SINGING IN THE REIGN Prairie Reign (Gone West), an unraced three-year-old in foal to Red Ransom, brought a final bid of \$385,000 to top yesterday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Out of Classic Reign (Vice Regent), a half sister to champion Sky Classic, the Canadian-bred mare was consigned by Anderson Farms as agent for Sam-Son Farms and was purchased by Nicoma Bloodstock Agency, agent. It was a strong day for Ashford's first-season sire King of Kings (Ire). The 1998 English 2000 Guineas winner was represented by three of the top five weanling colts to sell at yesterday's session. The top-priced weanling was hip number 1641, a son of King of Kings out of Heartful Star (Star de Naskra). The black colt is a half brother to 1995 Preakness runner-up Oliver's Twist (Horatius). Through five sessions of the 14-day sale, the average is up 20.5 percent from 1999 and the median is up 11.1 percent. The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

RIBOLETTA RETIRED Riboletta (Brz) (Roi Normand--Joy Valley (Brz), by Ghadeer (Fr)) was injured during her disappointing run in the Breeders' Cup Distaff and has been retired from racing, according to Thoroughbred Times. The five-year-old mare dominated her division this year, winning six straight graded events and seven overall. Among her triumphs were the GI Beldame, GI Santa Margarita Invitational, GI Vanity H., GI Ruffian H. and GI Milady Breeders' Cup H., but she ran a dull seventh in the Breeders' Cup last Saturday. "The day after the Distaff, she had a little bit of a filling [in her left front leg]," trainer Eduardo Inda told the Times. "We waited until we got her back to California for the x-rays and the scans. The x-ray showed no fractures, so we were relieved, but the scan showed the filling. We could give her six months off, turn her out, and try to bring her back. But she has meant too much to us." Inda also criticized the track condition at Churchill on Cup Day, saying the track was too hard. Owner Aaron Jones is considering breeding Riboletta to either Forestry or Saint Ballado next year. Riboletta retires with eight wins in 17 North American starts and earnings in the United States of \$1,467,086.

HONEST LADY RETIRED Multiple graded stakes winner Honest Lady (Seattle Slew--Toussaud, by El Gran Senor) has been retired from racing, according to The Blood-Horse. The four-year-old filly ended her career with a dramatic stretch run to come up just a half-length short of Kona Gold in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Sprint. "She retires 100-percent sound," said trainer Bobby Frankel, "There isn't a thing wrong with her. She proved she was a great filly, having to swing 10 wide [in the Sprint]. Another jump or two and she would have been champion sprinter." Honest Lady captured this year's GI Santa Monica H., Gll A Gleam H. and Gll Distaff Breeders' Cup H. She was second in the GI Metropolitan Mile. The Juddmonte Farms color bearer retires with six wins and five placings in 15 starts for earnings of \$894,168. She may be bred to Storm Cat.

COOLMORE FEES CLIMB Several Coolmore stallions have seen their fees for the upcoming breeding season climb as a result of Breeders' Cup performances. Star three-year-old Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), whose European campaign initially valued him at a fee of Ir90,000gns, will now start his stallion career at Ir100,000gns following his excellent second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs last Saturday. Ashford stallions Honour and Glory (Relaunch) and Thunder Gulch (Gulch) will have their fees rise for 2001 as well. Currently the leading freshman sire, Honour and Glory will go from \$30,000 to \$40,000 following the victory of his daughter Caressing in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Thunder Gulch, the leading secondcrop sire, had a banner day at Churchill, with his threeyear-old filly Spain winning the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and his two-year-old Point Given second a nose in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Originally scheduled to stand at \$25,000, his fee will rise to \$30,000. "The phenomenal success of both stallions [was shown] by both siring first-crop winners at the Breeders' Cup last Saturday," said Aisling Cross, Ashford's director of sales.

