JAPAN CUP GOES TO HOME TEAM

T.M Opera O (Jpn) (Opera House {GB}), the champion Japanese three-year-old of 1999, likely cemented Horse of the Year honors for this season as he outfinished arch rival Meisho Doto (Ire) (Bigstone {Ire}) to register a narrow decision in the G1 Japan Cup yesterday afternoon in Tokyo. The four-year-old came into the race on a six-race winning streak, having defeated Meisho Doto by a neck in the June 25 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin, and by 2 1/2 lengths on their most recent meeting in the Tenno Sho over 10 furlongs at Tokyo Oct. 29. Settled in midpack by jockey Ryuji Wada, T.M Opera raced in tandem with GI Man O' War victor Fantastic Light (Rahy) until the field reached the head of the lane. Meisho Doto grabbed the lead once into the stretch, but the winner would not be denied. "It was a considerably slow-paced race and I really hadn't picked up my speed at the stretch," Wada said. "The two horses beside me nearly drew even, but I could feel that T.M. Opera O was determined not to let them get any further than that." Off at 1-2, the hometown hero ended a streak of 14 losing favorites in the Cup. Meisho Doto nosed Fantastic Light for the place, while Ela Athena (GB) (Ezzoud {Ire}) rallied from the back of the pack to finish a narrowly beaten fourth.

TATTERSALLS DECEMBER BEGINS

The Tattersalls December Sales may be little more than half the size of Keeneland November, but the historic Newmarket fixture is still comfortably the biggest Flat auction in Europe. Although it is breeding stock and foals who form the bulk of the 2,452-lot catalogue, the sale begins today at 9:30 a.m. with a selection of yearlings. Most of the 271 lots catalogued have either failed to sell or missed a previous engagement, although a few pinhookers are looking for a quick return with purchases from earlier in the sale season. The December yearling record of 280,000gns set two years ago could be threatened with some good sorts entered. Andrew and Madeleine Lloyd-Webber's Watership Down Stud sold two of the top three lots at the Houghton Sales in September and have four entries here, including lot 194, a Rainbow Quest three-parts brother to the G1 Coronation S. winner Gold Splash, who was withdrawn from the Houghton. From the same vendor is lot 193, a Danehill colt which did not reach its reserve of \$175,000 at Keeneland in September, Lot 180, an American-bred Halling colt from Glenvale Stud as agent, was bought back for 180,000gns at the Houghton. Singspiel (Ire)'s first-crop yearlings have sold well and his only representative, lot 190, is a colt from Round Hill Stud who missed the Houghton and made 90,000gns as a foal. Drafts from the Weinfeld family's Meon Valley Stud are always well received and include lot 169, a Polish Precedent half-brother to Noushkey (GB) and San Sebastian (GB). The same sire is responsible for a full-brother to the G1 Irish Oaks winner Pure Grain (GB), lot 159, consigned by Ted Voute. A G1 Irish Oaks winner with a daughter catalogued is Melodist, whose Rainbow Quest filly, lot 103, is consigned from Bill Gredley's Stetchworth Park Stud. The sale takes a break tomorrow and resumes with the foal section from Wednesday to Saturday, starting each day at 9:30 a.m.

On the board in 10 of her previous 12 starts on the grass, Tout Charmant put in one of those rare out-ofthe-money efforts in last year's edition of this race, in which she weakened to finish eighth after pressing the pace. But, after moving to trainer Ron McAnally's barn and being sold to Stonerside, the bay came back like gangbusters this year, taking the May 14 GIII Wilshire H. and Oct. 13 GIII WinStar Galaxy S., finishing second in the Aug. 16 GIII Palomar H. and Sept. 9 GI Ramona H. and third in the June 4 Gl Gamely Breeders' Cup H. Coming off her WinStar win, the consistent miss was let go at 16-1 in the 1 3/8-mile GI Breeders' Cup "Disturf," but nearly pulled off the upset, rallying to run Perfect Sting to three-quarters of a length as the runner-up. The Kentucky-bred was sent off the second choice as part of an entry with Caffe Latte (Seattle Dancer) here and was sharp despite the drop in distance, stalking the pace from third before angling out at the top of the lane and driving past favored Tranquility Lake to take the photo. "It was thrilling, that's for sure," jockey Chris McCarron said. "This filly is just dead game. She obviously doesn't have to take her track with her--she runs well everywhere. She has improved a great deal since the summer." Added McAnally, "She is unbelievable. She really is a classy filly. Everything that she's done for us, since we've had her, has been good. Now she'll get a rest. There is no more racing for her until March."

Off at a whopping 58-1, Designed For Luck was hard on the heels of pacesetter David Copperfield to the stretch and finally fought his way to the lead inside the sixteenth pole, then held off a hard-charging Brahms to cross the line a head in front. Unfortunately for his connections, the winner of the Oct. 21 GIII Ascot H. (who was claimed for \$62,500 last December) drifted out under the left-handed whip of Laffit Pincay Jr., bothering both Zentsov Street and Walkslikeaduck (Blushing John) in deep stretch. He was disqualified and placed fifth for the interference, leaving the crowd's choice as the winner, "Laffit's horse got drifting through the lane and took away the room," Chris McCarron, aboard Zentsov Street, said. "It cost us." Brahms, twice placed in Group 1 events at two in England, ended his juvenile campaign with a seventh-place finish in the Breeders' Cup, but is undefeated this year, taking a Saratoga allowance test in September, the Seattle Slew S. at Keeneland in October and the GIII River City H. at Churchill Nov. 5. Never far from the lead, the \$1 million Keeneland July yearling made his bid from the far outside, avoiding trouble and finishing fast to just miss. "I think this could be the best older horse in training next year on the turf, and we might even try him on the dirt," trainer Elliott Walden said.

