When you have all that, you've got to pay." Decker and partners paid \$1.7 million for four-year-old **Debit Account** (Mr. Prospector), in foal to Deputy Minister; and \$1.4 million for the five-year-old **Sister Act** (Saint Ballado), in foal to the same stallion. "[Deputy Minister] is a little cool right now, but I'm sure he's going to come back," WinStar's president remarked. "He's had a lot of good ones and I'm sure he'll have more." Also headed to WinStar are **Troubling** (Storm Cat), a half sister to MGSW Adjudicating and GISW Time for a Change in foal to Seeking the Gold who went for \$1.4 million; and **Coldheartedcat** (Storm Cat), a half sister to GI Belmont S. winner Caveat in foal to A.P. Indy who sold for \$1.4 million as well. The WinStar broodmare band now numbers approximately 75.

SOMETHING TO SMILE ABOUT

Britton House Stud, looking to add to its band of broodmares, went to \$2.5 million to get the four-year-old **Woodyoumileforme** (Woodman), in foal to Red Ransom. The stakes-placed filly is a full sister to MGSW Ciro; her second dam is the great Korveya, who has produced champions Bosra Sham and Hector Protector (both by Woodman) and holds the record as the highest-priced mare ever sold at Keeneland November, selling for \$7 million in 1998. "She's a lovely mare," said bloodstock agent Dick Fawlston, who advises Britton House owner Roger Baines, of yesterday's purchase. "She'll join our growing broodmare band." He added, "We bought Mackie here and she produced a lovely Mr. Prospector. We plan on selling the colts and keeping the fillies. This mare fits into our plans."

TOPPING THE WEANLINGS

The highest-priced weanling on the day was a filly by Storm Cat out of Now That's Funny (Saratoga Six). The dark bay, a half sister to British champion Lucayan Prince and MGSW Comic Strip, was purchased by Timmy Hyde for \$1.2 million. That bid tied the second-highest price ever paid for a filly foal at Keeneland November. Hyde indicated he would pinhook this purchase. "Most of mine are," he said. "Hopefully, we'll do the same thing with this one. But we'll wait to see what happens." A filly by A.P. Indy out of Golden Petal (Mr. Prospector) attracted a bid of \$1,150,000 from B. Wayne Hughes. The chestnut is a half sister to MGSW Lotus Pool. The top-priced colt yesterday was a son of Storm Cat out of Beware of the Cat (Caveat), who brought \$1.1 million from Demi O'Byrne. The chestnut is a half brother to GI Belmont S. winner Editor's Note, who also captured the GI Super Derby, was second in the GI Florida Derby and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Preakness.

TAYLOR MADE IN THE SHADE

Taylor Made Sales Agency topped all consignors at yesterday's session with \$22,352,000 in sales, accounting for six million-dollar plus broodmares as well as a six-figure weanling. Next was Lane's End, which boasted session topper Jewel Princess among its five six-figure broodmares and ended the day with sales of \$20,545,000. Rounding out the top five consignors were: Claiborne Farm, \$11,130,000; Three Chimneys Sales, \$10,625,000; and Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds, \$8,410,000. Lisa Troutt was the top buyer at \$12.66 million, followed by John Ferguson Bloodstock at \$10.4 million and Reynolds Bell Jr., agent, at \$7.1 million.

AT THE SALES WITH...

THE \$100-MILLION SESSION

It's all about zeroes, this is what I keep saying to people. The six-figure stud fee, the seven-figure yearling and now, for the first time ever, the nine-figure session...that particular \$100-million barrier has now been broken. There were 300 horses sent through the ring at Keeneland yesterday (39 fewer than last year), of which 226 sold (75.3%) for a total of \$102,450,000.

Last year, 277 sold (51 more than this year) for a total of \$99,318,000--see, that's still eight figures. As a consequence, the average jumped almost \$100,000, from \$358,549 last year to \$453,319 yesterday. So that's a 26% jump in average.

It's important to keep in mind, though, that comparing mixed sales isn't always comparing apples to apples. Whereas in the yearling sales we've been able to count on the composition of the overall catalogue being roughly comparable from year to year (even if we'd have to add together '99 July plus September to '00 July plus September to account for Lane's End's shift to September), that's not always the case with mixed sales. There is more variation in the composition of the November catalogue from year to year--the Sunday dispersal day is always the most obvious example of this, but it's true as well of the catalogue as a whole--and therefore the yearling sales do tend to be a better measurement of the overall marketplace.

