GOFFS NOVEMBER SALE STARTS TODAY

Goffs, which has enjoyed a highly successful year, looks to add to its achievements for 2000 as the sixday November Sale gets underway in Co. Kildare, Ireland. The sale offers four sessions of foals from Tuesday to Friday, and two sessions of broodmares and fillies on Saturday and Sunday. Among the gems of the near 1,400 lots is lot 659, a filly foal by Eagle Eyed from Moygaddy Stud. She is out of the very good broodmare Flute (Fr), and is a half to stakes winners Any Song and Mick's Love (Ire). J.K. Thoroughbreds sends in lot 742, by Bahhare out of Dublah, the dam of five winners to date, including Listed winner and groupplaced Perugino Bay (Ire). Pat O'Kelly's Kilcarn Stud sends in lot 816, a weanling colt by Desert Prince (Ire), who is a half brother to G1 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) winner Poliuto (Ire), from the family of Spectrum (Ire), Petrushka (Ire) and Millenary (GB). Oak Lodge Stud is represented by lot 825, a filly by Pursuit Of Love (GB). The weanling is a three-parts sister to G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner Catchascatchcan (GB), who was purchased for \$4.7 million at the recent Keeneland November Sale. There are also lots by such top stallions as Alzao, Barathea (Ire), Danehill, Grand Lodge, Kris (GB), Lear Fan, Night Shift and Trempolino. The highlights when in-foal mares grab the spotlight include lot 981, Karamiyna (Ire), in foal to Be My Guest. A three-time winner in France, she is consigned by His Highness the Aga Khan's Sheshoon Stud and is a full sister to multiple group winner Kartajana (Ire). Also from Sheshoon is Linnga (Ire), lot 982, the only mare in the catalogue in foal to Singspiel (Ire). Lot 1014 is Tafrah (Ire), sent up by Derrinstown Stud, in foal to Mark Of Esteem (Ire). Covering sires also include Alzao, Cadeaux Genereux (GB), Grand Lodge, Kris (GB), Night Shift, Peintre Celebre, Pursuit Of Love and Second Empire (Ire). Bidding begins at 10 a.m. daily.

DUBAI CARD ATTRACTS CLASS ENTRY

Just about every international performer of note is among the 664 entries received for the 2001 Dubai World Cup meeting at Nad Al Sheba next March 24. A total of 248 horses are from the United States, 143 from the United Arab Emirates and 97 from Great Britain have been entered. The culmination of the seven-race meeting, offering a total of \$15.25 million in prize money, is the \$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup, sponsored by Emirates, which has attracted 81 entries. The American nominations include this year's World Cup runner-up Behrens (Pleasant Colony) and Ecton Park (Forty Niner), who was fifth in the 2000 edition of the race. The European representation appears packed with quality. Heading the list is three-time Group 1 winner Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain), while Fruits Of Love (Hansel), Greek Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Endless Hall (GB) (Saddler's Hall {Ire}) are also in line for the race. Godolphin have G1 Man o' War S. winner Fantastic Light (Rahy), Best of the Bests (Ire) (Machiavellian), Ekraar (Red Ransom) and Sakhee (Bahri) among their entries, in a bid to follow success in 1999 and 2000. Australia may be represented by champion Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}), winner of the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley Oct. 28. Nominated to World Cup undercard events are Breeders' Cup heroes Macho Uno (Holy Bull) (\$2 million UAE Derby, 1 1/8m), Perfect Sting (Red Ransom) (\$2 million Dubai Duty Free, 1 1/8mT) and Kona Gold (Java Gold) (\$1 million Dubai Golden Shaheen, 6f). Rounding out the program are the \$2 million Dubai Sheema Classic, 1 1/2mT; \$1 million Godolphin Mile on the main track; and the \$250,000 Dubai Kahayla Classic, 1 1/4m. Les Benton, the chairman of the Dubai World Cup Committee, said, "We could not have wished for a better list of horses at this first entry stage. Nad Al Sheba racecourse will host the richest day of racing in history on March 24 next year and this, along with the prestige of competing at one of the world's foremost race meetings, has lured trainers and owners worldwide. It is not surprising to see the most powerful racing nations represented. But another pleasing aspect of the first entries is the fact that we received nominations from so many areas and countries such as Uruguay, Norway and Canada."

