GIANT NAMED CARTIER HORSE OF THE YEAR

Europe's 10th annual Cartier Racing Awards Ceremony was held yesterday evening at the Four Seasons Hotel in London. The Horse of the Year Award went to the Aidan O'Brien-trained **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat). The first horse since Mill Reef in 1971 to triumph in five consecutive Group 1 races, the "Iron Horse" ended his career with a typically courageous effort, finishing narrowly second in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Cartier's Racing Consultant, Harry Herbert, commenting on the high quality of European horses in 2000, said, "This really has been an extraordinary year and the voting has been extremely tight with only a few points separating the contenders. To have the likes of Giant's Causeway, **Sinndar (Ire)** (Grand Lodge), **Dubai Millennium (GB)** (Seeking the Gold), **Kalanisi (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}) and **Montjeu (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in the same season is quite remarkable." There was some consolation for Arc winner Sinndar, who was named the Cartier three-year-old colt of the year, while Breeders' Cup Turf winner Kalanisi scooped the award for best older horse. The Queen was the recipient of Cartier's Millennium Award, in recognition of both her success as an owner and breeder and her patronage of horse racing. Her Majesty received the award Nov. 6 at Buckingham Palace from Arnaud Bamberger, Managing Director of Cartier. Bamberger said, "The 20 members of the Jury voted to a person that Her Majesty's success and patronage should be recognized in this way and it was the greatest honor for me to present her with this unique award." *The Daily Telegraph* Award of Merit was given to His Highness The Aga Khan, owner of dual Derby hero Sinndar and Kalanisi. This year has been one of the most successful ever for His Highness, who ended the 2000 Flat season as the champion owner. Presenting the award, Jeremy Deedes, Managing Director of the *Daily Telegraph*, said, "I am delighted to present this Award to His Highness The Aga Khan not only for his wonderful success as an owner this year, but also in recognition of his family's remarkable influence on the modern Thoroughbred." The Cartier Awards, run in conjunction with the *Daily Telegraph*, aim to recognize excellence in the racehorse. Winners are decided through points earned in pattern races, votes of journalists from the *Telegraph*, *Racing Post* and *The Times* and also by votes from readers of the *Telegraph*.

KEENELAND MARCHES ON

The 14-day Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale continued yesterday in Lexington, Kentucky, with top price of \$67,000 paid for hip number 3971. The chestnut weanling, from the first crop of group and graded stakes winner Bon Point (GB) and out of the unraced Groom's Swing (Runaway Groom), was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent. James B. Keogh made the winning bid. The top-priced mare of the session was hip number 3955, **Forever Fine** (Sunshine Forever). The six-year-old mare, in foal to Announce, was purchased by Newmarket International for \$55,000. She was consigned by Bluewater Sales LLC, Agent II. Through 11 sessions, the average price is up 9.4 percent from 1999 and the median is down 7.5 percent. The sale continues today at 10 a.m. *Keeneland stats p. 2*

SUCCESSFUL APPEAL TO WALMAC SOUTH

Successful Appeal (Valid Appeal--Successful Dancer, by Fortunate Prospect) has been retired to Walmac-South in southern Florida. The four-year-old captured the 2000 GII A. G. Vanderbilt H., the 1999 GII Withers S., GII Kentucky Cup Sprint H. and GIII Amsterdam S. and the 1998 GII Cowdin S. "Successful Appeal is the type of horse that has historically done well in the Florida market," commented Dean DeRenzo of Walmac South and Hartley-DeRenzo Stallions. "He showed his ability by running seven consecutive races in which he earned a triple digit Beyer number and is the leading money winning son of one of the most successful stallions to stand in Florida. With his race record, one would expect him to sire early-maturing offspring." Successful Appeal's introductory fee will be \$5,000 live foal, payable when the foal stands and nurses. He retires with eight wins and six placings in 22 starts for earnings of \$654,681.

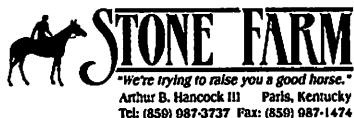

Florida-bred Stakes Program at Gulfstream:

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association, the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and Gulfstream Park have reached an agreement to implement a program of Florida-bred stakes at the upcoming Gulfstream Park meet. Under the agreement, the FTBOA will provide Gulfstream with \$50,000 to be used as an additional supplement for each of their 12 \$100,000-added stakes races. Only Florida-bred foals registered with the FTBOA will be eligible for the bonus. In addition, the FTBOA will provide funds for two \$100,000-added Florida-bred restricted stakes races to be run on Florida Derby Day. "We are delighted that we were able to come to terms on what has proven to be a very successful and important program to Florida racing," commented Richard Hancock, FTBOA executive vice president. "We look forward to the continued success of the program and will continue to work on innovative ideas, such as a Florida Cup Day, to keep Florida racing vital."

