LAZY LODE ATTEMPTS THREE-PEAT

Lazy Lode (Arg) (Lode) looks to join the likes of Native Diver, Flawlessy and Answer Do by becoming the fourth horse to capture a Hollywood Park stakes three consecutive years in a row. He'll face some stiff competition in the 20th running of today's GI Hollywood Turf Cup. The six-year-old has raced only once since his win here over **Single Empire (Ire)** (Kris {GB}) last year, coming off an 11-month hiatus to run fourth in an allowance effort at this track Nov. 19. The Argentinian-bred has run out of the top three only once at this distance and track. Single Empire has earned over a million dollars on the turf, but has been disappointing this year. Most recently, he ran a distant ninth behind **Res Judicata (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), who dead-heated for second in the Oct. 29 Gill Carleton F. Burke H. at Santa Anita. A Listed winner and grouped stakes placed in France, Res Judicata has only been improving in his stateside races. He debuted on American soil in the restricted Escondido H. Aug. 9 and ran seventh behind second place-finisher **Perssonet (Chi)** (Hussonet) before stepping up his performance in the Burke. **Bienamado** (Bien Bien) has claimed the role of morning-line favorite and deservedly so. The four-year-old is two for two at Hollywood, having come home the seven-length winner of the restricted Jim Murray H. in his second U.S. effort June 25 and the winner of the GII Sunset H. July 23. In his latest outing, the chestnut colt finished fourth to Chester House in a strong field of competitors in the Aug. 19 GI Arlington Million. He enters this race with four months of freshening under his belt. The French **Binn Tin Tin (Fr)** (Irish River {Fr}) tries out American racing and Lasix for the first time here and does so with one second from one start at the distance to his name. The Nicolas Clement-trained colt has fared well in French handicaps, taking a race of that level Oct. 19 at Longchamp, but has yet to test his skill at this class. "I am more hopeful that confident," said Clement, whose brother Christophe trains Charge d'Affaires (Fr), the winner of the Nov. 25 GII Citation H. "Binn Tin Tin is a fresh horse who has been doing well and we would be happy to be stakes placed here."

RECORD MEDIAN AT TATTERSALLS

Pinhookers, banking on a continued rising bloodstock market at yesterday's session of the Tattersalls December Foal Sales, helped the day's median of 24,500gns shatter last year's record by 53 percent. The average of 35,151gns also narrowly beat the old mark set in 1998. Those looking for racing and breeding prospects were equally prominent at the top of the market and it was the Godolphin operation who took home the day's best-selling lot, a colt by Zafonic offered from David Shekells' Old Mill Stud. Irish pinhooker Timmy Hyde was in the market for this January-born youngster, but called it a day after Godolphin's agent John Ferguson bid 220,000gns. "He was bought to race, we always buy a few as foals," said Ferguson. The colt is the second foal from Classic Form (Ire) (Alzao), a full sister to the Epsom Oaks winner Shahtoush (Ire). Hyde had more luck when outlasting Swordlestown Stud manager Gerald Morrin for a filly from the first crop of the 1997 Arc winner Peintre Celebre, who will be based in Japan next year. Offered from Airlie Stud, the half-sister to German Group 3 winner Sinyar (Ire) (Machiavellian) was purchased for 200,000gns and will probably reappear in the sales ring next year. "She was a lovely filly from a good family by a decent stallion," said Hyde. "There is a good chance that she will be resold next year." Hyde also bought a colt by Grand Lodge from Kirtlington Stud for 155,000gns. One which was not a pinhook prospect was a January-born Baratheia (Ire) filly offered from Bloomsbury Stud, for whom Danni Chambers of Horse France (Ireland) paid 150,000gns. The underbidder was Bobby Donworth of Round Hill Stud in Ireland. Already named Artful (GB), the filly is out of French stakes winner Gold Dodger (Slew O'Gold). "She is for an undisclosed client, but will probably race in this country. She was a lovely scopey filly," said Chambers. Bloomsbury Stud, owned by Lord and Lady Tavistock, sold the useful two-year-old Ghayth (GB) to Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum at this foal sale in 1998. The Foals section of the Tattersalls December Sales concludes today, with bidding on the final session beginning at 9:30 a.m.

