GREEN DANCER PENSIONED

Green Dancer (Nijinsky II--Green Valley (Fr), by Val de Loir), the sire of 83 stakes winners, has been pensioned due to the infirmities of old age. The 28-year-old stallion has sired seven champions, including Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Suave Dancer, French 2000 Guineas winner Green Tune and Grade I winner Greinton. On the racetrack, Green Dancer won the 1975 French 2000 Guineas, the G1 Prix Lupin and G1 Observer Gold Cup S. In 1979, he was Europe's leading first crop sire. In 1980, Gainesway brought Green Dancer to the United States where he stood the rest of his stud career. "Green Dancer has been a stallion manager's dream," said Michael Hernon of Gainesway. "He was a third-generation classic winner who carried on the tradition by siring a classic winner himself. He has enjoyed excellent health and fertility throughout his career."

COMMENDABLE TO MILL RIDGE

GI Belmont S. winner Commendable (Gone West--Bought Twice, by In Reality) has been retired and will stand the 2001 breeding season at Alice Chandler's Mill Ridge Farm near Lexington, Kentucky. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas, the chestnut broke his maiden in his first start and was beaten just a length in his first gradedstakes appearance when fourth to War Chant in the GII San Rafael S. In addition to his 1 1/2-length success in the final leg of the Triple Crown, Commendable was third in the GI Travers and second to Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow in the GI Super Derby to close out his career. "Commendable is a big, good-looking horse that has a fascinating pedigree," Mrs. Chandler commented. "His bloodlines combine the tremendous success has in producing stallions by the Mr. Prospector line and the In Reality line." Commendable descends in female line from the outstanding mare Grand Splendor, ancestress to such prominent stallions as Fappiano, Honour and Glory and Quiet American. He will stand as the property of a syndicate for a fee of \$15,000 live foal.

PAIR OF COLTS TOP TATTERSALLS OPENER

The foal section of the Tattersalls December Sales made its traditionally inauspicious start yesterday with two colts topping proceedings at a modest 25,000gns. Although turnover was down by 30 percent, the bulk of this is because of the new vendor buy-back scheme, which was not in place last year. However, the average was up 12 percent and the median was unchanged compared with 1999. The first colt to hit the 25,000 gns mark was a son of Piccolo consigned by Home Stud and purchased through Emerald Bloodstock by Jimmy Murphy of Redpender Stud in Co Kilkenny. The underbidder was Joss Collins of the BBA, who was taking instructions from James Egan of Corduff Stud. "He'll be coming back to Redpender and we hope to earn a little bit re-selling him next year," said Murphy. "He looked one of the sharpest horses here today." Later, agent Fiona Needham paid 25,000gns to outbid Fiona Marner of Kingwood Stud for a son of Unfuwain offered from Charlie Mason's Silfield Bloodstock. "He was a lovely walker and was for a client who will re-submit him here next year," said Needham. David Botterill of Hall Farm Stud in Leicestershire had a good result when his home-bred colt from the first crop of Bahhare was bought for 23,000gns by Tony O'Callaghan of Tally-Ho Stud with Susie McKeever the underbidder. "He'll probably be coming back here next year--we'll see how he gets on," said O'Callaghan. The sale resumes this morning at 9:30 a.m.

CAFFE LATTE RETIRED Caffe Latte (Ire) (Seattle Dancer--Debbie's Next, by Arctic Tern), a disappointing sixth to stablemate Tout Charmant in the GI Matriarch this past Sunday, has been retired from racing, according to John Adger, racing manager for Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside Stables. The winner of the Prix Melisande at Maisons-Laffitte to close out her abbrieviated three-race European career in 1999, the filly, then trained by Julio Canani was second in the GII San Clemente and runner up in the GI Yellow Ribbon before a fourth-place finish in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. Switched to the barn of Bob Baffert this season, the bay won three of her eight starts, including the GI Ramona, but was ninth in the Breeders' Cup prior to her Matriarch. "She's done enough for us and she will make an excellent addition to our broodmare band," Adger commented. "[Trainer] Bob [Baffert] has done an excellent job with her, but she is clearly not running as well as she did in the Ramona, so we decided that it was time to send her home." A decision on mating plans for the four-year-old has not yet been reached.

NUMBERS CLIMB AT WOODBINE Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, closed its 2000 Thoroughbred racing season with significant increases in total handle and purse distribution, the latter as the result of the addition of 1,700 slot machines at Woodbine. Total handle from all sources exceeded \$293 million, up from \$261 million in 1999, for an increase of 12 percent. Of that increase, wagers accepted from off-track facilities in the U.S. were ahead by 42.2 percent. Total purses earned by horsepeople during the meet was over \$75 million, for an average per-race distribution of a remarkable \$49,431. The total disbursement of purses advanced by 49.7 percent versus 1999. Also of interest was an increase in telephone account wagering in Greater Toronto from \$5.9 million in 1999 to \$9.7 million this year. The leading rider at the meet was Patrick Husbands with 178 victories while Abraham Katryan topped the trainer's standings with 56 wins.