## AT THE SALES WITH... Bill Oppenheim



#### NO MARKET CONFUSION HERE

So it makes the stock market nervous, this uncertainty over who's the next President, because markets don't like uncertainty. No such problem in the Thoroughbred horse market at the moment. Sell a credible mare in foal to a top 10 stallion, or a really nice foal by a first-crop sire, and you'll get all the money. Even with the terrific numbers being offered at auction, as always what's perceived as the good stuff is very competitive, and very expensive. Any chinks in the armor, then you need a bit of luck.

I've been impressed with the performance of a number of first-crop weanling sires in the sale's first four days. Ashford's Grand Slam and Tale of the Cat had good days Monday, but on Tuesday their 1998 English 2000 winner King of Kings blew by them both. Three colts from his first crop went through for \$525,000, \$425,000 and \$260,000, making him narrowly leading first-crop weanling sire for the first four days (including Fasig), as six foals by him (from nine offered) averaged \$234,167. Adena Springs stallions filled the next three places, considering only stallions with 2+ sold. Awesome Again, the 1998 BC Classic winner, had colts bring \$500,000 and \$310,000 on the way to an average of \$221,667 for his six sold (of eight offered). Met Mile winner Wild Rush had a \$230,000 colt on Monday, so averaged \$190,000, but with just two sold, from five offered, while Belmont winner Touch Gold had three colts and one filly bring \$200,000 +, and his eight weanlings sold (of 10 offered) on the first four days averaged \$177,750.

In all, by my count, eight different first-crop stallions sired 17 weanlings which sold for \$200,000+ on the first four days. Five of those stallions had two or more \$200,000+ foals--Ashford's King of Kings (3), Grand Slam (3), and Tale of the Cat (2), and Adena Springs' Awesome Again (2) and Touch Gold (4). That looks a pretty impressive commercial performance even in a generally strong market.

For the sale generally, I mentioned the other day that there were essentially 100 fewer horses catalogued on the first four days this year than last year. But there have been over 200 less sold (861 vs. 1070), a drop of almost exactly 20 percent-that means a higher percentage of not-solds (and outs), which translates into a greed factor on the part of consignors and/or greater market selectivity on the part of buyers. The average of those sold was up 23 percent for Keeneland's first four days, but because of the drop in the number sold (and the fact that the Sunday dispersals were \$12 million lower), the four-day gross at Keeneland was actually down a little over \$7 million, or three percent.

But, again, it is very important to keep in mind this point about the difference in the overall catalogue from year to year. Here's a feature of this year's first four days (here including Fasig Sunday, but not the Stronach sale Wednesday night). Up to that point 918 horses (not including the Grayson seasons) had sold for a total of \$236,055,100. Of that total, there were 29 mares (of 30 offered, a sale-high 97 percent clearance rate) sold in foal to either Storm Cat, Danzig, or A.P. Indy. Those 29 mares constitute three percent of the horses sold. And those 29 mares grossed an aggregate of \$48,970,000--21 percent of the money spent. So there's the statistical bubble: three percent of the horses generated 21 percent of the money--and what they had in common was being in foal to North America's top three commercial stallions of 2000. So it's good business if you can afford to be in that bracket. As always, capital breeds capital. But, in this case, it only accounts for three percent of what goes though the ring. For the other 32 of 33 horses sold, different rules apply. In that world, three out of four horses get sold in the ring instead of 29 out of 30, and a lot of horses still make people money, but a lot don't. There are a lot of factors to consider and analyze, but the overwhelming conclusion must be that the rarefied atmosphere up there in Top Three Sire Land doesn't extend so very far downwards.