LION HEARTED TO MARYLAND Lion Hearted (Storm Cat--Cadillacing, by Alydar) has been retired and will stand at Northview Stallion Station in Chesapeake City, Maryland after Northview purchased 50 percent of the well-bred four-year-old from Odgen Phipps. Out of a full sister to Easy Goer, the Kentucky-bred's race record of 4-6-3 from 18 starts was highlighted when second in both the GII Riva Ridge S. and the GIII Amsterdam S. last year. The half brother to GI Futurity S. winning Strolling Along (Danzig) and multiple graded stakes-placed Cat Cay (Pleasant Colony) earned a total of \$191,630 in his three-year career. "Needless to say, I am extremely excited about the opportunity Mr. Phipps is giving breeders in the Mid-Atlantic and clients of Northview to participate in what could very well be one of the top Thoroughbred families in the world," said Richard Golden, president of Northview. Lion Hearted will stand for \$5,000, live foal.

WEST BY WEST HEADS TRIO TO TURKEY West By West (Gone West--West Turn, by Cox's Ridge) is one of three stallions bound for Turkey, according to *The Blood-Horse*. Sire of nine stakes winners, the 11-year-old will join Fantastic Fellow (Lear Fan--Chateaubaby, by Nureyev) and multiple Grade I stakes winning millionaire Marlin (Sword Dance {Ire}--Syrian Summer, by Damascus) if a deal is completed with the Turkish Jockey Club. Grade I stakes victor West By West's winning progeny have amassed \$5,068,178; the third-crop sire stood for a syndicate at Walmac International in Kentucky and is currently in Argentina, along with Marlin, for the Southern Hemisphere breeding season. Marlin's first foals are yearlings and Fantastic Fellow's first offspring were foaled this year.

KLINE PARTNERSHIP TO PURCHASE SPENDTHRIFT Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Kline, formerly of Dixiana Farm, have formed a new partnership which has purchased Spendthrift Farm. The Kentucky farm's operations will include boarding, foaling, sales preparation and breeding. Stallions Mr. Greeley, El Amante, Fly Till Dawn, Mystery Storm, Prized, Sefapiano and Senor Speedy will relocate from Dixiana to Spendthrift and will be joined by new sires Chief Seattle and Down The Aisle to stand stud for the 2001 breeding season. Kline will direct the operation of the farm with James Brown as farm manager, Suzie Oldam as sales/marketing director, Lianne Mize as office manager and Aimee Compton as broodmare manager.

Guilty Pleas in Penn National Race Fixing Case:

The Blood-Horse on-line reports that seven of the nine people charged with fixing races at Penn National have pled guilty. Those admitting to their involvement in the case are jockeys Ramon Pena, Lazaro Vives, Luis Morales, Rocky Jurado and Andres Reyes; and owners George Berryhill and Neil McElwee. Each could face up to five years in prison and a fine of \$250,000. According to the U.S. attorney's office for the Middle District of Pennsylvania, the owners allegedly decided which races to fix, then used Pena as a middleman to offer other jockeys from \$500 to \$1,000 to prevent their horses from finishing in the top three in the designated races. Berryhill and McElwee would then bet the trifecta in those races, leaving out the horses which were being held. Another defendant in the case, jockey Felix Pinero, is scheduled to go on trial in January, while jockey Manuel Torres did not appear for his Nov. 14 arraignment and is considered a fugitive.

JUST CALL HER A STAR

Just Call Me (NZ) (Blues Traveller {Ire}), the highest-priced horse ever bought at public auction in the United Arab Emirates, completely justified her high price tag with an explosive performance on debut at Nad Al Sheba on Thursday night, cantering home by nine lengths. Just Call Me topped the inaugural Pearls of Dubai Auction Oct. 7, falling to the final bid of Dhs2,000,000 (approx US\$543,400) by Sheikh Rashid bin Mohammed al Maktoum. The Pearls of Dubai Auction is a sale comprising 55 Southern Hemisphere-bred three-year-olds, graduates of which are eligible for the Dhs1,000,000 Pearls of Dubai Sales Graduate S. over 1,800m on the dirt at Nad Al Sheba. However there are larger targets in mind for this filly. "We would like to keep her lightly raced leading up to the Pearls of Dubai because we believe she can develop into a Group 3 or Group 2 filly and we may take her to England," said Sheikh Rashid. "We expected that; she has done everything right since the sale and she is a very good filly." Just Call Me went to the front at the top of the straight and cleared right out to defeat stablemate Pikachu by nine lengths. "What was particularly impressive about her effort was that she settled very well and I didn't have to ask for much and she quickened very nicely," said winning rider Ted Durcan. "She did everything right and there is no doubt she will improve on that." Just Call Me was eased down on the line and a guide to her effort can be drawn from the following event won by Asood, also owned by Sheikh Rashid. Her winning time for the 1,600m on the dirt was 1:40.02, a tenth of a second faster than Asood took over the same distance on the turf. While the Pearls of Dubai S. is the obvious target for Just Call Me, an interesting situation could arise as that race is on the same programme as the inaugural UAE 1000 Guineas. It was a night to remember for Sheikh Rashid as he went from successful owner to jockey by the end of the programme, the seventh and final event of the meeting, run just after midnight, saw him ride his first winner as an amateur jockey. Ironically the horse he rode, Martello Tower, is owned by his younger brother Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed, who rode Descendent into second place.