RECORD-SETTING LONE STAR SCHEDULE RELEASED Purse hikes for the Lone Star Derby and Dallas Turf Cup and the creation of a mid-season Texas-bred championship spearhead a record \$4.09million 2001 stakes schedule at Lone Star Park. The 74-day meet will run from Apr. 5 through July 15. The purse of the Lone Star Derby received a \$200,000 boost and will be worth a hefty \$500,000 when it is run on April 7. Of the 31 stakes races on tap, 20 are worth at least \$100,000. "Since we opened in 1997, we've strived to provide a strong, quality daily racing program, anchored by an attractive stakes schedule," said Steve Sexton, Lone Star Park's executive vice president and general manager. "We continue to look for ways to attract the best racing product possible and believe that's evident by the changes we've made to our stakes program. This, along with the continuance of an aggressive national recruiting effort, will help lure some of the country's best horses to North Texas." In addition to its purse increase, the Lone Star Derby has also increased in distance. It will be run at 1 1/8 miles in 2001 and it will be televised nationally on ESPN's "Racing to the Kentucky Derby." A \$1-million bonus will be paid to the connections of a horse that can combine a Lone Star Derby win with a Triple Crown victory. The 2001 Dallas Turf Cup will be worth \$300,000 when it is run June 16. The race will be televised nationally in the inaugural "NTRA Champions" turf series on CBS Sports. The Stars of Texas Day will have its inaugural appearance on June 30. The day consists of six stakes races worth \$650,000. The centerpiece of the May 28 Lone Star Million Day is the \$300,000 GIII Lone Star Park H. Also on the Memorial Day program are the \$200,000 USA S., the \$200,000 WinStar Distaff, the \$100,000 Lone Star Park Sprint and the \$100,000 Wild Flower S. Also on tap at Lone Star in 2001 is the Apr. 28 \$300,000 GIII Texas Mile.

CHARITY BEGINS AT CALDER An Open Letter to Cot Campbell

I would like to take this public forum to nominate Victor Sanchez for the 2001 Dogwood Dominion Award. Yeah, it might be a little early...it also might add a little extra pressure, reading this for the first time in a national publication, but anyone who deals with as many owners as you do has to be used to pressure.

Victor Sanchez was born 53 years ago in Puerto Rico and came to Brooklyn at the age of five. Somewhere in his formative years he must have been surrounded by good people.

After breaking horses in New York for W.C. Freeman and spending winters in South Carolina breaking babies Sanchez started riding races. He rode for four years in New York before succumbing to the fate of most young men who want to be jockeys, weight.

In 1972, Sanchez moved to South Florida and took up life as a jock's agent. (I didn't say he was without sin.) Over the years he's had the book of Jacinto Vasquez, Alfredo Smith and Alex Solis at Calder, Gulfstream and Hialeah.

In 1993, when Bob Umphrey came back to South Florida to take over as racing secretary of Calder and Gulfstream, he asked Sanchez to take over the colors in the jockey's room and also help as assistant clerk of scales. Sanchez agreed.

The new colors man knew there would be a horde of young jockeys coming from Central and South America. Most of them would still be in their teens and wouldn't be able to speak English. Sanchez knew that, even without the language barrier, it would be tough for any young rider to step into a jocks' rooms where the atmosphere is as competitive as any NFL locker room, Major League dugout or NBA bench.

Shortly after he settled into his new job, looking to make the kids feel at home, Sanchez decided to invite all the jocks at Calder to the beach for a cookout. He dug into his own pocket and bought soda, ice, chips, burgers, dogs and buns at the supermarket.

The first week only a couple guys showed up, but Sanchez didn't get discouraged.

The next week he went around to all the jocks and invited them again. Picked out a spot on Hollywood beach where there were a dozen picnic tables, plenty of shade trees and an ocean with bathtub temperatures. And sprung for the food again. The crowd picked up, but it took more than a couple of weeks.

"I didn't have to force anyone to go," said Sanchez. "I knew if people were having a good time the word would get around."

Eventually the word did spread. Husbands and wives, kids and grandparents started coming for the picnic, and for the competition.

"There's a volleyball net up on the part of the beach where we have our cookout and, of course, with all the energy the young jockeys have. it didn't take long to them to choose up sides," Sanchez said.

Sanchez makes sure to extend a special invitation to all the new arrivals in the jock's room.

"I don't want them to feel left out," he said, adding, "You'd be surprised how competitive they can be five days a week on the track, and then how they gang together when they are on the same volley ball team."

Sanchez says he stops at the store on his way to the beach to pick up the food so he'll get there by 11:00 a m

"By then everyone is finished working horses in the morning. And if any backside help wants to join us when their day is finished, they are welcome, " he said. "My girl friend Mimi [Rangel] and I take our time and get the charcoal fires going so we can start eating around 3:30 p.m.