I keep finding reason to mention the now-standard doubling of stallions' book sizes over the last five years, and I'll wager it had an effect on the prices in yesterday's session, too. Storm Cat and A.P. Indy both covered books of around 130 mares this year, and there were 18 mares in foal to one or the other who went through the ring yesterday, plus another two in foal to Danzig. Of the 20 mares in foal to one of those three yesterday, 19 sold, and 13 of the 19 were among the 24 mares yesterday who sold for \$1 million (that's seven figures) or more.

Including Beautiful Bid, the \$2.6-million mare at Fasig Sunday night in foal to Storm Cat, eight mares in foal to him have so far averaged \$2,143,125. The three mares in foal to Danzig (one on Sunday) have averaged \$2,283,533, and the 10 mares in foal to A.P. Indy have averaged \$1,267,500.

Yesterday, the 19 mares in foal to these three stallions sold for a total of \$33,420,000--roughly a third of the gross. That's what you call Sire Power.

But those were just the headline horses. Eleven more fillies or mares brought seven-figure bids, and the rest of yesterday's session still added up to nearly another \$70 million. It was an unabashedly strong session, and one impressive feature of it was its consistency. If a market is consistent, whether consistently strong or consistently weak, it's much easier to read. I think we can all agree that yesterday it was consistently strong.

One impressive feature of yesterday's market, I thought, was the performance of foals by first-crop sires. I particularly noted eight foals sold by five first-crop stallions, all of whom stand either at Ashford or Adena Springs. Fillies by Ashford's Grand Slam brought \$535,000 and \$425,000, and their Tale of the Cat registered sales of \$300,000 and \$200,000. Adena Springs' Touch Gold had a \$255,000 colt and a \$240,000 filly. Their Awesome Again had a \$500,000 colt, and even Wild Rush got into the act with a \$230,000 colt--not bad for a \$15,000 stud fee! The message here, too, is that there is plenty of demand for the good individual by the most promising young sires.

Last year there were 1,425 horses catalogued on the first four days, whereas this year there are 1,338, including the 10 seasons at the end of Sunday's session which were not included in the session totals. So there are 97 fewer horses, 7% less than last year. This is most likely accounted for by the sale spreading out from 13 to 14 days. Anyhow, by the end of the first four days last year, 1,090 horses had grossed \$210,217,000 and averaged \$216,072. Given that the composition of the first four days this year is not totally comparable to last year, it will still be interesting to see how they compare at the end of tomorrow's session. So far, the two-day gross is actually down a bit (last year's dispersals totaled almost \$12 million more than this year's), but the average is up 20%.

El Cielo came into this event with six wins and two seconds in nine tries over this course, and four victories and a second from his last five appearances. The bay started only four times last year, winning twice, then returned after nearly nine months on the sidelines to take a Santa Anita allowance in January. Second by a neck in the Reb's Policy H. Feb. 6, he then scored in a Mar. 11 allowance event and the Apr. 24 Gill San Simon H. before heading to the shelf once again. Making his return here, the Florida-bred was handed the role of favorite despite the six-month absence and came through for the crowd, closing from fifth to take the lead in deep stretch and edge clear.

A Group 2 winner in his seasonal debut back in January, Machikane Kinnoshi was sidelined for four months after that victory and was held winless in two starts in the spring before taking another four months off. He returned to finish eighth in the G2-Jpn Mainichi Okan Oct. 8, but improved enough here to earn both the victory and a ticket to the Nov. 26 G1 Japan Cup. Rating kindly off a slow pace set by Sunday Sarah, the four-year-old saved ground to the stretch before bursting through an opening between horses to take the lead and then hold off the late bid of Mejiro Ronzan for a narrow score.

BREEDERS' CUP ROUND-UP

Just as it is difficult to say which horse emerged with the most credit from the seven Breeders' Cup events, it is hard to know which stallion made the biggest contribution to a wonderful day's sport.