Premier Harris to Receive Sovereign Honour:

The Premier of Ontario, the Honourable Michael D. Harris, will be presented with the E.P. Taylor Award of Merit, in recognition of his government's policies which have assured the continuing success of the horse racing industry in Ontario. Premier Harris will receive the award at the 26th annual Sovereign Awards Dinner on Dec. 15 at the Four Seasons Hotel in Toronto.

Yonaguska to Prevue:

Yonaguska (Cherokee Run), 12th in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will be supplemented to Sunday's GIII Hollywood Prevue S. "We're going to go ahead and run him at his best distance, seven-eighths of a mile," said Randy Bradshaw, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He's a Grade I winner at the distance and he bounced out of the Breeders' Cup very well."

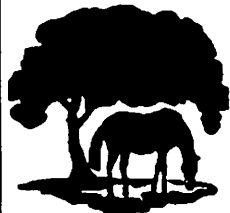

The son of Towser Gosden took to the United States for his baptism in racing in 1979, where he trained in California until 1988, enjoying G1 Breeders' Cup Mile success with Royal Heroine in 1984. In 1988 he arrived in Newmarket, where he occupied Stanley House Stables and trained four Classic winners, including **Benny the Dip (USA)** (Silver Hawk {USA}), who won the 1997 G1 Epsom Derby. From Newmarket he moved to Manton, where in his first season in 2000 he produced **Lahan (GB)** (Unfuwain {USA}) to win the G1 1000 Guineas S. in May at Newmarket, and **Observatory (USA)** (Distant View {USA}) to famously defeat Giant's Causeway in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in September.

"All our horses will be staying where they are--we haven't wintered two-year-olds in Dubai for about three years now," racing manager Angus Gold told *Racing Post*. "It's the yearlings that go there." Nayef, a half brother to Nashwan (USA) (Blushing Groom {Fr}) and Unfuwain (USA) (Northern Dancer {Can}), closed out his unbeaten juvenile campaign with a six-length success in the Listed Autumn S. at Ascot Oct. 7.

INCREASE TO BREEDERS' PRIZES ANNOUNCED

The Horserace Betting Levy Board announced yesterday that Breeders' prizes will be worth £1.68 million in 2001, a 3.5 percent increase on this year. Of the total, 48 percent will go to flat breeders, which is a drop of three percent from last year, with prizes continuing to be paid at the rate of 10 percent of race minimum prize money, with a maximum award of £3,500 per race. The prizes will go to British-bred winners of races from class A to D for two-year-olds and upwards. The description of British-bred will be tightened, as the two-year-olds of 2002 will have to be both the produce of a British-bred mare and by a British-bred stallion to be eligible for the prizes. Rodney Brack, the Levy Board Chief Executive, said today: "This year, in recognition of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association's contribution to the administration of breeders' prizes, a fee was charged to winning breeders who were not members of that organisation. This has had a positive effect, enabling the association to represent a greater range of breeders. Monitoring of the progeny of British-based stallions born in 2000, to calculate the effect on the take-up of breeders' prizes for two-year-olds from 2002, will be instituted."

DARLEY HEADING TO SINGAPORE

Kevin Darley, champion Flat jockey of 2000, will lead a group of British riders scheduled to compete in Singapore in early 2001, *Racing Post* reported. He has a riding license in Singapore for Jan. 1 to Mar. 4, and will be based at Kranji Racecourse. The other British-based riders include Eddie Ahern, Gary Carter, Michael Fenton, Jimmy Fortune and Darryll Holland.

ECLIPSE RETURNS TO STUD

Double Eclipse (Ire) (Ela-Man-Mou {Ire}--Solac {Fr}, by Gay Lussac {Ity}) will resume his career at stud after incurring a suspensory injury, *Racing Post* reported. After standing two seasons at Emral Stud in Wales, the eight-year-old bay returned to training this season and made one start for Mark Johnston, finishing second in the Listed Fred Archer S. at Newmarket July 1. A full brother to top stayer Double Trigger (Ire), Double Eclipse will stand at East Burrow Farm in Devon for a fee of 1,500, Oct. 1 terms.
