TALE OF THE CAT TOPS KEENELAND FRIDAY

Point Given (Thunder Gulch) caused quite a stir when he came flying down the stretch at Churchill Downs to miss winning the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile by a nose, and just six days later his baby sister created some excitement of her own. The filly, a weanling from the first crop of Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), brought a final bid of \$975,000 to top Friday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington. Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent for Ironwood Farm, the chestnut was purchased by John C. Oxley. Her brother, who has never been worse than second in five career starts, captured the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. and was the runner-up in the GI Champagne before his Breeders' Cup bid. The son of another young sire, G1 English 2000 Guineas hero King of Kings (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), topped the weanling colts, going for a bid of \$210,000 to the McKathan Brothers, as agent. Consigned by Highclere Sales, Agent III, the chestnut is from the family of European and American champion Hatoof, winner of the G1 English 1000 Guineas, GI Beverly D. S. and G2 Prix de l'Opera. King of Kings' first crop hits the racetrack next year. A 16-yearold mare in foal to Forestry (Storm Cat), whose first crop hits the ground in 2001, brought the highest bid for a broodmare yesterday. Mother Fletcher (Fappiano), from the Viking Stud, Inc. consignment, was purchased for \$250,000 by Charles S. Giles, M.D. The mare is the dam of MSW Squirm (Two Davids), as well as graded stakes-placed Hoyle (Dehere) and stakes-placed Sasha Sasha Sasha (Two Davids) and Mistress Fletcher (Sovereign Don). The November Sale continues through Saturday, Nov. 18. Bidding begins at 10 a.m. daily.

JOHN'S CALL TO JAPAN CUP MGISW John's Call (Lord at War {Arg}), a narrowly beaten third in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, will make his last start of the season in the G1 Japan Cup in Tokyo Nov. 26. Explaining the decision to send the nine-year-old overseas, owner Douglas Joyce said, "We waited for him to tell us what to do. To the best of our assessment, he appears to be in fine shape--he came out of the Breeders' Cup just fine. We have no reason to believe he won't be able to go forward. He's nine, and I don't know how many more chances we will get at something like this. We decided to give it a shot."

WAR CHANT TO HOLLYWOOD DERBY? GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner War Chant (Danzig) could make his next start in the 1 1/8-mile GI Early Times Hollywood Derby Nov. 26, trainer Neil Drysdale confirmed yesterday. "[Owner Irving Cowan] has not made a decision yet, but War Chant came out of the race good and has galloped well," Drysdale said. He added, "The Eclipse is to be considered in the decision." Already a contender in the male turf horse division, the three-year-old could stake his claim to the champion-ship with a win in the race, which would make him a perfect three-for-three on the grass.

ENCEPHALITIS UPDATE Dr. Keith Watkins, the senior veterinary surgeon of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, responded to news reports which suggested that, in addition to Group Fortune (Aus) (Barathea {Ire}), as many as three horses may have had to be put down after showing signs of Japanese encephalitis by saying, "No horse on or off the racecourse in Hong Kong has shown any clinical signs remotely suggestive of any equine encephalo-myelitis and none have died or been euthanased due to the disease, either before or since the Group Fortune case." Remarked Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, the Club's executive director of racing, "We are optimistic that the Group Fortune case will be an isolated one. It will be business as usual for the Hong Kong International races in December." The Hong Kong Government Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department also has stated that it believes there was just the one case of the disease, and added that foreign horses traveling to Hong Kong for the International races Dec. 17 will be housed only with horses of equivalent health status in germ-free quarantine stables.

Mouramara, third in her only start as a juvenile and again in her sophomore debut, has since put together a three-race winning streak. She completed the hat trick with a 1 1/2-length victory in the Sept. 30 G2 Prix de Royallieu at Longchamp, with Playact third. A perfect two-for-two at this distance, she gets Lasix for her U.S. debut. Playact, never worse than third in three tries at 1 1/2 miles, ended her European tour with a fourth in the Oct. 24 G3 Prix de Flore at Saint-Cloud and also gets Lasix for her American bow. Innuendo, twice a Listed winner in Britain and Group 2-placed in France, captured a Belmont allowance in June, ran fourth behind Perfect Sting in the GII New York H. July 15, then took three months off and returned to finish third, beaten only a head, in the GI E.P. Taylor S. Oct. 15.

