MORE THAN READY RETIRED

More Than Ready (Southern Halo--Woodman's Girl, by Woodman), fourth in Saturday's GI Cigar Mile H., has been retired and will head to Vinery in Lexington for the 2001 breeding season. Purchased by James Scatuorchio for \$187,000 at the 1998 Keeneland September Sale, the three-year-old won five of seven starts as a juvenile, including the GII Sanford S. and GIII Tremont S., where he broke Ruffian's 26-year-old Belmont Park track record, going the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:02 2/5. This year, he won the GI King's Bishop and GII Hutcheson S. and finished second in the GI Toyota Blue Grass, GI Vosburgh, GII Louisiana Derby and GII Dwyer S. He retires with seven wins, four seconds and a third from 17 starts for earnings of \$1,026,229. More Than Ready will stand for a fee of \$25,000, live foal.

DANEHILL COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS OPENER

The top three lots at yesterday's yearling session of the Tattersalls December Sales in Newmarket were all bought on behalf of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, to be re-sold at the two-year-old breeze-up at Sha Tin in 12 month's time. Dublin-based agent John McCormack signed for the top lot, a Danehill colt out of a half-sister to the dam of Johan Cruyff (GB). Offered from Ballygallon Stud, the colt had been withdrawn from the Houghton Sales, and had plenty of admirers. Local agents Amanda Skiffington and Linda Tate both bid to six figures, but it was Paul Shanahan of Coolmore, taking instructions by telephone in the gateway, who was underbidder to McCormack at 190,000gns. "He was the star individual here today and was a lovely looking horse. The pedigree obviously appealed, but you have to marry that together with the horse and he had both," said McCormack, Adrian Nicoll of BBA (Ireland) had purchased the previous lot for 100,000gns on behalf of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. The colt, by Polish Precedent out of an unraced half-sister to the sire's best performer Pilsudski (Ire), was also a Ballygallonsold Houghton withdrawal. Another well-connected Polish Precedent due to appear in the Hong Kong catalogue is Irish Oaks winner Pure Grain (GB)'s full-brother, offered by Ted Voute, who sold for 80,000gns to McCormack. He outbid Will Edmeades. who was accompanied by Thurloe Thoroughbreds manager James Stafford. There were several notable short-term pinhooking triumphs. Leading the way was a Kentucky-bred son of Mister Baileys (GB) from the family of Dancing Brave, who had been bought for \$5,000 by James Egan's Corduff Stud at Keeneland September, but had matured in value to 46,000gns by the time the auctioneer's hammer came down in Amanda Skiffington's favour. He will be trained by Roger Charlton.

sunline set for Hong Kong Earning her seventh win from seven starts in her native country, champion Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) cruised to a 3 1/4-length victory in Saturday's G2 Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' S. at Pukekohe in New Zealand. Prepping for the Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin Dec. 17, the five-year-old completed the seven furlongs in 1:21.42 to take the race for the second straight year. "She won it a bit easier than we expected," co-trainer Stephen McKee said, while jockey Greg Childs added, "She could have clipped a second off the time if I'd asked her."

HAPPYANUNOIT TO BREEDING SHED? According to the New Zealand Thoroughbred Update, Happyanunoit (NZ) (Yachtie {Aus}--Easter Queen {Aus}, by Rajah {Aus}), third in Sunday's GI Matriarch S., may have run her last race. The five-year-old was invited to compete in the Hong Kong International Cup, but indications are that she will be retired and bred to Gone West in the spring. The champion two-year-old filly in New Zealand, where she won the G1 Manawatu Sires Produce S., the dark bay shipped to the U.S. to race in 1999 and captured the Matriarch, the GIII Palomar H. and the Vinery First Lady S., setting a Keeneland course record of 1:53 4/5 for 1 3/16 miles in the process. This season, she added a victory in the GI Beverly Hills H.; overall, she had eight wins, five seconds and two thirds from 19 starts, earning \$1,426,408.

Third in the Sept. 17 G2 St Lite Kinen, the bay was most recently eighth in the G1 Japanese St Leger Oct. 22. Settled in third position by jockey Olivier Peslier, Joten Brave advanced to lead passing the midstretch marker and inched clear. "It was a clear break and my mount was very relaxed today," Peslier commented. "When I pushed him turning for home, he showed an impressive performance and never gave up."