Lovelorn gave Jack and Bob Ingham's Crown Lodge back-to-back Crown Oaks wins and trainer John Hawkes, who established his name in 1972 with Oaks winner Toltrice (Aus) before capturing the race again last year with Tributes (Aus), his third Oaks. With only moderate form this spring including a sixth to Oaks favourite Lolita Star last time out, Lovelorn was considered wanting as a substitute for Inghams' ill-fated filly Unwordly (Aus) who broke down in early October. But the sprightly chestnut enjoyed a cosy run behind fast-paced leaders, sitting in fourth one off the fence until jockey Brett Prebble urged her to the lead at the 300m where she fought tenaciously against Lan Kwai Fong, who held her ground along the fence with a neck separating the pair on the line. "It was a bit unexpected, but it's terrific," said Jack Ingham. "She fought like a tiger. We said to Brett to lead, but they went so fast out of the gates he settled her back and she had a soft run." Prebble said of the winning trainer, "John Hawkes is a super trainer. For these sorts of races he has them ready and if they are good enough they will win. I rode Lovelorn on Saturday and she didn't feel the best, but he's got her back to fighting form on the right day." Hawkes was represented by his son Wayne, who serves as Melbourne foreman in the four-state training operation. "Lovelorn hasn't had the best preparation with a few little things going wrong, but she is a Grand Lodge and they are one hell of a tough breed," said Hawkes Jr.

For example, there were 20 stallions listed on page five of yesterday's edition with weanling averages of \$160,000 + and two or more sold. Of those 20, only seven were stallions whose oldest foals are now four-year-olds and under. Four of those seven were first-crop weanling sires. Only one stallion--Pulpit--with first yearlings 2000 made the list. Only one--Unbridled's Song--with first two-year-olds. Only one--Cherokee Run--with first three-year-olds. None with first four-yearolds. Of the 13 proven sires, Kingmambo alone represented F95 sires (five-year-olds), and A.P. Indy and Saint Ballado are F94's (first six-year-olds). The other 10 are all 'older' (F93 and earlier) proven sires. Here is one more instance of where the pressure on younger, unproven stallions' fees is coming from.

#### CBS TO BROADCAST CHAMPIONS SERIES The

National Thoroughbred Racing Association and CBS Sports have reached an agreement to broadcast a new series of races featuring older horses and turf stars. The five-hour series will be broadcast over a seven-week period from June through July. The NTRA Champions series on CBS Sports will begin on June 10 with the GII Brooklyn H. and the GI Charles Whittingham H. from Hollywood Park. The series continues June 16 and July 1 and is expected to conclude July 28 with the GI Whitney H. from Saratoga, pending approval of the New York Racing Association. In addition to the \$2.5 million in purse money, the series will be linked by a bonus offering an estimated \$500,000 in supplements.

## IN MY OPINION...

#### SUPPORTING PURSES

Without the benefit of actually seeing it, many horsemen from around the country have begun to believe some of the clap-trap they hear about TVG--not enough races, insulting the core player, etc. Once they actually get to see the product, the typical "TVG stranger" in our business will usually point out what a great face the young network puts on our game--how it is far superior to the mundane exacta grids or multiple split screens offered up in other areas lucky enough to have some form of daily horse racing coverage on television.

But arguing about the differences in production between TVG and other account wagering providers is a trap. It's a red herring designed to throw horsemen off the real trail. As in many cases, for the real story, you need to "follow the money."

When TVG was born, it represented a megamillion-dollar investment in racing by its parent company, TV Guide, Inc. You don't have to know very much about our business to know that such bullish actions from major corporate players don't come around very often, and must be nurtured and given every chance to succeed when they do materialize. It also carried the prospect of a national distribution channel for horse racing. While this broad distribution has obviously not been realized yet, it remains a goal for which our industry should keep striving.

What truly made TVG a potential boon to our industry, however, was the unprecedented way in which it treated horsemen. This was no bettor-poaching operation that would rob Peter to pay Paul, filling its own pockets along the way with no benefit to the racing industry. With other quasi-national interactive wagering operations out there, we're talking about a zero-sum game in which each additional customer comes at the direct and irrevocable expense of someone else.

But instead of simply stealing customers from other markets, TVG rewards the home markets of its customers through source-market fees. So if a wagerer in Bethesda, Md., for example, places a bet through TVG on a race at Keeneland, a hefty percentage of TVG's cut as the bet-handler reverts back to the Maryland Jockey Club (i.e. Laurel/Pimlico) since that is the live racing facility operating in the area where the bettor resides.

What does the Maryland Jockey Club do with this money? It does many different things--including boost its purse account. The source-market fee example cannot be emphasized enough because its competitors use that very same money not to boost Pimlico's purses, but merely to line its own coffers.