"We usually finish up around 6:00 p.m., because everyone has to get up early the next day," he added.

The cookout/volley ball outing goes on 52 weeks a year, but in recent years the winter tournament has taken on a new excitement. Umphrey got Gulfstream and some of the van companies to put up over \$1,000 for a round-robin double elimination volleyball tournament. When there's money on the line you can expect to see trainers, assistant trainers, jock's agents and even racing officials in the competition.

The jockeys get involved in a different way.

"The big named jockeys like Jerry Bailey, Mike Smith, Pat Day all come by in the winter and slip me money and say, 'It's for the cookout,'" said Sanchez, adding, "Even the jock's agents contribute."

But there are still times, especially during the summer, when the kitty gets a little low and Sanchez has to dip into his pocket to pony up money for the eats.

I'll tell you one thing Cot, if Sanchez wins, the \$5,000 prize will end up in one of the cash register of a South Florida supermarkets paying for charcoal, soda, ice, burgers, dog and buns.

The Dogwood Dominion Award, sponsored by Dogwood Stable, is presented annually to an "unsung hero" in the Thoroughbred industry. There will be a nomination form on the Dogwood website, dogwoodstable.com, beginning in May. 'DOUBLE A' RETIRES

Racing journalist Alan Amies, whose reputation in the press rooms of Britain has gone before him for more than 35 years, is to retire from the sport. Known as 'Double A', Amies said yesterday: "I'm going to miss some parts of it--but I certainly won't miss the travelling. This is the main reason I'm packing in--I'm just fed up with the driving. I'm going to Hong Kong next week where I will be doing some punting, and when I come back I still intend to race from time to time. I've got to keep my hand in punting in this country as well." At Musselburgh on Friday, the racecourse is staging the Alan Amies Fond Farewell Novice Hurdle.

GO RACING FAVOURITES FOR MEDIA RIGHTS

The Go Racing consortium, involving Channel 4 and BSkyB, as well as Arena Leisure, is on the cusp of victory after the Racecourse Association yesterday backed their bid for media rights over rivals Carlton. The deal, worth £400 million, will bring action from Britain's 59 tracks. "It was a very close decision between Go Racing and Carlton," said Stephen Atkin, chief executive of the Racecourse Association. "The key difference was the broadcast package that Go Racing put together was superior to the Carlton offering. It involved existing broadcasters whose product we know. The time slots were already in place, so we knew precisely what we were getting from Go Racing." There are still negotiations to be carried out, but Arena Leisure, whose six racecourses--Folkestone, Lingfield, Southwell, Windsor, Wolverhampton and Worcestermake up 20 percent of the fixture list, are happy with the RCA's decision. "This has been a major decision for the UK racecourses," said Arena's finance director lan Penrose. "We are delighted that the strengths of the Go Racing consortium--comprehensive terrestrial coverage, interactive TV and gaming capability, together with global broadcasting--have been recognised. We look forward to working with the racecourses to maximise this opportunity for racing."

There are various issues which remain to be settled, such as the future of the National Stud, I am keen to ensure that the Levy Board plays its part in the successful resolution of such issues."

GOLDEN 'BELLE' SEEKING MILLIONS

Golden Slipper-winning filly Belle du Jour (Aus) (Dehere {USA}) demonstrated she was on track to capture the A\$1 million Magic Millions race for three-year-olds on the Gold Coast on January 14. Clocking 33.18 over 600m and 47.48 over 800m, she was well-held by jockey Len Beasley, who marvelled at her competitive attitude. "I was surprised how keen she was today; every time [work companion] Nan Tien came after me she just wanted to grab the bit more and get away from him, and that is the type of horse she is," Beasley said. "She was relaxed--but in saying that, she was keen at the same time; she used to get herself really upset and sweat up really badly," he continued about the filly who has won four of seven outings and more than A\$1.8 million. Belle du Jour's spring campaign was aborted after she suffered a minor virus at trainer Clarry Conners' stable, but it will suit her part-owner, Magic Millions sales company stakeholder John Singleton, to have her win the company's big feature race after finishing runner-up to Assertive Lad in the juvenile edition of the race last year. Conners plans to send Belle du Jour out in a 1000m Flying Welter at Randwick on Saturday week before a start in the Listed Razor Sharp H. (1100m) at the same track a fortnight later. Then Belle du Jour will tackle the A\$60.000 Emerald Bracelet (1300m) at the Toowoomba Turf Club's Clifford Park on December 30, before the Magic Millions (1400m) at the Gold Coast on January 14. "That was good as gold," said Conners, "I'm pretty happy. "Last time in she just wasn't right; she was in for four weeks and just didn't improve and now she is strong as an ox, I reckon she has put on about 40 kilos."