AN IRISH RENAISSANCE: A REVIEW OF THE IRISH RACING SEASON

by Tom Frary

It was thought that racing in Ireland was enjoying something of an upturn before 2000, but nobody could imagine just how successful this watershed year would be. In fact, arguably the names of the year, Sinn dar, Giant's Causeway, and Johnny Murtagh, all emanated from the island.

Although Aidan O'Brien has reigned supreme over Irish racing for the past three seasons, it was another figure who emerged in the big time this season, in the shape of John Oxx. It was the quietly-quietly approach that typified the Epsom Derby preparation of Sinn dar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}) in his native country, as he took in the G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown, having been beaten there when trying to concede seven pounds on his seasonal return. Johnny Murtagh, who, with his eventual 11 Group 1 successes, including a memorable three-timer on the day of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 1, was the human success story of the year, vowed that day that he would not be beaten on the colt again. At Epsom he out-battled Sakhee for a length victory, and he was sensational when running away with the Irish equivalent at The Curragh, taking the \$1 million bonus for the Derby double as a result. For most horses, this would be enough to secure a special place in history. For Sinn dar, it was merely the beginning.

Meanwhile, the campaigning of Giant's Causeway (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}) was breaking records and bringing a racing press and public to its knees with its remarkable boldness. Blessed with a remarkable constitution, natural tactical speed, raw toughness and intelligence, Giant's Causeway had all the necessary ingredients in place at the start of the year. Aidan O'Brien had a plan which was not limited by going or a certain distance; one that was ambitious. Despite two defeats in the English and Irish 2000 Guineas, his trainer's faith was rewarded with five successive Group 1 triumphs throughout the summer, a sequence that former Ballydoyle champion Nijinsky put in place in 1970 [Editor's Note: the Pattern was introduced in 1971].

Irish Season Review cont.

That was equalled in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, and the welcome he received on his return into the winner's enclosure will live long in the memory of those that were fortunate enough to be there. A mere neck away from victory in connections' ultimate aim, the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic, at Churchill Downs Nov. 4, the 'iron horse' exited the 2000 season as one of the finest horses ever to grace Ballydoyle.

Sinndar, fresh from his summer break, attacked the G2 Prix Niel with a vitriol previously undetected by the racing press, who started to talk of him defeating the great **Montjeu (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. At this point such talk was tantamount to blasphemy, such a grip did the French colt enjoy on the racing year. In fact, he had already shown what damage he could do at his imperious best in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh in May. Yet it was Murtagh who was on top in Paris, as Montjeu failed to even raise a fist. Punched out for Arc glory, Sinndar ended his brief but impressive career in league with recent champions such as Lammtarra, Peintre Celebre, and even Montjeu. Few would deny him that accolade.

Other notable Irish events in 2000 included the hard-won success for **Bachir (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) in the Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh, where he defeated the 'iron horse' to become the first to record the French-Irish Guineas double. This was one of four of the five Irish Classics to go to foreign raiders, as **Petrushka (Ire)** (Unfuwain {USA}), winner of the G1 Irish Oaks, and **Crimplene (Ire)** (Lion Cavern {USA}), winner of the G1 1000 Guineas, swept aside the home defence. The two-year-old scene was again dominated by Aidan O'Brien, however, who took all the Group 1 races on the national calendar with **Minardi (USA)** (Boundary {USA}) in the Heinz 57 S., **Beckett (Ire)** (Fairy King {Ire}) in the National S., and **Sequoyah (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) in the Moyglare S.

Pat Smullen also achieved a personal landmark, becoming Irish champion jockey for the first time with 80 winners. His trainer Dermot Weld, who has long since held a high regard for the young jockey, was largely instrumental in helping him to that goal. The trainer achieved success in the United States with **Pine Dance (USA)** (Pine Bluff {USA}), showing once again his aptitude for taking international opportunities. That he is to scale down his operation from 2001 is tribute to his wisdom, chasing quality at the expense of quantity, something which was once more in evidence, as he sent out the most winners, in 84, of the season.