CROWD PLEASER TO NORTHVIEW Augustin Stable's Crowd Pleaser (A.P. Indy--Creaking Board {GB}, by Night Shift) will enter stud at Northview Stallion Station in Maryland in 2001 for a fee of \$3,500. Winner of the GIII Saranac H. at three, the dark bay captured the Sycamore S. at Keeneland Oct. 22 in his last start, his ninth victory in 24 career starts for \$605,150 in earnings. "Whenever Northview can offer their breeders a graded-stakes winning son of A.P. Indy who has won \$605,000 out of a Grade I-winning mare who won stakes on both turf and dirt, we feel very fortunate," said Northview President Richard Golden. "He is a grand looking horse and we can't wait for our breeders to see him." Out of the GI Hollywood Starlet winner Creaking Board, Crowd Pleaser is entered in today's GIII Laurel Turf Cup. The five-year-old will be available for inspection at Northview later this month.

ADCAT TO FARNSWORTH GSW Adcat (Storm Cat --Adorable Micol, by Riverman) will stand stud at Mike Sherman's Farnsworth Farms in Ocala, Florida in 2001. Out of a U.S. graded-stakes and French-stakes winning mare, the New York-bred won the GIII New Hampshire Sweepstakes H. in '99 and recently scored in the Oct. 21 Mohawk H. at Belmont. The five-year-old has five wins, four seconds and three thirds from 26 starts and earnings of \$438,607 to date. He has been entered for today's GIII Laurel Turf Cup S. "He's the only gradedstakes winning son of Storm Cat standing in Florida," Sherman said of the Mark Hennig trainee. "He will stand the property of a partnership with an introductory fee of \$5,000, due when the foal stands and nurses."

STORM CAT SEASON TOPS STALLION ACCESS

SALE A season to Overbrook Farm's premier sire Storm Cat (Storm Bird) attracted a bid of \$500,000 to top Fasig-Tipton's Stallion Access Inc. Fall Sale of Selected Seasons and Shares, held yesterday in Lexington. The 17-year-old stallion topped last year's auction as well, with two seasons bringing \$430,000 and \$415,000. A season to Claiborne Farm's Danzig (Northern Dancer), sire of GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner War Chant, brought a bid of \$240,000, second-highest price last night. A nomination to Danzig sold for \$290,000 last year. One share in Northview Stallion Station's Two Punch (Mr. Prospector) was purchased for \$44,000, top price of the five shares sold. Overall, 32 no guarantee nominations sold for \$1,796,400, an average of \$56,138. The five shares brought \$99,600 for an average of \$19,920.

HANDLE RECORD FOR BREEDERS' CUP Total wagering on the 10-race Breeders' Cup program from Churchill Downs was an all-time North American singleday record of \$108,598,136. That figure marked an 8percent increase from last year's previous high of \$100,336,230. The handle on the eight Breeders' Cup races broke the \$100-million barrier for the first time, with \$101,283,427 wagered on the championship events, a 5-percent jump from 1999. The simulcast handle on the octet of Breeders' Cup races was also a new record at \$95,018,338, up 10.1 percent from last year. The state of California led all simulcast locations, with more than \$13.5 million bet on the Breeders' Cup races and the Ultra Pick 6. New York was next with a handle of more than \$12.6 million. International handle was a record \$6,705,778. Canada led the way with better than \$4.2 million wagered, followed by France, which topped \$1.5 million. The Ultra Pick 6 pool reached \$5,123,453; 68 winning tickets paid \$45,772 each. On-track, a crowd of 76,043 wagered \$14,363,349 on the Breeders' Cup card, fourth-highest handle ever on the event.

SAFFRON HEADS EAST Classic winner Saffron Walden (Fr) (Sadler's Wells {USA}--Or Vision {USA}, by Irish River (Fr)) has been sold to Japanese interests as a stallion prospect, the Thoroughbred Times reported. Europe's most expensive yearling of 1996 at Ir2,100,000gns, the bay colt captured the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas last season in the colours of Mrs John Magnier. In his only start at four, he finished third in the G3 The Minstrel S. at The Curragh in July. "I can't disclose the price, but, being a classic winner by Sadler's Wells and a half brother to Dolphin Street, Saffron Walden had obvious value," Bert Kerr of Kerr & Co Agency told the Thoroughbred Times. "He was flown out to Japan earlier this week and will be under the management of the J S Co. in Hokkaido." Out of the stakes-winning mare Or Vision, Saffron Walden is a half brother to highweight sprinter Dolphin Street (Fr) (Bluebird {USA}) and a full brother to GISW Insight (Fr).