Perhaps the award should go to Relaunch, a stallion who in the past enjoyed Breeders' Cup success with Skywalker (1986 Classic) and One Dreamer (1994 Distaff). This time he made his mark through his sons Cee's Tizzy, sire of the highly determined Classic winner Tiznow, and Honour And Glory, who capped a very good first season by siring the Juvenile Fillies winner Caressing. It is worth pointing out that three of the main elements in Relaunch's pedigree--Intentionally, Rough'n Tumble and The Axe--rank among the four great- grandsires of Holy Bull, sire of the Juvenile hero Macho Uno.

Danzig also made a notable contribution, enjoying a record fifth Breeders' Cup success as a sire, thanks to War Chant's dazzling finishing surge, and two other veterans also did well--Seattle Slew was represented by two honorable seconds from three runners, while the recuperating Affirmed was represented by two sons, Quiet Resolve and Affirmed Success, which each finished within half a length of the winner.

Perhaps the most encouraging aspect of the day, from an American viewpoint, was the way the exceptional proven stallions had to share the limelight with some much younger rivals. Holy Bull is only nine years old, Honour And Glory is only seven and Thunder Gulch, who went close to a magnificent double with Spain and Point Given, is eight.

Even though Thunder Gulch has enjoyed the benefit of large books of mares--171 named foals in his first two crops--he has still done very well to sire a winner of the Distaff in his first crop and a very close second in the Juvenile in his second.

Spain and Point Given both carry the colors of The Thoroughbred Corporation, which is credited with breeding them. However, Spain was being carried in utero when her dam Drina was purchased for \$62,000 at Keeneland's 1996 November Sale. Prince Ahmed Salman must count himself lucky that he still owns Spain because she was offered as a yearling, when the bidding rose no higher than \$25,000.

It mustn't be forgotten that Thunder Gulch himself cost only \$40,000 as a yearling and that he failed to reach his reserve the following April. In my hasty notes in my 1993 Keeneland July Sale catalogue I commented that this son of Gulch was small but sturdy, and I also drew attention to the fact that he was a ridgling and had a May 23 birthday. Thunder Gulch's dam, the Storm Bird mare Line of Thunder, is a lengthy, short- legged type and Thunder Gulch is still not very tall, around 15.2 or 15.3 hands. Perhaps the most striking aspect of his physique is the strength and breadth of his rear end. These power-packed quarters certainly served him well on the track, propelling him to victory in nine of his 16 starts, including the Kentucky Derby and Belmont S.

Thunder Gulch's ponyish physique represents an open invitation for breeders to send him mares with plenty of size and scope. It is interesting that the dams of several of his better winners are by horses who possessed plenty of scope. Point Given's broodmare sire, the Alydar horse Turkoman, stands 16.2 and so did Regal And Royal, the broodmare sire of Spain.

Spain has two lines (4x5) to Northern Dancer, through two similarly bred horses, Storm Bird and Nijinsky. Nijinsky sired Spain's third dam Shujinsky, a sister to the triple Grade III winner Manzotti, and Spain's fifth dam is Sister Shu. As her name suggests, Sister Shu was a sister to Shuvee, the champion older filly of 1970 and 1971. This is the Levee branch of the exceptional Bourtai family, so Spain has an appropriate pedigree for a Distaff winner.

BREEDERS' CUP OVERNIGHT RATINGS UP The Breeders' Cup telecast on NBC achieved an overnight rating of 2.6, up four percent from last year's rating of 2.5. Each rating point equals roughly one million homes. The overnight rating is derived from a sample of the top 45 markets in the country. The overnight share was six, down from last year's seven, but Breeders' Cup officials pointed out that there were more households watching TV this year, translating into a greater Breeders' Cup audience overall. The telecast was up against college football on ABC and PGA Golf featuring Tiger Woods on CBS. "We're ecstatic, obviously, to achieve a four-percent increase in the overnight rating against that kind of competition," said Damon Thayer, Director of Marketing for the Breeders' Cup. "Based on so many sporting events being down, including Monday Night Football, the World Series and the Olympics, we're declaring victory. It is a slam-dunk for the racing industry."