GOFFS NOVEMBER SALE CONCLUDES The 2000 Goffs November Breeding Stock Sale concluded yesterday in Co. Kildare, Ireland with an aggregate which gained 31 percent, a median which was up 22 percent and an average which grew 21 percent over the 1999 edition of the auction. The six-day event began with four sessions of foals, followed by two sessions of broodmares and fillies. Topping Sunday's finale was the three-year-old Twice The Ease (GB) (Green Desert), a broodmare prospect from the Moyglare Stud Farm consignment. The brown filly is out of champion Irish miler Easy To Cope (Affirmed), making her a half sister to Group winner Two-Twenty Two (Ire) (Fairy King) and an own sister to Listed winner Desert Ease (Ire). She was purchased for 170,000 Irish guineas by Hugo Merry Bloodstock for an undisclosed client. "She is a bit small in the feet--only for that, she would have made twice that price," Merry said. "She is for an American client who has a small farm with very good mares. She was reasonably priced by Keeneland prices." Overall, the broodmares section saw a 53percent gain in the median, a 25-percent increase in the aggregate and a 16-percent rise in the average. "The level of demand for both foals and breeding stock exceeded all expectations," Goffs Managing Director Matt Mitchell said. "It was particularly pleasing that seven foals exceeded the £100,000 mark, indicating that the buyers were present when a correct foal with the pedigree to match came into the ring." He added, "Purchasers from Turkey were very active, especially in the two days of the broodmare and fillies sale. Many Irish breeders have been purchasing better quality mares, which is encouraging and vital for the continued success of Goffs and the breeding sector."

CHURCHILL SETS HANDLE RECORD The 2000 Fall Meet at Churchill Downs which ended Saturday established a new record for total wagering. During the 24-day meeting, the track handled \$160,512,766 from all sources, up 7.2 percent from the mark set last year. Attendance was off 6.6 percent from 1999, but ontrack handle was up 3.2 percent to \$29,887,676. The simulcast handle on Churchill racing showed the biggest gain, growing 8.2 percent to \$130,625,089. Attendance and handle figures from the Breeders' Cup, which was held at Churchill for the fifth time, were not included in the total. "We're very pleased by the continued strong support for Churchill Downs racing by fans in Kentucky and throughout North America," Churchill President Alex Waldrop said. Pat Day, the all-time leading jockey at the Louisville track, picked up a record 16th Fall Meet title with 39 victories. There was a tie for leading trainer, with Bernie Flint and Elliott Walden saddling 10 winners apiece. The three co-champion owners, with six wins each, were Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey; the McKee Stable; and Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel. The 2001 Spring Meet at Churchill Downs is set for Apr. 28-July 8.

A \$1 million two-year-old-in-training purchase, Songandaprayer debuted for former basketball star Bobby Hurley and company amidst a media throng at Monmouth Park June 15, sprinting to a clear lead before holding on for a 1/2-length victory at 1-5. The colt was found to have hind ankle chips following that effort and was forced to the sidelines, but had been training forwardly for the return. Adding Lasix for the first time, the bay stalked the pace four wide, took over and held off favored Native Heir for the narrow success. "I was confident, but you go from one end to the other being 1-5 in his first race and 10-1 in a stakes next time out," Hurley commented. "We'll probably look to stretch him out after this. I'll talk to [trainer] John [Dowd] about what's next and set something as a goal."

DETTORI DISAPPOINTED IN TOKYO Jockey Frankie Dettori, who finished third in last year's Japan Cup aboard High-Rise (Ire), had to settle for the same placing again yesterday, missing by a neck and a nose aboard Godolphin's Fantastic Light (USA) (Rahy {USA}) in the Grade 1 event. Fantastic Light, winner of the GI Man o'War S. at Belmont Park in September and most recently a solid fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, rallied from the middle of the pack to battle winner T.M. Opera O (Jpn) (Opera House {GB}) and runner-up Meisho Doto (Ire) (Bigstone {Ire}) to the wire, but the top two proved narrowly the better. "The pace was too slow for the colt," Dettori, who won the Japan Cup with Singspiel (Ire) in 1996, said. "He did his best, but the top two colts were faster." Ela Athena (GB) (Ezzoud {Ire}) also finished well, getting fourth, just two lengths behind the winner. Reve d'Oscar (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) trailed to the final drive before closing to be seventh. Echoing Dettori, jockey Gerard Mosse said, "I stayed in the back as instructed by the trainer, but the pace was too slow. The filly stretched well, but the leaders were too strong." The European contingent was rounded out by Golden Snake (USA) (Danzig {USA}), 10th; and Fruits of Love (USA) (Hansel {USA}), 12th.

GODOLPHIN CONTINUES TO BUILD Godolphin has added two more two-year-olds to its stable, purchasing unbeaten colt West Order (USA) (Gone West {USA}) and the filly Tempting Fate (Ire) (Persian Bold {Ire}). West Order started twice for trainer Richard Hannon and owner Monsun Investments Ltd. this season, breaking his maiden at Newbury in September and adding a five-length victory in a conditions race at Newmarket Oct. 13. Tempting Fate, racing for owner Michael Kerr-Dineen and partners and trainer John Hills, won two of her four outings, taking a Newbury maiden Aug. 18 and a Salisbury conditions race Aug. 31. She ended the year with a fourth-place finish in the G2 Owen Brown Rockfel S. at Newmarket Oct. 14.