★ BRITAIN ★

MEDIA RIGHTS DECISION CLOSE

The battle between Go Racing and Carlton for media rights to British racing will be decided in the next few days, as both parties near the deadline for their proposals to the Racecourse Association. The bids, of £400 million each, put to the RCA yesterday evening in the case of Carlton, and Monday for Go Racing, will have to be considered thoroughly. Yesterday, Stephen Atkin, chief executive of the RCA, issued caution: "It depends on both bidders whether they stay in the race, but it would be very disappointing if one or both did withdraw their offers. It's a risk we have to take. There is a deadline with Carlton's offer of exclusivity, but it is not a contract offer. We have advised our members that both offers are very serious proposals, but it's not in our interests to get involved in a period of exclusivity with either party while there are certain issues outstanding. These issues can be resolved. We are in negotiations with both parties to get some detail on contract. There are two sets of negotiations currently running in parallel. We need contract offers before we can decide which one is the most suitable for our members. The end is in sight, but how close, I've no idea. There is a forum at Haydock and we will make use of the opportunity to bring our members up to speed on the negotiations." That is due for Nov. 21, involving representatives of all 59 racecourses.

BBC AND GO RACING AGREE TERMS

In a deal that will go forward if they are awarded media rights to British racing, Go Racing, the consortium of Arena Leisure, BSkvB and Channel 4, vesterday agreed terms to bring Channel 4 and the BBC together to offer integrated coverage of racing in the UK. As part of the agreement, the BBC will continue to broadcast its existing racing, while Channel 4 is planning to launch a new daily lunchtime racing programme. Go Racing promises 4,000 hours of live coverage each year, which would make racing the most televised sport in the UK. David Scott of Go Racing said: "With the BBC formally on board, Go Racing offers a much higher level of continued terrestrial coverage for racing than any other bidder. Allied to our technical ability to deliver the promised new services quickly and the pedigree of the partners involved, we believe this proposal represents the best solution for the future health and prosperity of racing." And Peter Salmon, BBC director of sport, added: "BBC Sport will continue to bring the nation the peak events of British racing under this arrangement. Our commitment to racing remains as high as ever and eventually the racing fan should see a more coherent coverage of their sport." The BBC has also agreed terms with Go Racing's competitor, Carlton, which will ensure continuation of coverage, whichever deal is accepted by the RCA. Mike Hales of BBC Sport said: "Under the Carlton deal, the Derby and Oaks will be back with the BBC and with Go Racing we will be looking at a further division of rights."

SEVEN POUND PLUM

Sir Mark Prescott's Perfect Plum (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) heads the 10 entries for Tuesday's G3 Prix Saint-Roman at Saint-Cloud. The winner of the G3 Prix des Reservoirs at Deauville Oct. 16 is set to be ridden by George Duffield, but she will have to overcome a seven-pound penalty for that success. She will have to concede that weight to Maurice Zilber's Prove (GB) (Danehill {USA}), unplaced when jumped in class last time in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp Oct. 1, and Jonathan Pease's Calista (GB) (Caerleon {USA}), impressive winner of a conditions event at Longchamp last time. Chris Wall will send Listed EBF Montrose S. (Newmarket Oct. 28) winner La Vita e Bella (Ire) (Definite Article (Ire)) across, while Jeremy Noseda's Blushing Bride (GB) (Distant Relative {Ire}), and Michael Bell's Heavenly Whisper (Ire) (Halling {USA}) are also set to oppose.

The German filly Catella (Ger) (Generous {Ire}), third in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf, may now secure an invitation for the G1 Hong Kong International Vase. "I know Peter [trainer Schiergen] is very keen to send Catella to Hong Kong for the Vase if she comes back from America all right," said Gisela Schiergen. "She has been a game filly all season and will enjoy the good fast ground in Hong Kong. She loved the going at Churchill Downs."