OWNER SUES PAT DAY James T. Hines Jr., owner of Sept. 16 GIII Turfway Breeders' Cup S. runner-up Ruby Surprise, has sued Pat Day, alleging that the jockey struck his horse with the whip while riding Spain to victory in that race, and that the contact cost his horse the victory. According to the suit, which was filed in U.S. District Court in Covington, Kentucky, Day used his whip "negligently, recklessly or intentionally." Hines is also suing the three stewards on duty that afternoon--Jack Middleton, Brooks Becraft and Ron Herbstreit--for failing to launch an inquiry after Ruby Surprise's trainer, Robert Holthus, lodged a complaint.

STUD FEE SET FOR CAT THIEF Overbrook Farm's Cat Thief (Storm Cat--Train Robbery, by Alydar), who captured the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at two and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GI Swaps S. last season at three, has arrived at Overbrook, near Lexington, and will stand there for a fee of \$35,000 in 2001, *The Blood-Horse* on-line reports. Unplaced in his final start in this year's Classic, the four-year-old retires with four wins, nine seconds and eight thirds from 30 starts for earnings of \$3,951,012. Second in the GI Whitney H., GI Haskell Invitational H., GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and GI Fountain of Youth S., he was also third in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

HUGHES SUSPENDED

Jockey Richard Hughes was handed a whopping 19-day suspension by the Jockey Club Monday, according to *Sporting Life*. The penalty relates to a careless riding charge incurred during the EBF Balaton Lodge Maiden Fillies S. at Newmarket on Oct. 28. The disciplinary committee became involved in the incident because Hughes had already been suspended the maximum 15 days over the previous 12 months for the same offence. The suspension begins Nov. 11. Hughes was also fined £500.

FIRST BRITISH WIN FOR PAKISTAN CHAMPION

Pakistan's champion jockey Shahid Rehman scored his first winner in Britain at Southwell's all-weather track yesterday. The stylish Rehman was successful aboard Single Track Mind (GB) for trainer Nigel Hamilton when making all in the second division of the Bet Direct 0800 211 222 Maiden Stakes. Rehman, successful in last year's Pakistan Derby, already has over 500 winners to his credit and is Pakistan's equivalent of Frankie Dettori. The 26-year-old has taken an extended break from riding in Pakistan and is hoping to make a name for himself riding on Britain's sand circuit throughout the winter.

WEATHER CONTINUES TO WREAK HAVOC

The continuing run of bad weather in Britain has further disrupted race meetings with today's scheduled jumps cards at Huntingdon and Sedgefield succumbing to the effects of persistent torrential rain. Huntingdon's clerk of the course, Hugo Bevan, said, "The nearby river has risen very quickly during the morning and basically we are flooded." Sedgefield's Alan Brown explained, "We had no option but to abandon. The course is completely waterlogged." The only racing in Britain today is the all-weather eight-race card at Lingfield. Tomorrow's meeting at Folkestone is subject to passing an afternoon inspection with clerk of the course Fergus Cameron hopeful of a positive outcome despite part of the course being waterlogged. "The forecast isn't too bad and if that is correct then I'm reasonably optimistic we can race." Ireland has not escaped the clutches of the weather with both Fairyhouse's compensatory fixture tomorrow and Cork's fixture on Sunday already abandoned.

£4 MILLION LOAN FOR CHEPSTOW

Wales' top racecourse Chepstow is to receive £4 million in an interest-free loan from the Horserace Betting Levy Board. The money will go towards a £10.3 million redevelopment at the track which will, among other things, move the paddock and winner's enclosure in front of the grandstands and will construct a new Members' Grandstand and refurbish the Tattersalls facilities. Other parts of the project involve extending the Tattersalls Enclosure, constructing new turnstiles, providing a new betting hall, introducing a new glass-fronted restaurant overlooking the course and installing lifts to improve access to all areas. The three-phase project is set to be completed in June 2003.

...AND A SMALLER ONE FOR KEMPTON

Kempton Park has also been granted an interest-free loan of £50,000 towards the cost of refurbishing its Silver Ring Enclosure. The Silver Ring is responsible for 23 percent of racegoer admissions each year at Kempton and its facilities are extensively used for non-racing activities. The Levy Board's financial help will be used to redecorate the Silver Ring Stand, provide new seating, lighting and public address system. The improvements, which are set to cost £110,000 in total, are due to be completed before Christmas this year.