BURKE SEEKS STATESIDE SUCCESS In a bold new enterprise. British trainer Karl Burke is to send horses to race in the United States under the Lifestyle Bloodstock banner, as graded stakes-placed My Alibi (Sheikh Albadou {GB}) did with success earlier in the season. The operation, jointly set up by Burke and bloodstock agent Matt Pearce as a limited company, will take owners' horses to a satellite base at Turfway Park, where they will be campaigned at racetracks in the area. The horses can race in the States for up to four months as British-trained before they have to be classed as U.S. residents. The four months will give the Lifetsyle horses the chance to put their talent on display, with the aim being to achieve a sale. Burke explained, "The idea is to take horses out there for a payment, which is refundable if they are sold. As for the type of horse that is capable of running on the dirt, I would have U.S.-breds in mind, as they seem to handle it, and I would personally like to see them go around Lingfield." Shipping Monday, the first horses to travel will be Referral (Silver Hawk), Browser (Ire) (Rubiano), Royal Insult (GB) (Lion Cavern), and possibly Rouge (GB) (Rudimentary).

Danzig's sons supplied several of the weekend's headlines, thanks to the G1 Premio Roma victory of Roi Danzig's daughter Elle Danzig and the GII Mrs Revere S. success of Pine Bluff's daughter Megans Bluff. These wins provided the perfect backdrop for the announcement that War Chant, Danzig's latest winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile, is to stand at Three Chimneys Farm in 2001, rather than race on as a four-year-old.

I have come to the conclusion that Danzig's stallion sons are generally held in higher esteem by European breeders than by their American counterparts, largely because Americans suspect that their progeny will prefer turf to dirt. However, War Chant has shown that he is equally at home on the main track as he is on turf and this is sure to work in his favor after he retires.

It is going to be fascinating to see whether Danzig's status as a sire of sires undergoes a significant change in the U.S. over the next few years, because he has several comparatively young sons who established their reputations on dirt.

Belong To Me, who has sired a Grade I winner on dirt in each of his first three crops, should soon be reaping the rewards of his move to Lane's End Farm. His first Kentucky yearlings sold for up to \$600,000.

Boundary, another high-class sprinter on dirt, now has a high profile in Europe. His handful of juvenile runners in Britain include Minardi, who is likely to be rated the year's best juvenile, and Santolina, a Listed winner, so it was hardly surprising that Demi O'Byrne paid \$625,000 for another of Boundary's sons at Keeneland in September.

American breeders should remember the wide-margin Grade III win on dirt by Boundary's daughter Roxelana.

Next year will see the first runners by Langfuhr, another of Danzig's fastest sons. It is worth pointing out that he showed his true ability only after he failed to win any of his five starts on turf.

Pine Bluff, too, is one to keep an eye on. Despite numbering the 1992 Preakness S. among his five graded stakes, this Lane's End resident has spent most of his stallion career at a fee of only \$15,000.

He too might soon enjoy the rewards of having sired such as I Ain't Bluffing, Lil's Lad and Middlesex Drive in his first two crops. He has a couple of notable three-year-olds this year in the shape of Megans Bluff and the Irish-trained Pine Dance. Significantly, Pine Dance has excelled on dirt since his turf win in the GII American Derby, notably taking the GIII Pennsylvania Derby, and now Megans Bluff has added a Grade II success on turf to her Grade III dirt wins in the Arlington Oaks and Arlington Matron H. If these two are anything to go by, Pine Bluff's stock can be admirably versatile.

I am beginning to wonder whether switching between the two racing surfaces is as difficult as we Europeans were led to believe. After all, America's bloodstock industry benefited from the importation of many top European turf performers, and Europe in turn has profited from the many successful stallions which carry the USA suffix after their names.

We also have the Breeders' Cup's dirt events and the advent of the Dubai World Cup to thank for the lowering of the barriers between the dirt and turf sectors.

The Breeders' Cup efforts of such as Arcangues, Arazi, Sheikh Albadou, Dayjur, Giant's Causeway, Ibn Bey, Jolypha, Swain, Eltish, Tagel and Crimplene are beginning to represent a solid body of work by inexperienced dirt performers from Europe. Also, the willingness of the Maktoum family to race horses of the calibre of Halling, Singspiel, Daylami, Almutawakel and Dubai Millennium on Dubai's dirt track heralds a new era.