This is why TVG's source-market fee policy is a breath of fresh air to horsemen. It's sad that until TVG came along, no other organization thought to rightly compensate local horsemen and local purse accounts as a higher and higher percentage of betting handle was migrating off-track. What has happened is that, as national handle figures have continued to rise, purse levels have not grown at a corresponding rate. This is especially true at smaller tracks, many of which operate in relatively remote areas and have a higher than normal reliance on imported simulcast handle.

I suppose it's not hard to see why certain account wagering providers have bashed the NTRA for its support of TVG. The whole concept of source-market fees makes a provider face up to being fair, and a lot of outfits don't want to do that. After all, that would only cut into profit margins.

There are those who say the NTRA should either affiliate itself with no account wagering providers or affiliate itself with all of them. If other account wagering providers paid the same source market fees as TVG, I would support the NTRA working with those entities, too.

This week the NTRA and TVG announced a payment of \$1.5 million in source market fees to Kentucky racing interests. Half that money goes to purses. Now just think for a moment what the impact on purses would be as TVG grows its market access around the country and if all account wagering providers paid similar source-market fees.

The NTRA has taken a lot of grief from some of its racetrack members over its decision to partner with the TVG. So while many continue to be impressed by TVG's "great face," I submit that its distinguishing beauty, at least to horsemen, is much more than skin deep.

• Increase national television exposure for high-quality horseracing, including more than 150 hours on ESPN, ESPN2

• Launch a new summer racing series on CBS with bonus programs for the Classic and Turf divisions;

• Continue the "NTRA Two-Year Old Challenge" from September through the Breeders' Cup, with expanded sponsorship, bonuses and TV coverage;

• Update the current, successful co-op advertising campaign and add an ESPN tune-in campaign to boost the image

and TV viewership of horseracing;

 Use funding from voluntary sales contributions to continue to increase our resources in Washington, D.C., including formation in 2001 of a Horseracing and Breeding Congressional Caucus in cooperation with the American Horse Council (\$600,000 budget in 2000, \$800,000 in 2001);

• Use funding and resources from Keeneland and others to launch an unprecedented, research-based, owner recruitment and retention program, TheGreatestGame.com;

- Continue the work of the Racing Integrity and Drug Testing Task Force, including release of the first "supertest" results; • Continue efforts, in cooperation with other industry organizations, to improve the industry's use of technology; and
- Expand other benefits of NTRA membership, from group purchasing opportunities to greater access to on-line marketing programs.

In short, we will continue to pursue programs and policies that increase the popularity of our sport and the economic health of our industry. We welcome the participation and investment of any industry stakeholders that share our commitments to live racing, a strong national organization for our game and to the goals of the NTRA.

#### PROSPECTS BRIGHT AFTER BUDGET

After the dust has settled on yesterday's Budget speech, racing is feeling upbeat about the prospect of a cut in betting duty. Chancellor of the Exchequer Gordon Brown announced that the time was right for a change in the way betting on horse racing is taxed. It is hoped that next year's budget could see betting duty replaced by a gross profit tax on bookmakers, a move which will finally combat the competition of "tax free" betting overseas. Yesterday Tristam Ricketts, secretary-general of the British Horseracing Board, said, "The Chancellor's statement represents the positive signal of change for which the racing and betting industries were looking. We welcome the government's explicit acknowledgement that there is scope for modernizing the way in which betting is taxed in the UK, which we have consistently said is vital if the growing threat of offshore betting activity is to be effectively addressed and revenues are to be protected. We look forward to participating in the further discussions which are now in prospect, with a view to ensuring that racing's interests, as well as those of other parties, are fully taken into account when the Chancellor makes a further announcement in his March 2001 Budget."