INTERNATIONAL CONFUSION AS FOREIGN QUARTET TARGET CUP

Before Irish hero Vintage Crop captured the 1993 Melbourne Cup, Bart Cummings declared the internationals wouldn't stand a chance in Australia's favourite race. In recent weeks Cummings, without a Cup runner for the first time in five years, has repeated his opinion that international runners should be strictly limited for the Melbourne Cup--four runners, representing regions, is plenty, the Cups King reckons.

But since Vintage Crop, the imports have hardly dominated the Cup, although since they come armed with impressive form dossiers, we're wary of them.

Cummings wants the spoils from the nation's richest race to remain here, and his point that the internationals compress the weights and thus deny the local up-and-comers a berth in the race is valid; 25 of the top 30 on the weights this year were internationals, although (discounting permanent resident Maridpour) only four will face the starter on Tuesday.

"Having all the internationals up there doesn't detract from our local stayers; it emphasizes the strength," responds VRC chief handicapper Jim Bowler. "The Cups allow the best horses from overseas to be matched with the best horses from Australia from a ratings point of view." However, Australia's highest weighted trio--Tie the Knot, Showella and Sky Heights, won't be taking part, leaving Freemason, with 53kg, shining like a beacon among the remaining antipodeans.

The dearth of Australian stayers at the top end of the weights has, at least, sparked debate about whether we're too preoccupied with the quick return of sprinters, neglecting the staying ranks with failed programming. Our staying ranks are indeed thin; there are some little known runners in the Cup.

After Vintage Crop made off with the Cup, Cummings and others protested the race would be dominated by overseas runners--but only three have managed to place in seven years since.

The Melbourne Cup hasn't been kind to foreigners: 1999 runner-up Central Park is retired, Caulfield Cup winner Taufan's Melody required a year to recover, as did 1998 Melbourne Cup placegetter Persian Punch. Arabian Story didn't race again, Double Trigger and Oscar Schindler struggled to regain form.

And last week, Enzeli (GB) (Kahyasi {Ire})'s trainer John Oxx pinpointed the key to Vintage Crop's success: with 55.5kg, he beat the handicapper.

"He got in light," Oxx said, pointing out that trainer Dermot Weld's carefully crafted plan meant when Cup weights were released Vintage Crop had a rating of 110, but arrived in Melbourne with a rating of 117. "Enzeli (57kg) has been weighted right up to his rating of 118," he said.

We haven't seen this year's foreign quartet tested on Australian tracks and regardless of their European form, that's the crucial thing. While the idea of global racing is all very well on paper, some horses cope with dual hemisphere travel better than others--whether our star mare Sunline can match it with the best on the other side of the equator will ultimately depend on how well she adapts to international travel. And Cummings of all people should know that, having lucked out in several attempts at the Japan Cup including when Saintly came down with travel sickness.

Nevertheless, even Godolphin's third stringer **Lightning Arrow (USA)** (Silver Hawk {USA}) commands respect, given that second stringer Central Park was runner-up last year.

Kayf Tara was considered far superior to the locals last year and **Far Cry (Ire)** (Pharly {Fr}) was only beaten a head by Kayf Tara in the Ascot Gold Cup. Now Far Cry's trainer Martin Pipe has declared his horse at the same level as when he met Kayf Tara and he's added blinkers to sharpen Far Cry for a torrid 3200m. "If we have one advantage it is that our horse can stay," he said. "If we can, we would like to make sure it's a staying test."

Far Cry has won nine of his 21 starts and has been successful at distances ranging from 2414m to 3621m; winning three times and placing twice at six attempts at or around 3200m.

Far Cry was a half-length second to Royal Rebel in the Goodwood Cup (3219m) at his last start on August 3. **Arctic Owl (GB)** (Most Welcome {GB}) has the Irish St. Leger to his credit, a race won by Vintage Crop before his Cup victory, but his work hasn't won over astute track watchers.

Enzeli is a classy horse and it won't be surprising if his part-owner Kerry Packer, a levathian punter, has a good whack on him on Tuesday. Connections remain coy. "Not sure," said Greg Hall after his second hit-out on the six-year-old. Oxx was hardly illuminating, "They (the owners) don't know too much about the horse and I don't know much about the Melbourne Cup," he said. "So we're all confused."

Hopefully, come Tuesday, we'll be less confused.