The Japanese sire rankings published in the Nov. 16 *TDN* made interesting reading. As expected, the all-conquering Sunday Silence headed the table, with earnings nearly three times those of his nearest pursuer, Tony Bin. What I hadn't anticipated was the scale of the numerical advantage Sunday Silence enjoys in Japan's National Racing. The statistics credit him with 302 runners, whereas Tony Bin had 189, third-placed Brian's Time 132 and fourth-placed Jade Robbery 149. Down in sixth place, with just 49 representatives, was Opera House, Europe's champion older horse of 1993.

Opera House owed his top-ten position largely to T.M. Opera O, a member of his second crop. This outstanding four-year-old's victory in the Japan Cup improved his record for the year to seven wins from seven starts, all at Group 1 or Grade 2 level. The colt is as versatile as he is talented, as he showed by winning the spring and fall versions of the Tenno Sho, the first over two miles and the second over 1 1/4 miles.

Considering that 1 1/2 miles was the longest distance that Opera House was asked to tackle, he might not have been expected to sire a winner at up to two miles from a daughter of Blushing Groom. It mustn't be forgotten, though, that Opera House's brother Kayf Tara established himself as the best European stayer of recent seasons, thanks partly to two victories in the Ascot Gold Cup over 2 1/2 miles.

These brothers were bred to be top class, resulting from matings between Colorspin, a winner of the G1 Irish Oaks, and Sadler's Wells, a winner of the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas.

A Classic future appeared to await Opera House when he won his only juvenile start so impressively that he became the winter favorite for the Epsom Derby, but his classic ambitions were thwarted by a pastern injury. Fortunately, he scored consecutive Group 1 victories in the Coronation Cup, Coral-Eclipse and King George as a five-year-old, also finishing a close third in the Arc.

Even though he was a champion with a champion's pedigree, Opera House was never going to find it easy to win the affections of Britain and Ireland's commercial breeders. Not only was he suited by a mile and a half, but he was also regarded as a late developer. He was also surplus to Sheikh Mohammed's requirements because the Sheikh had another of Sadler's Wells's best sons, In The Wings, at his Irish stud. Consequently, Opera House was sold to Japan.

T.M. Opera O isn't his family's only Group 1 winner this year. His second dam, Noura, is a sister to the second dam of Gaviola, the Cozzene filly who won the Garden City Breeders' Cup H. Coincidentally, Cozzene is also a product of this female line. T.M. Opera O's dam Once Wed was covered as a three-year-old in Japan, her first foal being the stakes-winning filly Channel Four (by Northern Dictator).

It is interesting that Once Wed has excelled with a son of Sadler's Wells, because Sadler's Wells has an undistinguished record with other Blushing Groom mares. The Sadler's Wells-Blushing Groom partnership has produced over 20 progeny of racing age, several of them out of very talented racemares, but there is no Group winner among them. Its best representatives are the Listed winners Kadaka and Roscius and the very useful stayer Admiral's Well.

Opera House's success with a Blushing Groom mare highlights how wrong it is to assume that a stallion will show the same traits as his sire, ignoring the fact that each stallion's dam contributes to his gene pool.

T.M. Opera O's Japan Cup triumph has surely secured him the title of Japanese Horse of the Year, an honour which was won in 1995 by Mayano Top Gun, another colt out of a Blushing Groom mare. Yet another Blushing Groom mare produced Yamanin Zephyr, 1993's champion sprinter-miler in Japan, so they seem very well suited to conditions in Japan.

MARSHALL WEST JENNEY DEAD Owner/breeder Marshall West Jenney, who owned and managed Derry Meeting Farm in Cochranville, Pennsylvania, died Sunday at Johns Hopkins Medical Center in Baltimore, Maryland after a brief illness. He was 60 years old. Born Dec. 4, 1939, Jenney graduated from Princeton University in 1963 and briefly worked on Wall Street before buying Derry Meeting Farm. There he bred such notable Thoroughbreds as champion sire Danzig and G1 French Oaks winner Mrs. Penney. He was also an amateur steeplechase rider. Jenney is survived by his wife, Bettina; two daughters; two stepdaughters; and eight grandchildren. A memorial celebration will be held at Christ Church Christiana Hundred on Thursday, Nov. 30 at 4 p.m. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested remembrances be sent to either The Brandywine Conservancy Laurels Endowment or the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine at New Bolton Center.