### **COCHRANE HINTS AT CHANGE OF DIRECTION**

After returning to the saddle following a horrific plane crash in June, Cochrane gave up his riding career last week due to neck and back injuries, but has plunged straight into the new role with enthusiasm. "It should be a good job and I am really looking forward to it," he said. "He has had a quiet year because of his injuries, but I will be doing the best I can for him next season and I will certainly be thinking in terms of the championship for him! The thing is, if you set off with a championship at the back of your mind then you will work very hard at it. You have to set yourself a goal, though at the end of the day it is the one who has the clearest passage who gets there." Dettori commented, "Ray and I go back a long way. He taught me a lot when I was a youngster at (trainer) Luca Cumani's. We went through hell and back together with the plane crash."

#### **MELBOURNE CUP BROUHAHA**

"We'll have to find a better horse next year," declared ever-ebullient jockey Frankie Dettori after the Godolphin horse Lightning Arrow (USA) (Silver Hawk {USA}) finished 17th in Tuesday's Melbourne Cup. Trainer Bart Cummings, an advocate of restricting international participation in the race, pointed out only one of the four foreigners finished in the first 14 home. "It was a typical handicap staying race, won by the horse with the lightest weight," he surmised. Arctic Owl (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}) struck interference twice and had to change course in the straight before filling fifth place to take home \$A85,000 for his efforts, and Victoria Racing Club plans to seek more like him for next year. VRC Racing Manager Greg Nichols countered criticism that Australia's favourite race should be kept for the locals. "The single-mindedness of those people that want to keep the Melbourne Cup as a purely Australian event are depreciating the value of the race from an international level and the recognition it deserves as one of the world's greatest races," he said. Nichols acknowledged that Cup winner Brew (NZ) (Sir Tristam {Ire}) had a weight advantage, but said he'd like a Cup winner to campaign overseas to "enhance our reputation and vindicate our assessment--that our racing is first class and that is what international competition is all about." Nichols revealed he'd had talks with Arctic Owl's part-owner David Morgan about finding a commercial sponsor to underwrite an Australian horse to campaign in the European summer. Far Cry's (Ire) (Pharly {Ire}) trainer Martin Pipe told the Australian newspaper after the horse beat only one home, "He's definitely better than that; I'll have to come back to prove it. It was a very competitive race." Far Cry came out of the race with a swollen off-side fetlock, while Arctic Owl is worse for wear and Enzeli (GB) (Kahyasi {Ire}) did not handle the firm track.

#### MCALPINE CAUGHT MAKING ILLEGAL BETS

Bookmaker's clerk Warwick McAlpine was disqualified for 12 months and fined A\$10,000 by Thoroughbred Racing Board (TRB) stewards on Wednesday after pleading guilty to accepting illegal bets on a racetrack. He is the son of, and a registered clerk for, leading Sydney doubles bookmaker Don McAlpine. McAlpine, a clerk for 18 years, was witnessed taking a string of bets via a mobile telephone at the Canterbury night meeting on Oct. 26. Following a tip-off, believed to be from another bookmaker, Warwick McAlpine's activities were watched for several hours before stewards swooped.

McAlpine was charged with carrying on the business of a bookmaker while not licensed between the period of July 29 to Oct. 26.

#### ANABAA HAS DREAM AUSTRALIAN START

First season sire Anabaa (USA) (Danzig {USA}--Balbonella {Fr}, by Gay Mecene {USA}) has started his career in dream fashion with a total of four stakes winners and 12 individual winners, making him the leading French first season sire to date. Leading the Kentucky-bred's progeny is King Of Prussia (USA), winner of the Listed A\$60,000 Drumstick Gold S. by 3 3/4 lengths at Flemington on Melbourne Cup day. Following in his footsteps is Anabaa's first Australianbred runner Donna Natalia (Aus). The filly, an A\$160,000 Inglis weanling sale-topper, won the Gimcrack S. by six lengths at Randwick in early October and in the process broke a 21-year race record of :58.30 when she clocked :58.13. The eight-year-old stallion's success has been tempered by an injury which knocked him out of the 2000 southern hemisphere breeding season. "It's a shame we have had to advise breeders to wait another year for Anabaa, but he had a minor injury and we weren't prepared to take any risks with him," said Widden Stud Marketing Manager Antony Thompson. "But we couldn't have hoped for a better beginning for Anabaa."
