ARLINGTON MILLION ONCE AGAIN

The purse for the GI Arlington Million will be \$1 million next year, it was announced yesterday. This year's edition of the race, which was back after a two-year hiatus while Arlington was closed, carried a purse of \$2 million. "In our first year back, it was necessary to raise the purse of the Arlington Million to \$2 million to put it back on the map," Arlington President and CEO Scott Mordell said, but added, "We have reallocated the money available for stakes to bolster the effectiveness of the entire program in order to support the continued growth of Illinois racing." Benefitting from the Million's cut will be the GI Beverly D. S., which goes from \$500,000 to \$700,000; the GII Washington Park H., getting a boost from \$250,000 to \$400,000; the GIII Arlington H., going from \$150,000 to \$250,000; and the GIII Modesty H., which gets a raise from \$100,000 to \$150,000. Looking ahead, Mordell said, "We are confident that we will be able to increase the Million in the future as Illinois purse monies continue to grow from increased wagering and from the full implementation of the recent Illinois racing legislation." The 2001 Arlington season will be held June 13 through Oct. 28. The Million and the Beverly D. are set for Aug. 18.

GODOLPHIN ADDS EXPRESS TOUR TO STABLE

Express Tour (Tour d'Or), who started the Florida Stallion Series as a maiden, but swept all three races in the series, has been purchased by Godolphin for an undisclosed sum, the Thoroughbred Times reports. The three-year-old has now won three of his four starts for a bankroll of \$413,515. The colt will be shipped to Dubai, where he will prepare for a possible tilt at the 2001 U.S. Triple Crown.

BLUEBIRD BABY TOPS GOFFS WEDNESDAY

For the second straight day, a foal by Bluebird topped the Goffs November Sale as a bay filly brought a bid of Ir£40,000 from Michael Downing. Offered by Coppice Farm, agent, she is out of the Pennine Walk (Ire) mare Accountancy Jewel (Ire), a half sister to the dam of champion sprinter Lake Coniston (Ire) (Bluebird). She was purchased on behalf of a syndicate and will be resold as a yearling next year. The second-highest price on the day was the Ir£34,000 for a colt by Desert Story (Ire). Consigned by Old Half-Way House, he is a half brother to Italian stakes winner Innocenti Evasioni (Ire) (Favruz). The bay colt, purchased by Dermot Cantillon, is intended for resale next year. The sale continues this morning with the third of four foal sessions beginning at 10 a.m.

NO HOLLYWOOD DERBY FOR WAR CHANT GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero War Chant (Danzig) will not make a final start in Sunday's GI Early Times Hollywood Derby, it was announced yesterday. The three-year-old is heading to stud at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky in 2001. "[Neil Drysdale] and I spoke recently," explained owner Irving Cowan. "The horse is not ready to run. He has not bounced back as quickly from the Breeders' Cup as we had hoped."

MORE INVITEES TO HONG KONG The Hong Kong Jockey Club yesterday issued additional invitations for the International races at Sha Tin Dec. 17. Added to the G1 Hong Kong Vase were Germany's Caitano (GB) (Niniski), Second Coming (NZ) (Oak Ridge {Fr}) from New Zealand and American representatives Val's Prince (Eternal Prince) and Lord Flasheart (Blush Rambler). The G1 Hong Kong Cup will see Hightori (Fr) (Vettori {Ire}) from France and Falcon Flight (Fr) (Persian Bold (Ire)) from the U.S. One Won One (Naevus), representing Ireland, will run in the G1 Hong Kong Mile. as will Princess Ellen (GB) (Tirol {Ire}). The G3 Hong Kong Sprint has attracted four new faces, including the speedy Serenita (Arg) (Southern Halo), who was unbeaten in three Argentine starts and defeated her elders at Hollywood Park last week. Singapore's Superb Effect (Aus) (Bletchley Park {Ire}) and the British-trained duo of Perryston View (GB) (Primo Dominie {GB}) and Repertory (GB) (Anshan {GB}) will take their places as well.

With the defection of likely favorite Captain Steve (Fly So Free), who missed his flight from California according to the Daily Racing Form, fellow sophomore Aptitude could be the one to beat. The Juddmonte Farms' colorbearer was second over the surface to Fusaichi Pegasus in the Kentucky Derby and runner-up in the Belmont S. before earning some time off. The dark bay resurfaced with a powerful late run to defeat local allowance company Oct. 29 by 2 3/4 lengths and is well spotted for his first stakes victory. Breeders' Cup Distaff runner up Surfside, the only Grade I winner in the field, is the actual highweight on the scale with a three-pound filly allowance. The two-year-old filly has two wins and a second in three starts for earnings of \$107,586.

COMMITISIZE TO WYCOMBE HOUSE STUD

Four-time graded stakes winner **Commitisize** (Explodent--Goodbye Heart, by Tsunami Slew) has been retired and will stand the 2001 season at Wycombe House Stud near Reddick, Florida. A winner of 10 of his 31 career starts, the five-year-old captured the GIII Hollywood Prevue at two, the GIII Cinema H. at three, the GII El Rincon H. at four and the GIII Arcadia H. this season. He made his final start in the Nov. 3 Skywalker H. at Santa Anita, finishing fifth. His bankroll stands at \$777,577. The property of Mike Pegram, he will stand for an initial fee of \$4,500, live foal.

LINGFIELD TRACK COMES IN FOR CRITICISM

The Jockev Club have been called in to inspect Lingfield's all-weather Equitrack surface ahead of next Tuesday's meeting, due to complaints yesterday about the condition of the track. Jockey Martin Dwyer described the course as a 'disgrace', as moisture continued to cause freezing of the sand. "During the afternoon, the stewards became concerned over the degree of kickback that was coming back," said stewards' secretary Paul Barton. "There was a growing concern that the kickback was worse than normal, and some of the jockeys were coming back and complaining of having marks on their arms, outside of their body protectors. The general opinion was that there were larger pieces than normal coming off the track. Therefore the stewards decided to inspect the track--they inspected partly up the straight and then after the winning post. Having inspected it with Chris Rutter, Dale Gibson and Paul Eddery and three trainers, the jockeys were happy to continue given that Richard Linley, the Jockey Club's senior inspector of courses, will come to the track on Friday and inspect the surface."