Coincidentally, the horses mentioned above include a son and a grandson of Danzig--this male line has a lot to offer breeders, whatever surface they prefer.

FIVE BIDS FOR NYC-OTB Bidding for the New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation closed Friday with five separate offers having been submitted. According to corporate counsel Michael Hess, bids were received from Churchill Downs; Catskill OTB; a partnership of the New York Racing Association and TVG; a group consisting of Magna Entertainment, Greenwood Racing and businessmen William Mack and Robert Baker; and the Nomura Group, the largest securities firm in Japan. Hess declined to release the bid amounts, saying that the corporation was not obligated to accept the largest bid, but would instead be considering other factors, including the companies' experience in racing. It is believed that the winning bid will be in the neighborhood of \$400 million.

OFF MEET FOR MEADOWLANDS Both attendance and handle showed declines at the 2000 Thoroughbred meet at the Meadowlands which concluded Saturday. Attendance at the New Jersey track was down 8.6 percent, while total handle dipped 13.9 percent to a nightly average of \$1.8 million. On-track handle was off 7.8 percent, averaging \$530,014 per night. "Overall, we're disappointed," Bruce Garland, senior executive vice president of racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, said. "We started off strong, but when we couldn't run on the turf and the fields became shorter, the bettors chose other venues." Jockey Joe Bravo picked up a record eighth riding title at the track with 48 victories, while Rachel Lavov captured the apprentice title, finishing fourth in the overall standings with 30 wins. Eddie Broome topped all trainers with 17 winners to take his third championship in the last four years. Broome was also runner-up in the owner standings to Richard Englander.

DANSILI TO BANSTEAD MANOR Dansili (GB) (Danehill {USA}--Hasili {Ire}, by Kahyasi {Ire}), a troubled third in the Breeders' Cup Mile, has been retired and will join the stallion roster at Prince Khalid Abdullah's Banstead Manor Stud near Newmarket, England. He will stand for £8,000. "We seriously considered sending Dansili to be trained in the States following his outstanding effort [in the Breeders' Cup] at Churchill Downs," explained Philip Mitchell, general manager of Juddmonte Farms. "Many people considered him the winner in everything but name and we felt he deserved the chance to put the record straight next year. Unfortunately the American racing programme offers very few Grade 1 opportunities for a turf miler, so Dansili is being retired as originally intended." A twotime group winner in France, the four-year-old ran second in the 1999 G1 Poule D'essai des Poulains. He was runner-up behind Giant's Causeway (USA) in the 2000 G1 Sussex S. and behind Kalanisi (Ire) in the G2 Queen Anne S. Dansili retires with five wins and seven placings in 14 starts and earnings of \$552,023.

CAULFIELD GUINEAS WINNER DQ'D Caulfield Guineas winner Skalato (Aus) (Semipalatinsk {USA}) was disqualified from the the Oct. 14 Group 1 race after a 10-hour inquiry into the horse's post-race positive test for the prohibited drug ketoprofen. Trainer Clarry Conners was fined A\$12,000 and his son Heath a further A\$4,000 by Racing Victoria stewards. Show A Heart (Aus) (Brave Warrior (Aus)) will now be awarded the winner's cheque of \$487,500 and the \$2,000 trophy, with Fubu (Aus) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) second, Sale Of Century (NZ) (Prized {USA}) third. Show A Heart's trainer, Barry Miller, told the Age newspaper, "I'd sooner have won it on the day. I'm sad for the owner and sad for Clarry Conners. But it's good for my owner and good for me." Ketoprofen is an anti-inflammatory used to ease muscle soreness. Melbourne solicitor Jeremy Rosenthal, acting on behalf of Skalato's owners, said an appeal would be lodged in the next 24 hours. Conners' Sydney veterinarian John Crowley said there were a number of possible reasons for the positive swab, such as Skalato being dehvdrated. Crowley said the amount of Ketoprofen found was "minute." He added, "We are talking about 1000th of a millionth of a gram that has been found in the horse."
